Americans visiting London, England, will find our directories on file at Messrs. Henry F. Gillig & Co.'s, 449 Strand, Charing Cross.

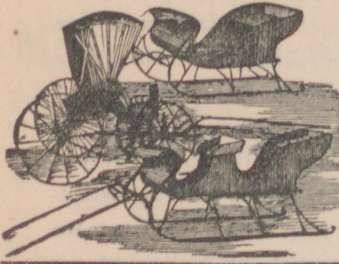

## THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY.

This institution was incorporated under the name of the Maine Charity School, in 1814. In 1817 it went into operation at Hampden. In 1819 it was permanently located at Bangor. Its object is to provide the means of a thorough professional education to ministers, and is open to Evangelical Christians of every denomination.

Candidates for admission must have been regularly educated at some respectable College or University, or otherwise have made literary acquisitions which, as preparatory to Theological studies, are substantially equivalent to a liberal education.

The number of students varies from 40 to 60. Whole number of Alumni, about 500. The library contains more than 13,000 volumes.

The Anniversary is on the first Wednesday in June. There is but one vacation in the year, commencing at the Anniversary, and continuing fifteen weeks. The proper time for admission to the Seminary is the first week in the Academical year, which commences fifteen weeks from the Anniversary.

All letters are delivered free by carriers when addressed to street and number. People should inform their correspondents of above and have their letters addressed accordingly.

Persons leaving their address at the General Delivery can also have their letters sent, but it is much more convenient to have the street and number on, and they will be delivered *earlier* than if the same is put on at the office. Carriers make two deliveries daily, the first trip supplying the extremes of their routes.
