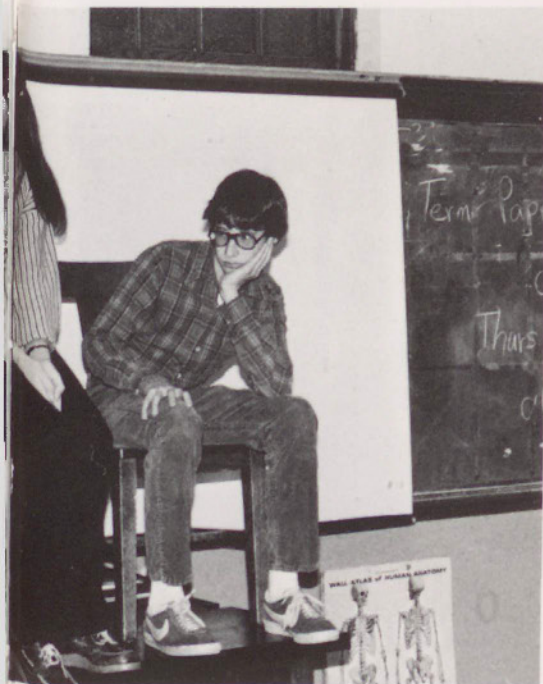
education to each student. Along with the basic required courses, John Bapst offers a wide variety of classes to satisfy the needs of all who attend. The Honor Roll and the infamous "D & F List" signify the emphasis placed on academics

by the school administration. These lists recognize outstanding achievement or lack of achievement in the area of academics. These lists serve as an incentive, encouraging students to get and maintain good grades.

The Science and Math departments are more than adequate in their offering with classes ranging from Elementary Algebra to Advanced Biology. Future scientists and mathematicians may choose from Calculus, Trigonometry, Computer Science, Advanced

Math, Accelerated Chemistry, Biology I & II in order to fulfill their needed preparation. Students are required to pass two years of a language and they may choose from Latin, French or Spanish. The student who is interested in continuing for more than two years is free to do so.

For the more artistically oriented, Bapst offers a two year art program. Under careful supervision and instruction, the student can master many skills including etching, pencil, silk screening,



sculptoring, and pottery. Many students elect to study Art in order that they might have a more rounded education.

Preparing the student for a college career has always been the primary educational objective of John Bapst High School, and this remains the same today. The traditional academic courses still comprise the nucleus of the students' course load. As a result John Bapst High School graduates intelligent, logical, and mature young adults ready to meet the challenges of the modern world.

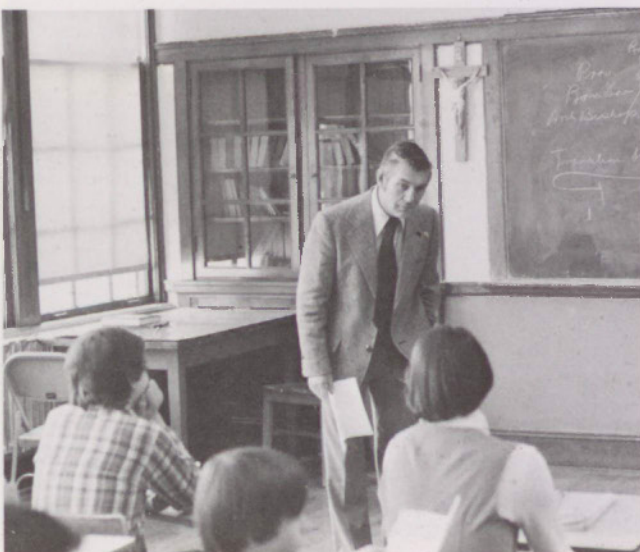
The Classroom:

