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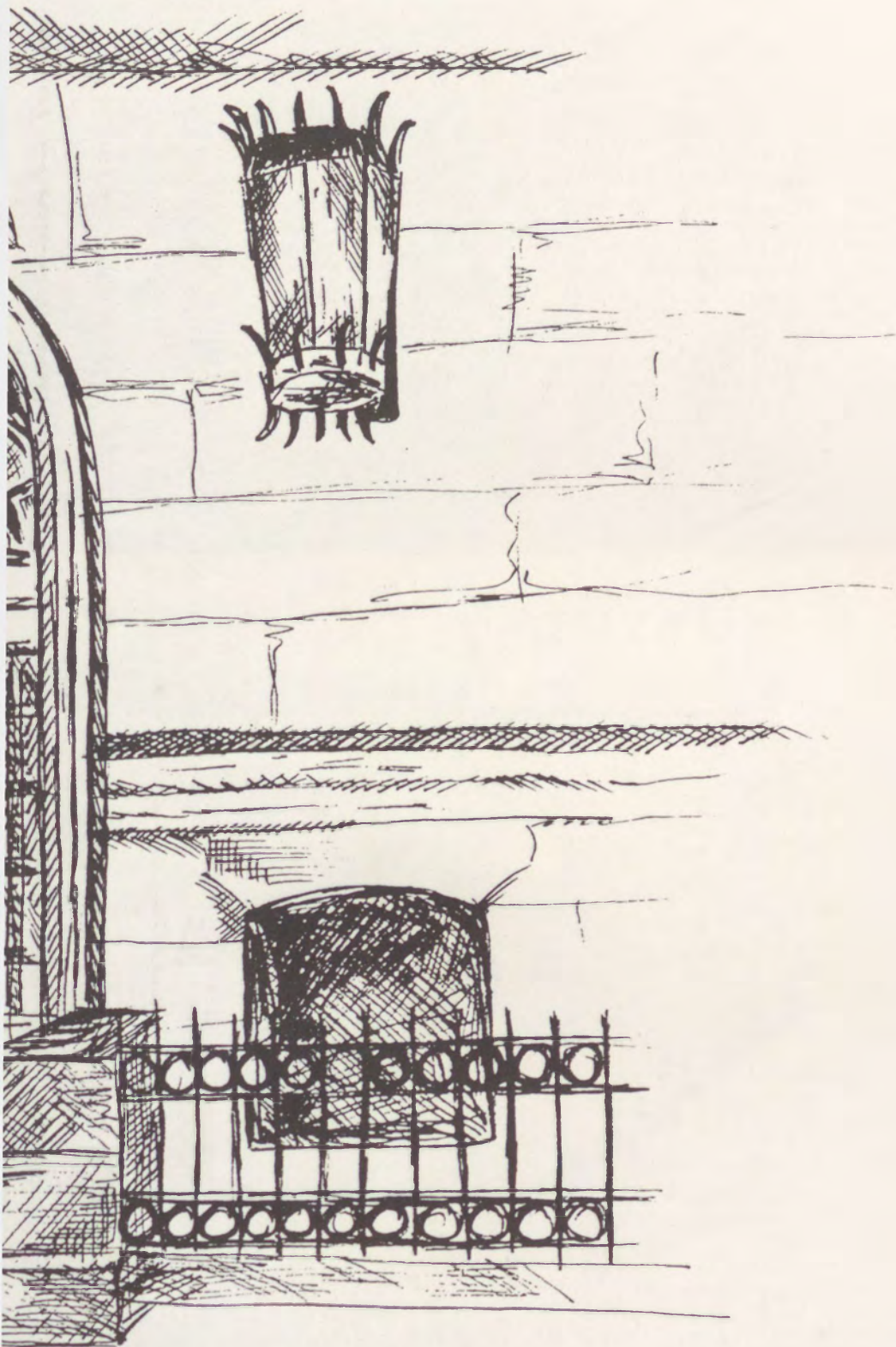

When we entered high school, we were given more traditions to follow: proms, senior pictures, and spring musicals.



PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

The 1989-1990 year marks a milestone in the history of John Bapst Memorial High School. This completes the first 10 years of the "new" John Bapst. Over the past decade many accomplishments have been recorded. The first entering class, the class of 1983, had only 33 members who had the courage and parental support to enroll into this new high school. For the past two years, entering freshman classes have exceeded 100 students. Students travel each day from Belfast, Ellsworth, Dover, Foxcroft, Aurora, and Newport and all the cities and towns in between.

Besides enrollment, the school has increased the number of extra-curricular activities available to the students. They include: Boys and Girls Soccer, Indoor Track, Swimming, Wrestling, and Golf. Non-athletic additions also include Art Club, Math Team, and Outing Club. New courses that have been added are Spanish I, II, and III and of course our now famous music program including stage band, concert band, and jazz band.

To list all accomplishments of the students as individuals and the many teams would take more space than available. Some of the more memorable are 3 state championship basketball teams; 2 boys and 1 girls; 3 state championship cross country teams, 2 girls and 1 boys; a state championship in girls indoor track; and a state championship chess title. The school has finished first in the state two of the four years the MEA's have been given, and of course those memorable annual musicals that involve so many students of which the entire John Bapst family is so proud.

As the next decade of John Bapst Memorial High School begins to be recorded, I predict that our school will be every bit as successful in the future as we have been in the past.

To each graduating senior, I offer my personal hope that whatever you attempt after you graduate, you are successful and will have fond memories of your years at John Bapst.

