At Bangor High, he lettered in football, basketball, and baseball. As a senior, he was co-captain of his football and basketball teams and president of the B-Club.

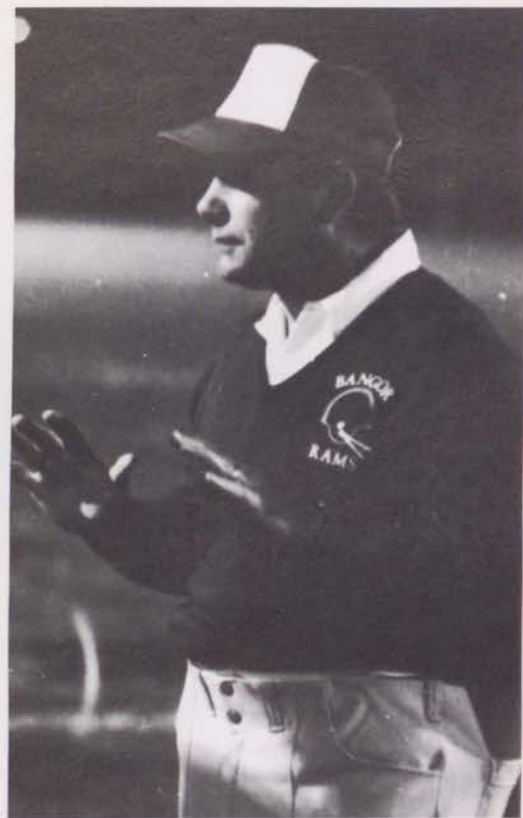

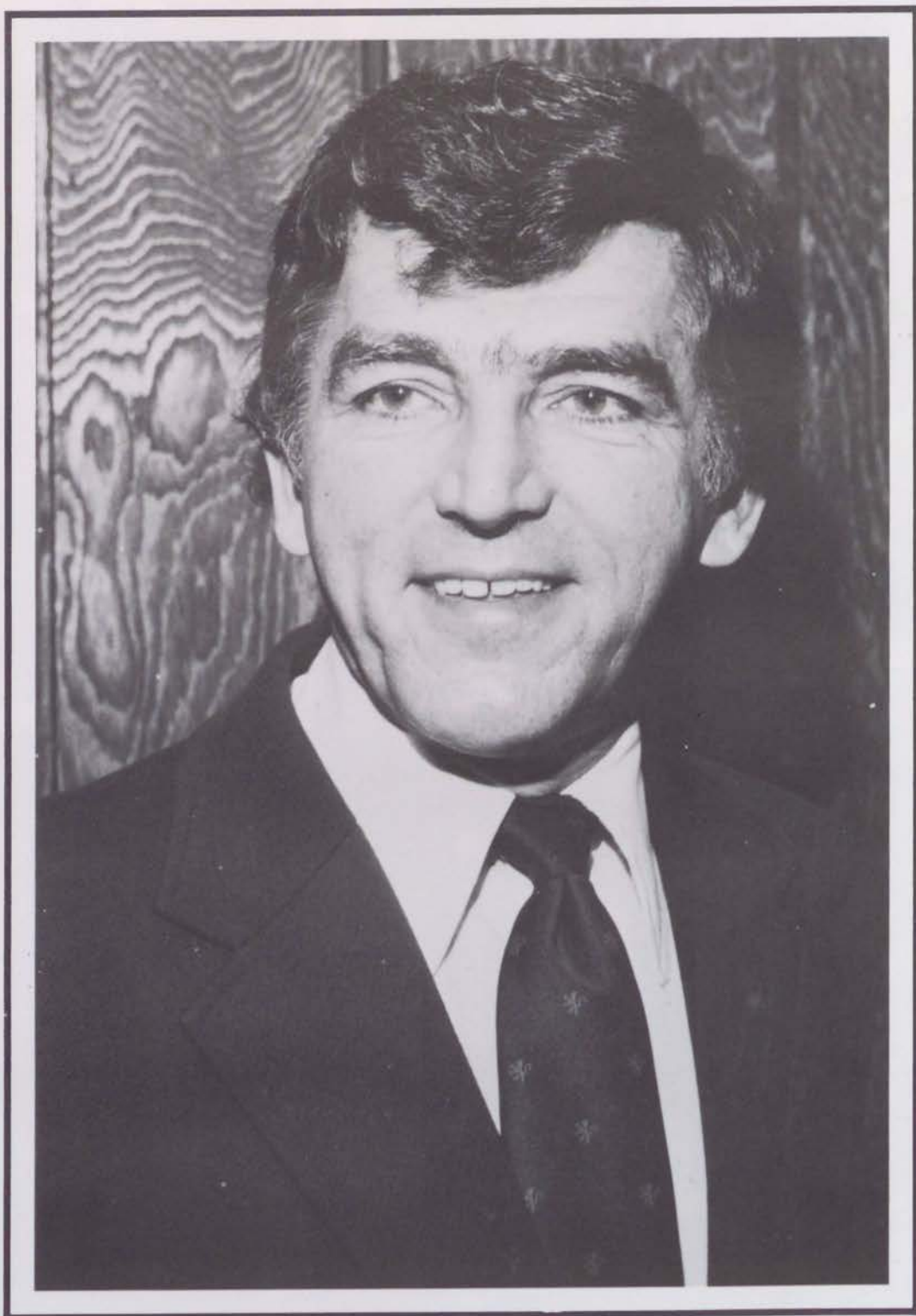


Coach Price with his daughter Susan and his wife, Mary.

