

HISTORY OF THE 134th FIELD ARTILLERY



CREST: That for regiments of Ohio National Guard.

WREATH: or and gules.

MOTTO: Fides et audax (Faithful and bold).

DESCRIPTION: The shield is red for artillery. The saltire represents Civil War service, and is blue to indicate that the service was with Union Forces. The three alerions are taken from the arms of Lorraine to denote the World War service in that department.

The 134th Field Artillery traces its origin back to July 6, 1839, at Cleveland, Ohio, with the organization of a gun section in the Cleveland Grays, a unit of the Ohio National Guard. In 1845, this section was redesignated the Cleveland Light Artillery, and in 1860 was expanded into a regiment and designated the First Regiment of Light Artillery, Ohio Volunteer Militia. One week after Fort Sumter was fired upon, this regiment was mustered into Federal service for ninety days as the First Regiment Light Artillery, Ohio Volunteers. On July 27, 1861 it was mustered out of service, only to be reorganized and again mustered into Federal service on August 6, 1861, and from that time on was in the active service of the Union forces, and due to the fact its various units were scattered among the different theatres of action, it saw service in the majority of the battles of the Civil War, and today from its standard float streamers attesting of its service at Shiloh, Valley, Manassas, Fredericksburg, Murfreesborough, Chancellorsville, Gettysburg, Vicksburg, Chickamauga, Chattanooga, Atlanta, Franklin, Nashville, Kentucky 1862, Tennessee 1862, 1863, 1864, Georgia 1864, Mississippi 1862, and Virginia 1862.

After four years of faithful service to the Union, the regiment was mustered out on July 30, 1865. In 1872, it was reorganized as the Cleveland Light Artillery, Ohio Independent Militia, and in 1886 was expanded to eight batteries and designated the First Regiment, Light Artillery, Ohio National Guard. The regiment continued in state service until the outbreak of the Spanish-American War, at which several of the units were transferred to form cavalry and infantry units. This reduced the regiment to one battalion known as the First Battalion Ohio Volunteer Light Artillery.

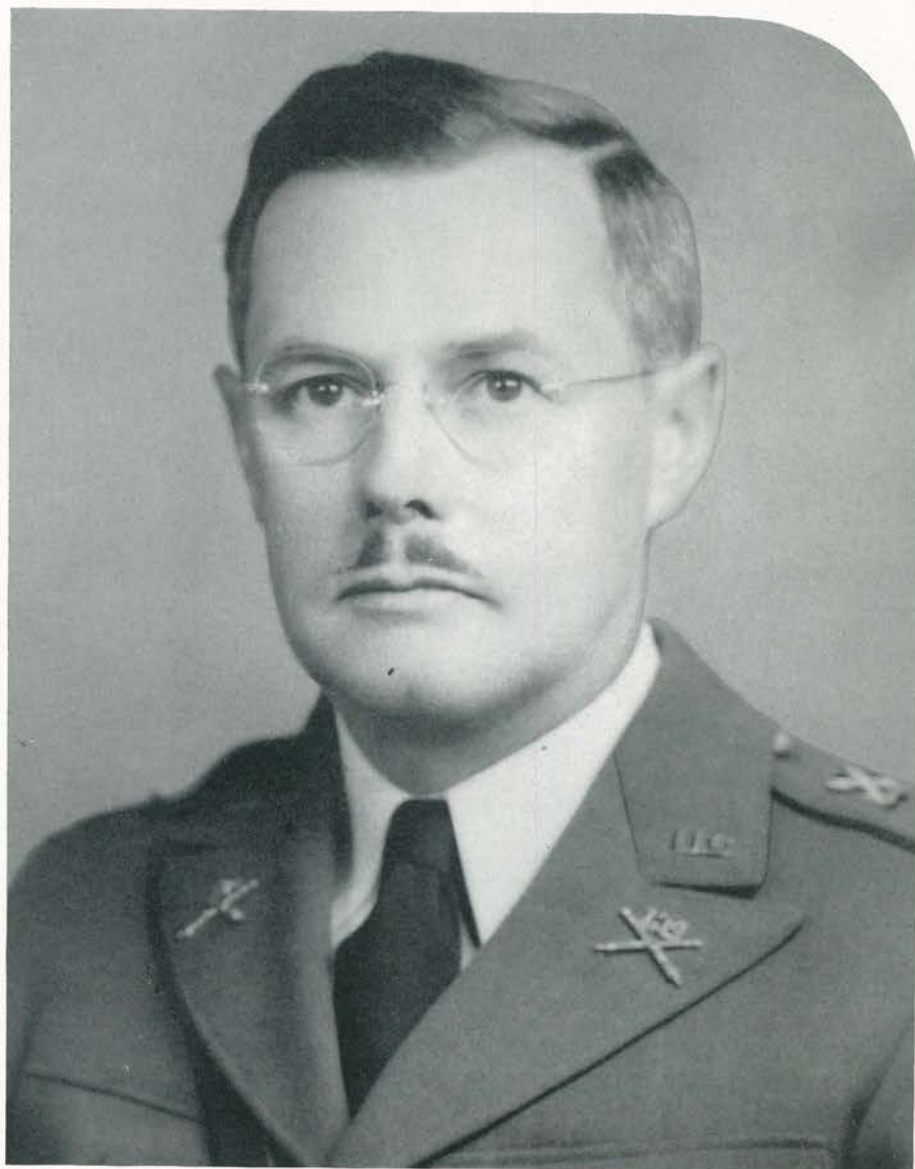
This battalion was mustered into Federal service on May 11, 1898, but saw no service outside the continental limits of the United States. In October, 1898, it was mustered out of Federal service and reverted to its former state status, receiving the batteries which had been taken away at the outbreak of the war.