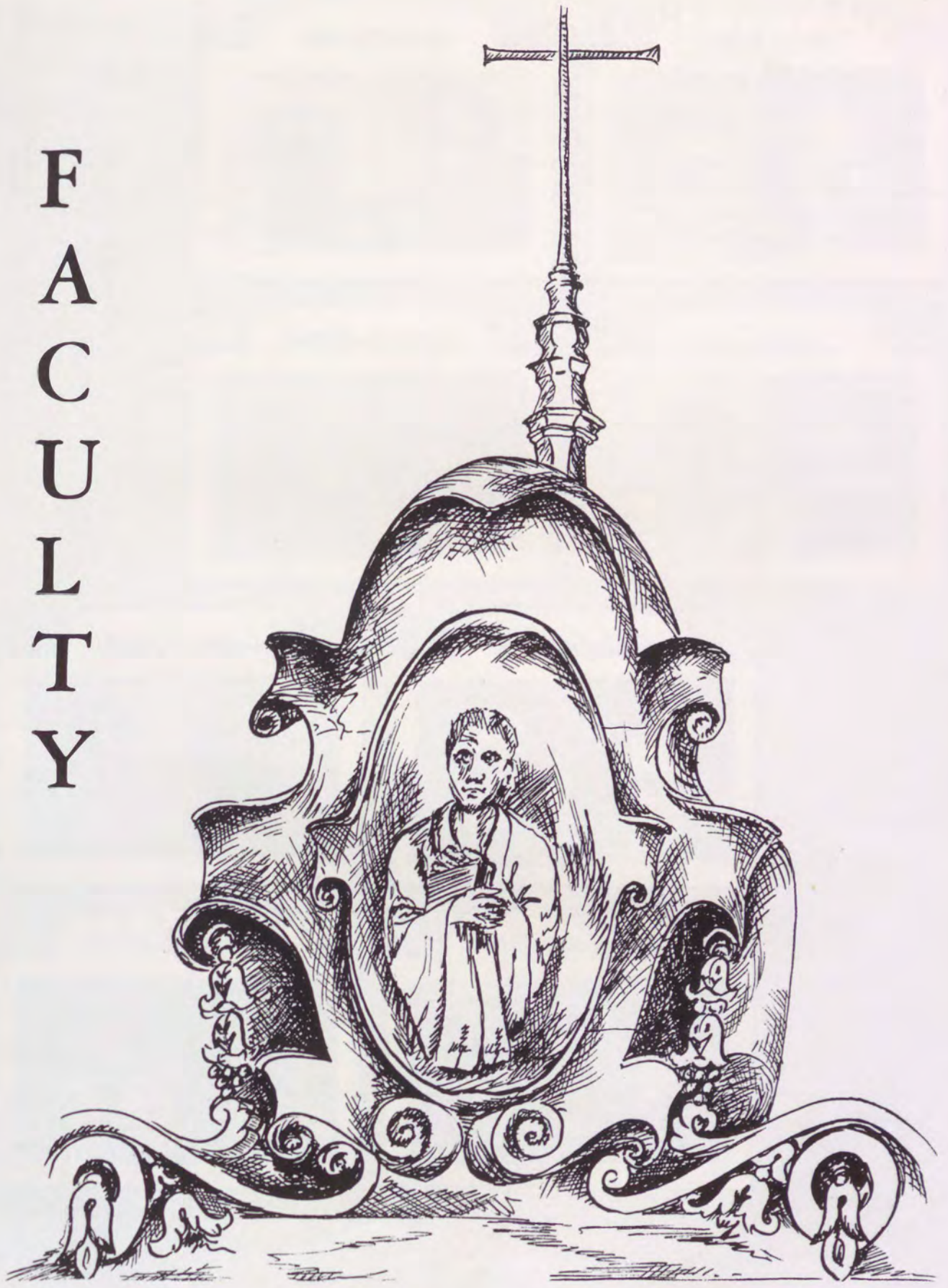


BOARD OF DIRECTORS

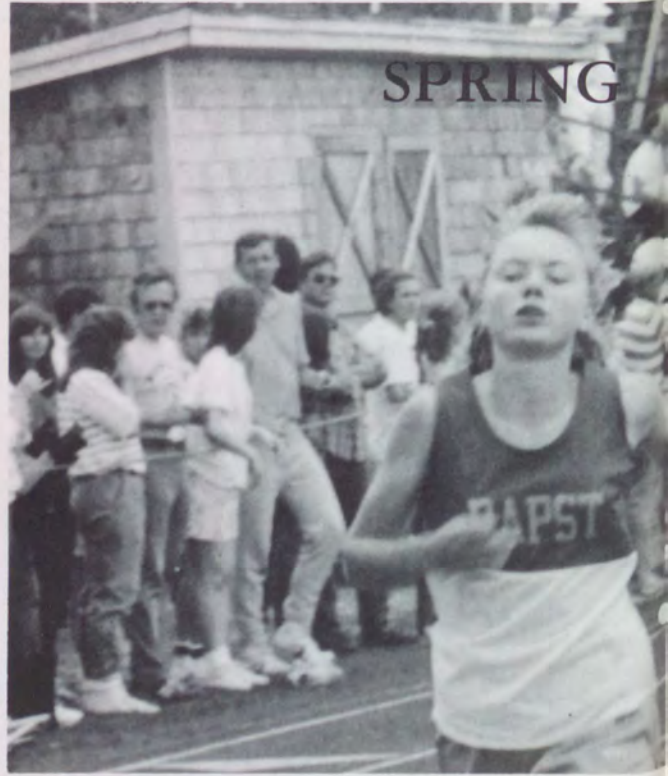

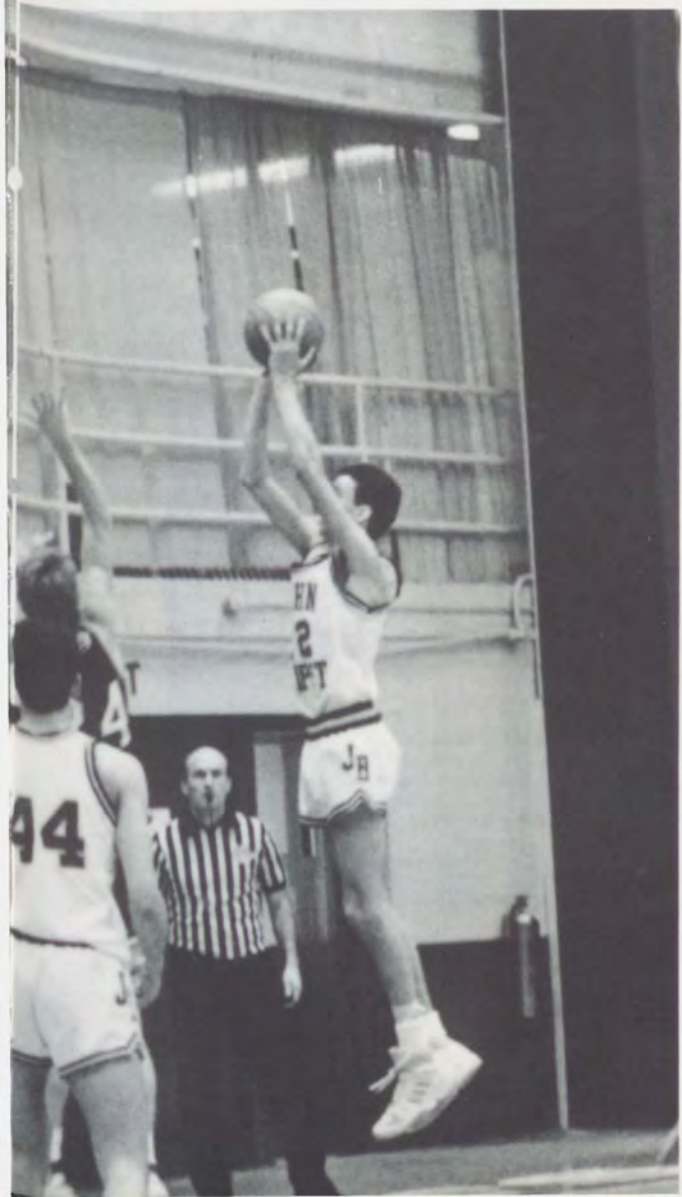


BOYS' BASKETBALL

The band is involved in many activities including playing at Maine Hockey games, at