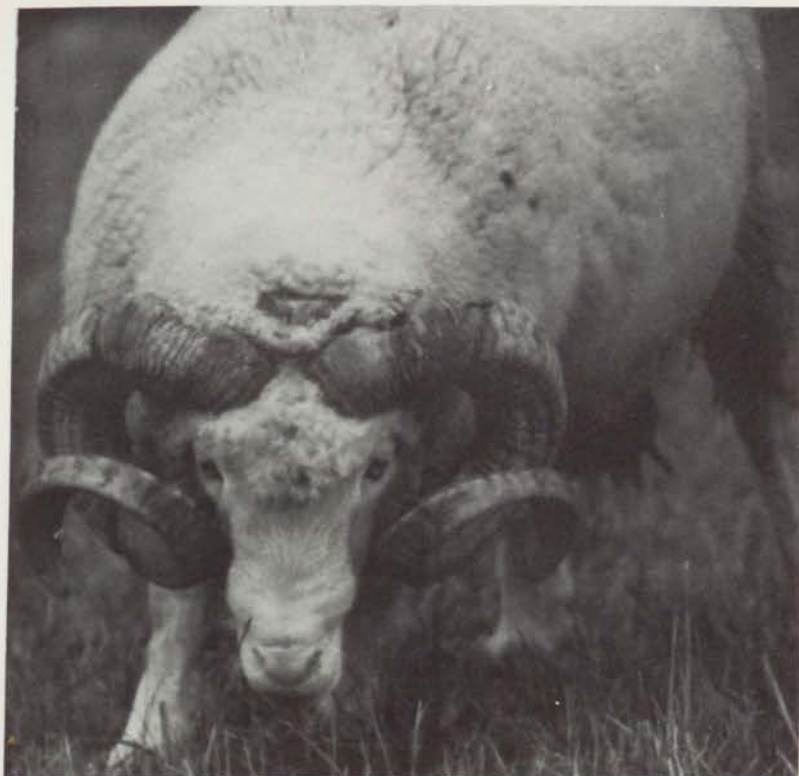

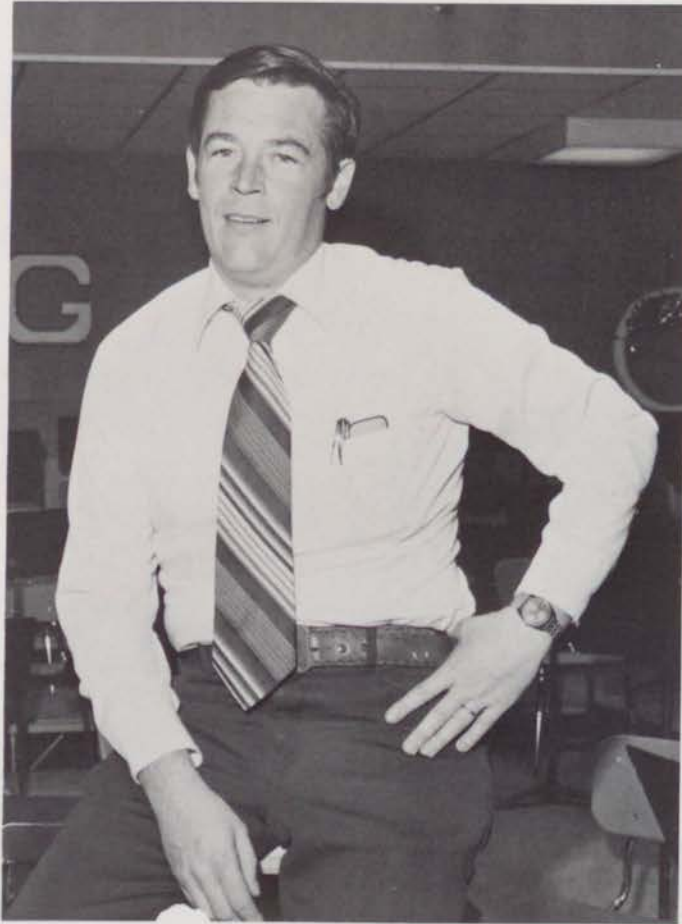

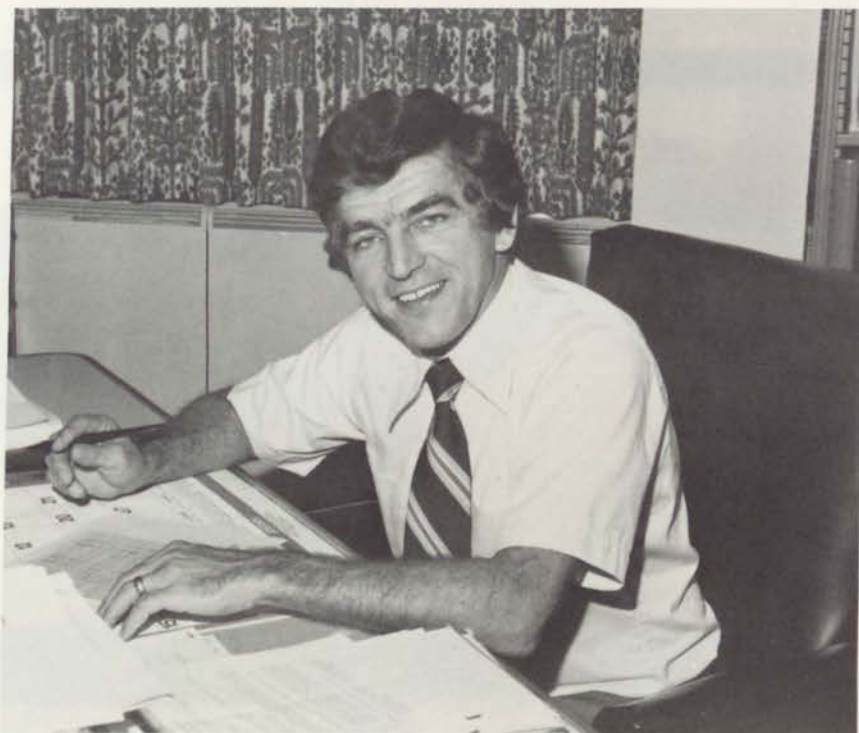

As years pass, the Oracle, perhaps as no other single vehicle, will have the power to bring into focus memories of three