MR. BUSSIERE, MR. VANIDESTINE AND MR. NICKERSON: Thank you for your time in answering our many questions and solving our problems.

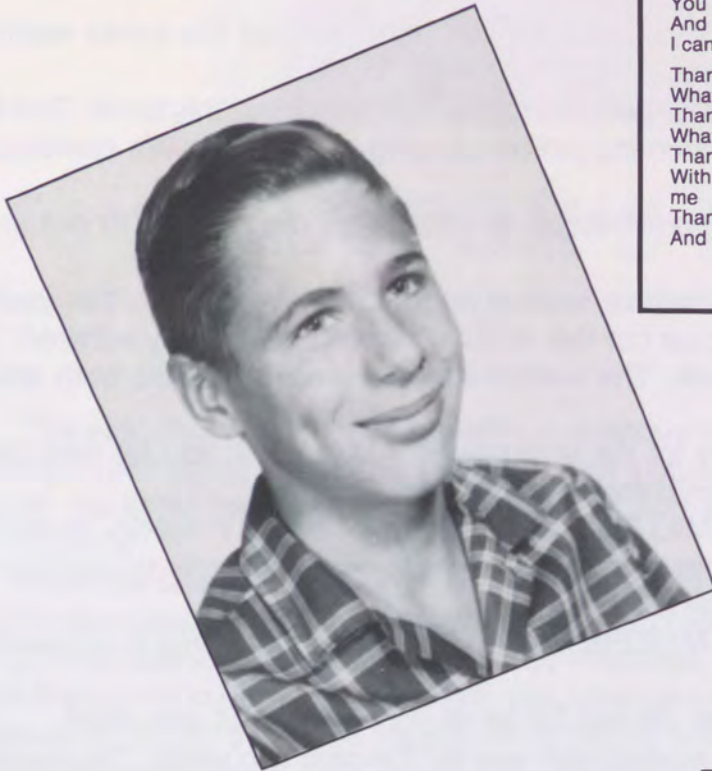

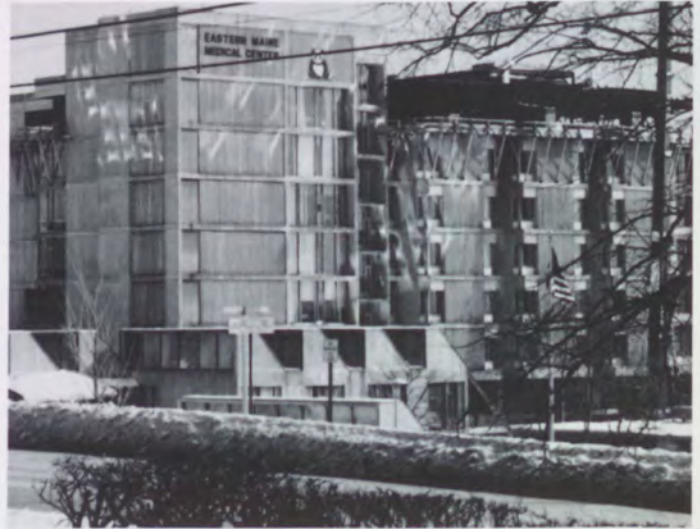

ONE HUNDRED YEARS OF BANGOR



This first City Hall, established in 1812, was located on Exchange Street. Its function was that of a court house and congregational meeting place. In the mid 1800's the City Hall was moved to a remodeled building on Columbia Street where it remained until 1893. Between 1893 and current day, one other building housed City Hall.



The Eastern Maine Medical Center was established in 1892 in a house. Originally referred to as The Eastern Maine General Hospital, a name change in 1969 left us with the present day EMMC. The hospital was first expanded in 1899 and has been growing ever since.



On Sunday, April 30, 1911, a fire broke out in J. Frank Green's hay shed. The wind carried sparks from the shed on Broad St. across the stream to Exchange St., and the fire spread from there. Special trains were needed in order to carry fire fighting equipment to Bangor from around the state. The flames could reportedly be seen from Bar Harbor. In twelve hours the fire caused three million dollars damage, including Bangor High School, the Post Office, the Bangor Public Library, and many other municipal buildings. Miraculously, the death toll consisted of only two local men.



