The great respect the cast has for the director is obvious from its behavior.



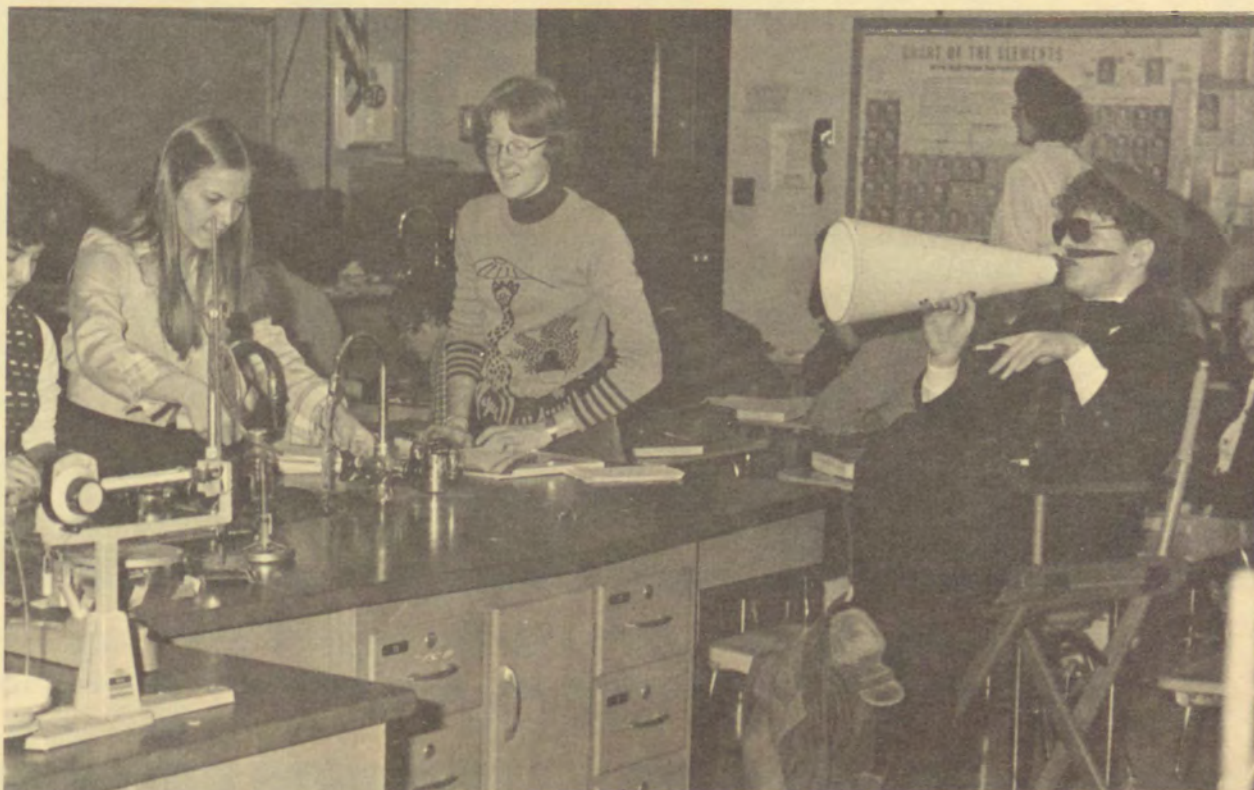

