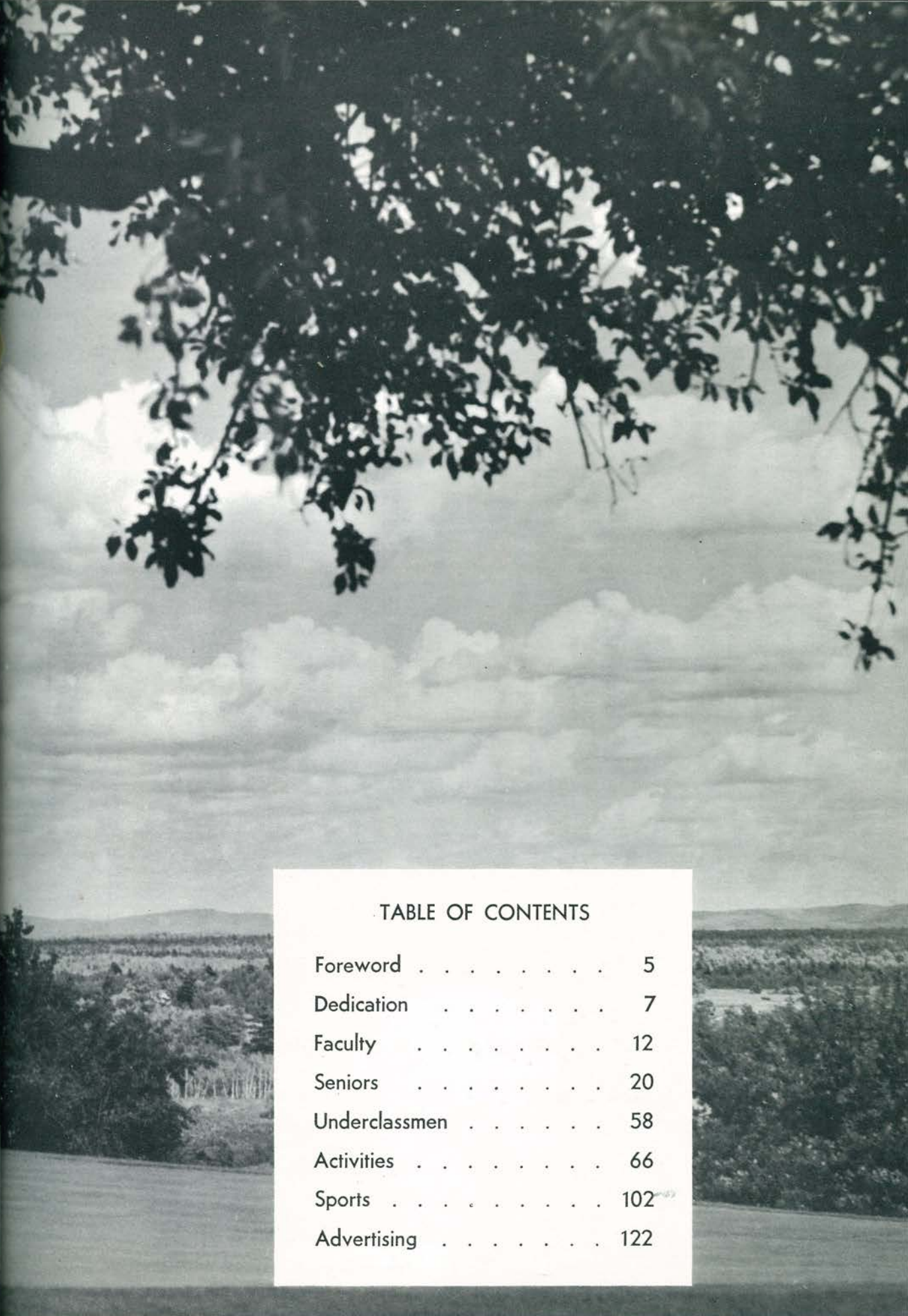

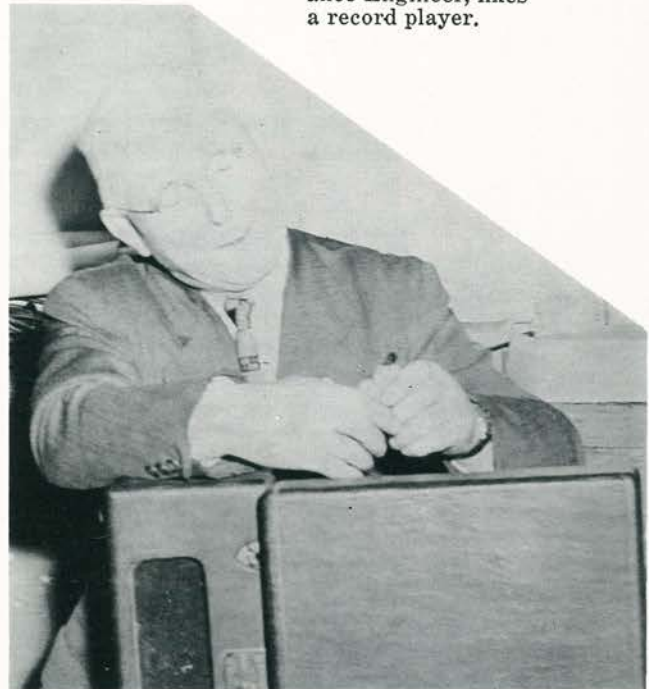
LAWRENCE "LARRY" STRILEY

