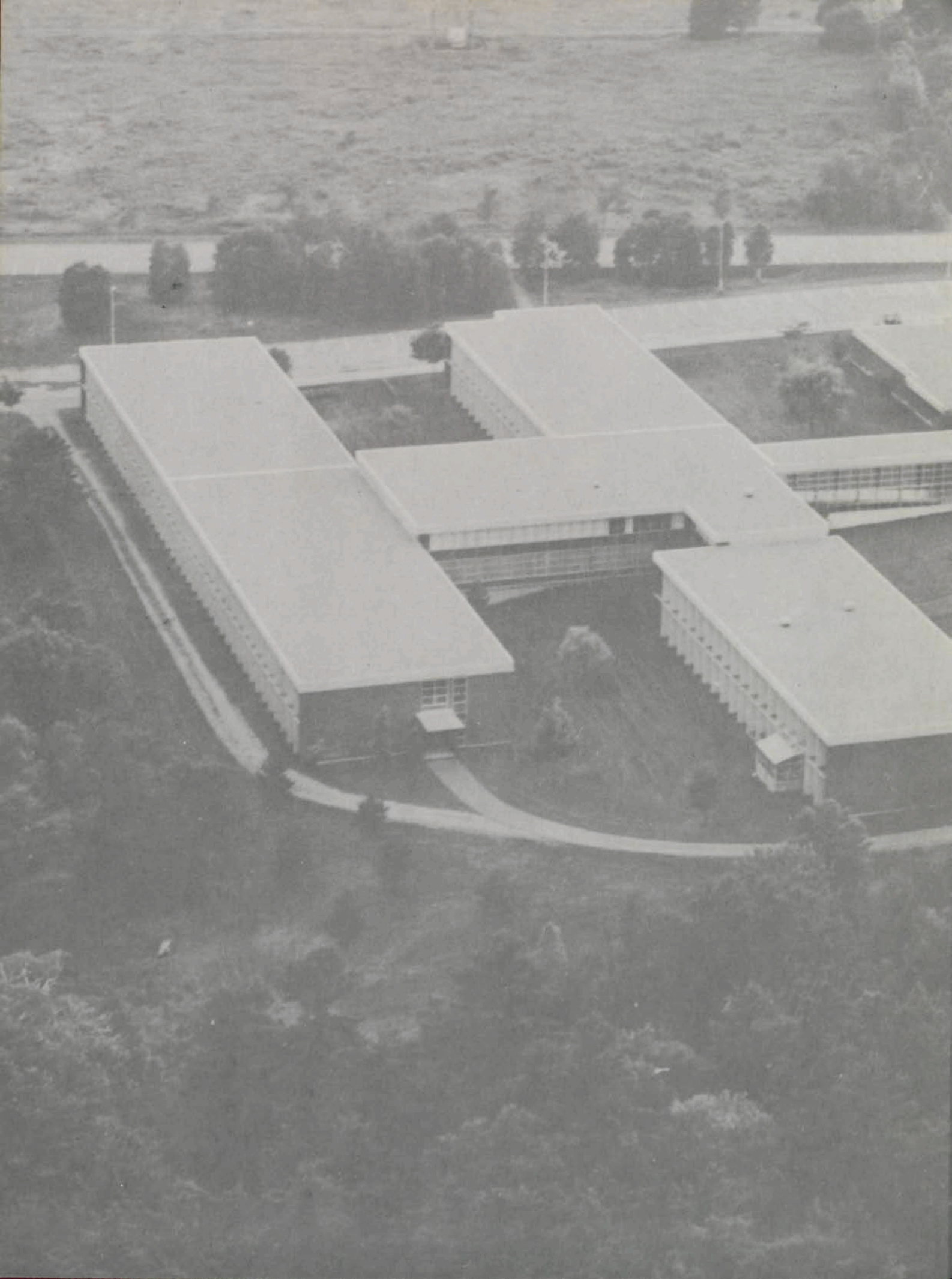

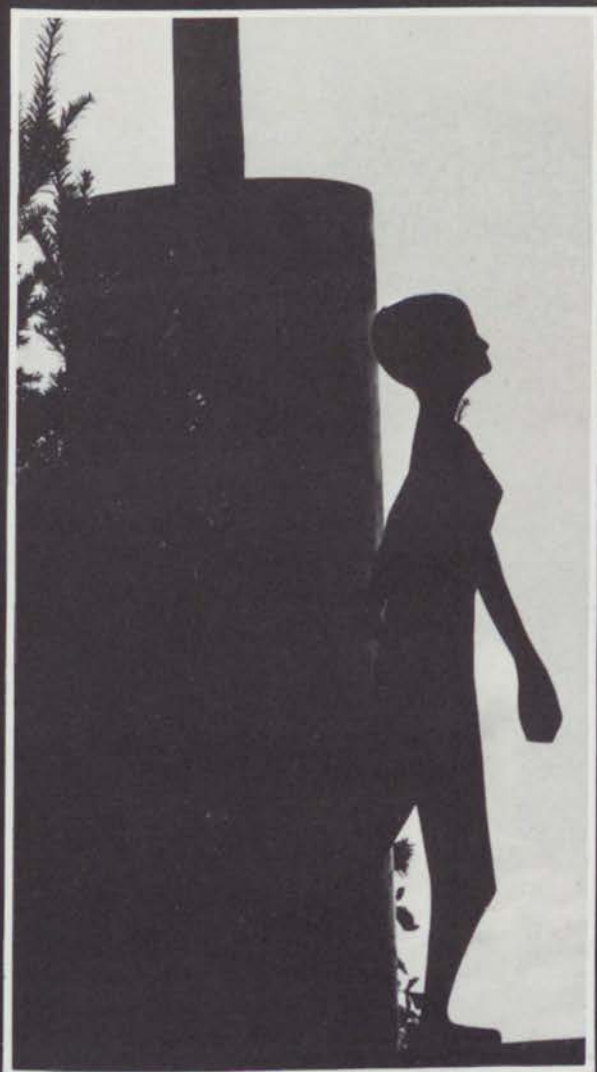

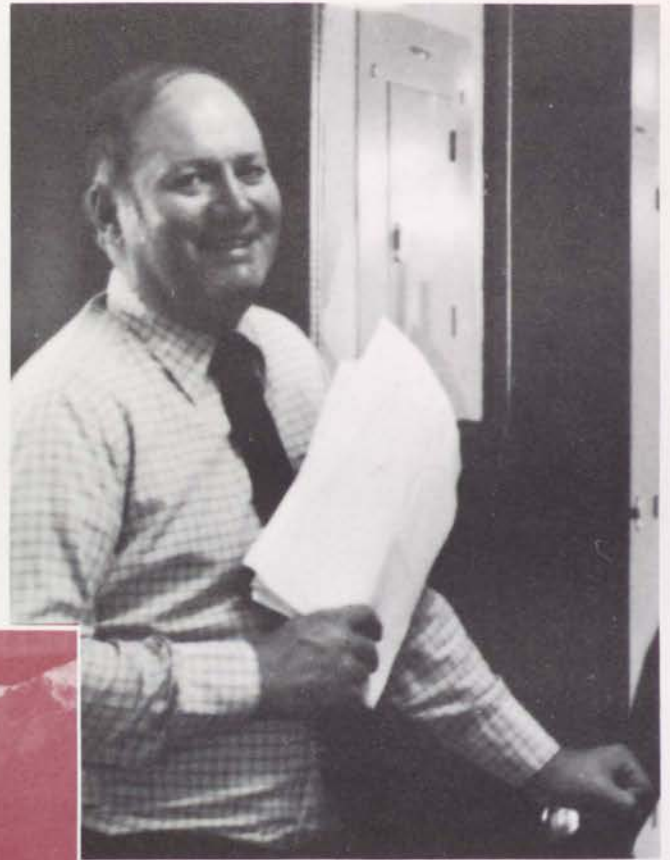

Mr. and Mrs. Johnson now live in Hermon with their two sons, Glen, twelve and Brian, eight.

Mr. Johnson hunts and fishes whenever possible, and