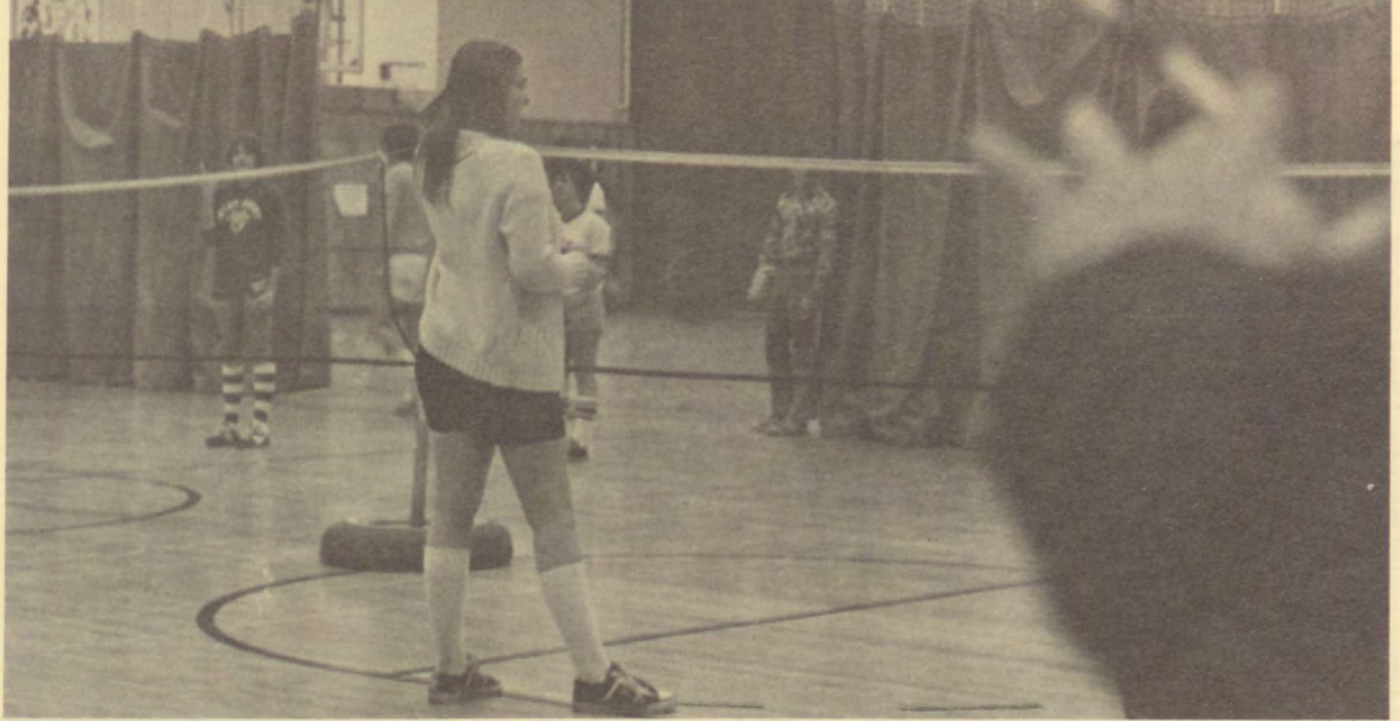

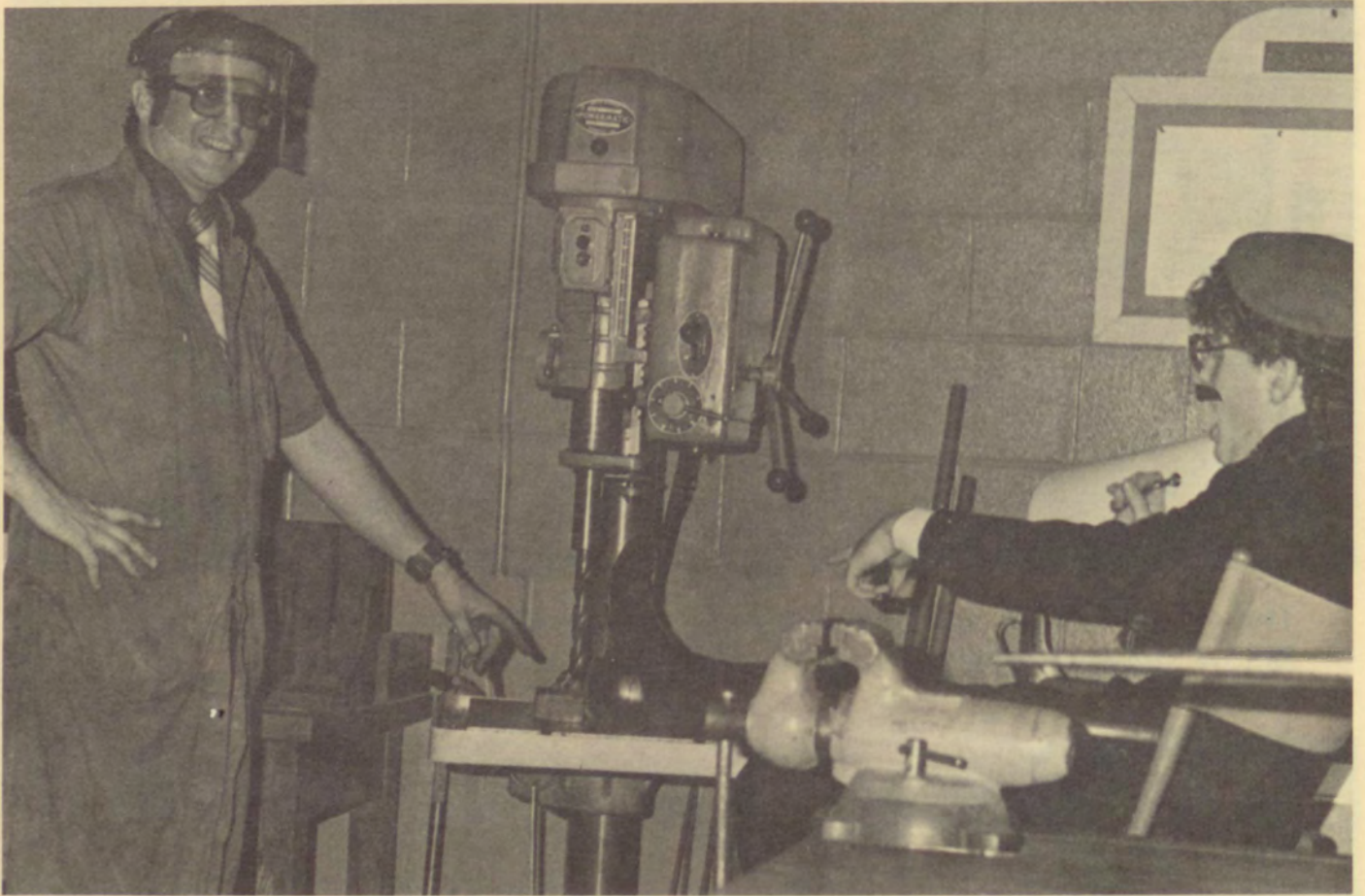
Here is Rodney carefully directing a crucial scene in which a