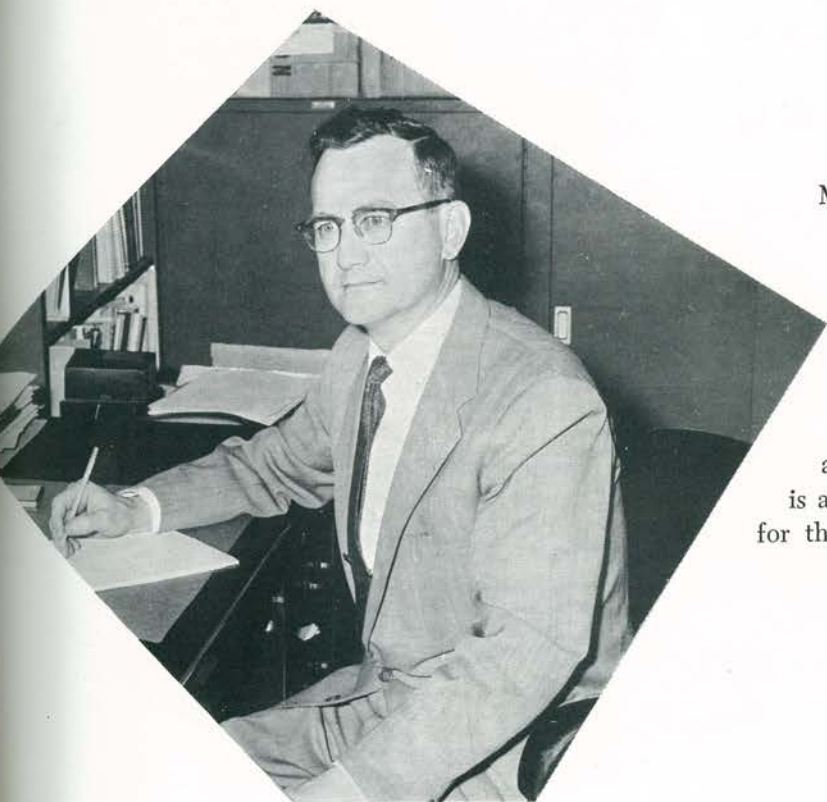

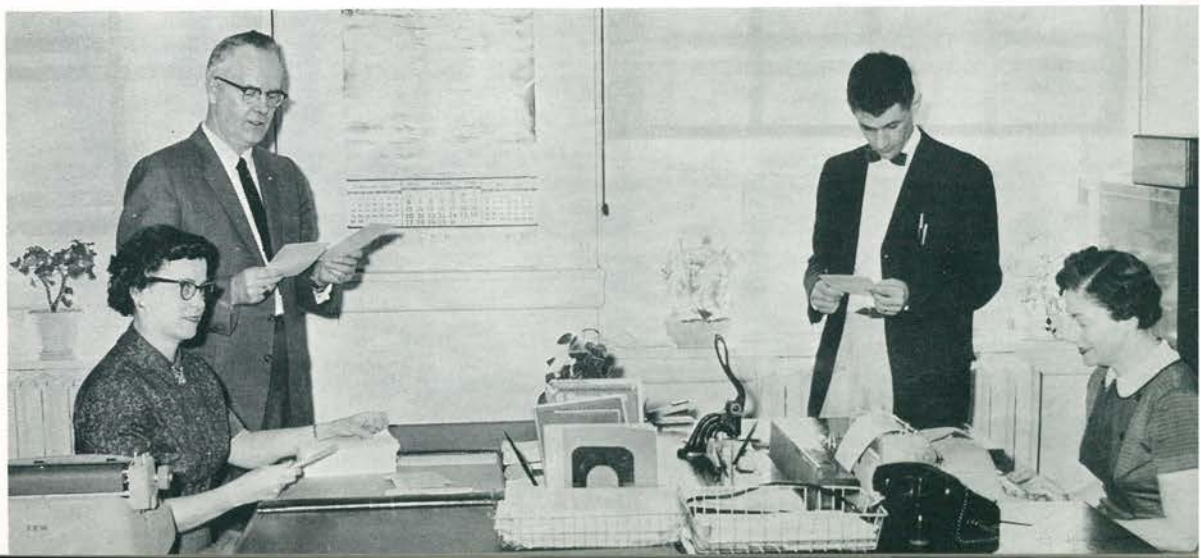

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

