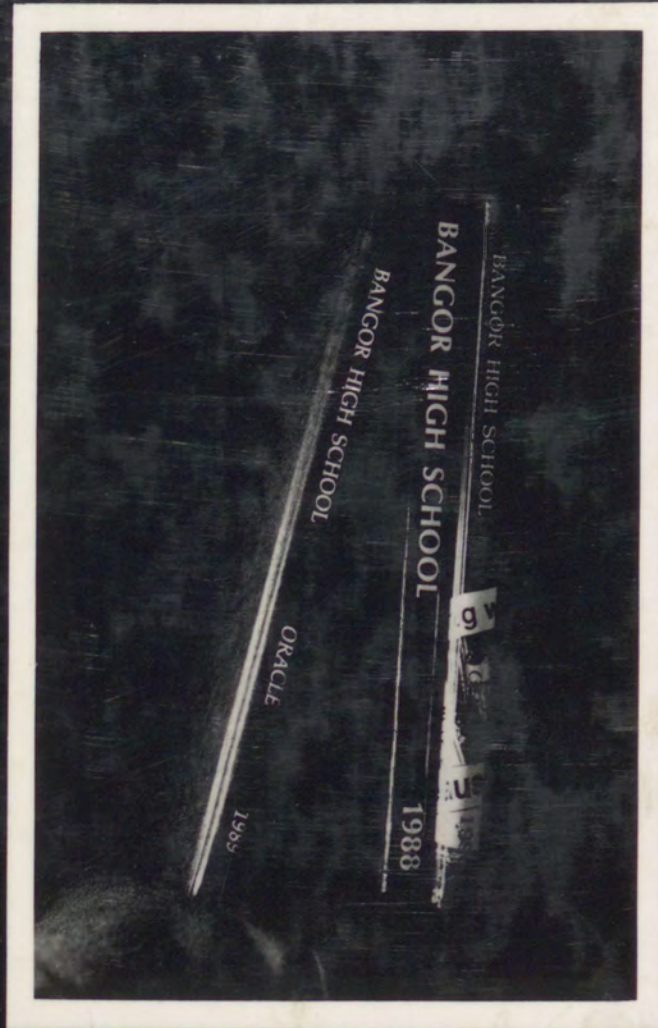

The *ORACLE* staff and advisor deserve a great deal of praise for, once again, producing an outstanding book.

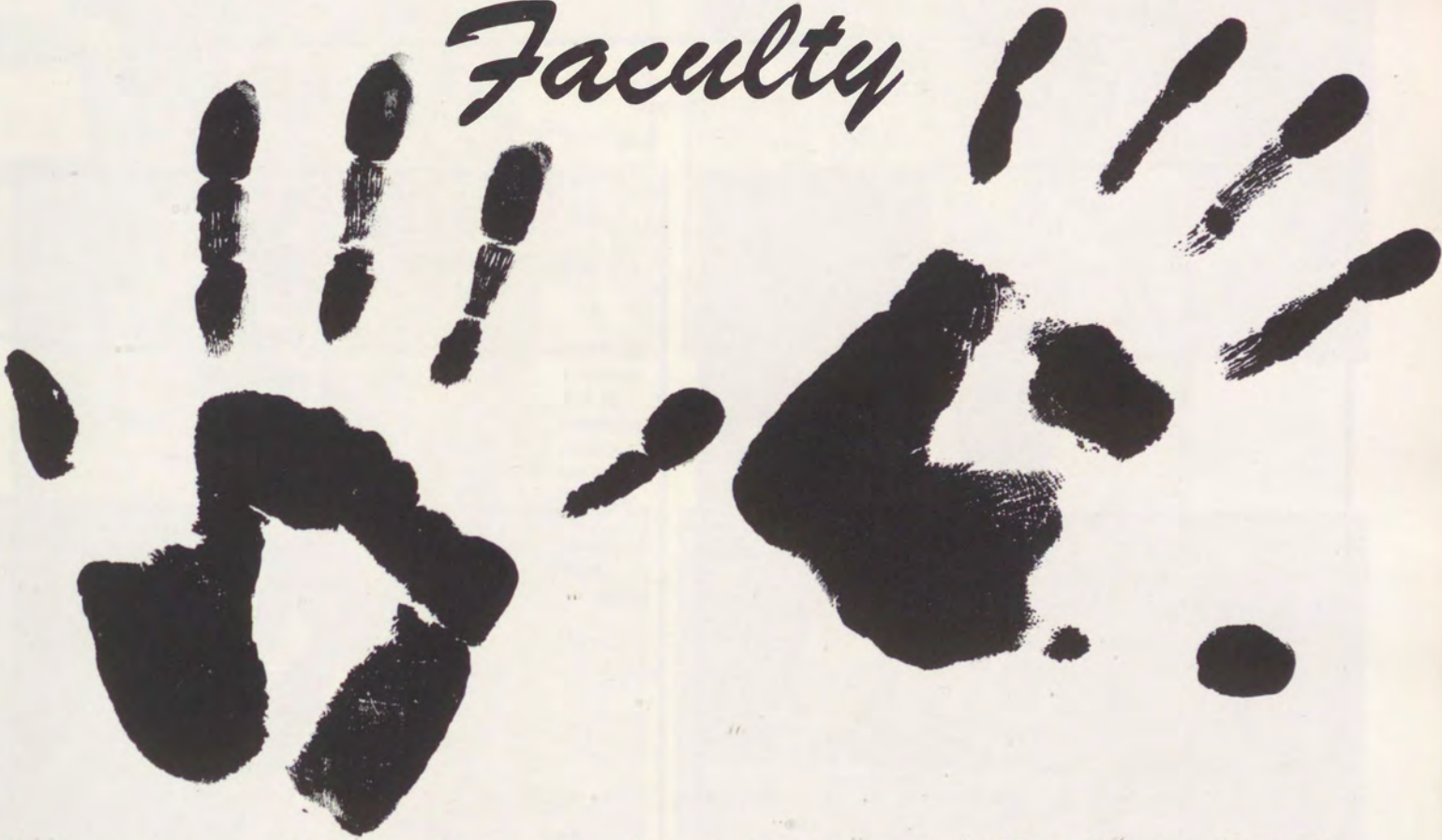
