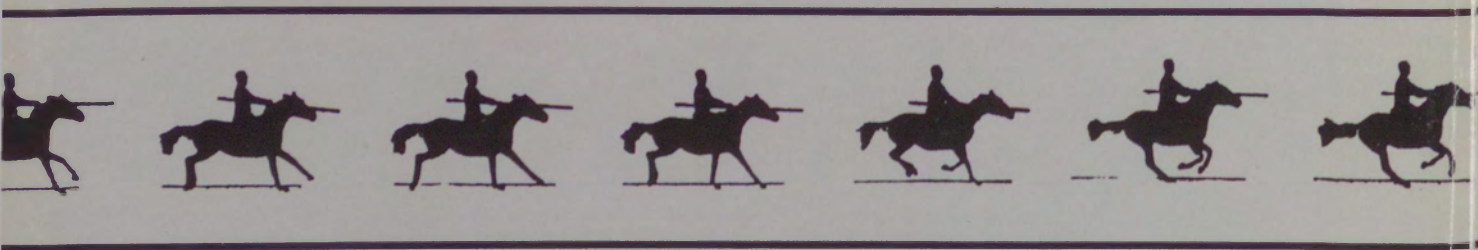

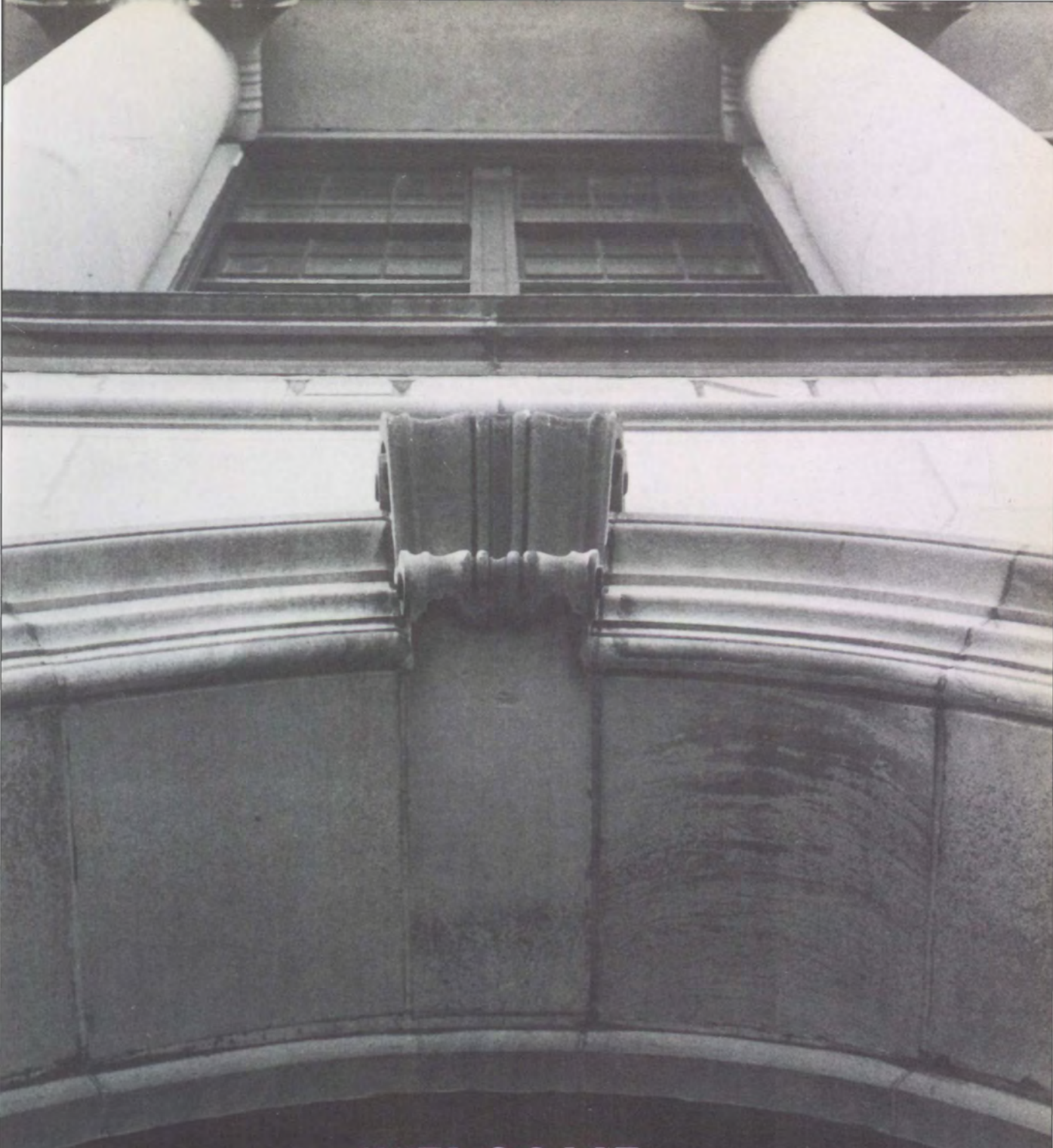

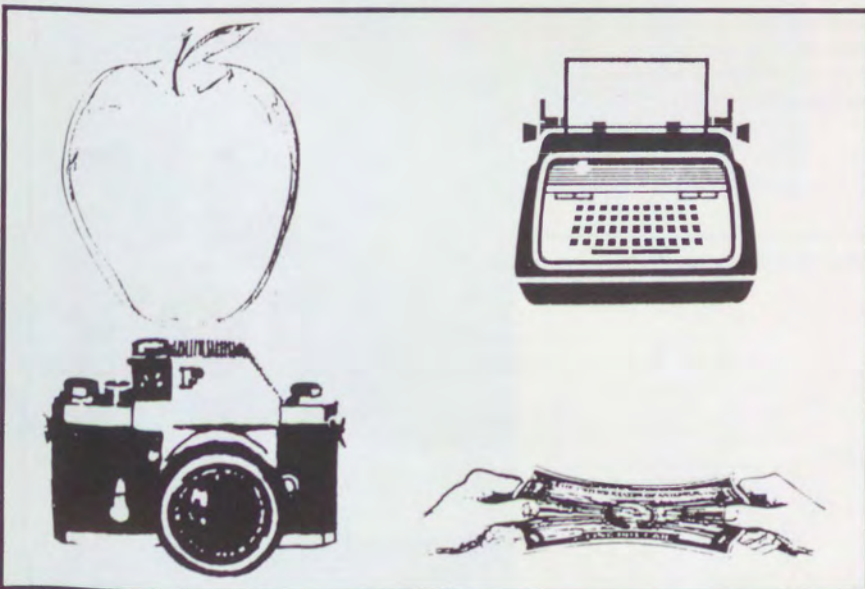
# YEARBOOK DEDICATION

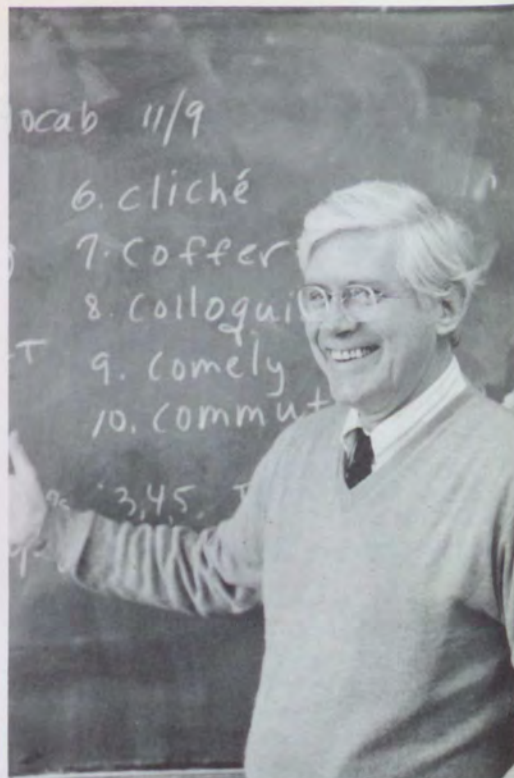

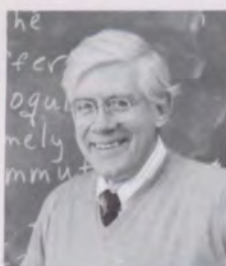

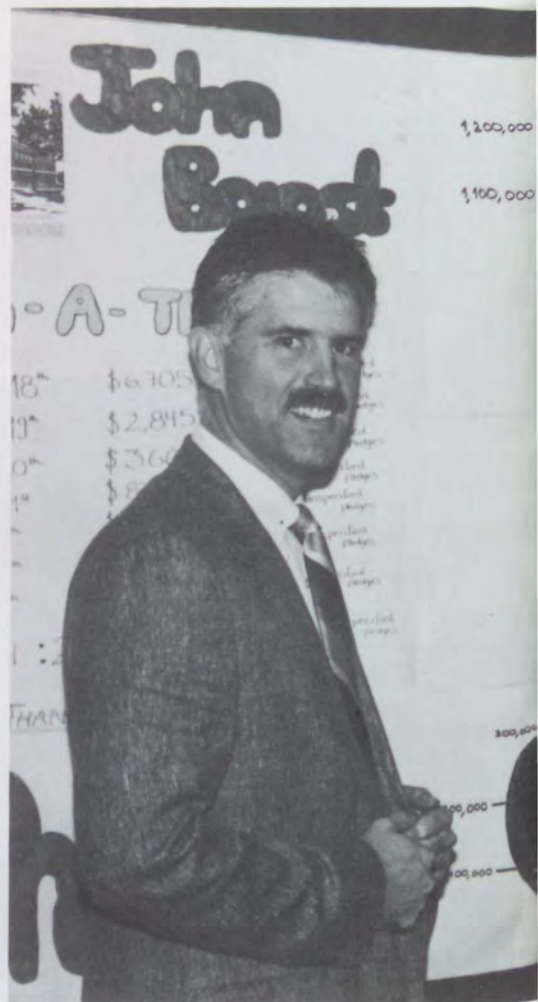
# JB CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

"Proudly Forward," the slogan of our recent Capital Campaign, is appropriate indeed. Over the past year the entire John Bapst family has joined together to work toward a mutual and noble goal: the betterment of John Bapst Memorial High School. Our goal was an ambitious 1.2 million dollars, a goal nearly achieved by December of this year.

The fund drive was organized by Consultant John Landry and Development Director Aurelie Mathieu, and spearheaded by Co-Chairmen Dick Campbell, Earle Hannigan and Doug Brown. Large numbers of Bapst students complemented the effort by working a successful car wash and recycling drive. Many students and staff also took

