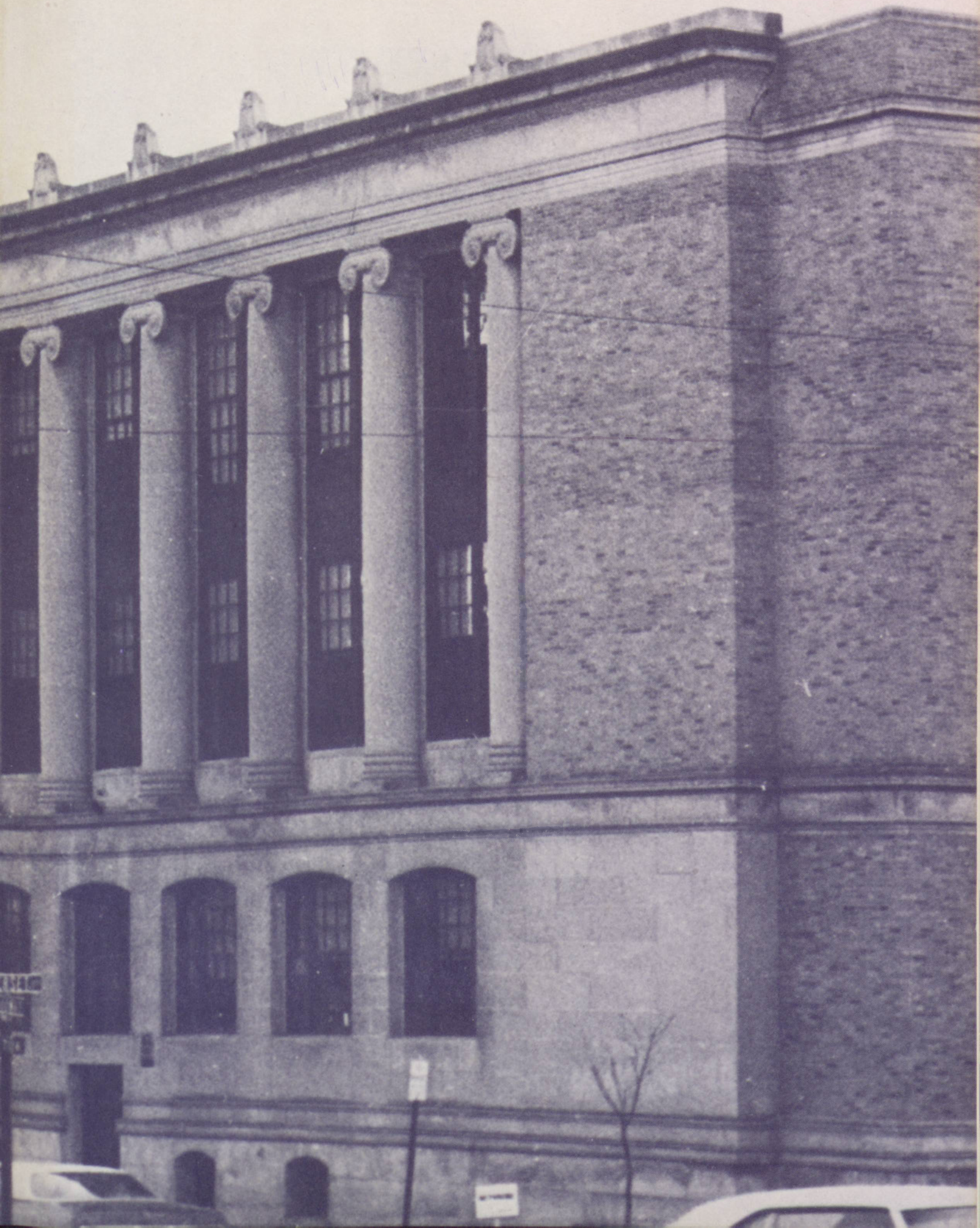

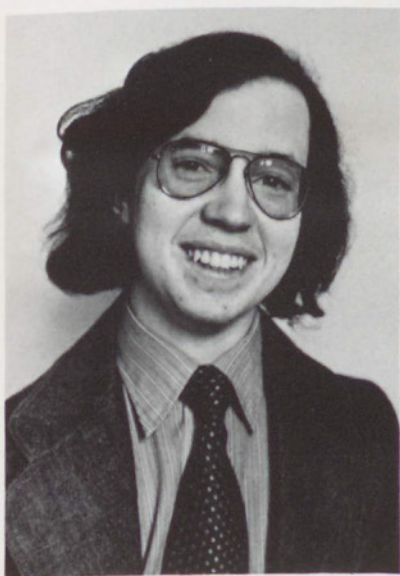

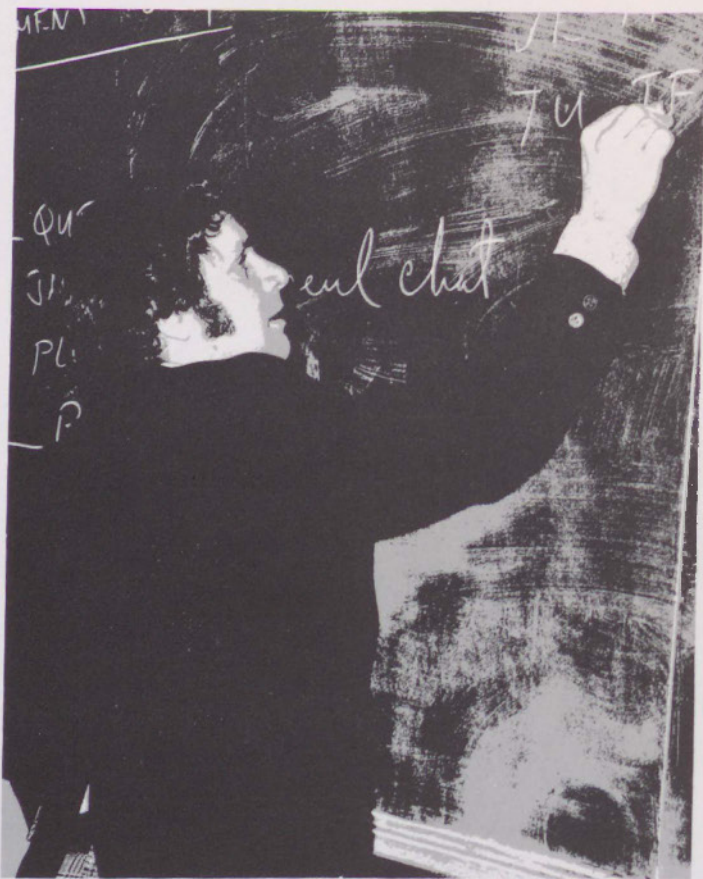
It is indeed rare in such a short time as four years to become completely mystified with any person. It