On April 14, 1899, the regiment was disbanded, but Batteries A, B, C, D, E, F, and H continued to serve as unattached batteries of light artillery. On September 23, 1911, Batteries A, B, and C were designated the Battalion of Field Artillery, Ohio National Guard.

On July 11, 1916, this Battalion was again mustered into Federal service for service on the Mexican Border. On May 4, 1917, the Battalion was again expanded to a regiment and designated the First Field Artillery, Ohio National Guard, and in October of that year was sent to Camp Sheridan, Alabama, and was redesignated the 134th Field Artillery. After several months extensive training in the Southern camp it was sent overseas and saw service with the 28th and 92nd Divisions, being actively engaged when the war ended by the signing of the Armistice on November 11, 1918.

At Camp Sherman, Ohio, on April 9, 1919, the regiment was mustered out of Federal service, and in August of the same year was reorganized as the First Field Artillery, Ohio National Guard. In 1920, it was redesignated as the 134th Field Artillery. In 1935 it was changed from horse-drawn to motor drawn.

On October 15, 1940, the regiment was again mustered into Federal service and on October 24th arrived at Camp Shelby, Mississippi, and since that time has been engaged in a period of intensive training that it may be able to perform, in a manner worthy of its tradition, all duties demanded of it.

HISTORY OF THE 135th FIELD ARTILLERY



DESCRIPTION: The shield is red for artillery. The saltire represents Civil War service, and is blue to indicate that the service was with the Union Forces. The three alerions are taken from the arms of Lorraine to denote the World War service in that department. The bordure is added as a mark of difference from the coat-of-arms of the 134th Field Artillery.

The 135th Field Artillery Regiment had its birth in what was known as the Cleveland Light Artillery. In 1839 a gun squad was formed within the Cleveland Grays, a military company of the early days. This was the beginning of what is now the full regiment, and the date to which the 135th Field Artillery traces its inception.

In 1845 the gun squad withdrew from the Grays, forming a separate organization known as the Cleveland Light Artillery.

During the period 1845 to 1860, the original battery in Cleveland had been the guiding spirit for an organization which was to gain the proportions of a regiment and to be known as "1st Regiment, Ohio Light Artillery."

Companies A, B, D and E, all from Cleveland, Company C from Brooklyn, which was then a separate city, and Company F of Geneva, Ohio, had been organized into a regiment and as of August 1st, 1860, designated as "1st Regiment of Light Artillery of Ohio Volunteer Militia." Later these units were redesignated "The 1st Regiment of Ohio Light Artillery, 3rd Brigade, 4th Division, Ohio Militia."