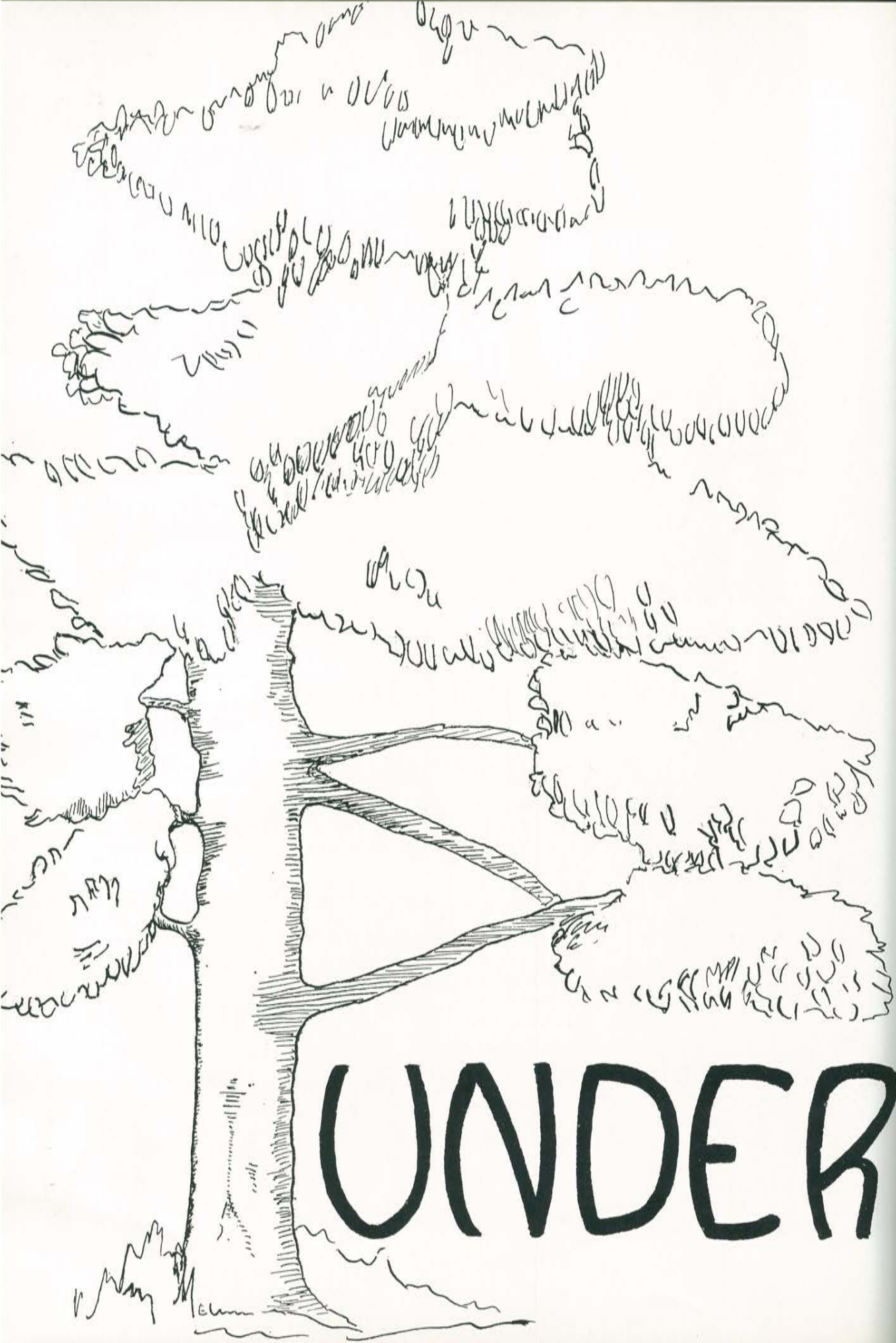

Jill Barry was chosen by her classmates as the March of Dimes Queen for the Freshman Class.