Although teachers at Bapst stress good study habits and in-class performance, the classroom atmosphere remains relaxed and sociable. Students are able to discuss problems with their teachers on a conversational level, while either taking notes or reading class material. The teachers are willing to find time to divert from structured schedules in order to hold discussions or debates, which benefit pupils while introduc-

ing them to various fields of education. 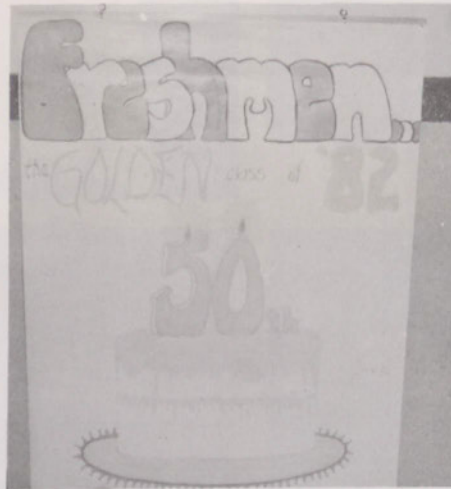
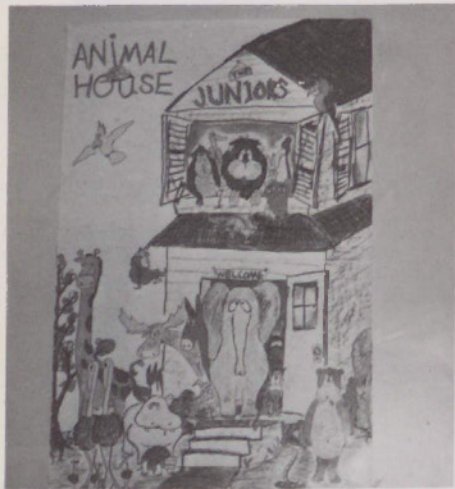




Winter Carnival: Short But Sweet.

In State.

The John Bapst cross country teams, in only their second year of competition, surpassed all expectations by becoming the 1978 state runner-ups for Class "C". This accomplishment only highlighted the feats of the current season which already included the capture of the Eastern Maine Regional Championships. The boys led by Donovan and Kenny, fourth and ninth respectively, compiled a team total of 91 points at the state meet to finish second, nine points behind Dirigo. Their counterparts, the lady Crusaders, managed a low score of 62 yet were edged by Monmouth for the state title.

The girls' execution of near perfect bunching in the state meet (8, 11, 13, 14, 15, 18) evidenced their consistency and team depth which led them to a 9-5 season. Led by MVP winner Cheryl Dexter, and MIP Toni Farrenkopf, the girls bested such perennial powers as Bangor, Hermon, MDI, Bucksport and Orono enroute to their 3rd place finish in the PVC.

