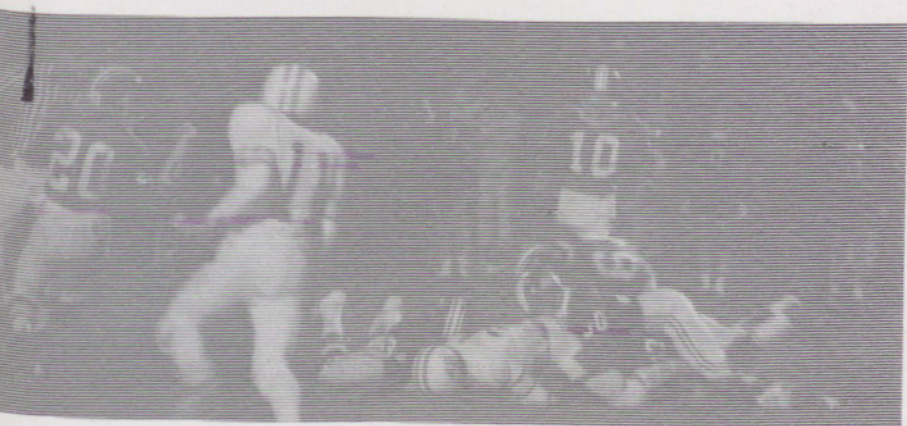
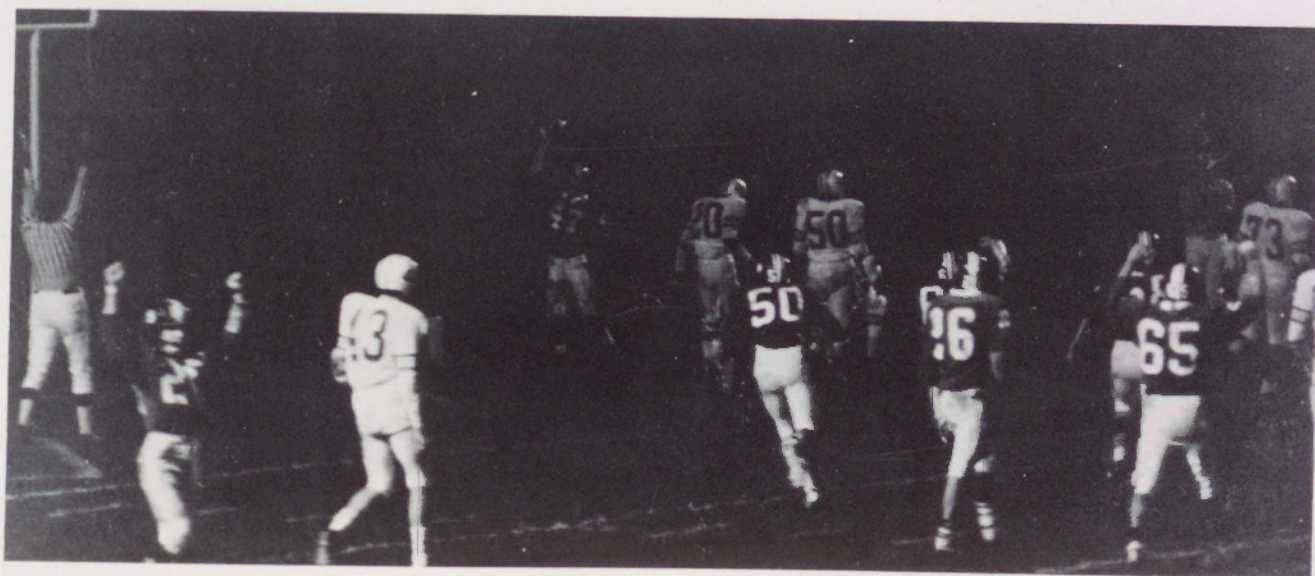
Despite the able coaching of Mr. Bob Brennan and his assistants Mike Connolly, Tom Coyne, and Joe McInnis, the lackluster Crusaders could not overcome the misfortunes that hampered them. Four of the setbacks which they incurred over the course of the season were decided by the margin of a touchdown.

Spearheaded by just eight lettermen, the team did provide at times much excitement for its faithful supporters. The victory that they achieved over a heavily-favored Orono team in a closely contested battle, not only garnered the Crusaders their second win but kept the purple and white's record for Homecoming games unblemished by defeat.

However, the team of 1974-75 will not be remembered so much for their poor record, but for the dedication and courage which they displayed throughout the season in spite of a losing cause. With a nucleus of the team returning, it is hoped that this past season will have laid the groundwork on which future football championships at John Bapst will be built.