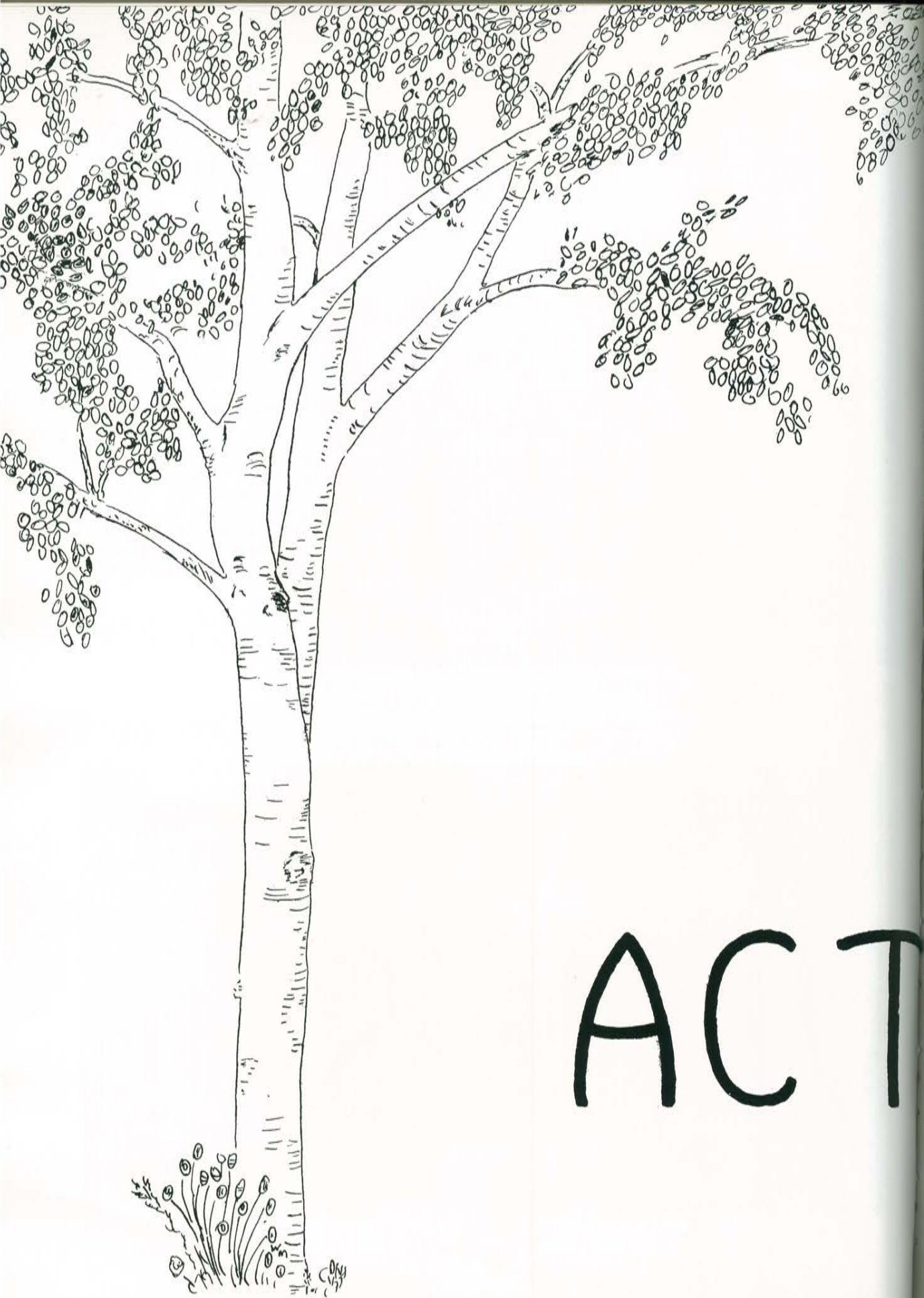



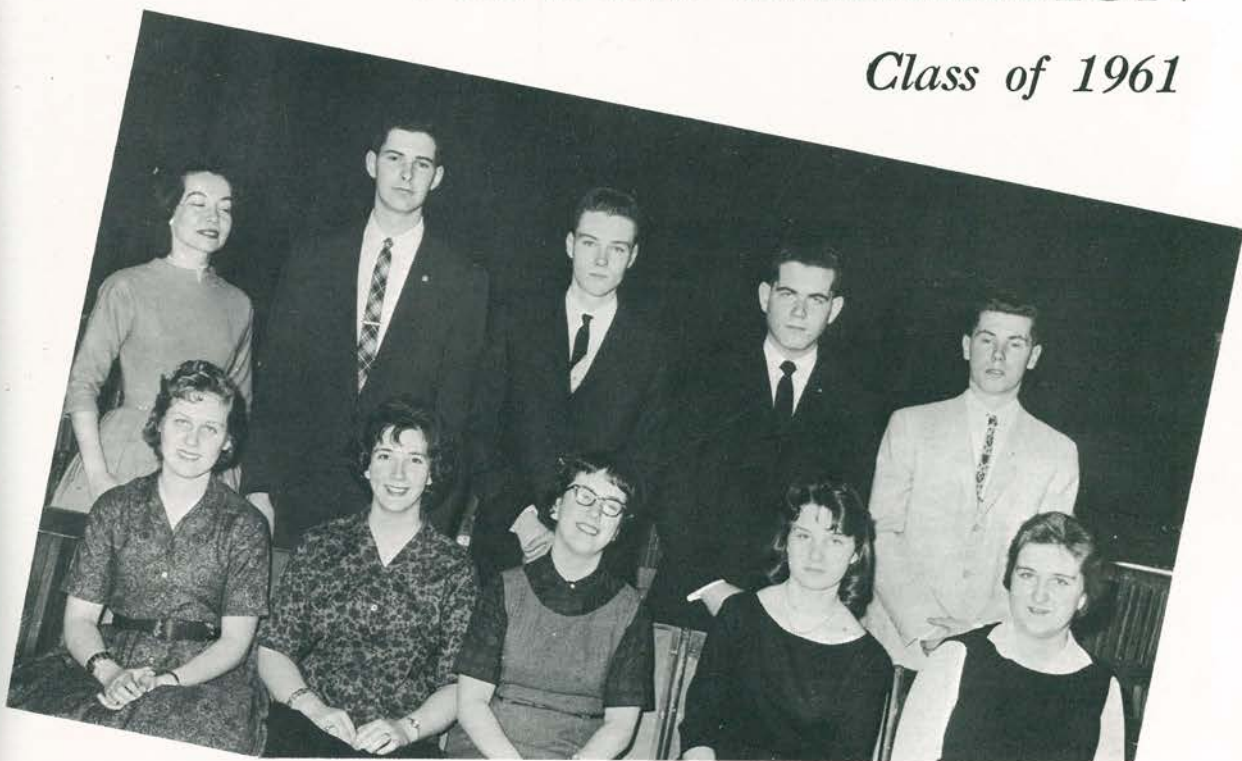