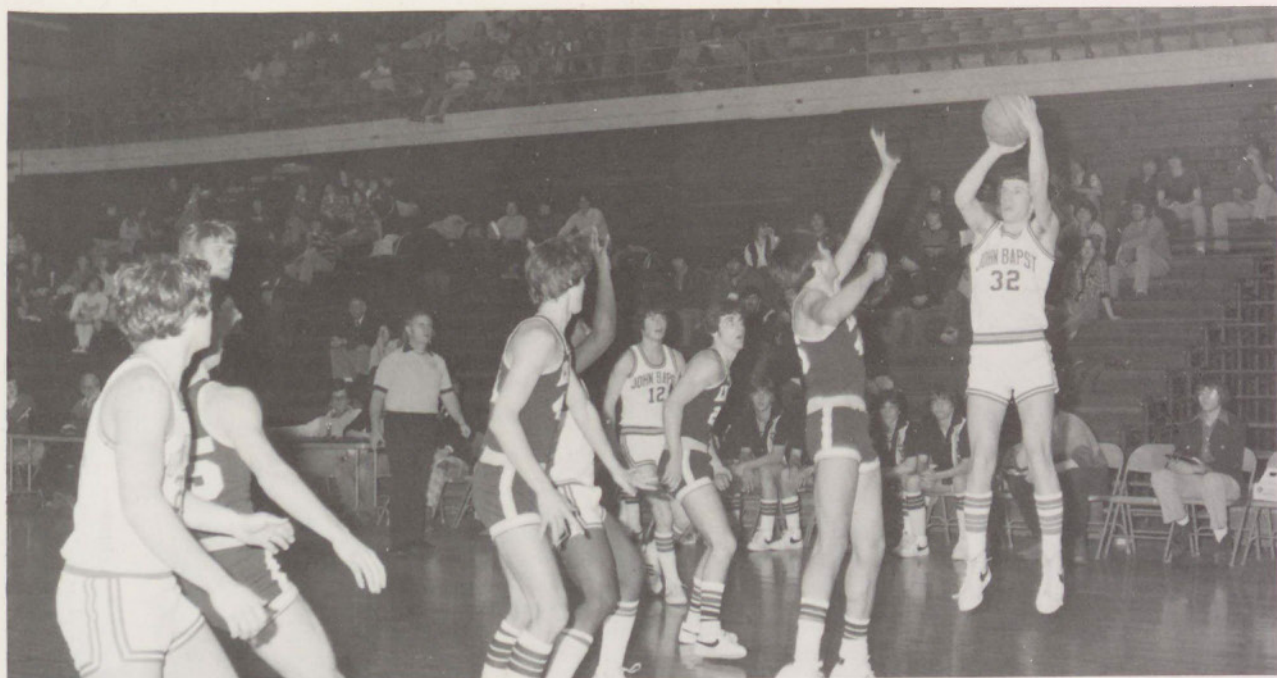

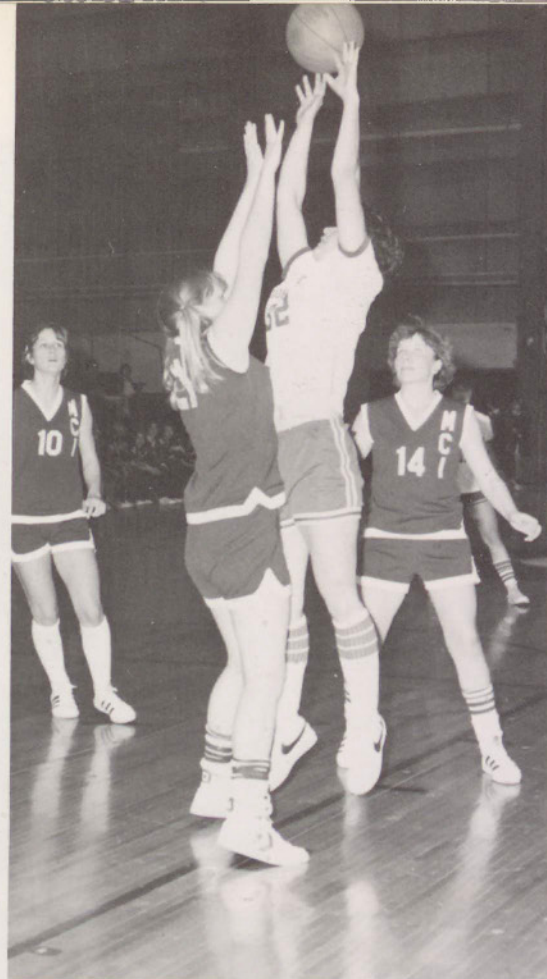

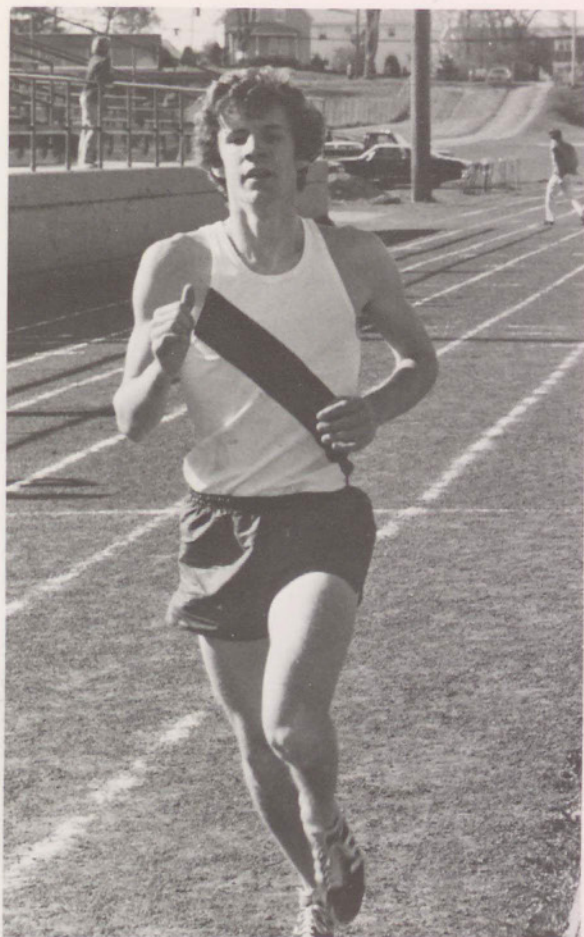
