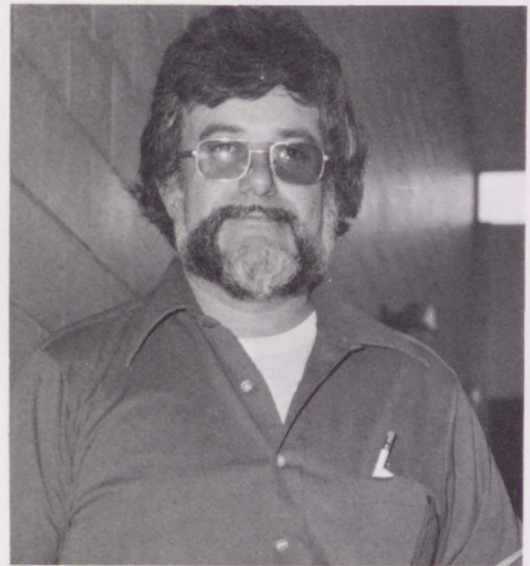
To instill in each student an understanding of self-responsibility. There are established standards of individual performance, conduct, academic achievement, for all members of the Cadet corps.