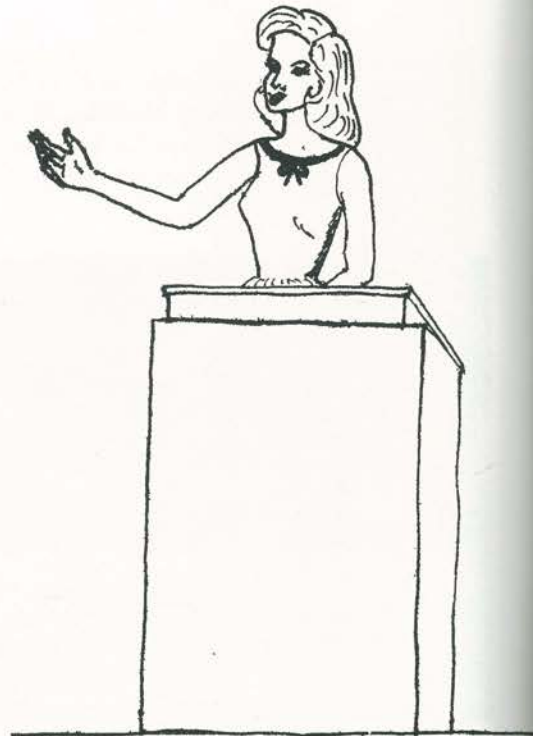

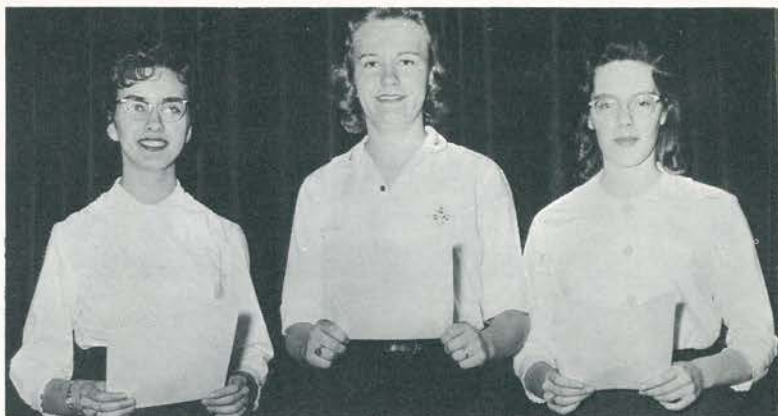
