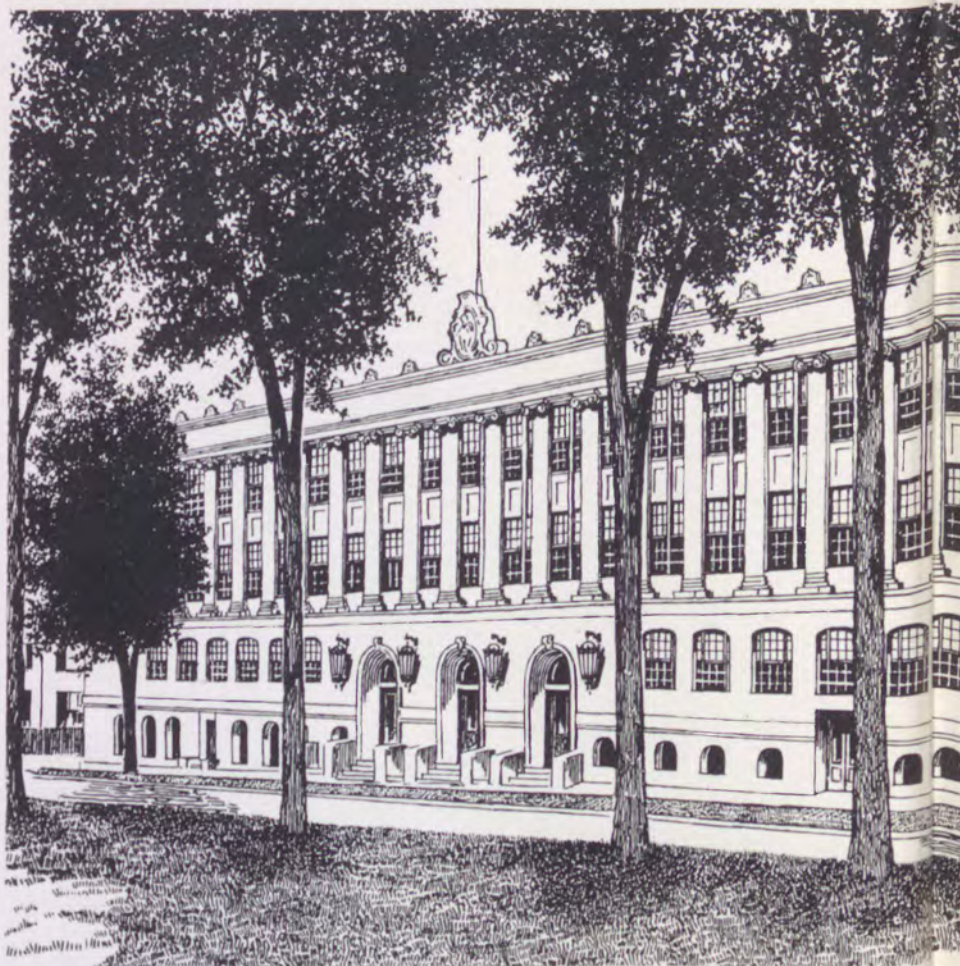

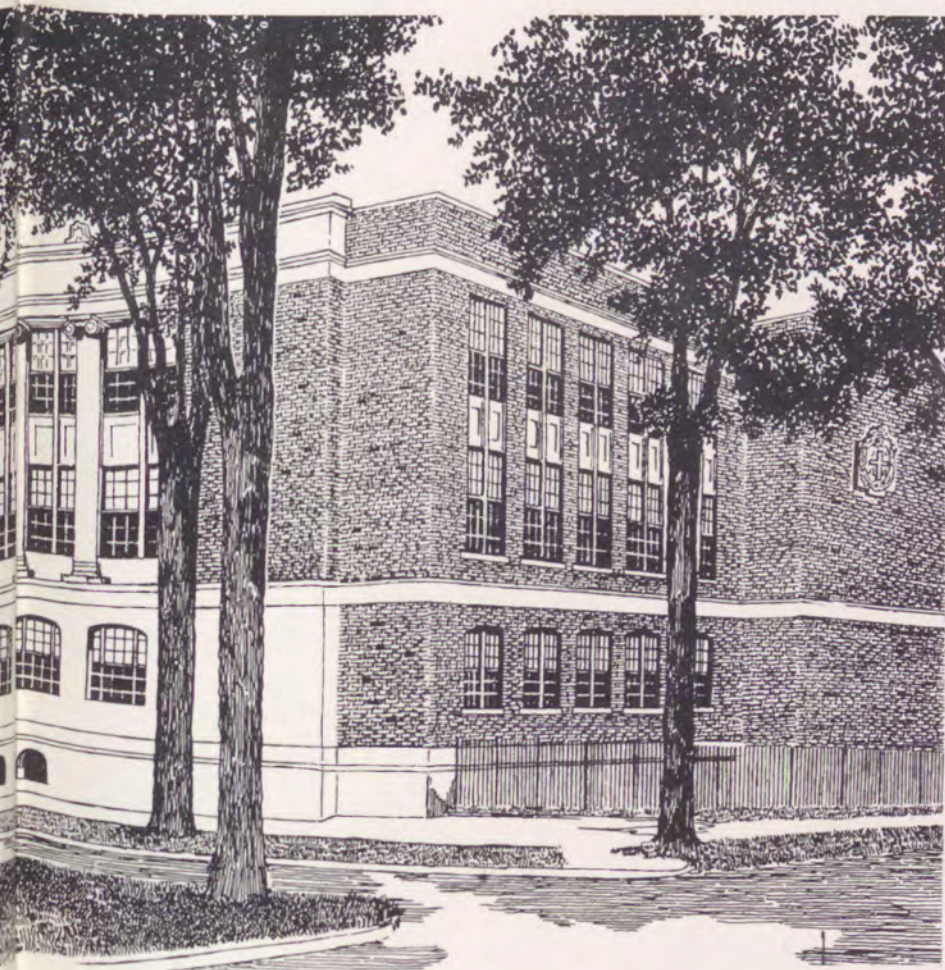
"A model of beauty and convenience" were words used to describe the new high school building dedicated to the memory of Father John Bapst, S. J. on Sunday, September 8, 1928.

