She is undoubtedly the MOST energetic person at Bapst.

Julie Waring has a pride and dedication to Bapst that exudes from every pore of her body. She expects kids at Bapst. to be nothing less than spectacular, and because of her expectations, every year her seniors leave having learned respect, discipline, and her love of music.

Julie DeLaite began her musical education in 1971 after graduating from Ellsworth High. day we will have phones in each room, instead of our present intercom. Wishful thinking?



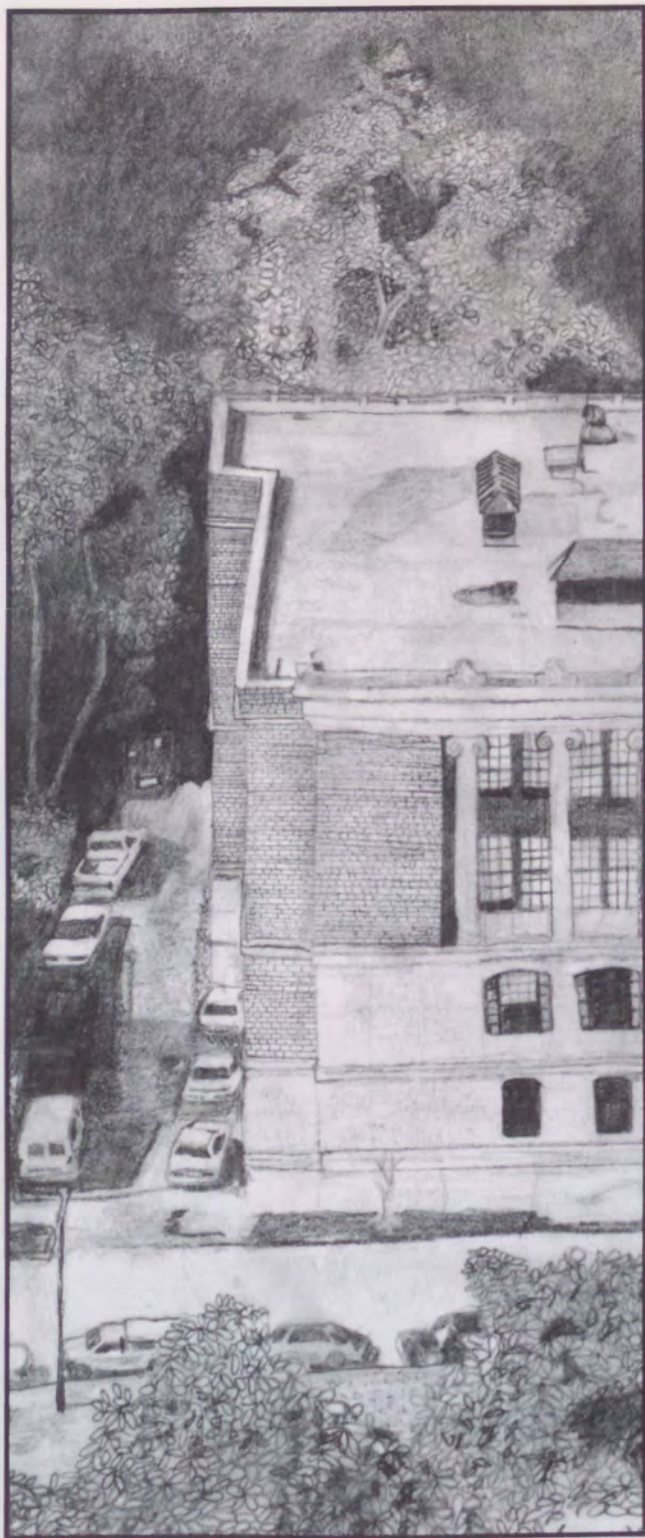

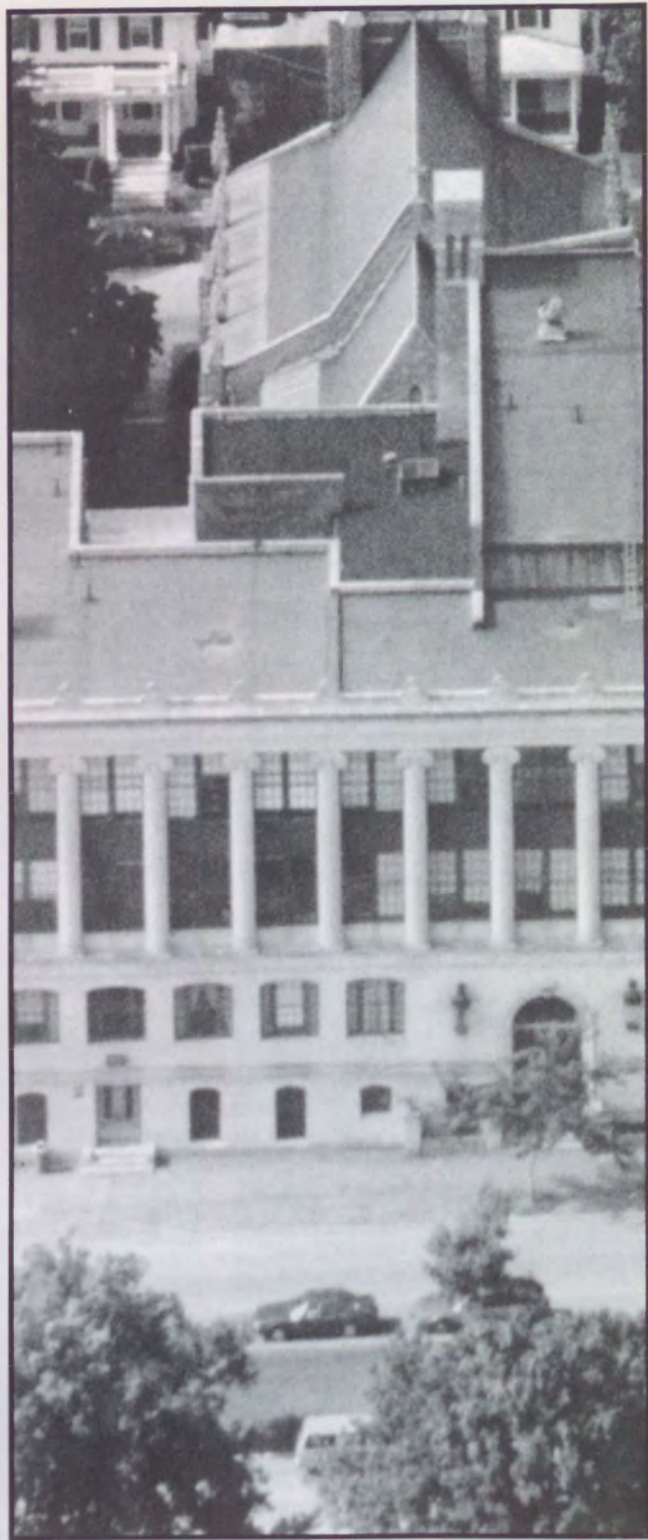

Begin March 8 . . .



March 8, 1991 was a historic day for the nation and John Bapst. The troops that served in the Gulf War began coursing through Bangor International Airport that day and they were greeted by the music of the John Bapst Band. At the time no one knew how momentous the occasion would be.

That morning Band Director Julie Waring assembled 47 musicians on short notice and played for three plane loads of returning troops. The rest is history. As the elated troops began borrowing instruments and lending a hand, the soldiers of the 82nd Airborne began chanting "Doc!" "Doc!" Sgt. Kevin "Doc" Tillman then borrowed a

saxophone from Bapst Senior Ryan Bellmore. As he began to play the National Anthem with the band, Waring realized that his version would not be traditional and silenced the rest of the band. Tillman's stirring solo version of the Anthem was picked up by the national networks, propelling Bangor, Maine and John Bapst into the national spotlight.

