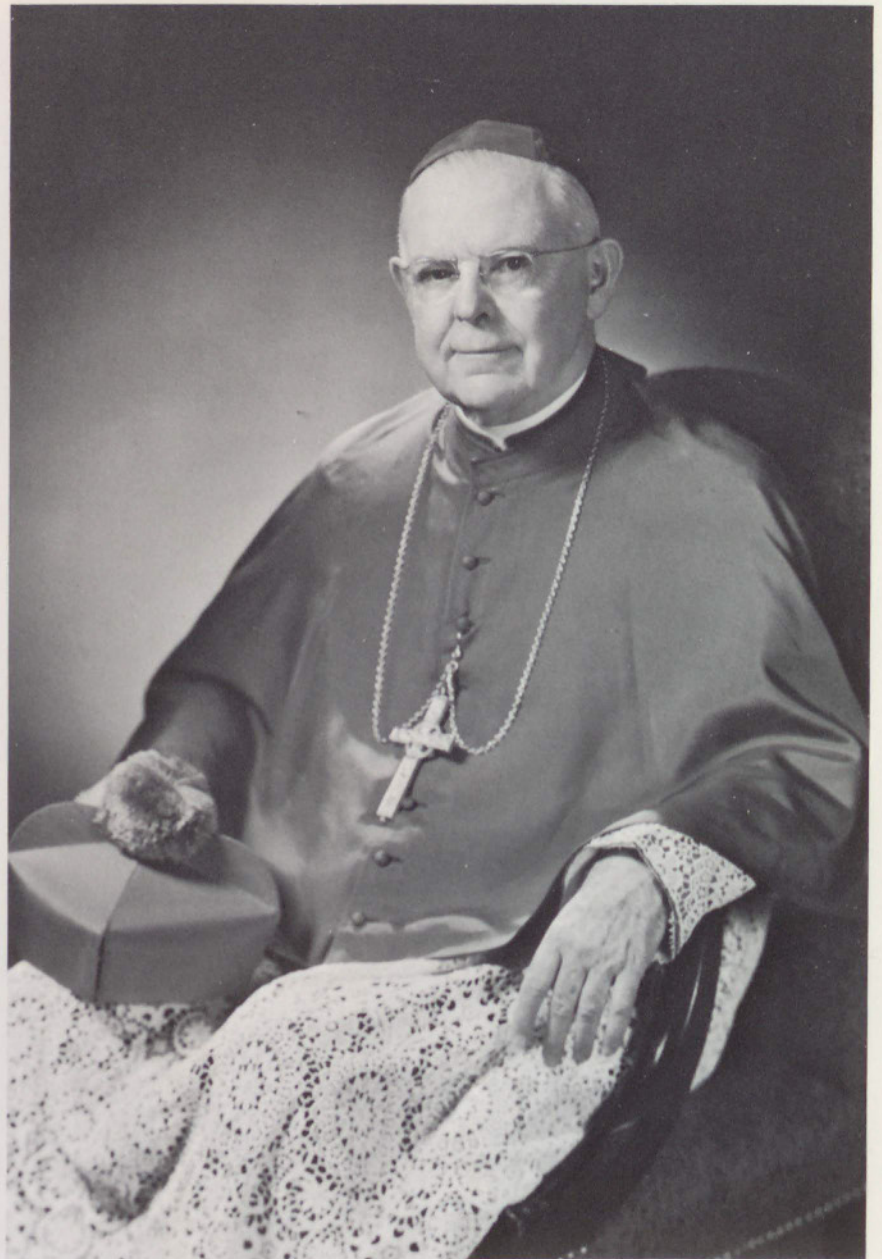

IN MEMORIAM

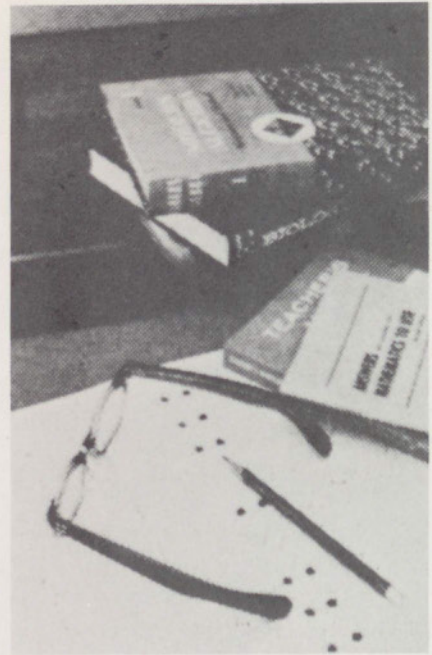

Credit must be given to Coach Joe Sekera. He can look toward the future hopefully, as he has much potential among the frosh and sophomore runners.