The new high school was the realization of the plans and dreams of Father John's parish whose inspiring zeal was a strong factor in the fulfillment of the plans. Timothy Houlihan, pastors of St. Mary's parish. The name "John Bapst" was given in recognition of the great works of the pioneering priest.

Work was begun on the new high school in 1926. O'Connell and Shannon's foundation and the Richard Kennedy Co. of Portland built the super-structure. The cornerstone was laid and the school was dedicated to God under the patronage of Georgetown University, delivered the address on this occasion.

The school was formally opened on September 9, 1928. Mother Mary Edward M. Shannon was first principal of the boys' division. In 1933 the boys' division with Brother Adalbert as the first principal.

Mother Mary Raphael was followed as principal by Sisters M. Florence and Sister Mary. Brother Adalbert was succeeded in turn by Brother Adalbert. Brother Adalbert is the present principal of the boys' division.

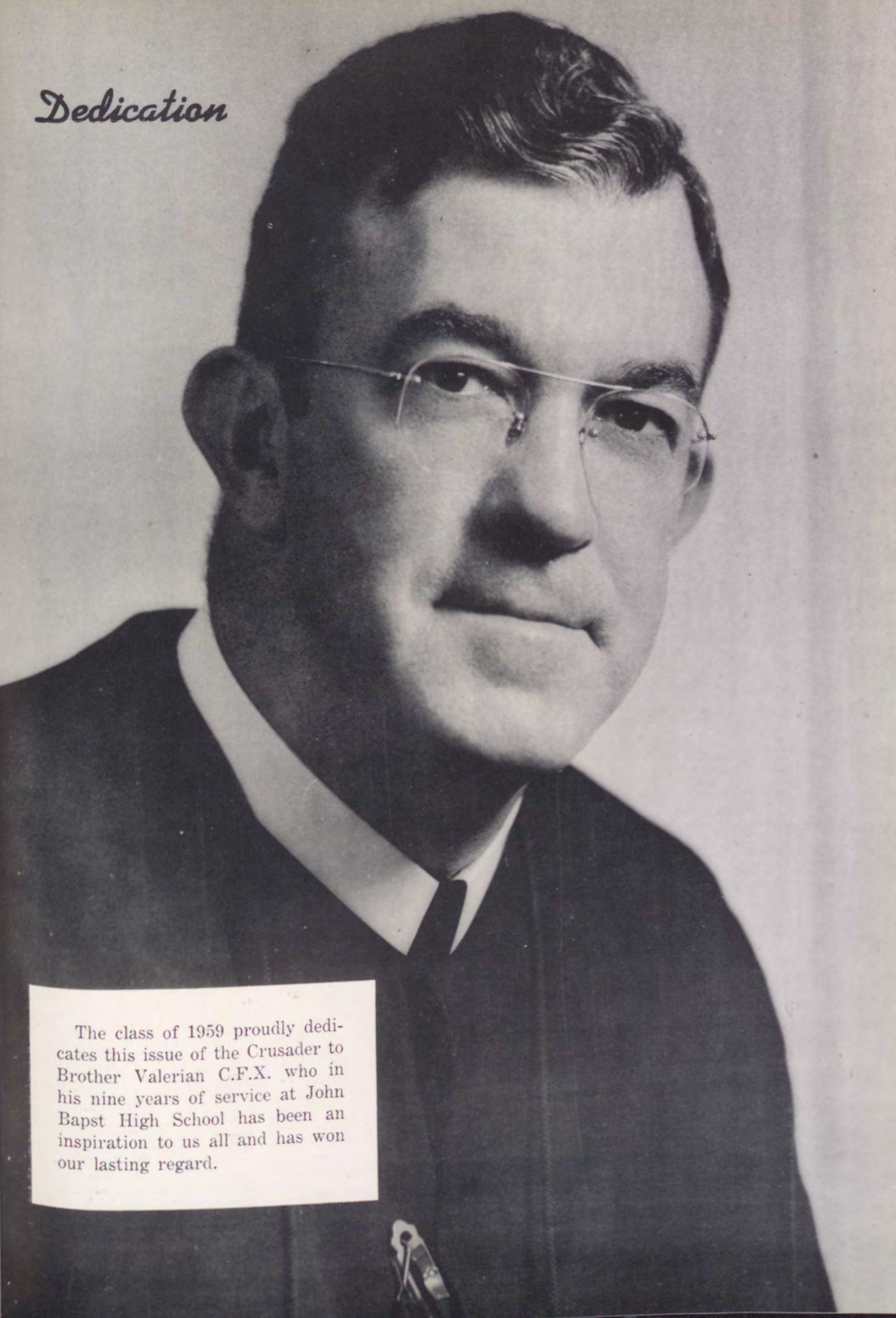
Dear Reader:

We, the staff of the 1959 Annual, feel we owe you, the public, an explanation as to why our yearbook was not published at the time appointed.



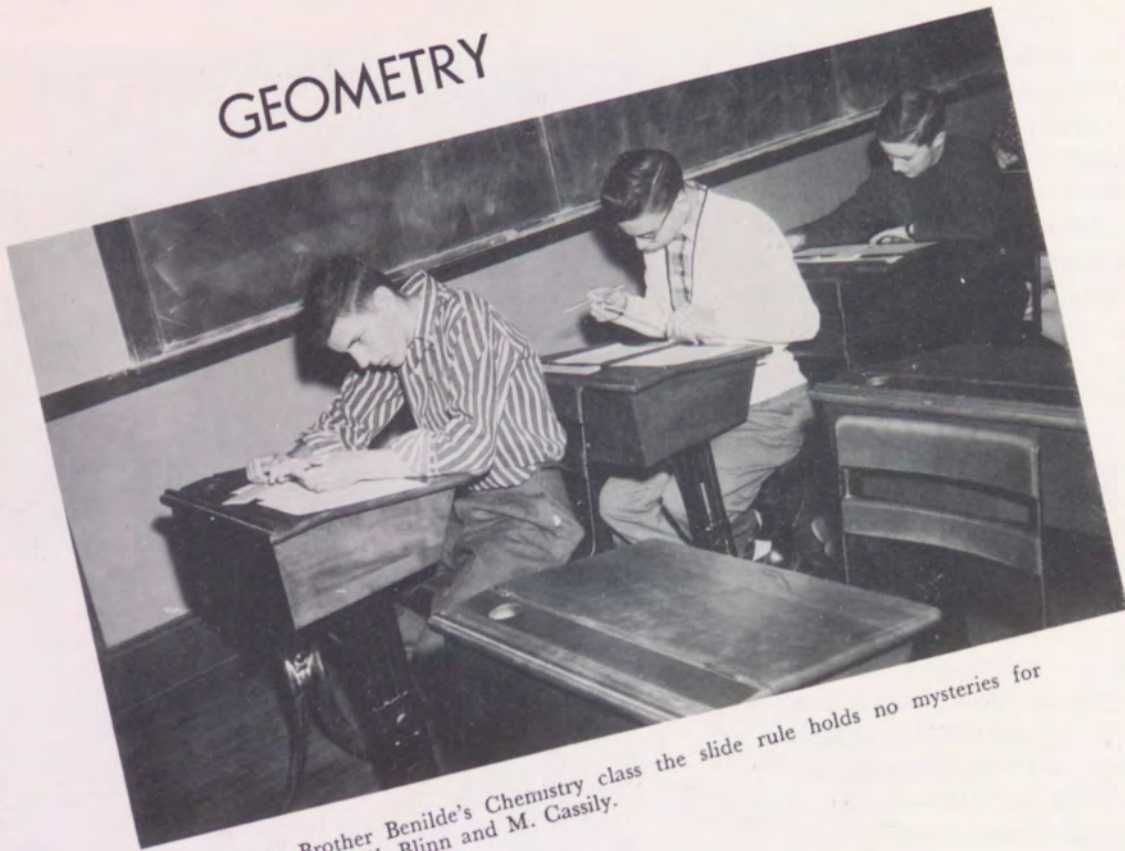

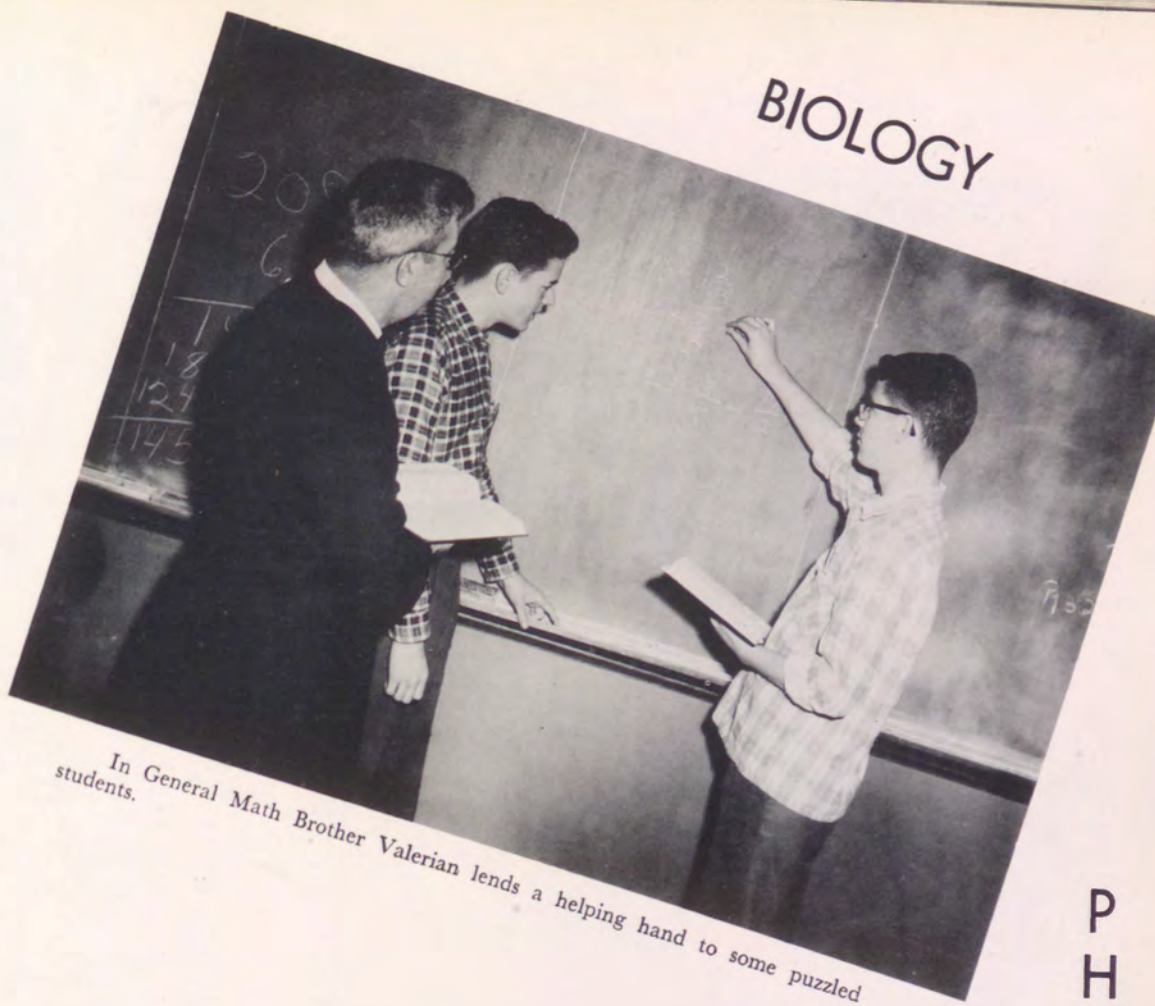

With more and more teenagers having drivers' licenses and owning their own cars the Governor, then Governor Edmund Muskie, and his Council decided to institute a Youth Highway Safety Council. Each year it has grown and has received excellent support from both the state and local governments and the Maine State Police.

We in the Safety Council also owe a debt of gratitude to the late "Brim" Brian M. Jewett whose efforts helped make a youth safety organization a reality. Death took this dynamic worker early this year.

Last year we at John Baptist were fortunate enough to have a Youth Safety Council organized. With the help of our Moderator Brother Remegius, our Principal Brother Evangelus and Trooper Jim Reeves of the Maine State Police, our Council grew from fifteen members to well over sixty in the two years of our existence.

Among projects which our council took part in were: The Annual Teenage Rode-E-O, the Annual Maine Youth Safety Council and the Maine Highway Safety Committee which got three highway safety bills passed by this legislature. We also sponsored a bicycle safety program for the Grammar School students.

With the help of Mr. Chris Ruby, Brother Remegius, Sister Mary Luke, the Boys' Youth Chairman Mike Mosbacher, and our County Representative Tim Samway, we were able to start a Youth Highway Safety Council in the Girls' Department. Mrs. Ruby who is also the Driver Education Teacher for the Girls' Department became Moderator and Polly O'Brien was elected Chairman of the new council.

We in the Youth Safety Council believe that we have helped to instill safety practices in our young drivers' minds and have made them realize that the life they save may be their own.



Science

Each year the science students of John Baptist High School submit the plans of their projects to their teachers for approval. Every science student, whether a student in chemistry or physics, must submit a project to his teacher for approval. This is seen as an excellent science activity of the year.

Every student's display is examined by a judge in each of the four divisions. Brother Lucas C.F. acted as judge.

Some of the pupils in developing their projects are as follows. In the chemistry division prizes were awarded to Mosbacher, second; and John Shaw, third.

