The '72 season proved to be an exciting one and at times heartbreaking. But to John Bapst, CRUSADERS will always be NUMBER ONE!!!

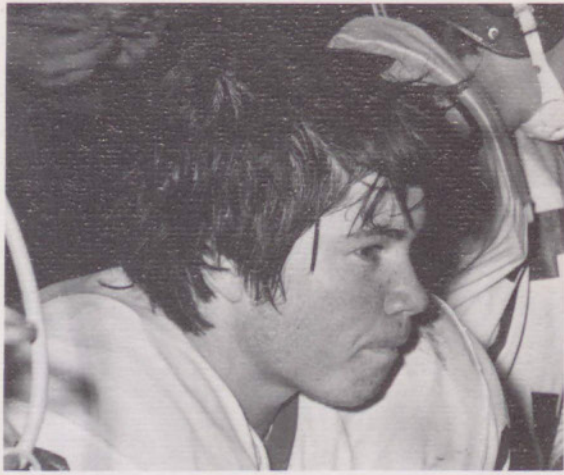

## CRUSADER FIVE

The 1972-1973 basketball team put together the finest season since the '68-'69 team. Under the leadership of new coach, Jesse Bedwell, the Crusaders compiled a 12-6 record which earned the fifth place in the final standings and a tournament spot.

Throughout the regular season the Crusaders won the pressure games when they needed them most. When it looked like we might not make the tournament, the Crusader five pulled off what might be the greatest single game effort ever by a Bapst basketball team. The starting five played every minute of the game with all of them scoring in double figures.

The team was led in scoring by senior guard, Bob Rioux. The board work was done by junior center, Jerry Hayes, and junior forward, Mark Higgins. The remaining two starters, Pete Dubay and Bob Quirk, accounted for themselves with their own excellent playing. Pete led the team in steals and had many double figure scoring nights. Bob Quirk was the floor general, always supplying the good pass for a basket and also scoring in streaks of hot shooting.

The John Bapst team played in the tournament this year for the first time since '68-'69. They played a good game and were on pretty even terms for three quarters before cold shooting finally caught up with them and the Penquis Patriots went on to win by nine points.

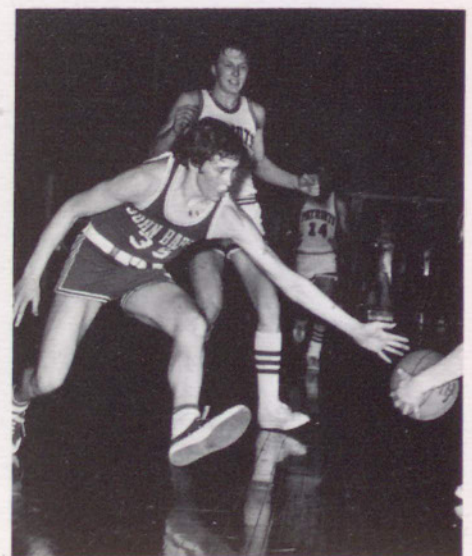
The team played a very good season and can be commended for their success. With six players coming back next year, the Crusaders should once again prove themselves strong contenders for Class B Tournament action.
