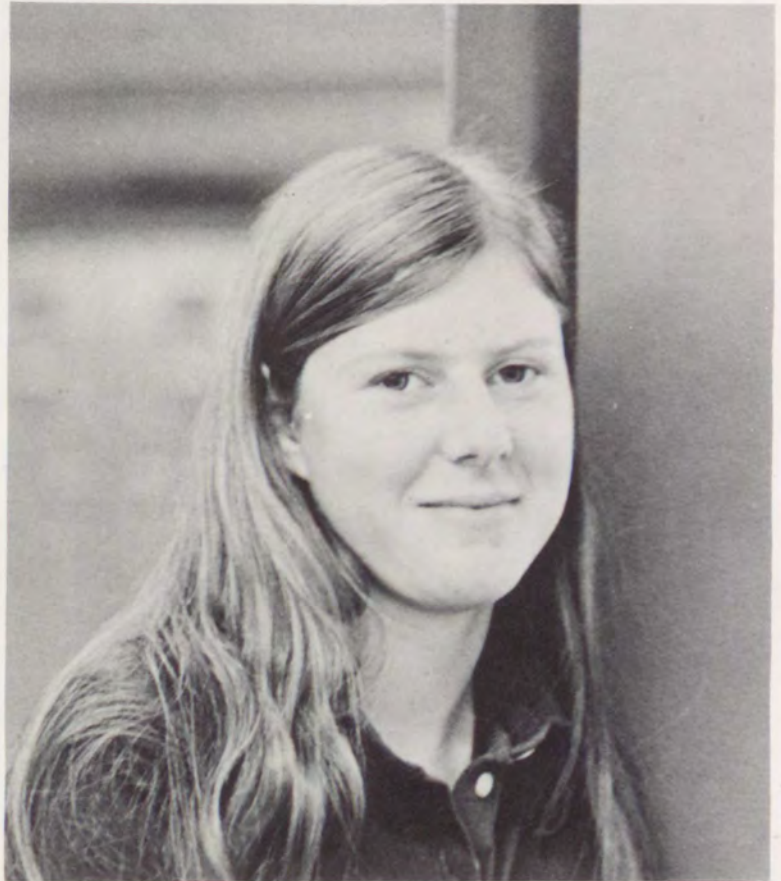
# MISSION: IMPROBABLE

You will find it interesting to note that Bangor High students are often seen smiling, and are apparently very happy.