MIXED CHORUS

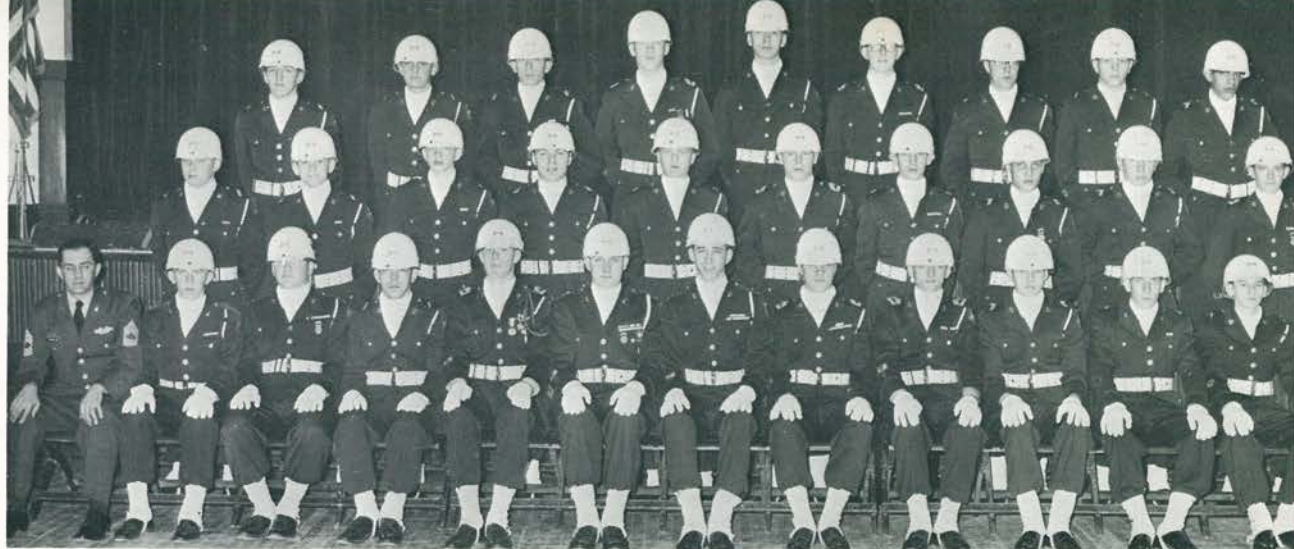