### COLOPHON

"THE BAPSTONIAN" of John Bapst Memorial High School was printed at Herff Jones, Inc., an employee owned yearbook company in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. It was printed in a limited edition of 245 copies with 144 pages. The cover chosen utilizes royal purple #41056 vibra tex base material on 120 point binders board. The cover is silkscreened in silver #23 and the title "Bapstonian" is foilstamped in silver #F1. The Crusader logo is applied using a silver mettalay application. The grain used on the cover is handtooled and individual student names are foilstamped in silver #F1.

The endsheets use VC#08 grey and are printed different front and back utilizing our theme graphic. The paper stock used in most of the book is an 80# stock referred to as Bordeaux Special. The book is trimmed to 7 3/4" X 10 1/2" and bound in 16 page signatures. In addition to offset printing in black ink throughout the book there is one 16 page signature of full color using 100# Eurogloss stock. This section has custom school designed layouts pasted up by the staff.

The type style used in the book is LYDIAN. Captions are set in 10 point and most of the headlines used are 36 point size. Paragraphs throughout the book are flush left and the folio numbers are in the lower outside corners. *The faculty members of the staff are: Mr. Todd Carr, Layout Adviser; Mr. Ernie Guimond, Business Manager and Mr. Mitchell McCarthy, Copy Adviser. The key students on the staff are: Kimberly Horn, Editor-in-Chief; Sarah Gontoski, Sports Editor and Karen Currier, Activities Editor. Our representative from Herff Jones Yearbooks is Mr. Charles Crosby.*