is involved with new hobbies; the piano and the computer.

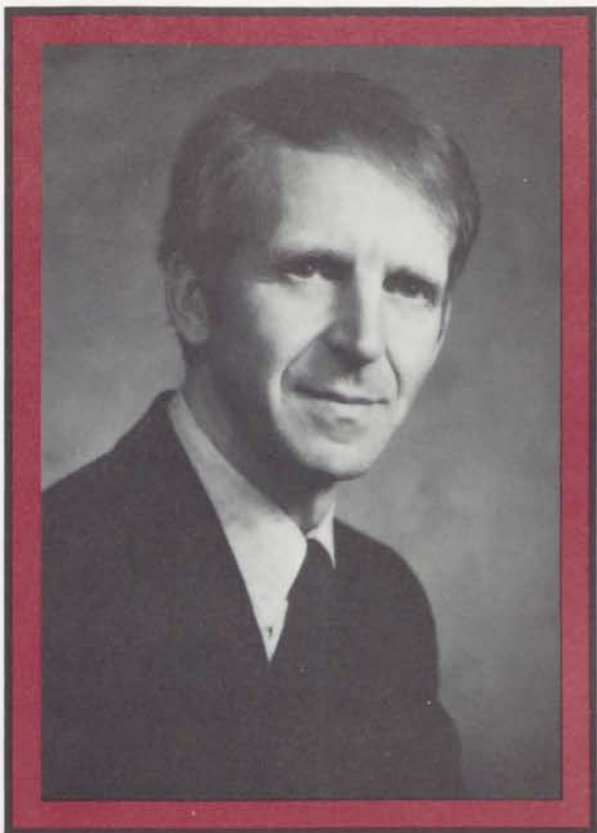
Dear Members of the Class of 1983:

The 1983 edition of the ORACLE, your yearbook, provides a visual testimony of the various aspects of school life at Bangor High.