This photograph depicts the dependence of Bangor shipping on the lumber industry. The location of the city in regard to key waterways established the city as an important link in providing lumber for a newly founded nation.





Westmarket Square, once referred to as Robinson's Corner, was as well-known one hundred years ago as it is today. It currently houses the ever popular Grasshopper Shop and attracts shoppers of all walks of life. In its day, the Square was Bangor's largest commercial district. It stands today as one of the most historical sites in the city.



This Victorian house, located on West Broadway, may not look familiar in this photo. However, this is how it looked when it was first built earlier this century. Today, the house is easily recognized as the home of author Stephen King.



King moved to Bangor in the late 1970's and remodeled the house. It remains one of the city's popular attractions for tourists who wish to view the abode of a national bestselling writer.



The Opera House, a historical building, remains in its original location. The original building was destroyed in the fire of 1911, and the current building was constructed in its place. Though the Opera House is no longer in operation, it brought popularity of vaudeville as a source of entertainment to Bangor. Later it served as a movie house where first silent, then speaking films were shown.





Today, Bangor High School is located on Outer Broadway. Each year, there are about 1100 students attending school. Bangor High School is now the third largest high school in the state. Students are given a first class education while also the opportunity to participate in the numerous extra-curricular activities.



Bangor High was first located in Abbott Square. It was a wooden framed building with separate quarters for boys classes and girls classes. The girls classrooms were located on the ground floor, the boys on the upper floors until classes were combined in 1864. The building was expanded twice before it burned down in the Great Fire. All that remains today of the old school is the parking lot across from the Bangor Public Library.



The Harlow Street building became the second home of Bangor High School after the original building was destroyed in the Great Fire. The building, composed of brick, was constructed in 1912. It is likely that inflammable building materials were chosen to prevent another catastrophic fire. Today the building houses apartments and an athletic club.



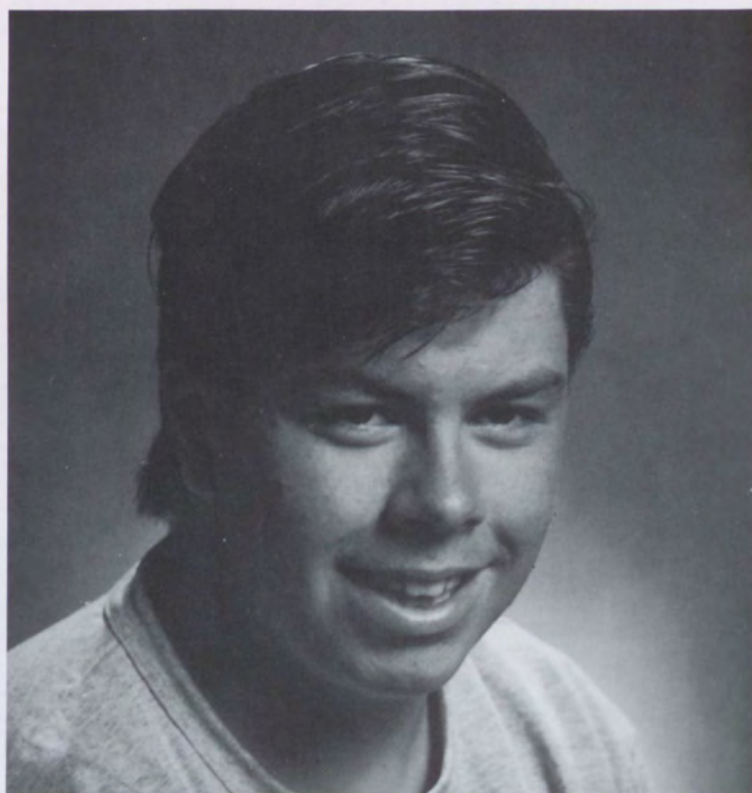