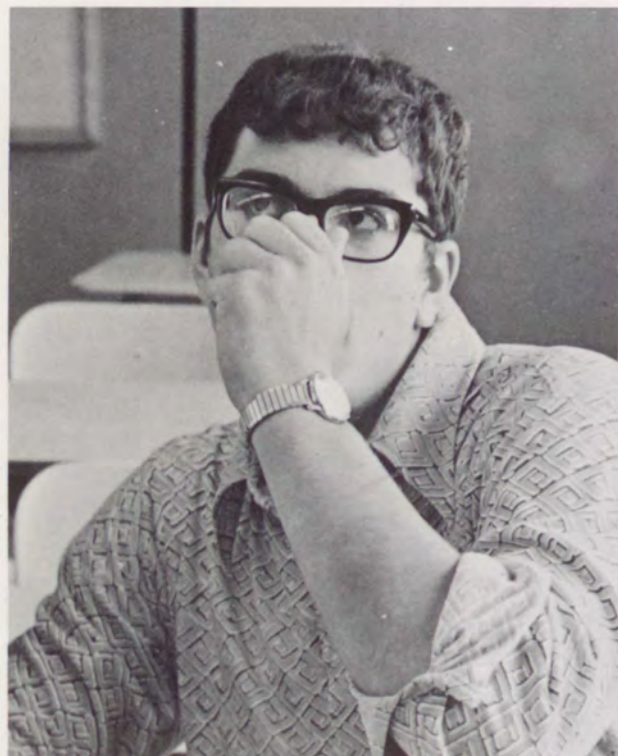

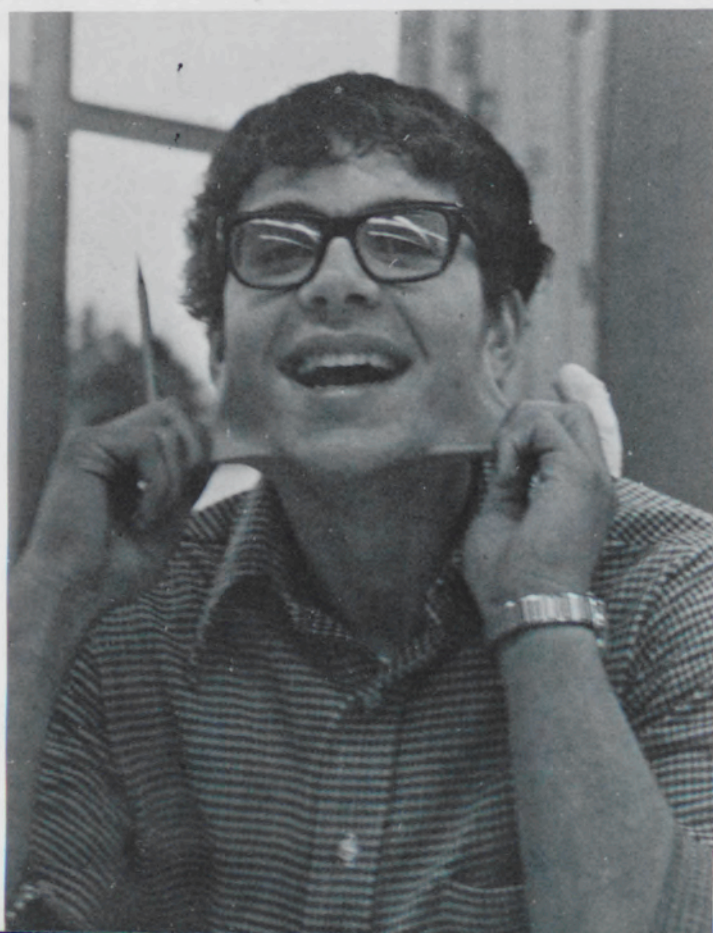

... and have shown themselves to be very sophisticated.



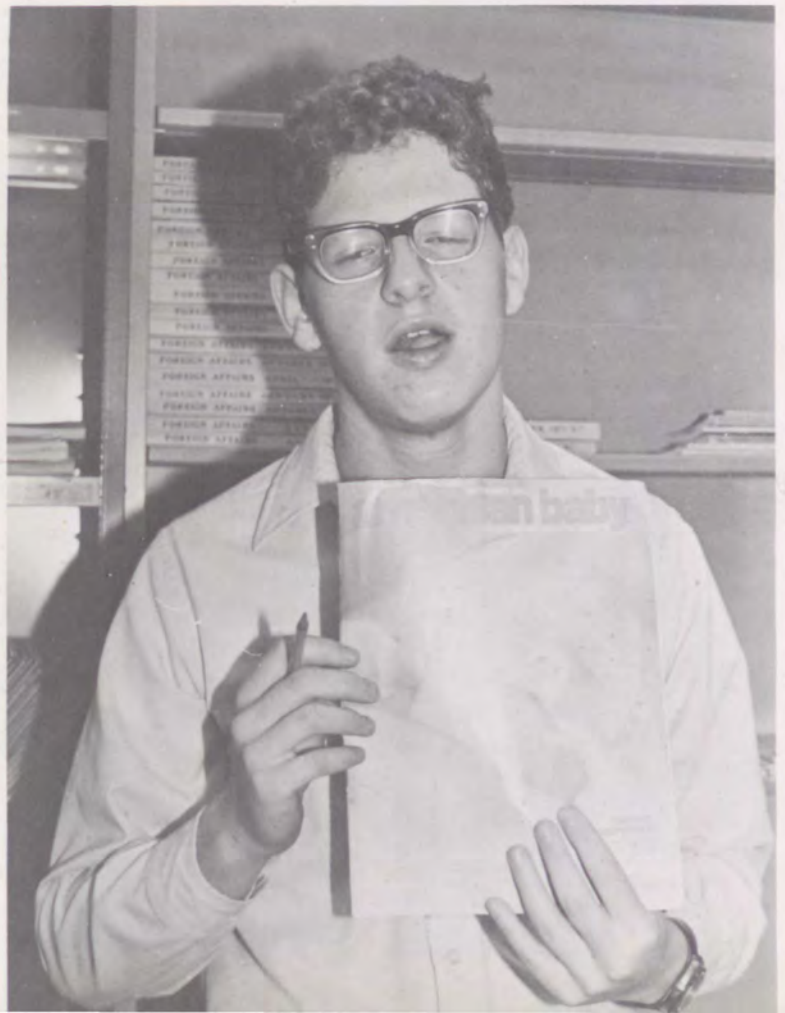


They possess excellent study habits...