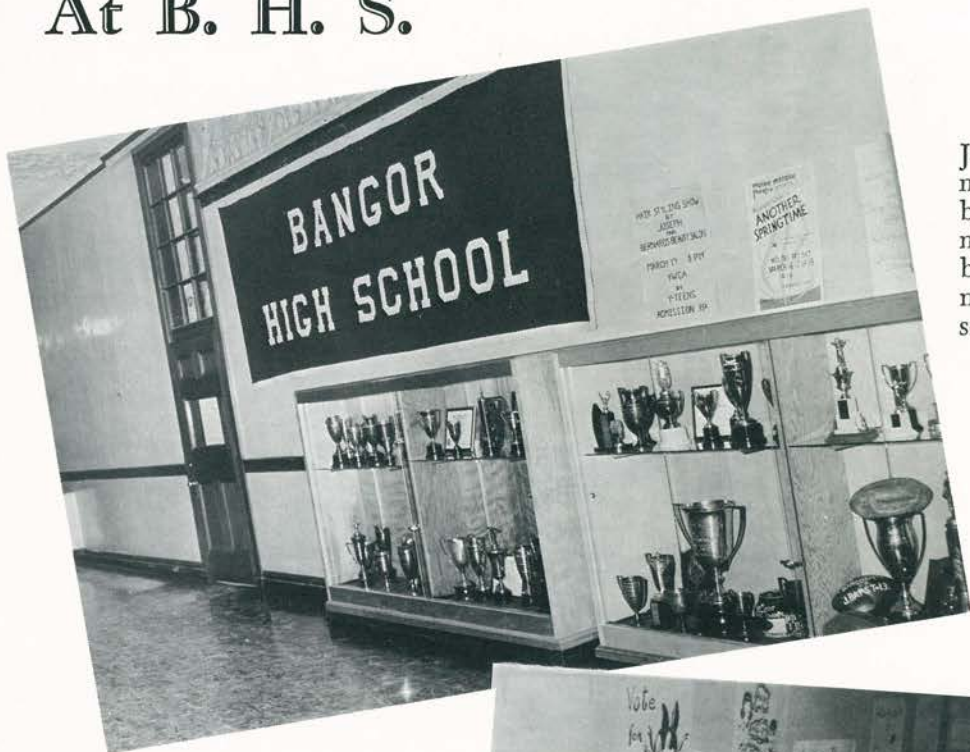

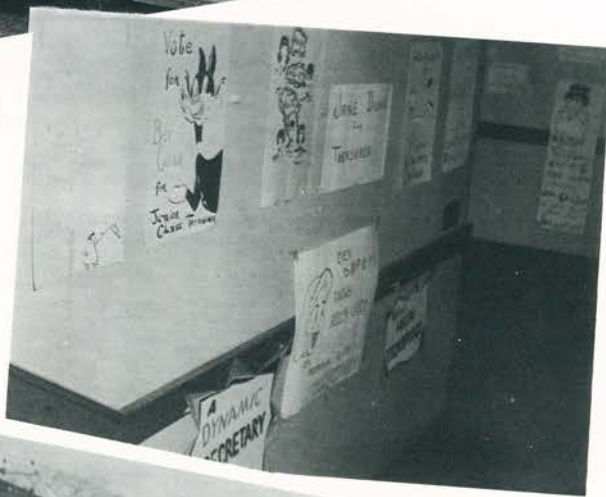