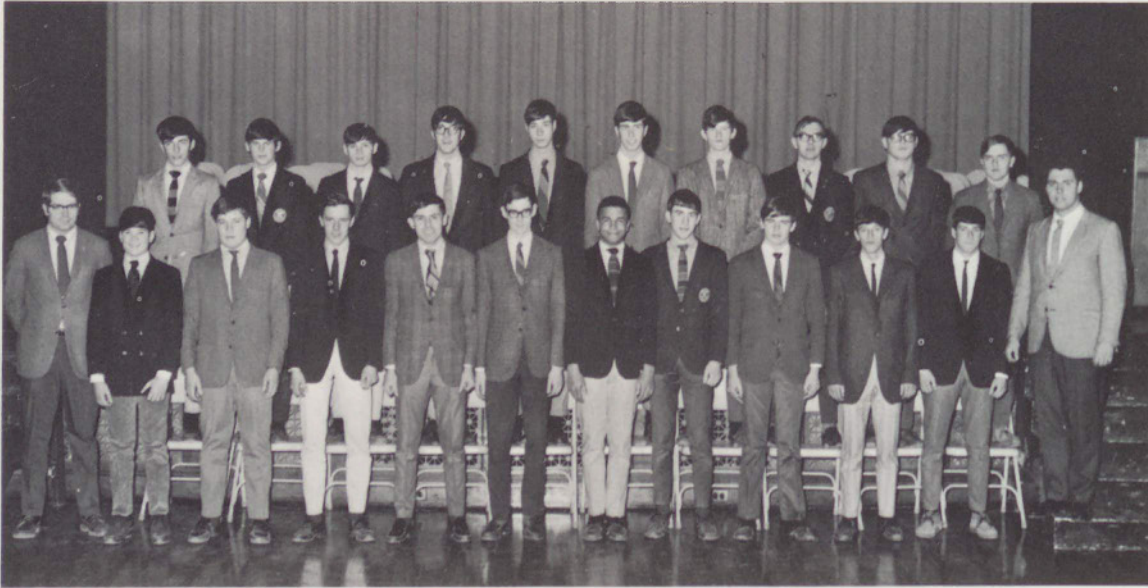

THE SEASON'S OVER

John Bapst experienced one of the worst football seasons in the history of the school. A final record of 0-10 is not one to praise. However, considering the lack of experience and size of the team, just showing up for the game was an accomplishment.