Bapst made two more official trips to BIA, one with a larger contingent from the band and a third with any student who wished to go. Over 300 Bapst students made that third trip, but the stage was already set for a more exciting excursion.

What began on March 8th culminated in a musical exodus to Washington, D.C., for Independence Day 1991. It took five motorcoaches to carry the Band and Chorus and their families to Washington on the 14 hour trip.

The invitation to Washington came after the Band's highly visible trips to BIA to welcome troops returning from the Gulf War and set in motion a well-orchestrated effort to make the invitation a reality.

July 3rd, the first performance date, was a sweltering D.C. day. Heat and humidity took its toll as the day wore on and the longest wait was for a cool glass of water. The afternoon granted a reprieve because students were free to explore the many air-conditioned museums that line the Mall.

On July 4th, John Bapst executed a Capitol Coup. In a covert action, Jim Nahra "obtained" an official's badge for Father Cleon Ross who then helped reorganize the foundering events of the morning. This gave the Band and Chorus extra time to perform for the ever increasing crowd on Constitution Avenue.

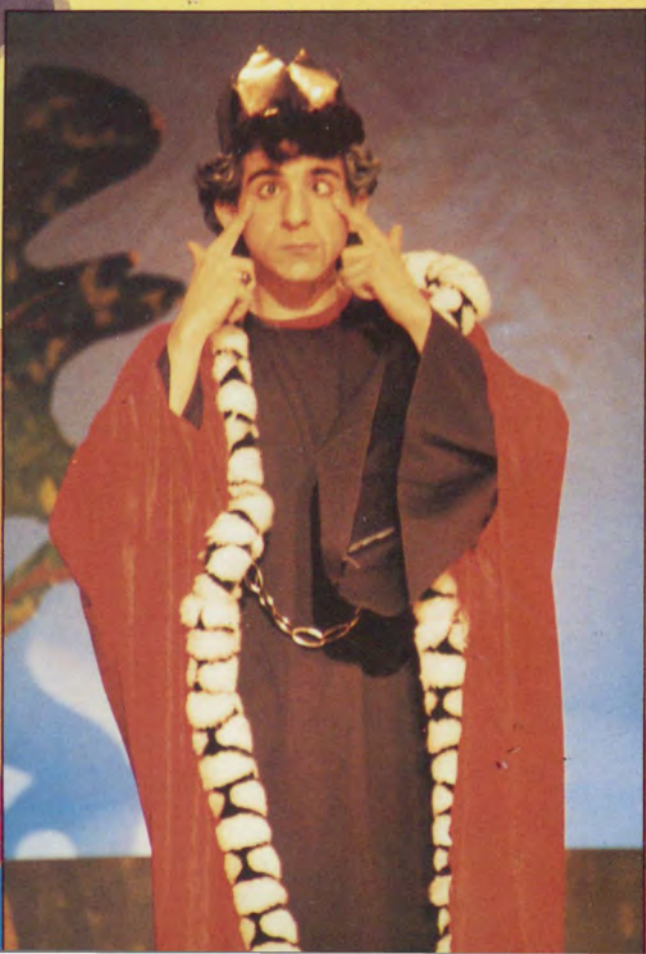
The play features Ted Curtis as the mute King