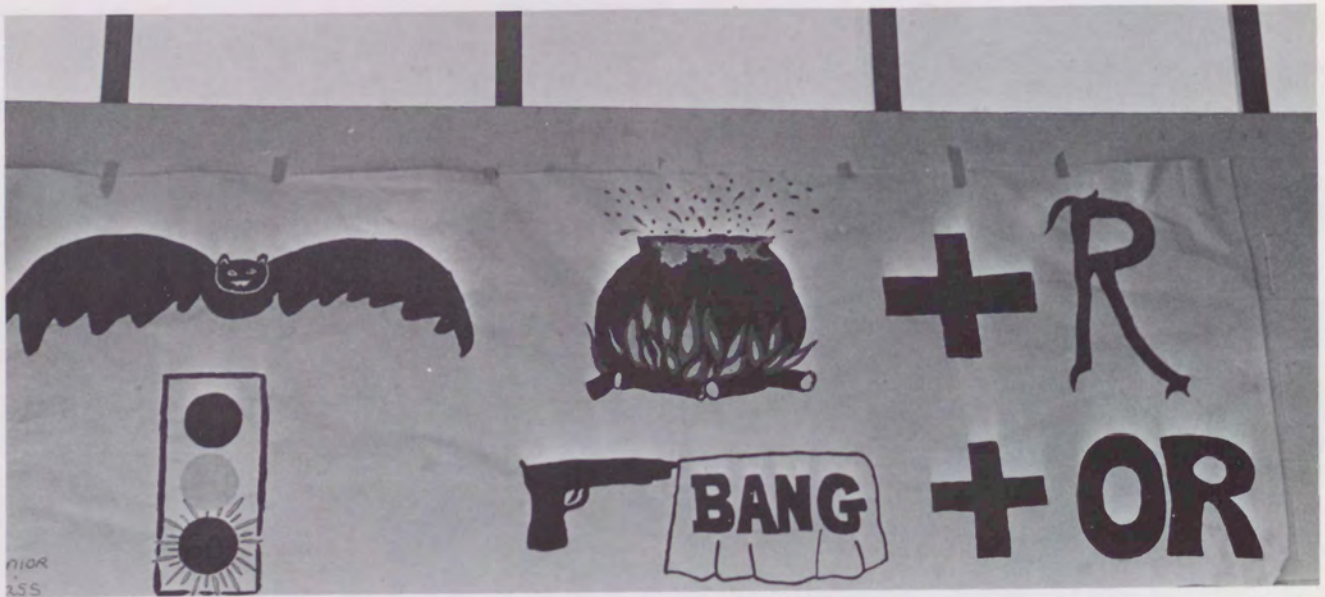


... the students indulge in activities such as ramp-walking, loitering in the halls, and eating.

A word of caution here: at no time should you antagonize them, as they have been known to attack in groups when threatened.