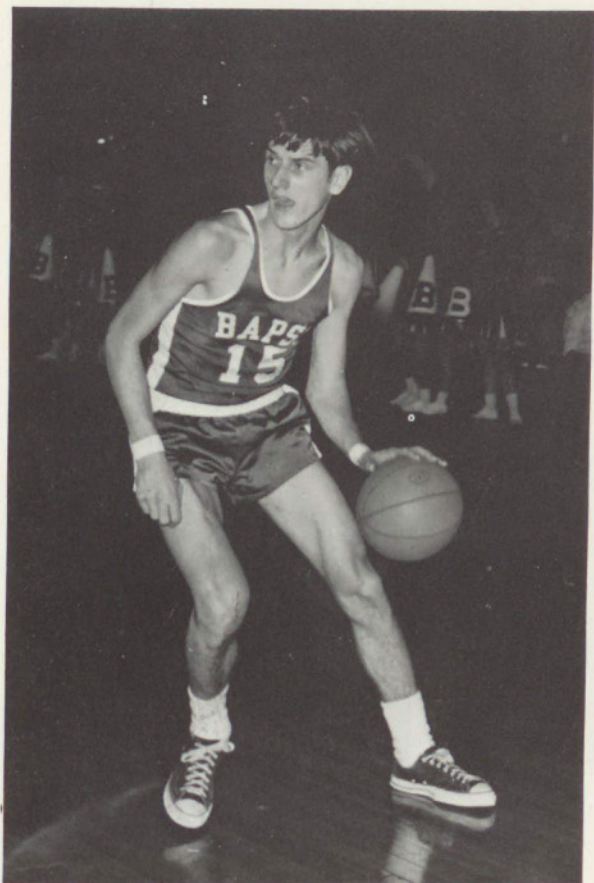
CRUSADERS CONCLUDE 1970 SEASON

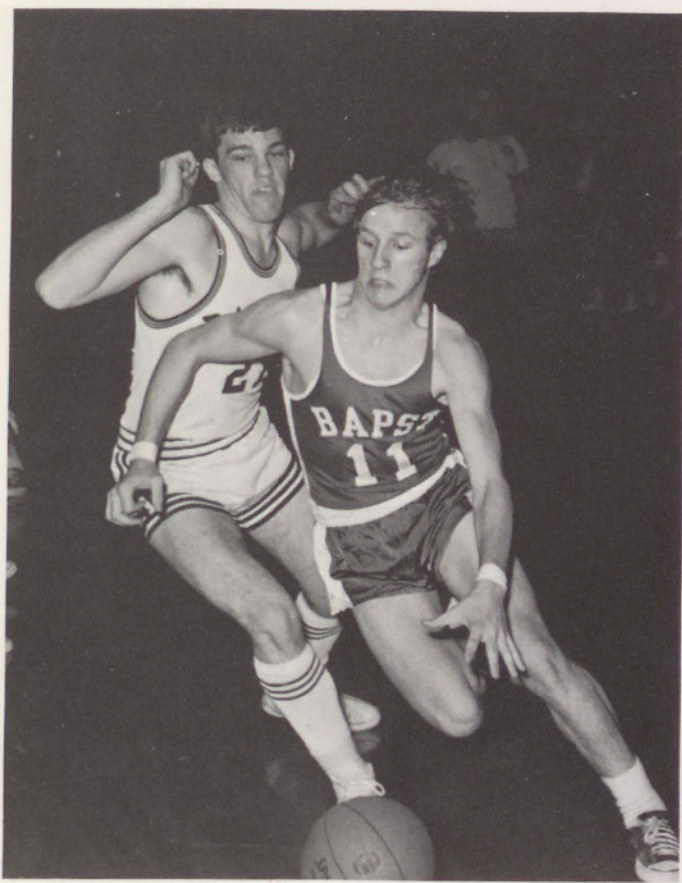

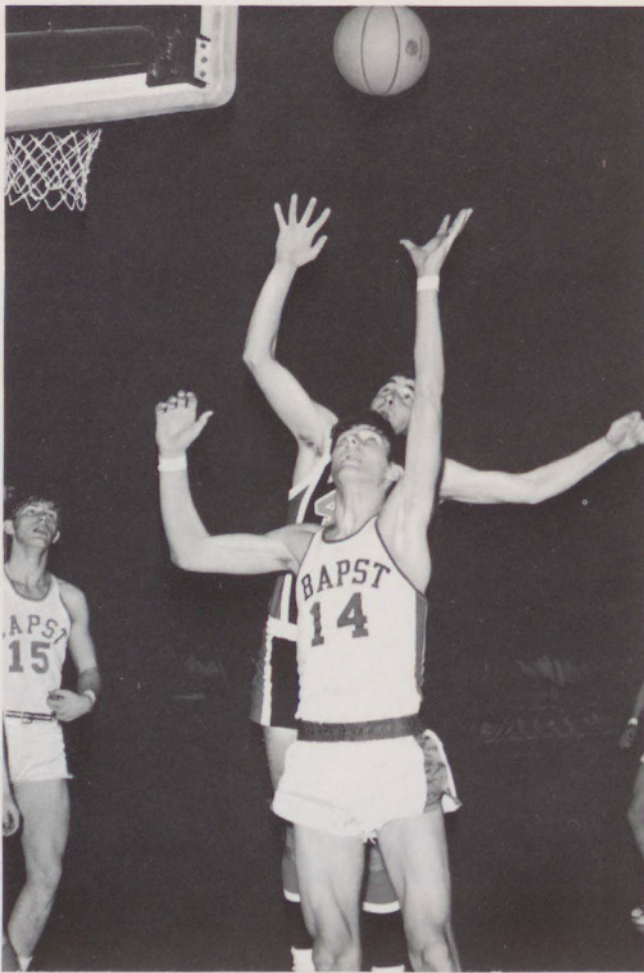