Jerry McGuire's display consisted in the development of autoradiographs. Not only did McGuire's project win second prize in the State Science Fair held at the state award Jerry McGuire had to enter his project in the High School. The many projects entered in the area. From these regional fairs are selected the displays for the state fair.

Martyn A. Vickers was awarded first prize in the general science field. Second prize winner in this division was Mary Jane McClay, third prize.

In the general science field prizes were awarded to second; Mary Jane McClay, third.

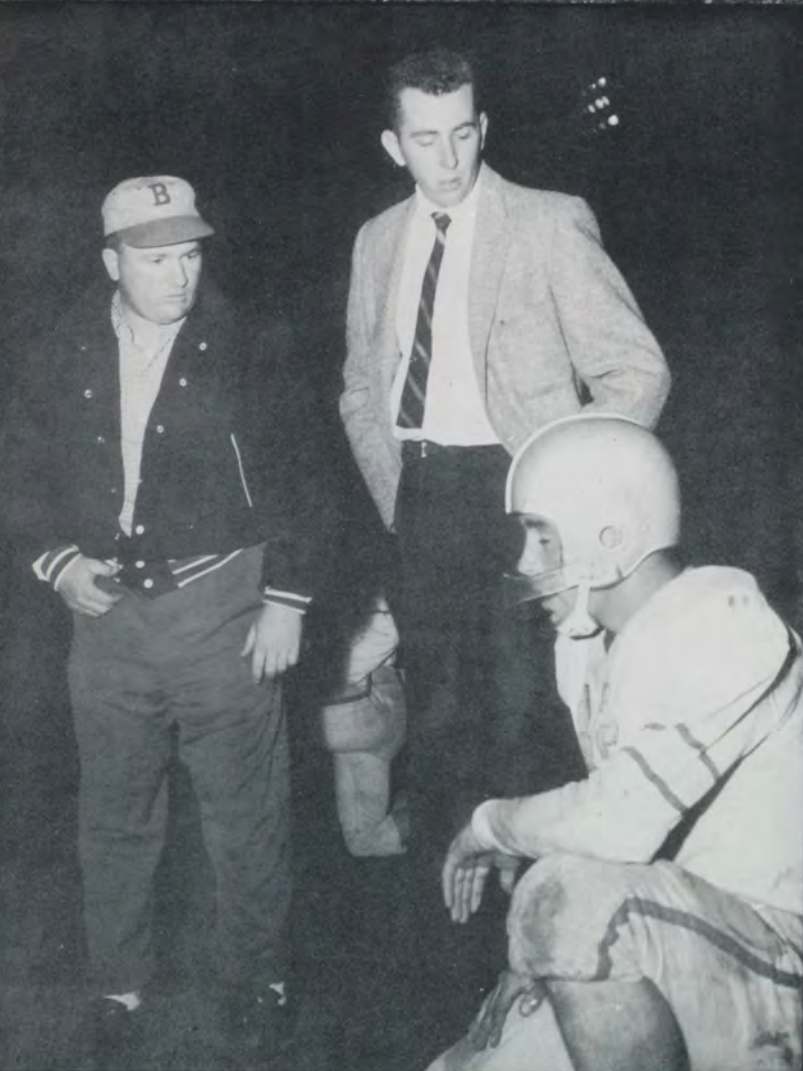

The squad finished with a record of three wins and four losses and a tie.

In Coach Mahaney's debut as head football mentor, the Crusaders won for him his first varsity win as they defeated Crosby High of Belfast by a 39-19 score. Co-captain Jerry McGuire was top man offensively, scoring a touchdown and racking up long gains of 64 and 78 yards. End Jim Curtis sparkled on defense.

The second contest of the season saw the Baptist gridders give a sound trouncing to the Old Town Indians, 40-13. Again co-captain McGuire sparked the attack. He ran back the opening kick-off and before the game was over he had scored four more times. Good passing by Quarterback Archie Verow and touchdowns by Verow and Lousier added to the excellence of the squad.

In our next game, we ran up against a determined Madison club that battled all the way and held our boys to a 0-0 tie. A Crusader scoring drive in the late minutes of play came too late for a touchdown.

Lawrence High of Fairfield was next on the list of possible victories. They proved too much for the stricken Crusaders and the final gun saw Fairfield the winner 34-6.

The loss was a costly one because of the fact that one of our line standouts, Stu Whittemore, suffered a leg fracture and was lost for the season.

Our next battle on the gridiron saw the Crusaders beaten again by the undefeated Brewer team 38-0. The tough Brewer combination was too much for the further weakened Crusaders. McGuire was unable to play because of an injury, and his loss was deeply felt. Roger Greenan took over his first starting assignment and proved a top defensive player for the remaining season.