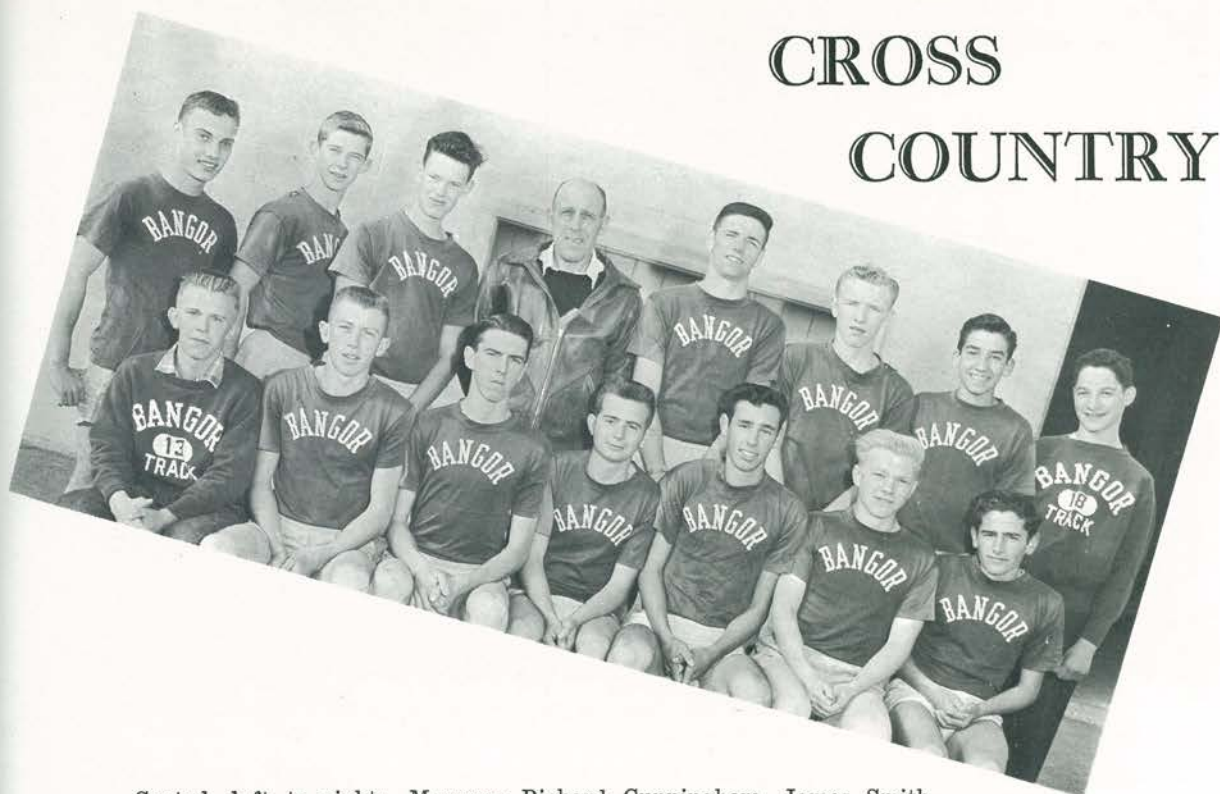

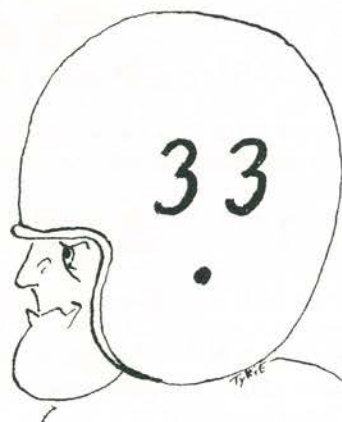


