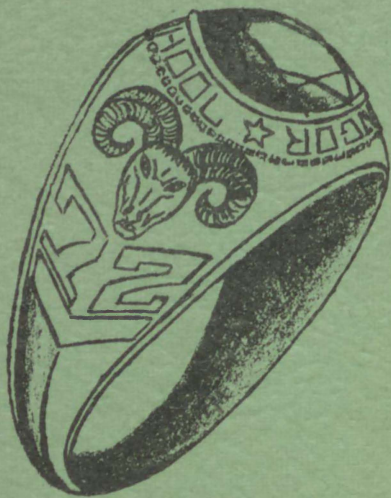

Wearing of Caps and Gowns

Caps and gowns are worn during both Baccalaureate and Graduation exercises. The following are some helpful hints to the proper and most comfortable ways to wear them:

1. Caps should be placed on the head so that the mortarboard is level. The front of the cap is indicated inside the crown. Boys remove their caps during the Baccalaureate Services and also during the Invocation and Benediction at Commencement. Girls do not remove their caps during either exercise at any time.

2. The tassel is worn over the left temple. It will be shifted to the right on the signal from the class president at the end of the Graduation exercises.

3. Collars of gowns should be hooked on the back of the yoke and fastened on each side in front with a small safety pin which comes in each envelope.

4. It is most practical for girls to wear lightweight dresses without high necklines. Since the girls' gowns are white, it is preferable that dresses be light colored.

5. Boys do not have to wear coats under their gowns. A white shirt and dark tie are suggested, but bow ties are not worn.