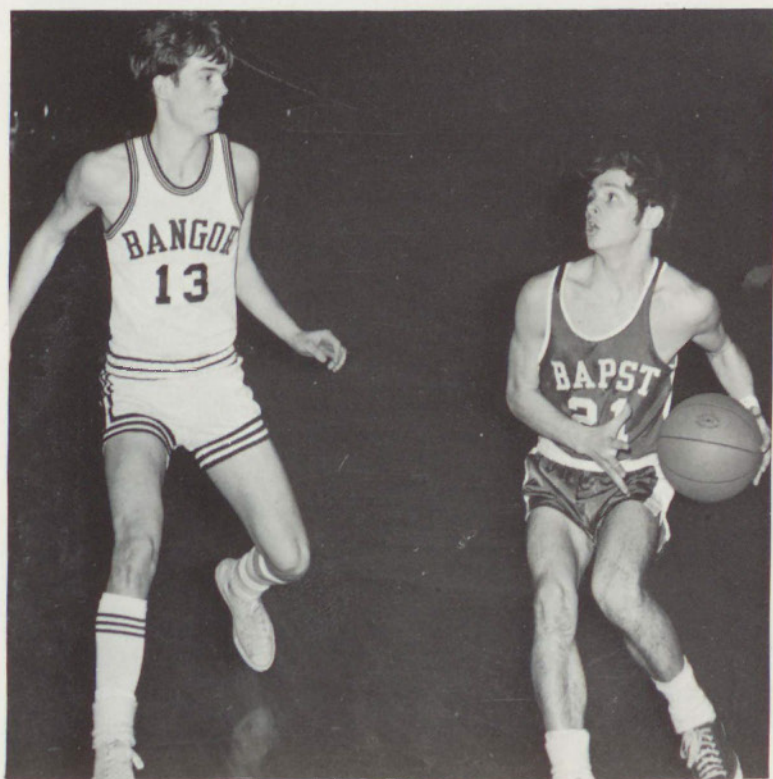

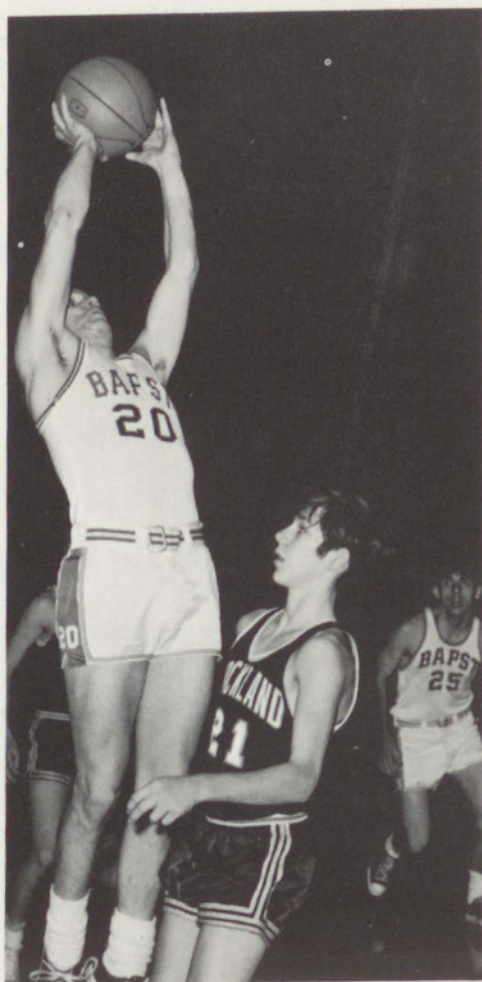
J.V.'s HAVE BUILDING YEAR

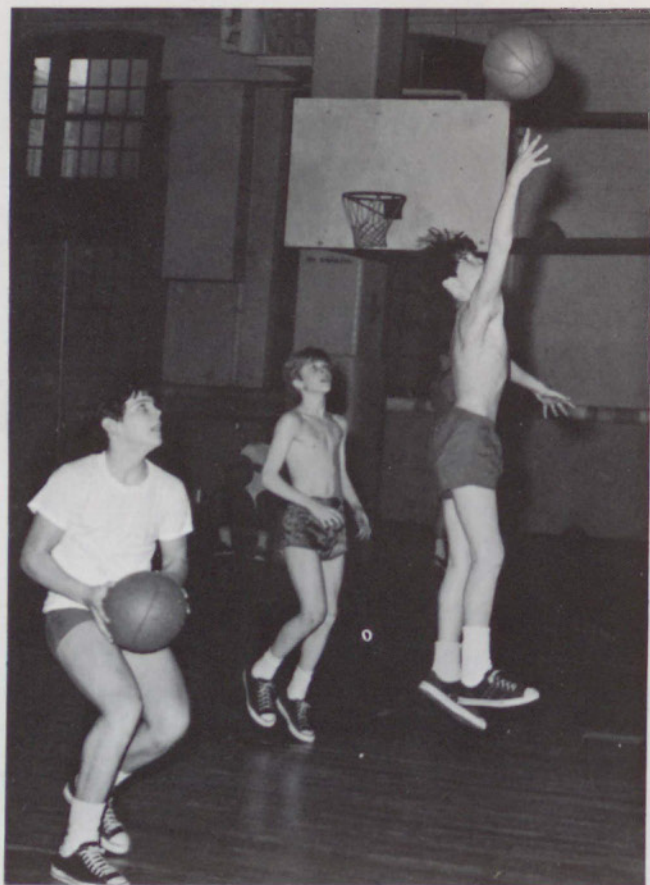

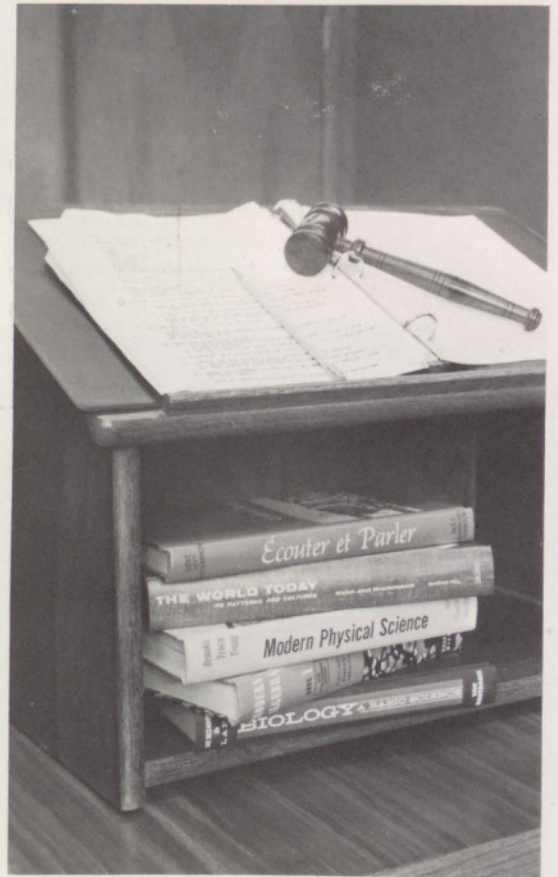
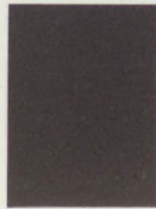
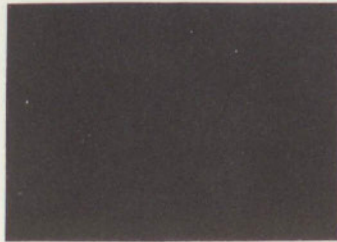
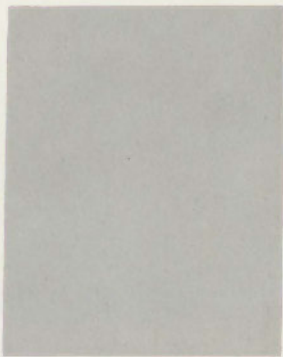
JOHN BAPST HOLDS BENEFIT MARATHON