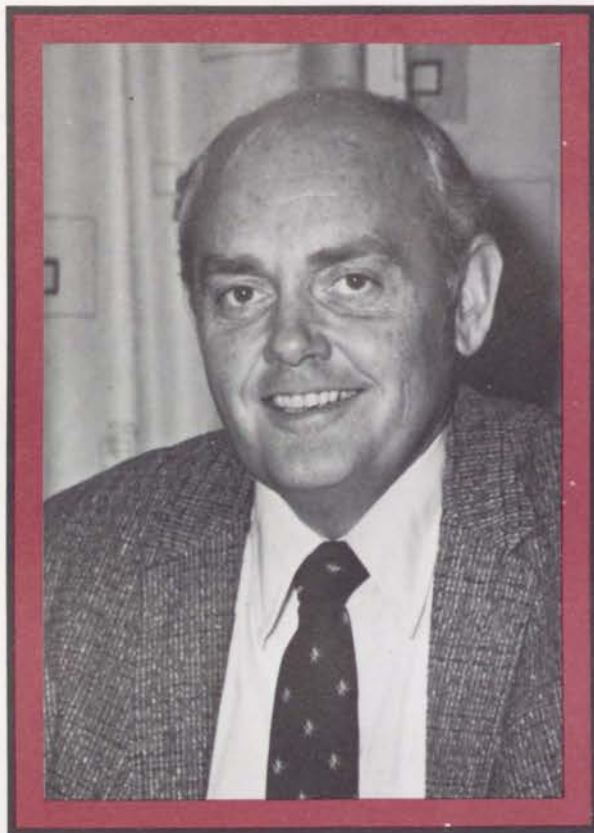

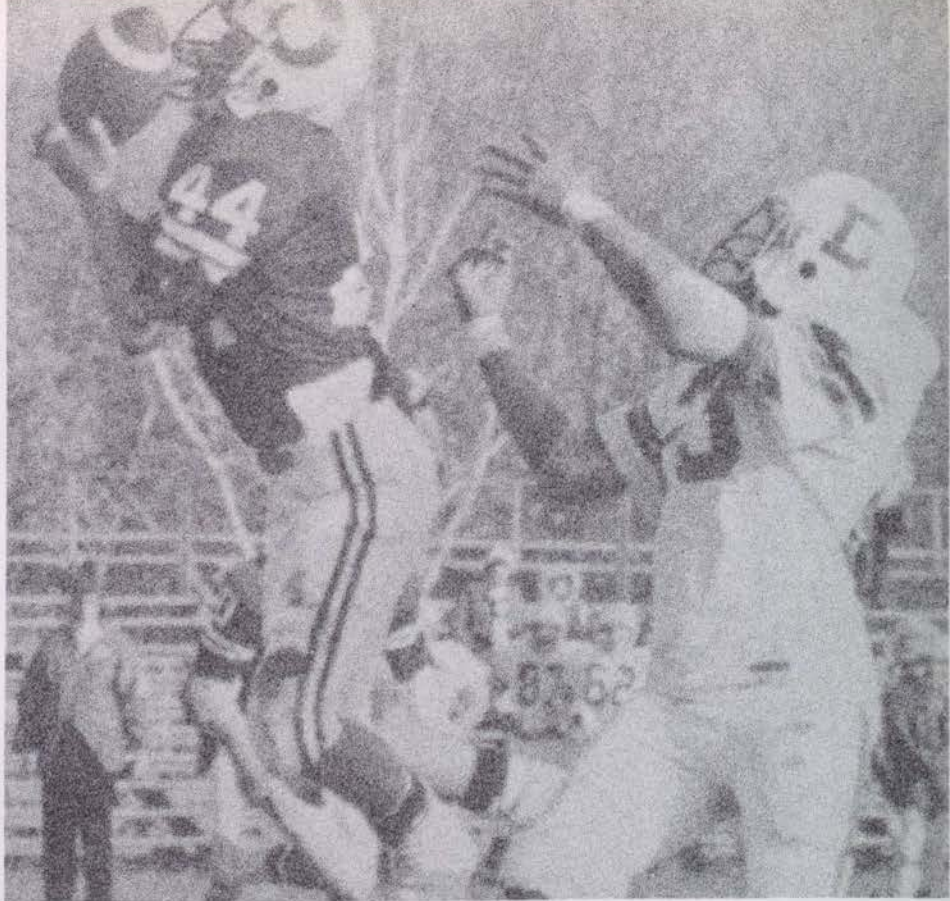
CLASS "A" CHAMPIONS