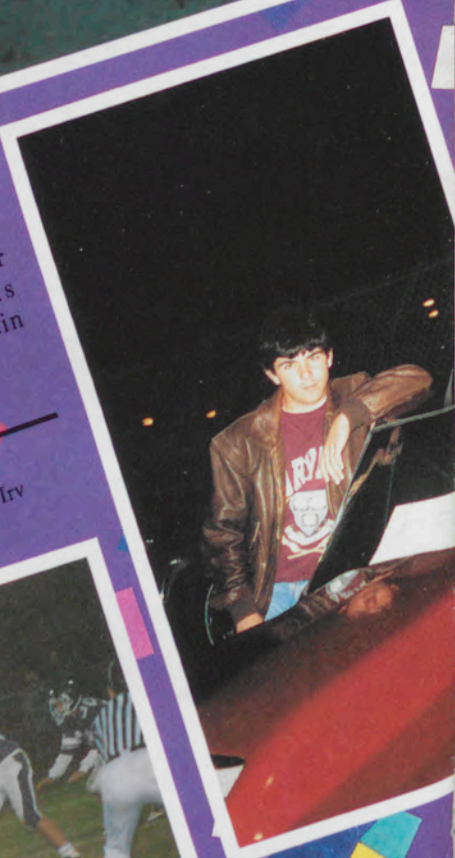
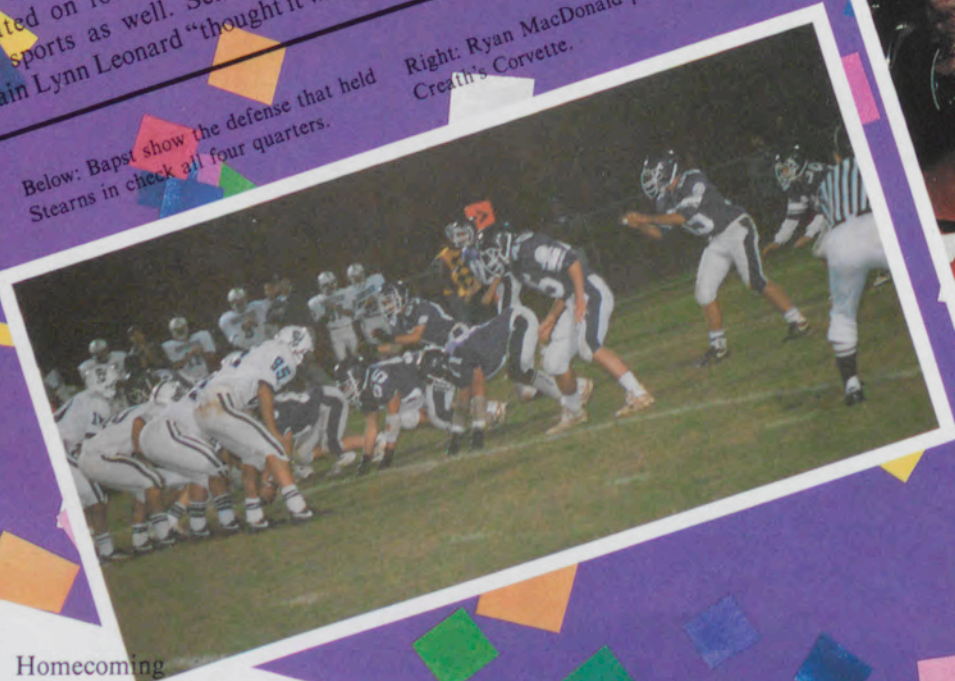
very strange this year. It wasn't coordinated well. Both soccer games were away. I don't like the fact that it is mostly centered around football."