is not so rare, however, when that person is as unique a man as Mr. Floyd is.

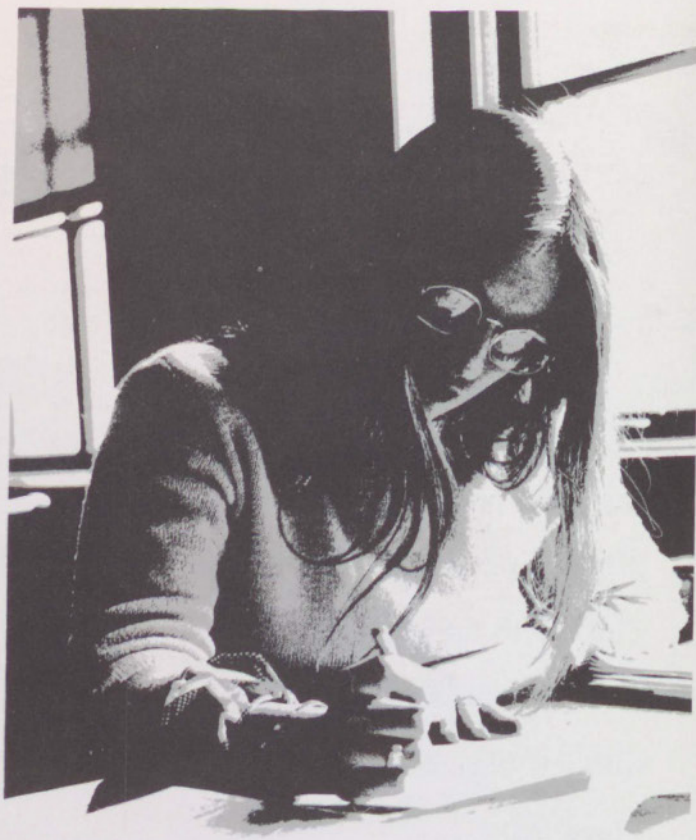
John Bapst is lucky indeed to have such a man; the Class of 1974 is lucky to have been able to learn from him.

