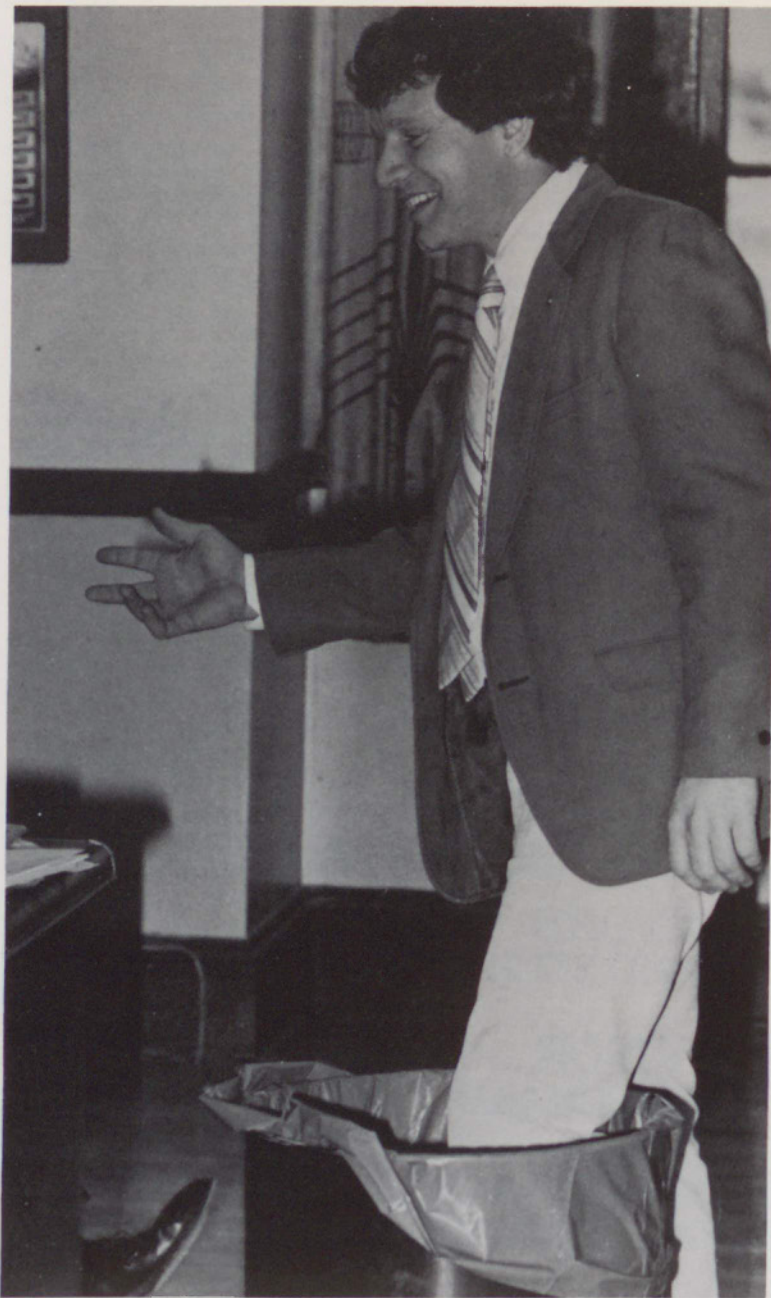

Hope we never have to find out! Thanx!

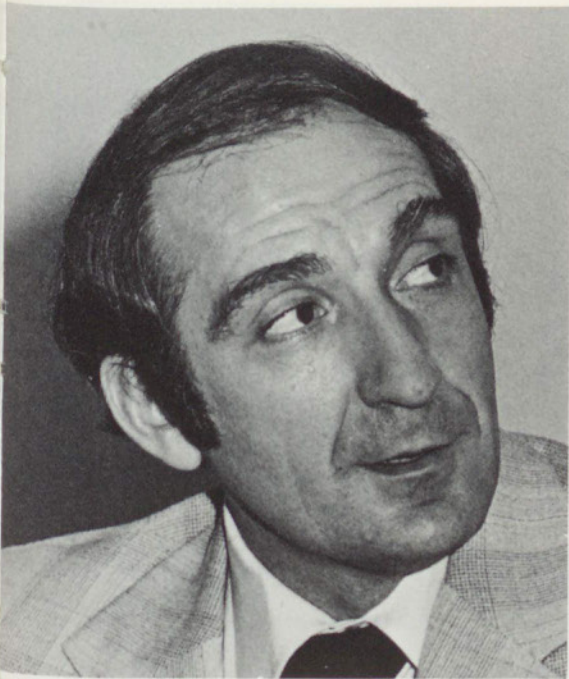