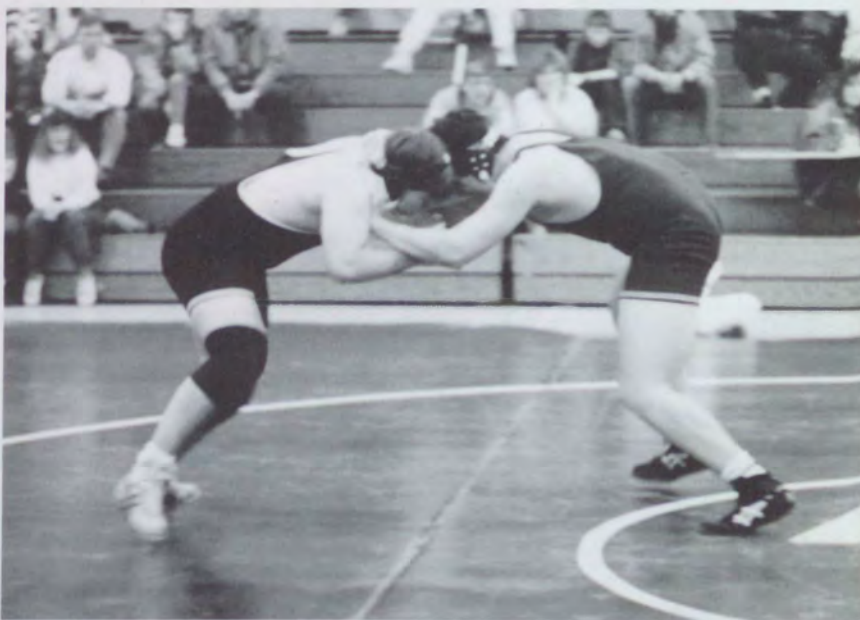


1st Class, All Class

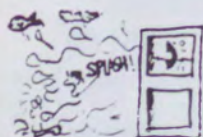

