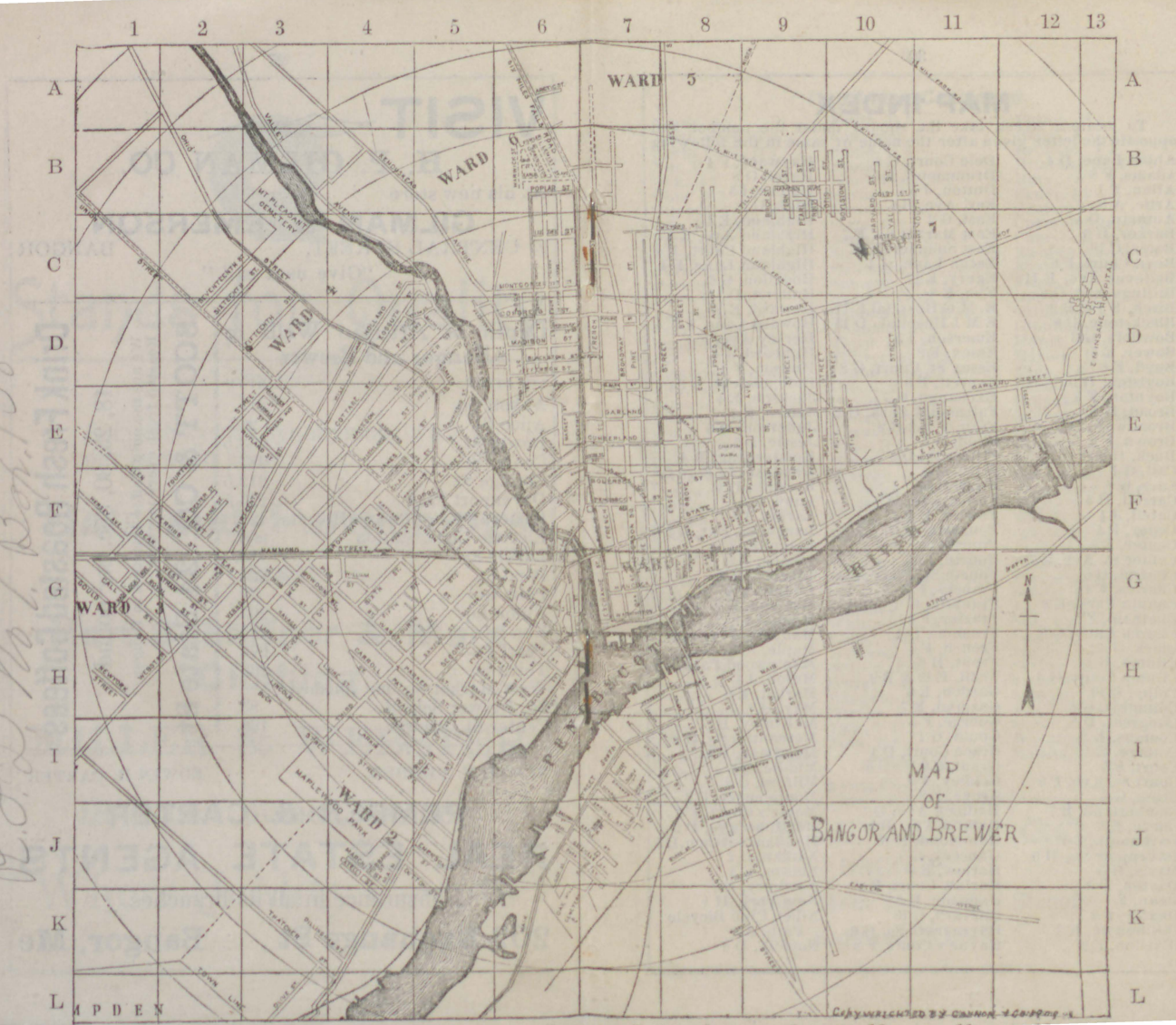

## RATES OF POSTAGE

**First Class:**—On letters and other written matter and on all sealed matter, two cents per ounce or fraction thereof, and on all city letters. Limit of weight four lbs. (Including Canada, Mexico, Great Britain, Ireland, Germany, Newfoundland, Phillipines, Cuba and Porto Rico)

**Second Class:**—On newspapers and periodicals published at stated intervals, one cent for each four ounces or fraction.

**Third Class:**—Books, circulars and other matter wholly in print, one cent for each two ounces. Limit of weight four pounds except on a single volume.

**Fourth Class:**—Merchandise and all matter not embraced in the above classes, one cent for each ounce or fraction.

**Foreign:**—Letters five cents first ounce, three cents each additional ounce. Newspapers one cent for each two ounces. Books the same. Merchandise rates, apply at the P. O.

Registration fee on letters and other articles is ten cents in addition to regular postage.

The immediate delivery of any piece of mail matter (including registered matter) at any United States postoffice may be affected by affixing thereto a ten cent special delivery stamp or ten cents in ordinary postage stamps in addition to the lawful postage and endorsed across the face of the envelope for Special Delivery.

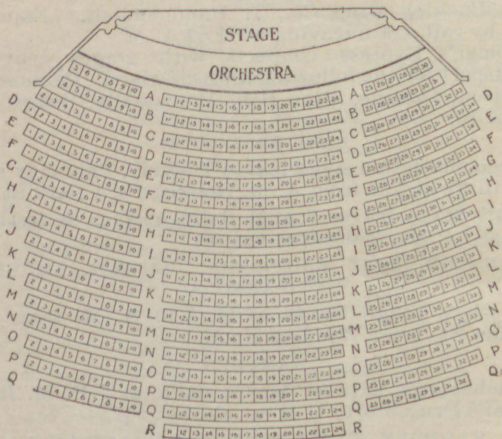

One stroke of the bell when the department is in service is signal that more hose is wanted.

## INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING FIRE

Alarms to be given from the nearest location of the fire.

Do not give an alarm for a fire seen at a distance.

To give an alarm open the door, pull the hook and let go.

After giving an alarm be sure to close door of box and remain or leave some one to direct the firemen to the fire and see that no one interferes with the box.

Do not pull the hook a second time or allow any one but an officer to do so.

Never open a box except to give an alarm.

The locks are trap locks, and you cannot take out the key until the arrival of a Fire Engineer with a master key.