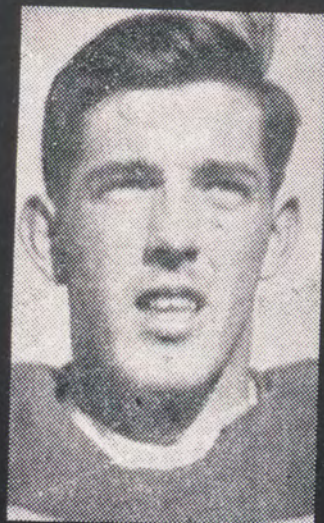

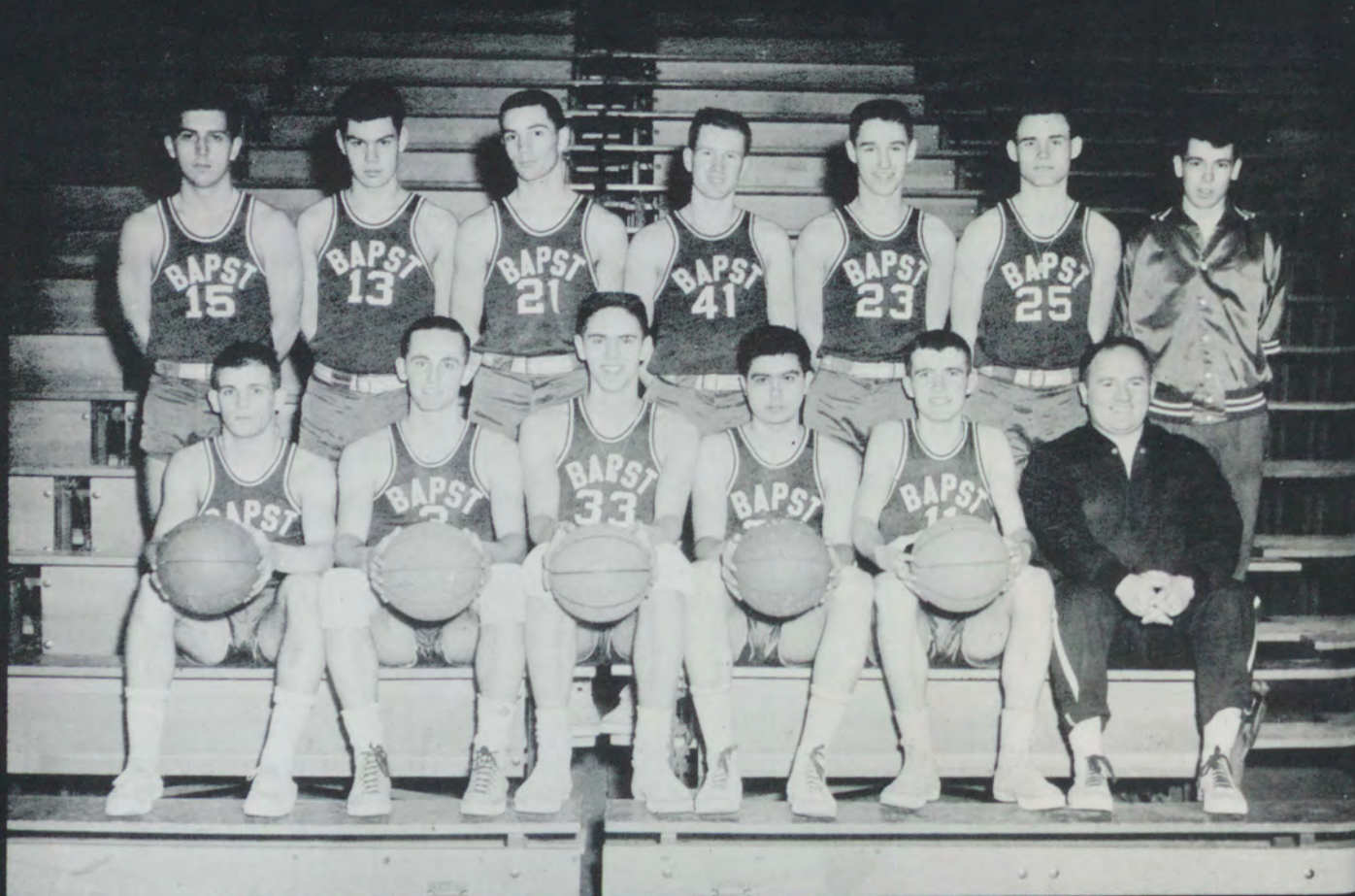

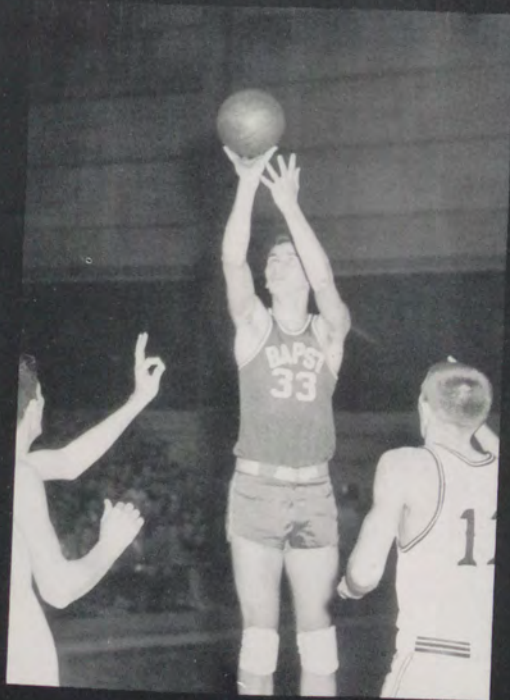

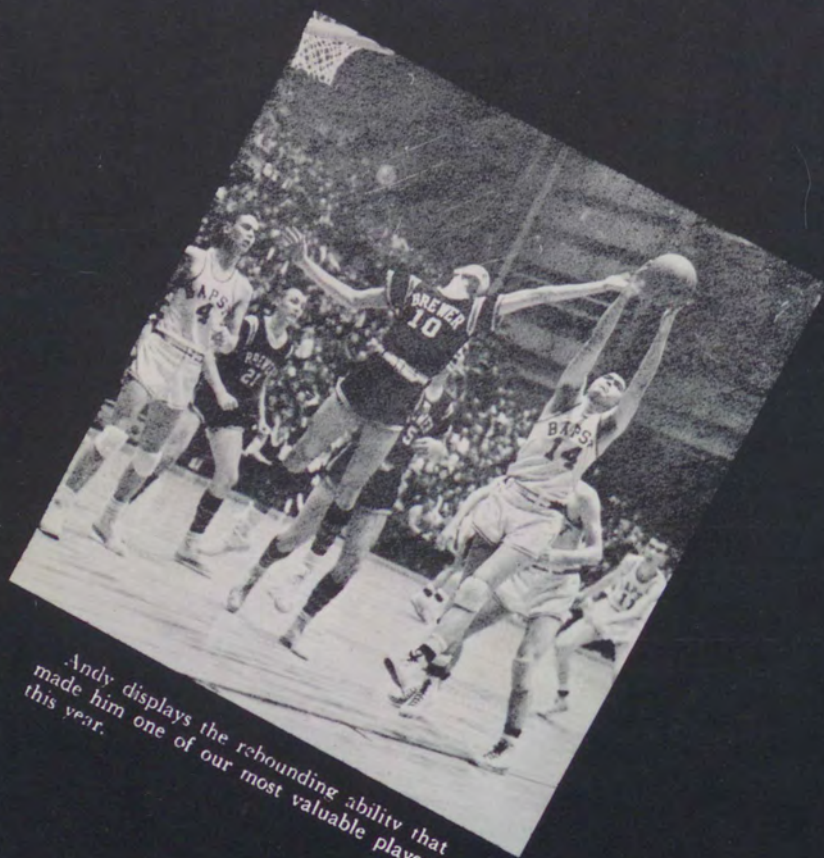

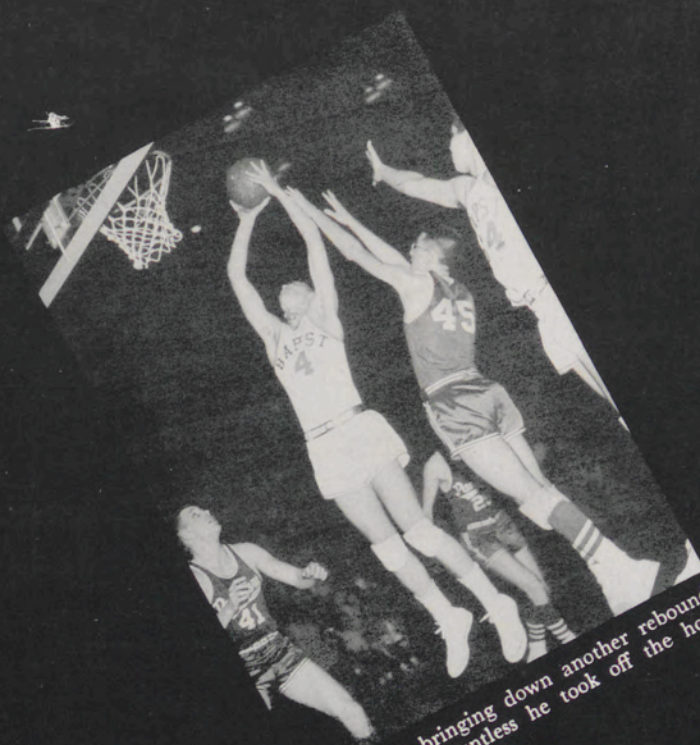

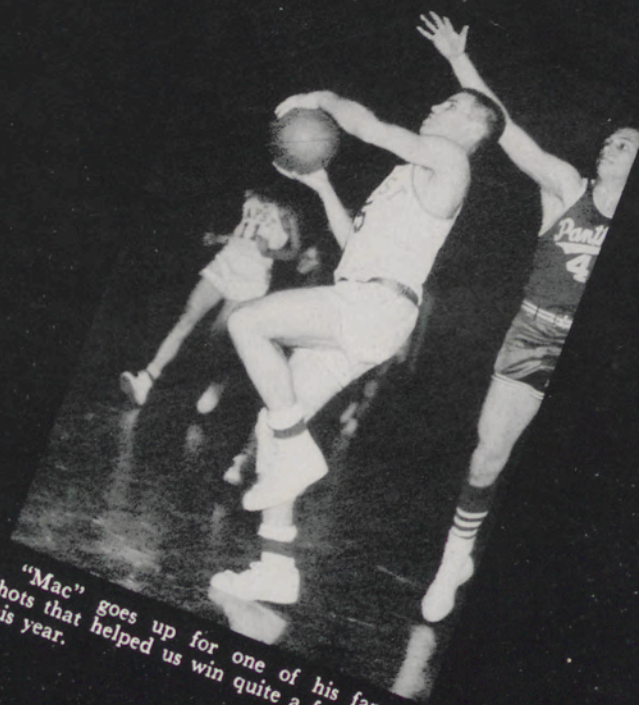

BREWER LOSES HEARTBREAKER

Bob McAllister Hero, John Bapst In Finals

With his club trailing 50-59 with only 26 seconds left on the clock, Marvelous Mac moved into the foul circle and jumped to set the count at 59-57. And then with only nine seconds to go, he drew a two-shot foul.

Stepping calmly to the charity stripe amid a bedlam of noise coming from upwards of 6,000 hoarsely-screaming fans, Mac flipped both shots cleanly through the nets to send the game into the first overtime.

Brewer's Danny Coombs, who appears destined to be the forgotten man in this beauty of a ball-game, moved under the hoop to curl in a layup to start out the overtime.

Ties It At 61

But McAllister moved back to jump with another winner from the top of the key and it was 61-61. Coombs' 25-footer at the gun failed to connect, and the sudden-death session was in order.

Mac missed a 20-footer for the first crack at the hoop in the sudden-death period, and shortly thereafter, Dennis Vanadestine of Brewer drew a one-one foul.

Vanadestine Hits One

The Brewer barometer rose to the boiling point as Vanadestine dumped his first shot over the rim and had only to connect with the second one to send the Witches into the final.

But the fates frowned on the Orange and Black and Bapst, controlled the rebound.