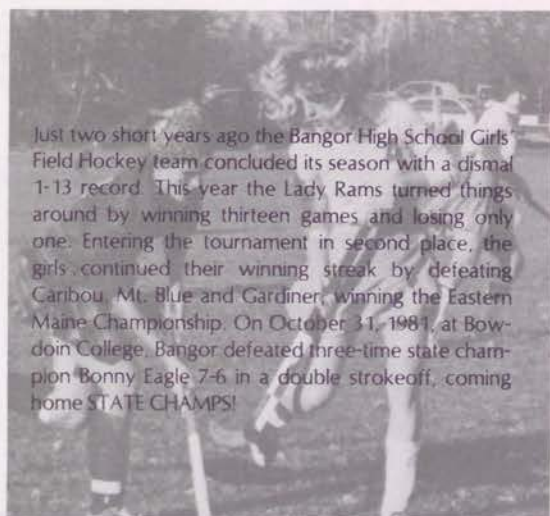
ALL THE WAY.

1. The VFW Voice of Democracy script-writing and spelling competition. (January)
2. The American Legion Oratorical Contest: prepared and extemporaneous speaking on the United States Constitution. (winter and spring)
3. The Maine Speech Festival. Six categories. Sponsored by UMO. (winter and spring)
4. The Brewer Speech Tournament. Seven to nine categories. Sponsored by Brewer High School. (winter)
5. The Spear Speaking Contest. Interpretative category changes each year. Sponsored by the State Principals' Association. (spring)
6. Programs for community-at-large: schools, libraries, hospitals, clubs. (all year)
7. Maine Forensic League Competitions. Occasionally. (fall, winter, spring)

At press time Bangor speakers this year have won superior honors in all competitions listed. Spear Speaking, American Legion, and Forensic State Finals have yet to be held.

Ka-Rim Troyli, Jayne Rowe, Debbie Thomas, Mitchell McCarthy, and Tim Constantine won first-place gold medals and trophies at UMO and Brewer. Anne Dean was tops in the school Voice of Democracy Contest. Trip Switzer has won the county and regional competition of the American Legion Oratorical Contest. Judy Meltzer and Robert McLaughlin, victors in the BHS Spear competition, will meet other school winners during the week of March 22 in the Eastern Regionals. Spear finals will be held at UMO Augusta on April 6.

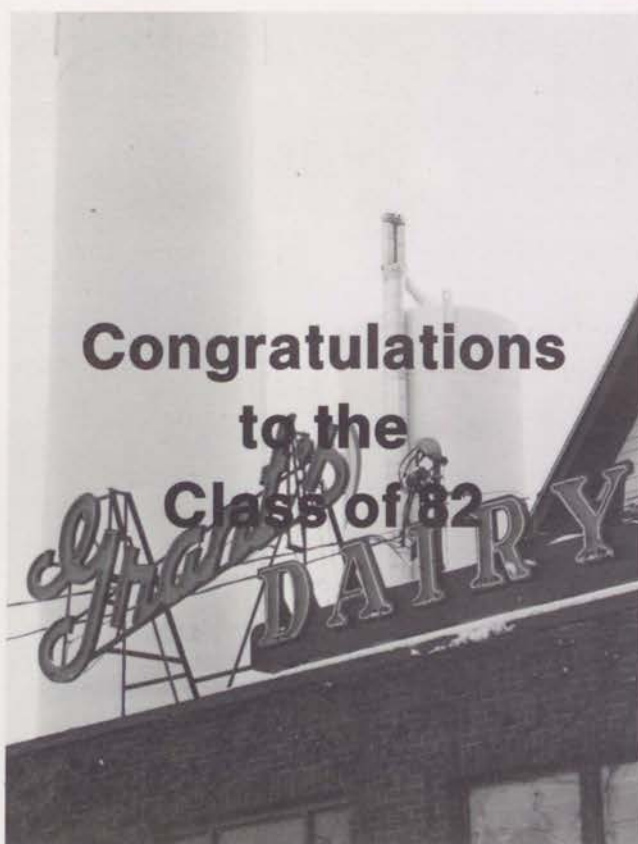




