Dr. John J. Fahey

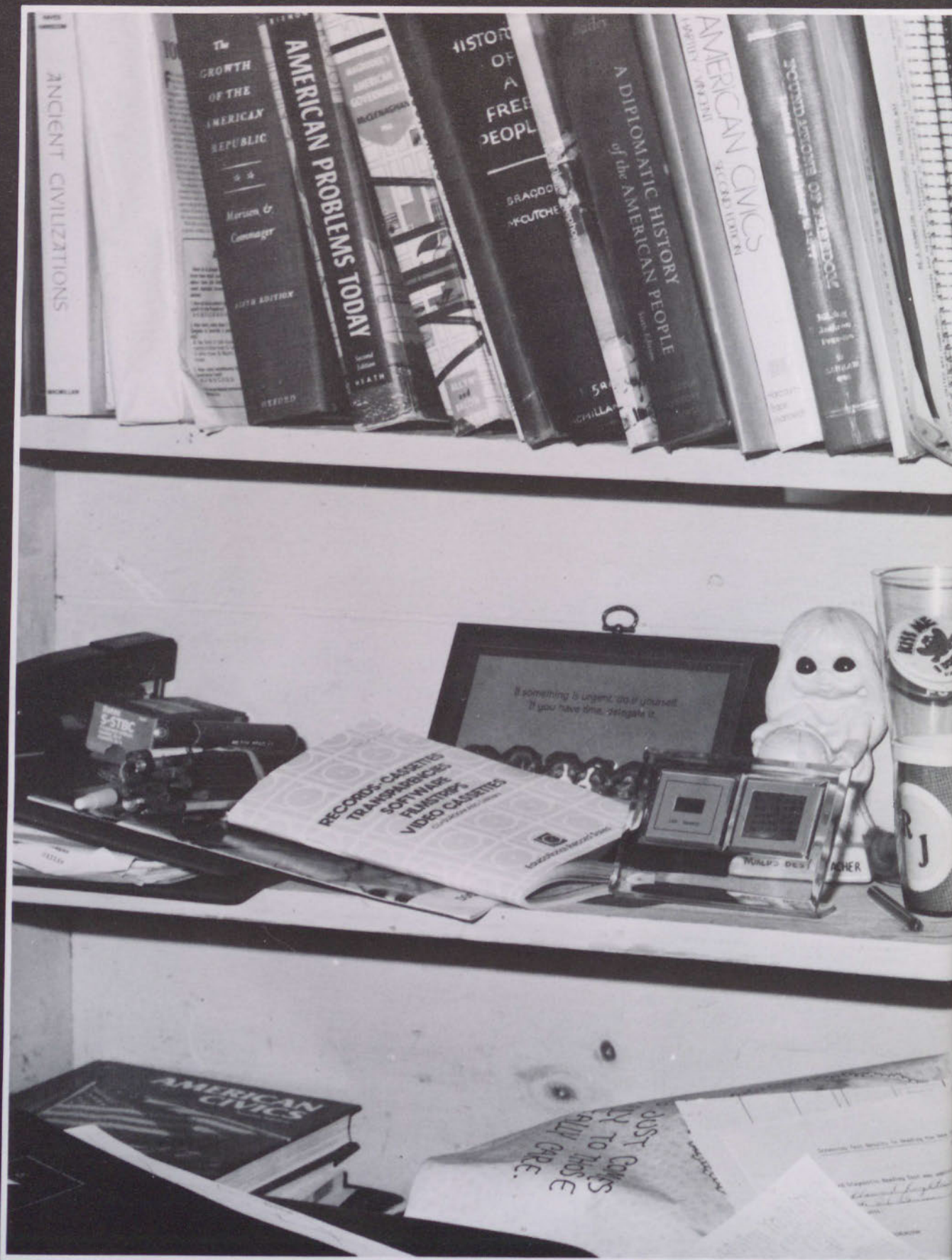

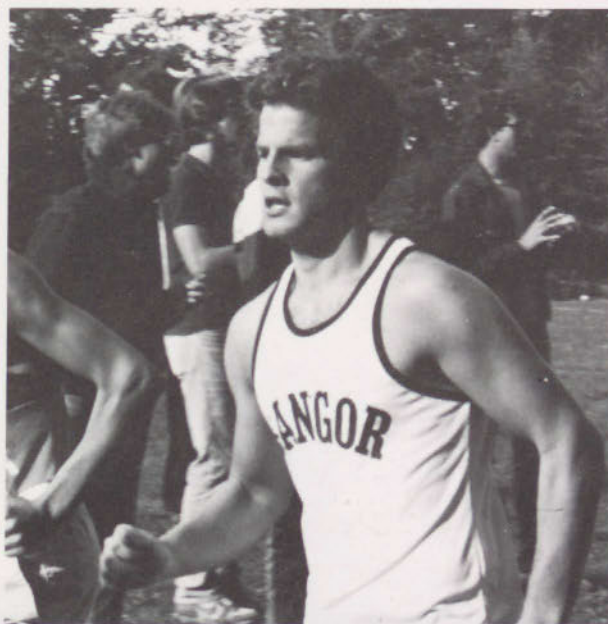


CROSS COUNTRY

Abbott Square Building

Because our current B.H.S. is having its 20th birthday in 1984 we thought it would be interesting to see how it has changed during this century.

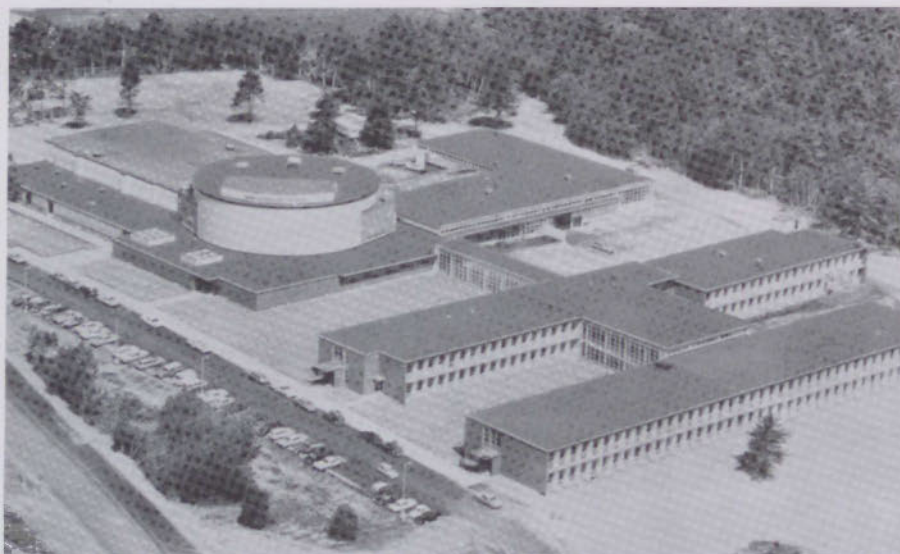
The first picture depicts the Abbott Square building, our earliest photo of Bangor High School. In 1911 the Abbott Square building burned in the Bangor fire. In 1913 the school was relocated on Harlow Street where, for fifty years, it served as the senior learning