disturbed young man (center, played by A.D. Youngman) discovers that he is eating his napkin.





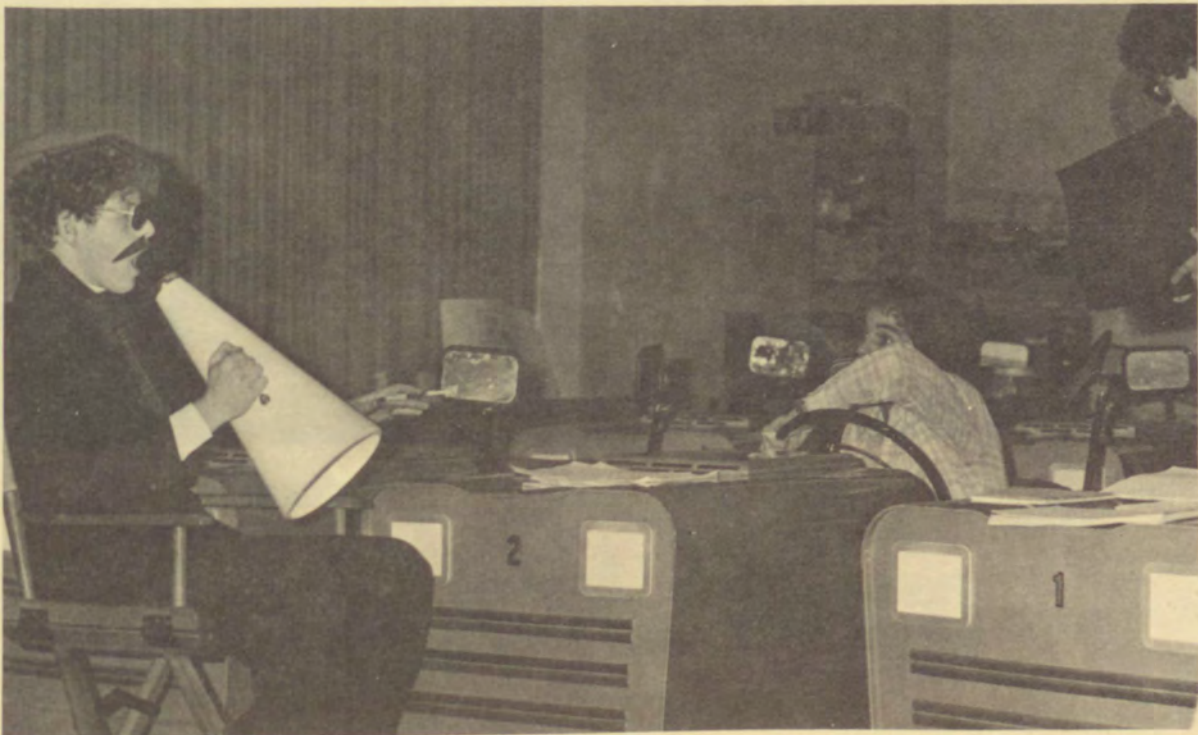
