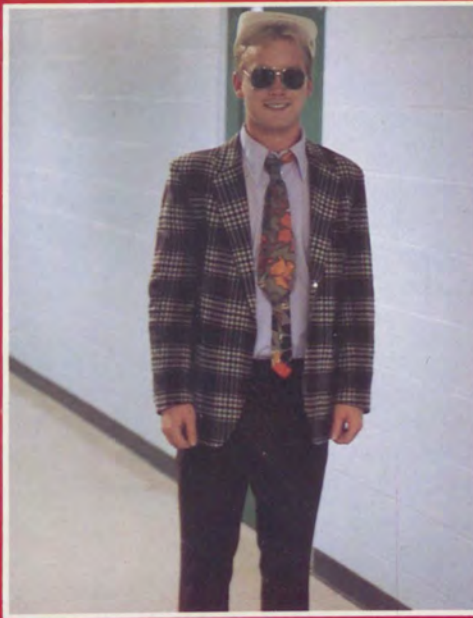

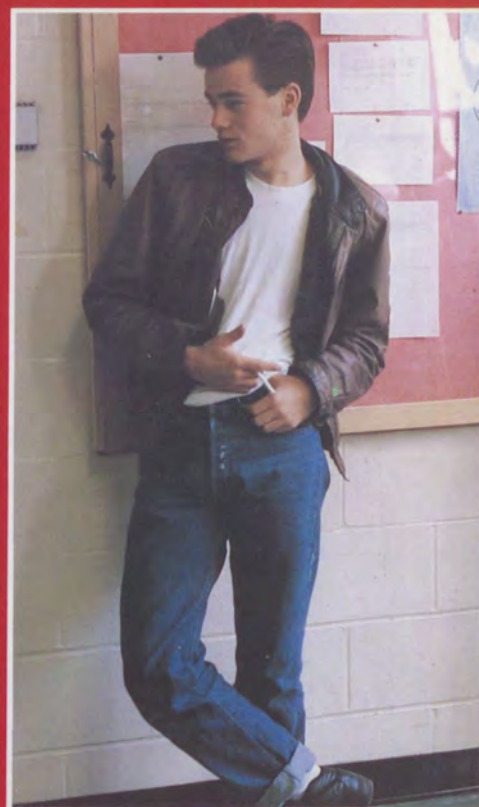

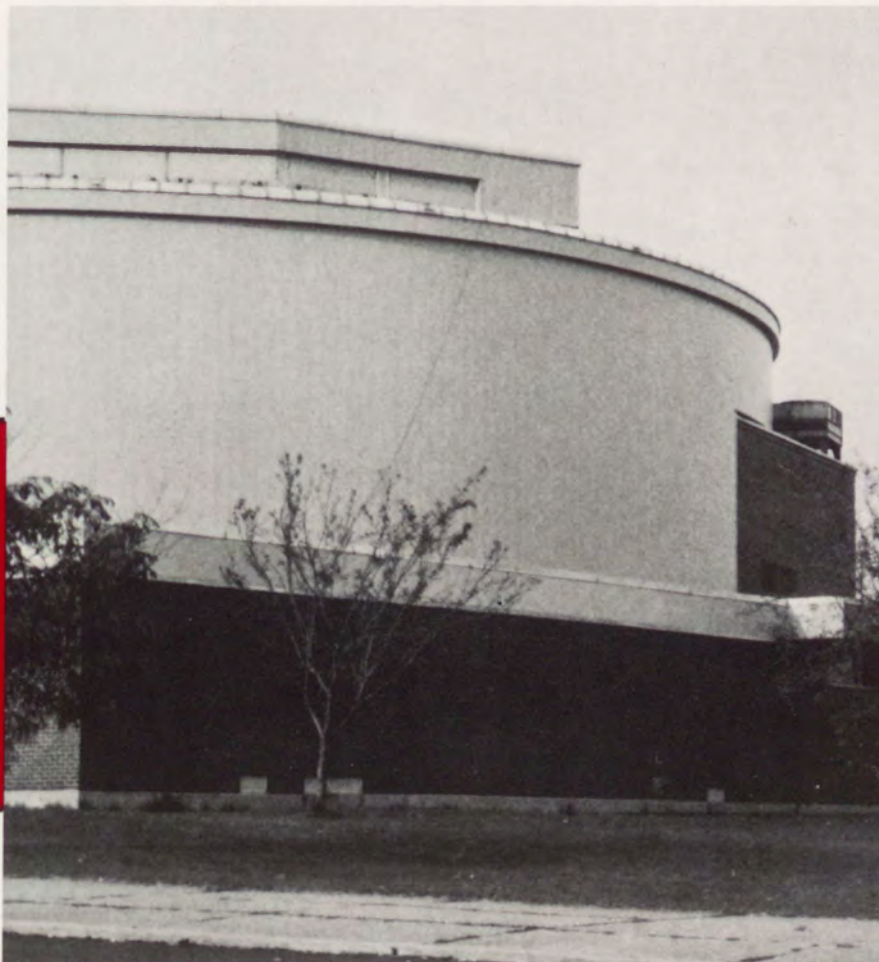

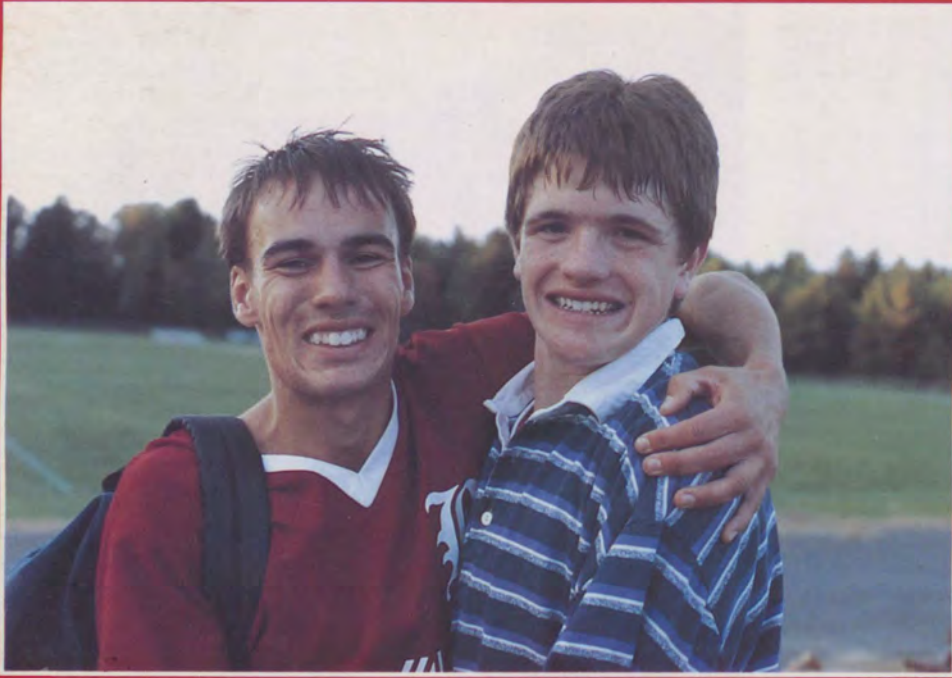

Back Breakers, those teachers at Bangor High. Evil men and women who have chosen to devote their lives to the continual punishment and suffering of high school students.

But are they? Are they really? Undoubtedly every student would agree that if he had a choice between slaving over yet another math assignment or lounging in front of the television with a bag of Doritos, that Calculus worksheet would simply go unfinished. And there are some who refuse to believe that the ability to recite Chaucer will ever come in handy (unless they just happen to be surprised in a dark alley by a burly mugger with an acute appreciation for English Classics). But the faculty's simple persistence and unflinching patience in convincing the student that yes, this chapter of American History is truly important, should be enough to convince him that there might be some truth buried in those words. "Buenas dias," or "Bonjour," the Foreign Language Department offers students the