center. During that period increased enrollment made it necessary to have double sessions; the seniors, juniors, and most sophomores went in the morning; while business sophomores and freshmen went in the afternoon. The demand for a better equipped and more spacious high school now faced the city. For this reason the present structure was built. And thus, ever since 1964, Bangor High has given us learning, friendships, and hope at its outer Broadway location.

To the Office Staff: Thanks for the use of the intercom and all the support you gave me.

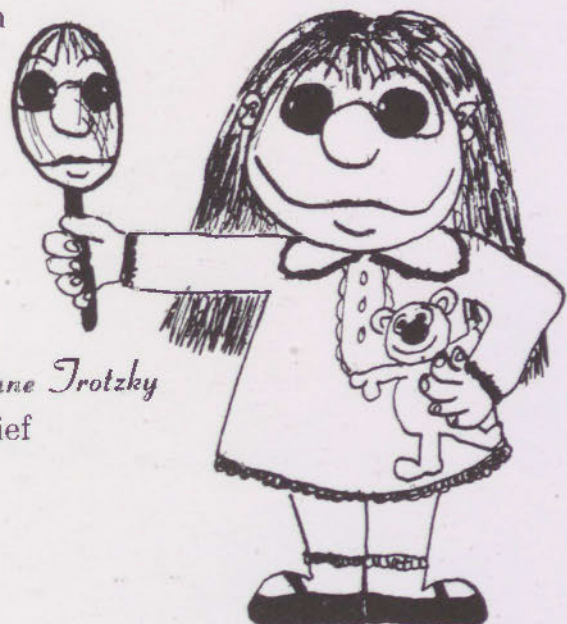