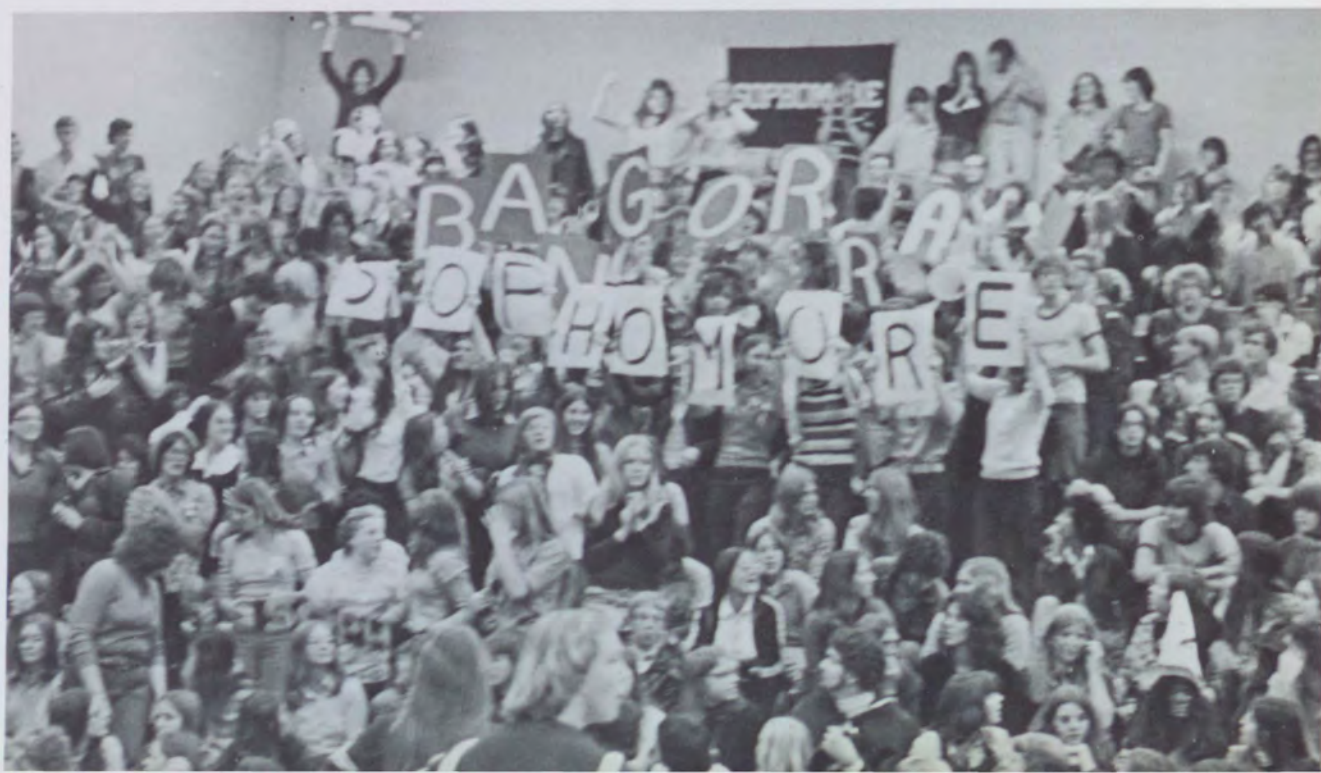


For the most part, though, Bangor High is an orderly and tranquil school where everything is in its place.



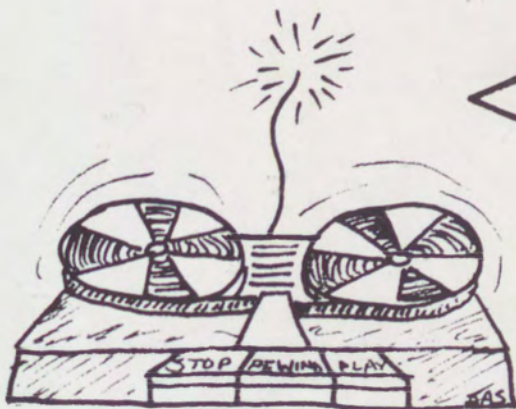
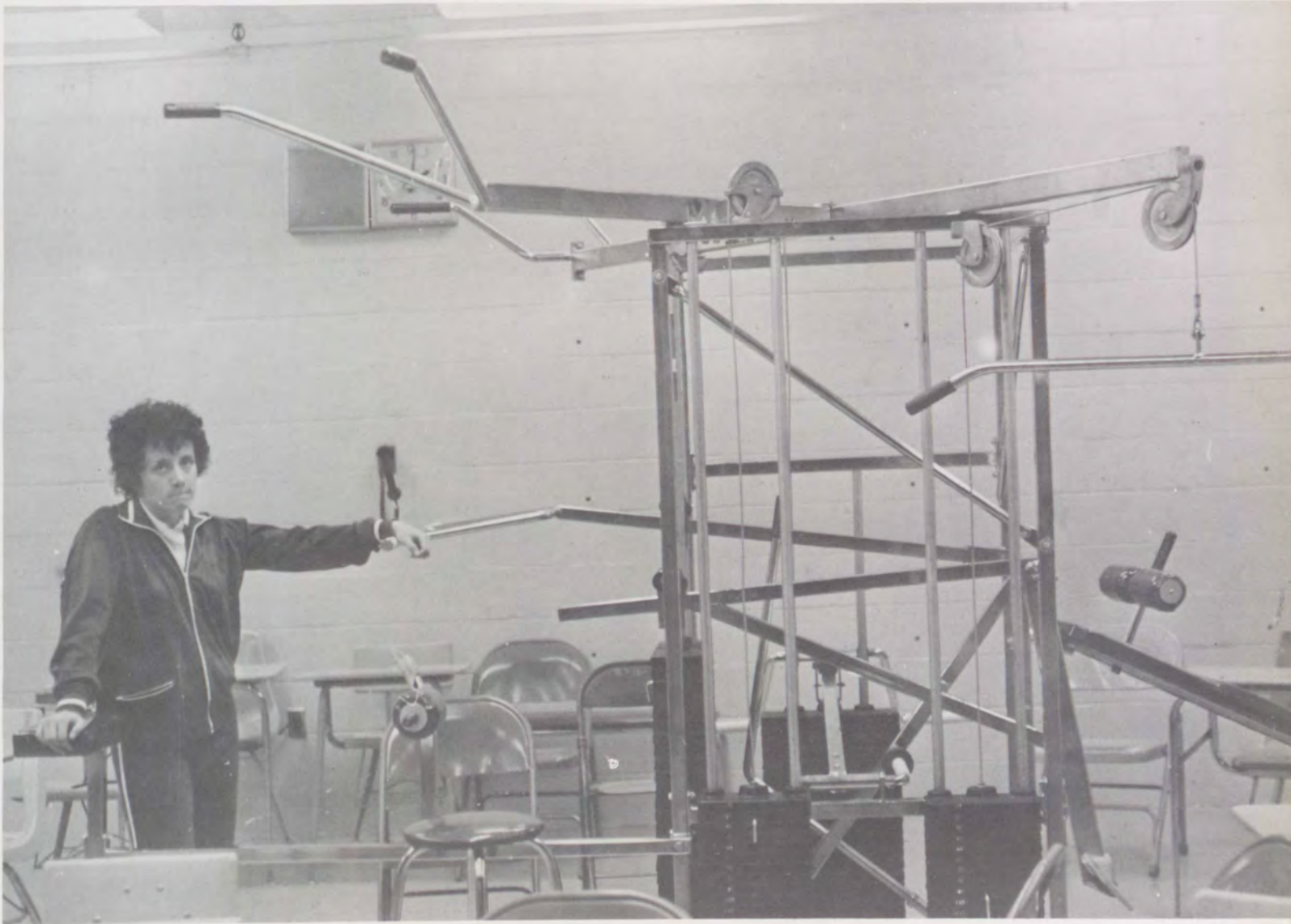