chance to master the tongue of a foreign country. But the Science Department is committed to giving students a solid foundation in this increasingly complex field. Teachers such as Bangor Vice's very own Mr. Don Johnson, Mr. "Kahuna" Emery, and Mr. "Save A Tree Today" Harrington prove to be exciting mentors in guiding students to an understanding of the physical and biological principals of our world.

Grab a straight edge and pray that your teacher will permit the use of a calculator, for you have just entered the Math Zone, that rare plane upon which all students form 90 degree angles with their seats and pass notes coded in binary. The Mathematics Department prides itself on its continued dedication to the education of its students. Although many students have initially found geometric theorems and algebraic equations impossible, a tireless teacher has been shown to



make all the difference. Instructors such as Thank-Goodness-She's-So-Patient Mrs. Grant, Mrs. "Pascal" Lord, and Department Head Mr. Godsoe exude the kindness and concern characteristic of the Mathematics Department.

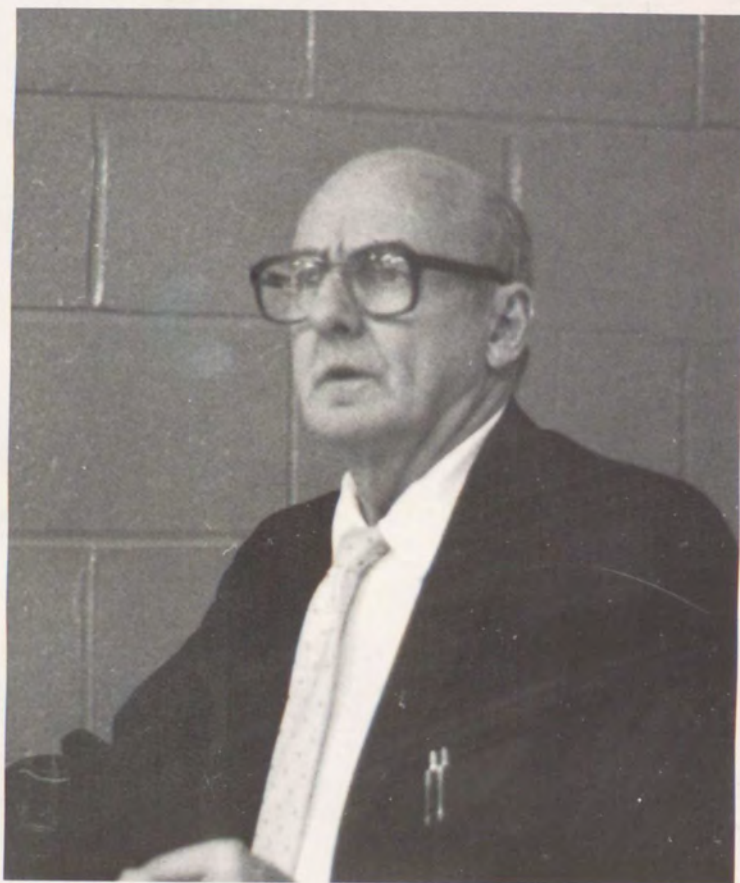