The ball was given into McAllister's capable, hot hands, and the Crusader field general motioned his men to move into position. He backed into the foul circle, spun around a defending Brewer man, jumped, and the game became history.

Crusaders Take Lead

The game began with the Crusaders in complete command as they carefully engineered a 7-11 first quarter lead behind Andy Akins' corner shots and some good moves by Tommy Jordan. Coombs was great for the Witches, hitting with almost amazing accuracy, especially in the second chapter to move Brewer steadily to the front. It was a 25-foot set by the well-built and quickly-moving junior with 20 seconds to go which gave Brewer a 29-27 halftime margin.

Brewer Ahead

He hooked up with big center Pud Robertson and backcourt man Bump Hadley in the third quarter to move Brewer away to what appeared to be a fairly comfortable 45-39 margin.

The picture looked its darkest for the title hopes of the Bapst quintet at the outset of the final period, when Coombs and Hadley dropped in three foul shots to give the Witches a 49-39 lead. Then Brewer took its biggest margin of the night after Jordan hit two free throws. Robertson dunked a foul shot, and Hadley barreled in for two on a fast break to make it 52-41.

35-Foot Jumper

But Akins jumped from the right side for two. McAllister jumped from 18 feet out for another bucket, and Johnny Greer picked up a loose ball and whistled in for two more to shave it to 52-47.