## ... ABLY COACHED

The 1972-73 track season was one which proved unfavorable for the John Bapst team. Even though it was under the able coaching of Mr. O'Connell and Mr. Maley the team won few of its meets. The most memorable exception to this was Hermon's crushing defeat by Bapst with a score of 103 to Hermon's 37. However, the John Bapst team only beat another team in three out of the seven bi- or tri-meets in which they entered.

However, this low record is due in part to the poor weather conditions in which they had to compete. As Coach O'Connell explains it was a very rainy season. This is evidenced by the fact that only seven out of the originally scheduled eleven meets were attended because of the severe weather.

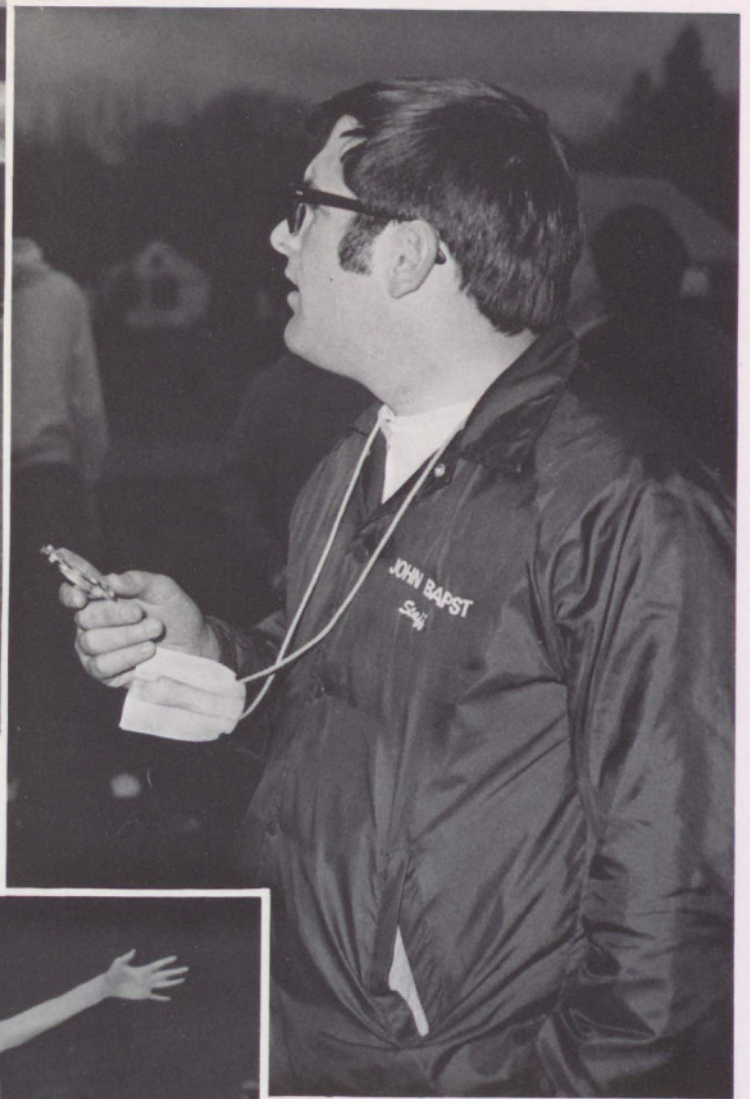

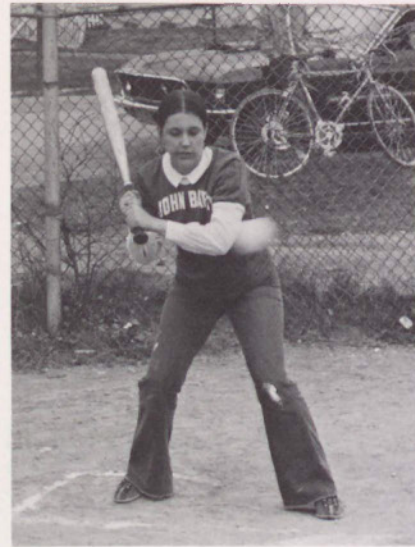

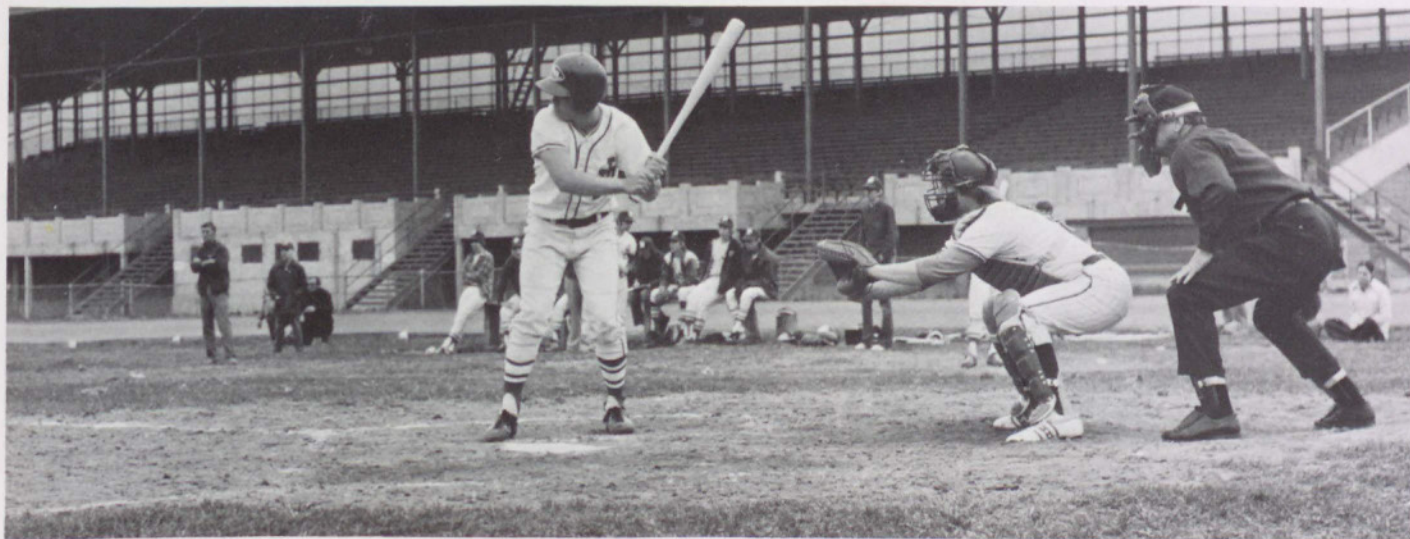
## *1972-73 VARSITY BASEBALL*

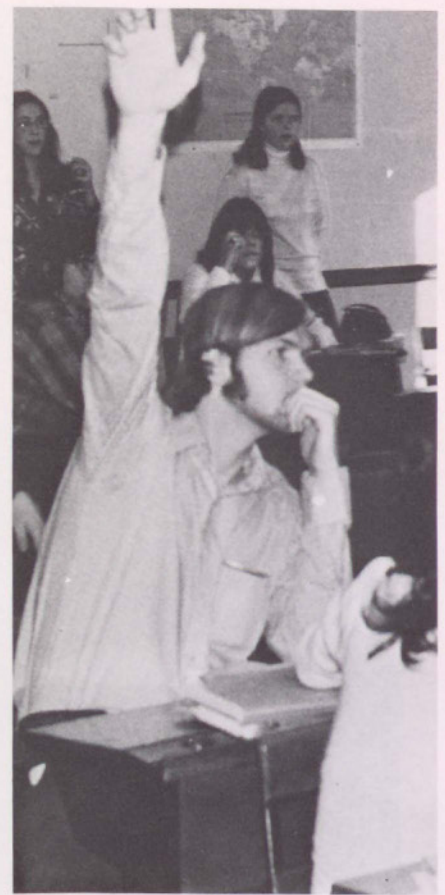
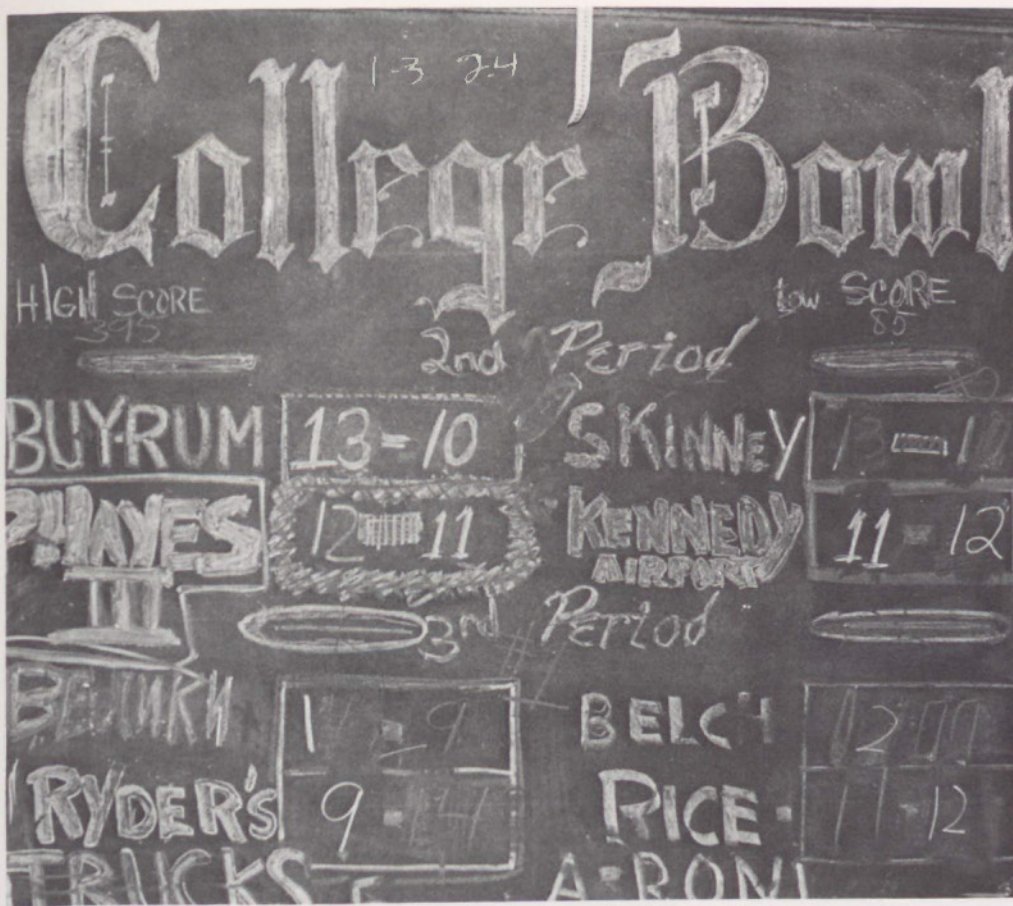


## HUMANITIES