1978

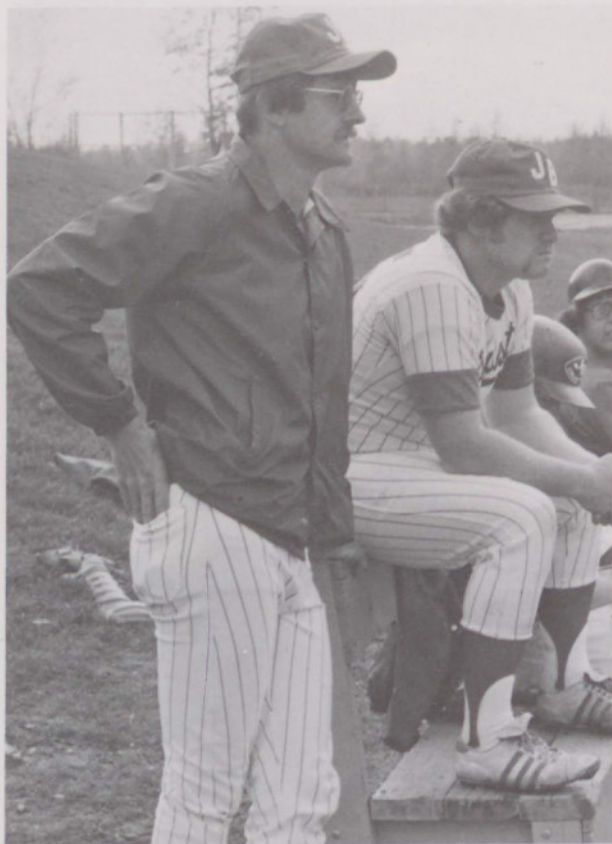

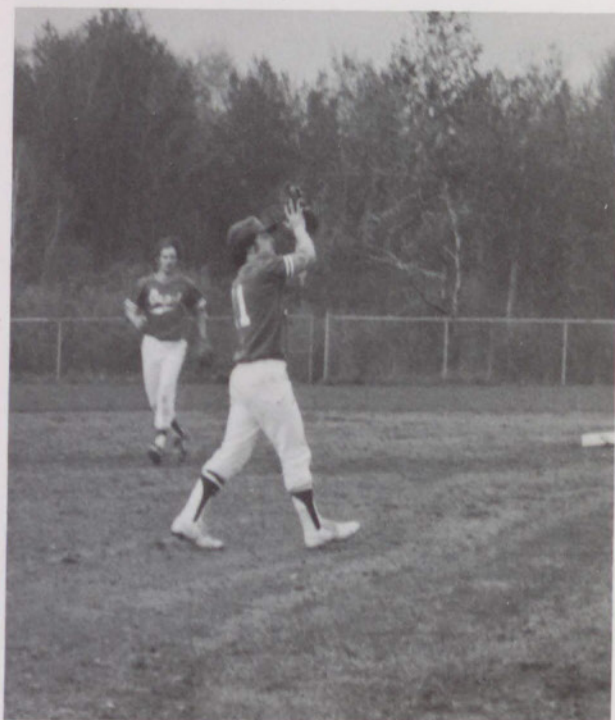