Vanadestine put it back to 54-47 on a set from the side, but Jordan added a free one. Greer followed up a shot for two and DeGrass hit a foul shot to move back to within three.

Coombs connected on a driving jumper and Akins came back with a beautiful move across the bucket to make it 56-53. Brewer.

Nerve-Searing Battle

From then on it was a duel between Coombs and McAllister. Jordan fouled out and Coombs sank two free throws which looked big at that point with only a minute remaining, and then it appeared to be all over when Akins fouled out and Robertson made it 59-55 with 36 seconds left on the clock.

But Mac came through with his foul clutch skills to set up the nerve-searing additional action.

Coombs, who had a monopoly on the hero-label for the first three periods before McAllister stole the show, finished the night with a terrific 28-point total in the losses.

February 28:

Thus we lost the coveted Eastern Class L Championship, despite the superhuman efforts of Bobby McAllister who made 22 points in nine minutes of play before fouling out of the game, and the rest of the team that fought valiantly but fruitlessly to pull the game over the top. (Final score: John Bapst—61; Bangor—70).

However, one loss, not even one carrying such importance as the one on which the championship depended, could ever change the fact that this was a great year for a great team. This was a year in which the public was forced not only to "lift their hats and raise 'em high 'cause John Bapst was passing by" but also to "run for cover" before a mighty team, coached by a mighty man, that did a mighty fine job.