basketball games, Band-O-Rama and Football games.

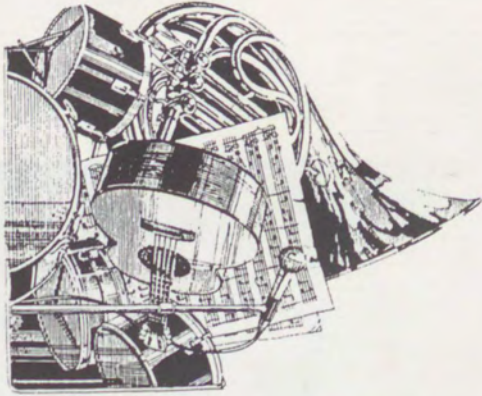

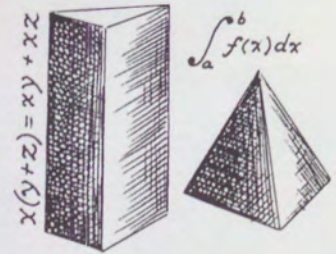

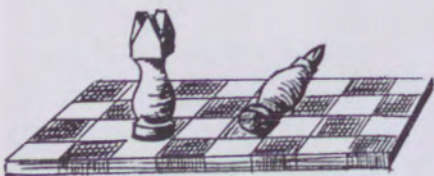
Math Team

Debate Team



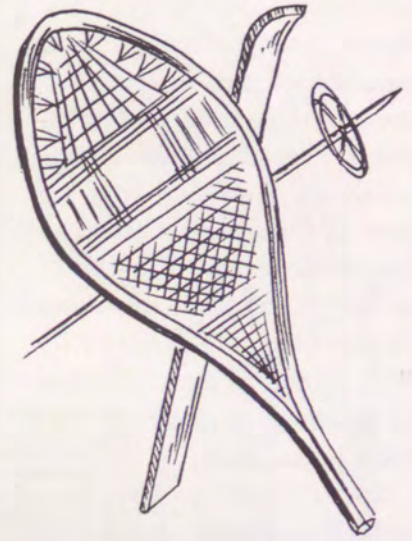
