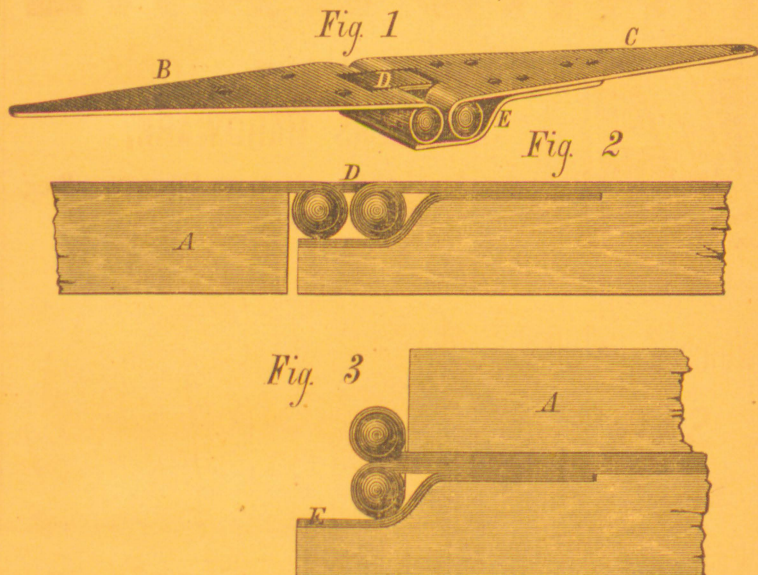
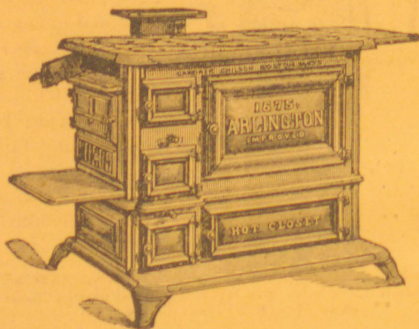
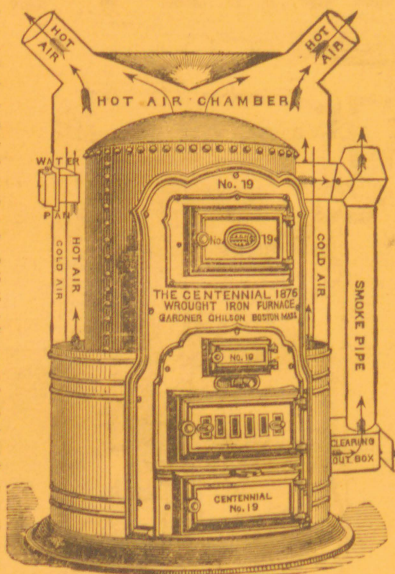


Fig. 1 shows the device in perspective; Fig. 2 is an edge view with the door, A, closed, and Fig. 3 a similar view with the door open. Referring to all three engravings, B and C are the straps of the hinge, on which are formed eyes, which tightly enclose the pivot pins. D, shown more clearly in Fig. 1, is a clasp, which is received in the openings cut in the parts of the straps which form the eyes, and the ends of which are bent around and move freely upon the pivot pins. It will be seen that a double joint is thus formed, whereby the hinge when extended as in Fig. 1 presents on its upper portion a uniformly flat surface. E is a plate attached firmly to the strap C, and projecting under the eye of the strap, B. Its object, as shown in Fig. 2, is to receive and support the inner edge of the closed door. Fig. 3 plainly represents the location of the different parts with the door open, and also shows the movement of the hinge in permitting the door to be thrown flat back, the clasp, D, working freely around the pivot pins, and eventually assuming with the latter a perpendicular position.

Beginning at the north-west corner of Ward One; thence easterly, on the line of Ward One, to a point at the centre of Exchange street; thence northerly to a point in the centre of Park street; thence, on said centre line of Park and Centre streets to Six Mile Falls road; thence, through the centre of said road, to Kenduskeag avenue; down said avenue to the southerly line of lot No. 56, Holland; thence on said line westerly to the Kenduskeag stream, and down said stream to the centre of Kenduskeag bridge; thence to the place of beginning.

## WARD No. VII.

Beginning at the Penobscot river at the point intersected by the line between the city of Bangor and the town of Veazie; thence down said river to a point which would be intersected by a continuation of the centre line of Newbury street; thence on said line of continuation to and through Newbury street to State street, down State street, in the centre thereof, to Grove street, up the centre of Grove street and Bannister street to Milford street, and on Milford street to the railroad; up said railroad to the line of Orono; thence on said line south easterly to the point intersected by the line between said city and the town of Veazie; and thence southeasterly and southerly following said line to the place of beginning.

## THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY.

This institution was incorporated under the name of the Maine Charity School, in 1814. In 1817 it went into operation at Hampden. In 1819 it was permanently located at Bangor. Its object is to provide the means of a thorough professional education to ministers, and is open to Evangelical Christians of every denomination.

Candidates for admission must have been regularly educated at some respectable College or University, or otherwise have made literary acquisitions which, as preparatory to Theological studies, are substantially equivalent to a liberal education.

The number of students varies from 40 to 60. Whole number of Alumni, about 500. The library contains more than 13,000 volumes.

The Anniversary is on the first Wednesday in June. There is but one vacation in the year, commencing at the Anniversary, and continuing fifteen weeks. The proper time for admission to the Seminary is the first week in the Academical year, which commences fifteen weeks from the Anniversary.

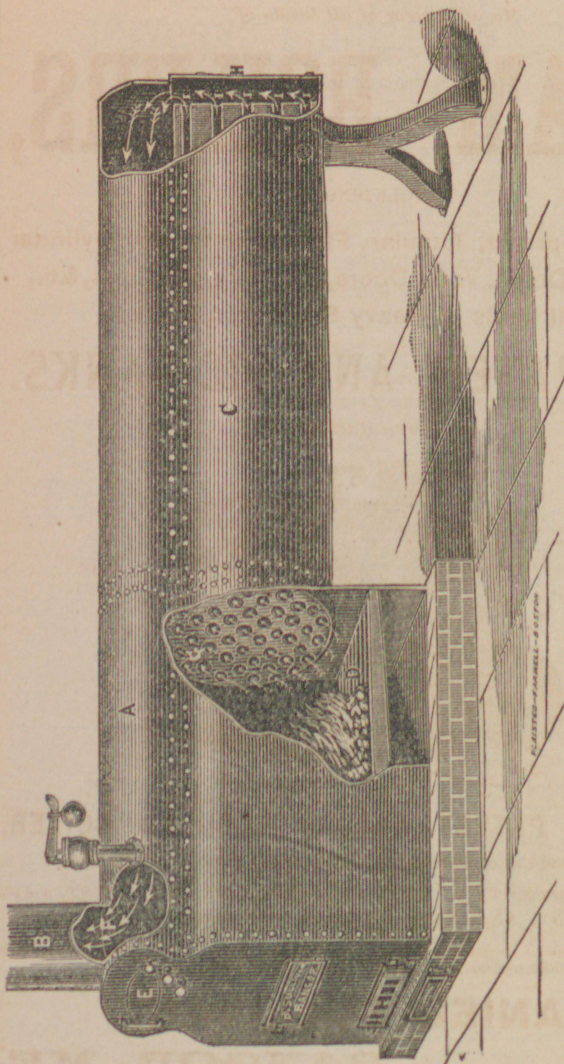