years spent as part of the B.H.S. family.

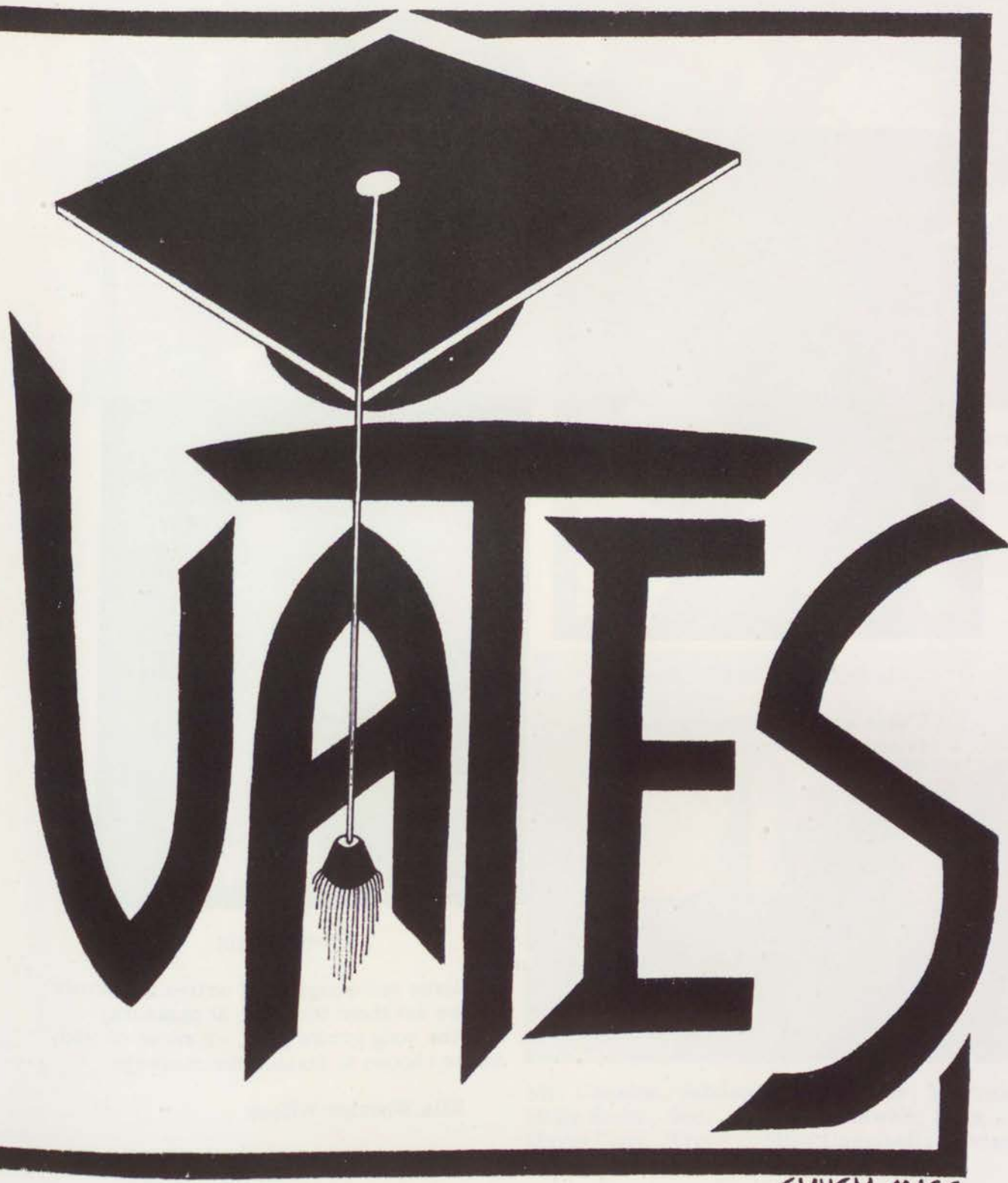
It is our wish, that as the Oracle is read and re-read; pictures scanned, and then studies, that the intangibles of three years of one's life will be remembered.