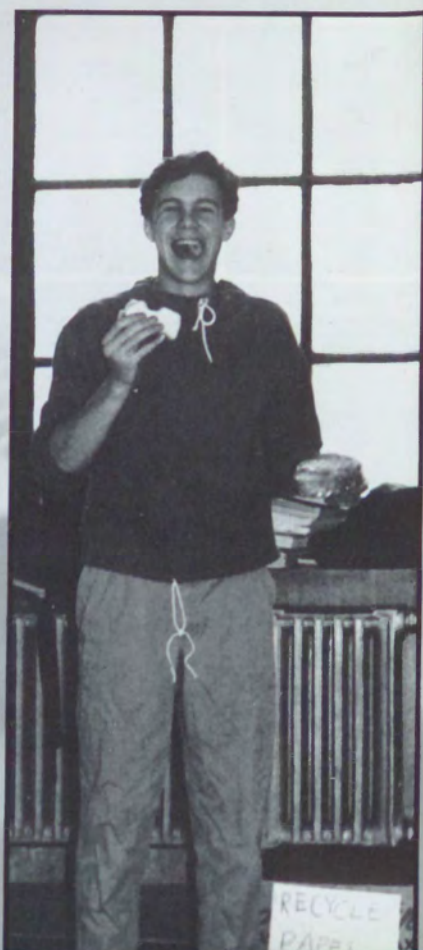

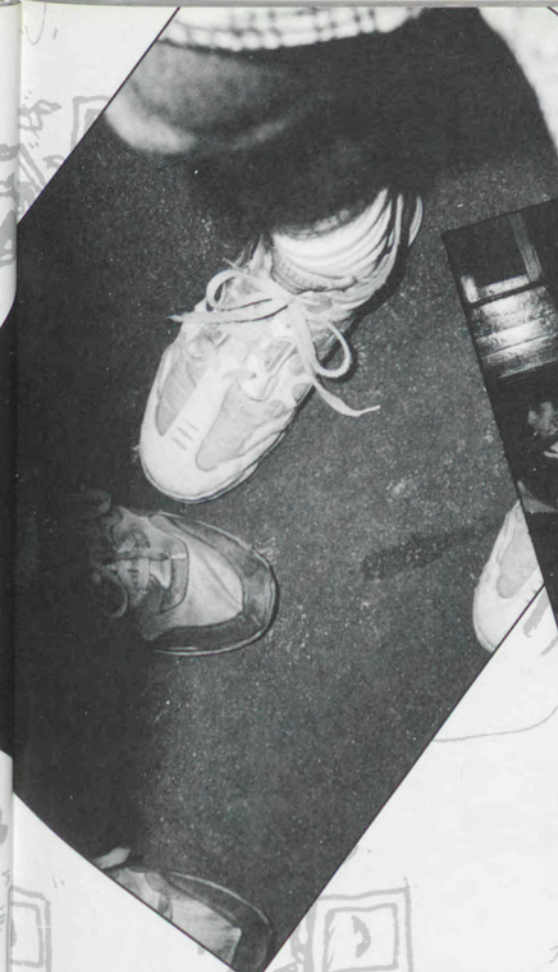

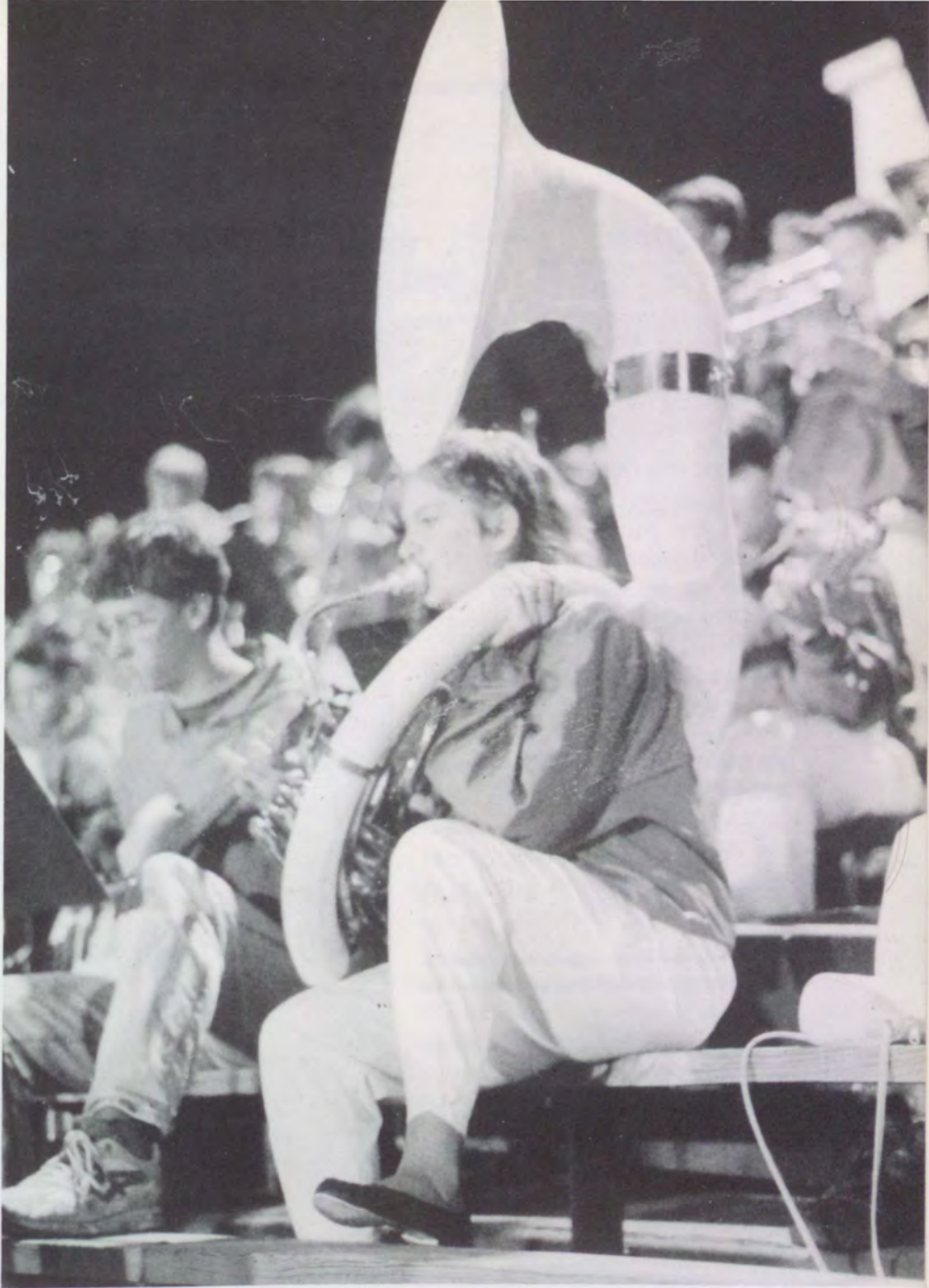
