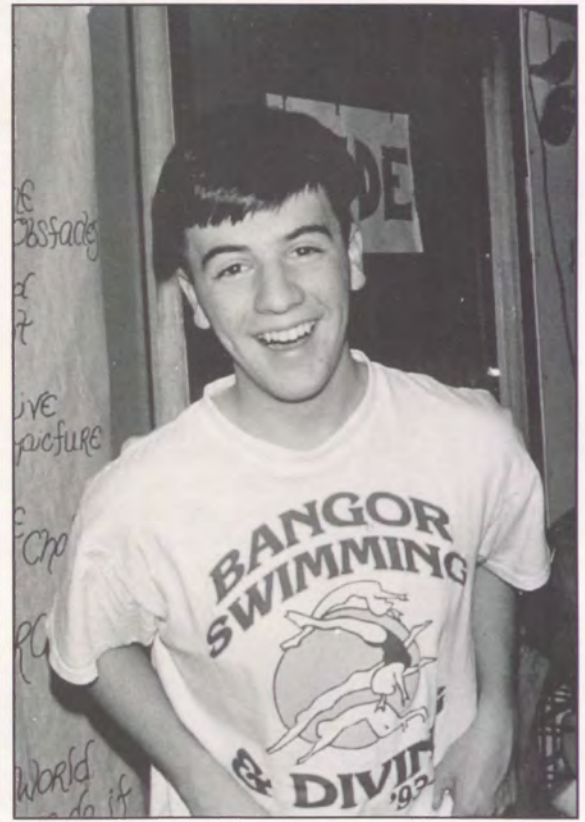
# INDOOR TRACK