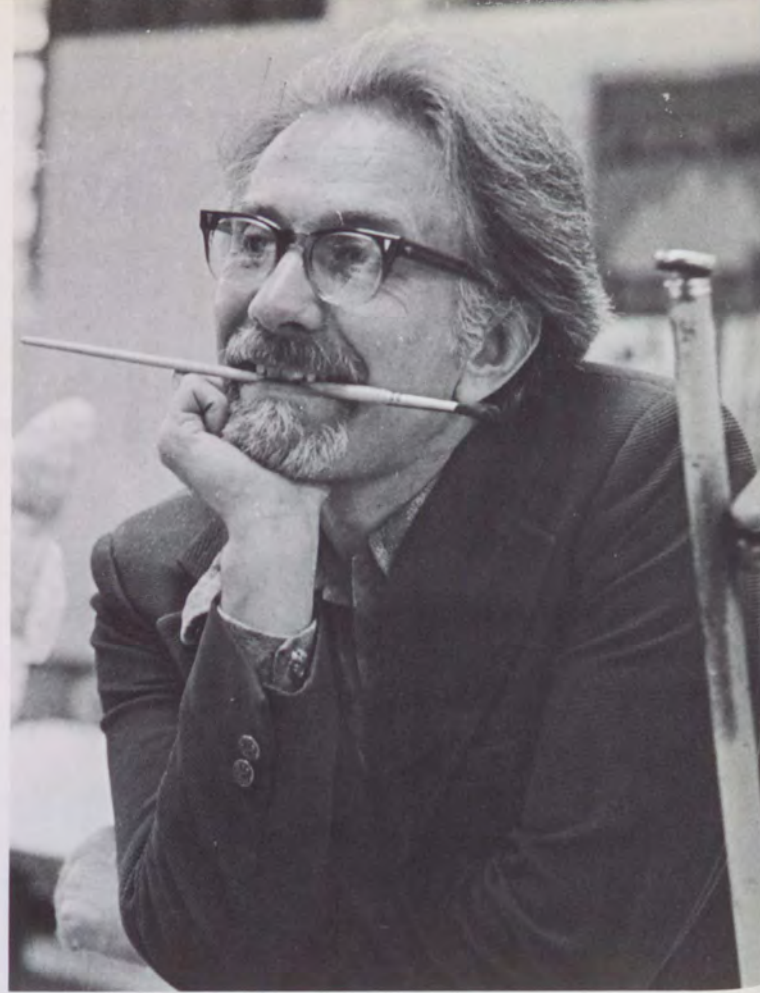
# FINE ARTS