Upon its entrance into the Civil War, the regiment had its baptism of fire at Philippi, West Virginia, on June 3, 1861. Following the first 90 days service the regiment was reorganized on August 8, 1861, and twelve batteries were formed in rapid succession throughout the state, in addition to those already comprising the Cleveland Light Artillery.

The Ohio Artillery had now become a state-wide organization, and was completely reconstituted as the "First Regiment, Light Artillery, Ohio Volunteers" on February 3, 1862. A list of the principal engagements follows:

Shiloh, Manassas, Fredericksburg, Murfreesborough, Chancellorsville, Gettysburg, Chickamauga, Chattanooga, Nashville, Atlanta, as well as operations in Kentucky, Tennessee, Georgia, Mississippi and Virginia.

By 1872, the reorganized Cleveland Light Artillery was a part of the Ohio Independent Militia, and officially accepted by the State of Ohio under the Ohio Independent Militia law in May, 1873. Special Order No. 7, dated May 6, 1886, formed the First Regiment, Light Artillery, Ohio National Guard.

During this period of its existence the regiment assisted in such calls for state aid as Railway Riots of 1877; Cleveland Labor Riots of 1882; Cincinnati Floods and Riots of 1883; Cincinnati Riots of 1884; and also in Cincinnati in 1886 at the time of the further labor trouble there. The regiment also was in demand during the Zanesville Railroad Riot of 1887; Toledo Fire, 1894; Wheeling Greek Campaign, 1894; Akron Labor Riot, 1894; Washington Courthouse Riot, 1894; Mount Sterling "Industrial Army" trouble, 1894; Springfield Fire, 1894; and the Cleveland Street Railway Riot, 1899.

In 1898 certain units of the regiment were transferred to the Infantry and Cavalry. The remainder, designated "First Battalion OVLA," was called into Federal service on May 11, 1898, and mobilized for service in the Spanish War.

It had no foreign service during that war, getting no farther than Camp Bushnell, and in October was mustered out of Federal Service.

The battalion was called into the Federal service June 19, 1916. Mobilized at Camp Willis, Ohio, July 5, 1916, the battalion was mustered into Federal service on July 11, 1916, and after a brief training period left for Mexican Border duty on Labor Day, 1916.

Arriving on September 7th, the battalion served on the Mexican Border in the vicinity of Fort Bliss, Texas until March 12, 1917. Later at Fort Harrison, the battalion with added units was on May 4, 1917, designated the First Field Artillery, Ohio National Guard. On September 15, 1917, the First Field Artillery was redesignated the 134th Field Artillery, and assigned to the 62nd Field Artillery Brigade, 37th Division. The regiment found itself on October 10, 1918, occupying a portion of the Marbache sector in the Lorraine district.

While there, the regiment served as assigned artillery in support of the 92nd Division, in lieu of divisional artillery. The Command Post was located during this

COMMANDING THE 135th FIELD ARTILLERY

Colonel Robert D. Schmidt, commanding officer of the 135th Field Artillery, first entered the service of the United States as a candidate at the First Officers Training School at Ft. Benjamin Harrison, Indiana, on May 15, 1917. Forced to leave the school for hospitalization due to an injury, he completed the course on November 26, 1917, and was commissioned a 2nd Lieut. of Field Artillery on that date.

He was assigned to the 324th Field Artillery and served with that regiment in France for the duration of the War. On April 2nd, 1919, he was promoted to 1st Lieutenant and upon demobilization was discharged in that grade on June 5, 1919.

Upon the reorganization of the National Guard, Col. Schmidt enlisted as a private in the Cavalry on October 22, 1920, and on June 14, 1923, upon the organization of Battery B, 135th Field Artillery, was again commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant. On October 9, 1923, he was promoted to 1st Lieutenant, and on January 5, 1925, was promoted to Captain and assumed command of the battery.

On December 1, 1930, he was commissioned Major, having assumed command of the 1st Battalion of the Regiment, was promoted to Lt. Colonel on February 8, 1932, and upon the death of Col. Shem assumed command of the Regiment, being promoted to Colonel, Field Artillery, November 15, 1937.

He again entered Federal Service when the Regiment was inducted on October 15, 1940.

Col. Schmidt is a graduate of Case School of Applied Science, Class of 1916.

HISTORY OF THE 136th FIELD ARTILLERY

The 136th Field Artillery was originally formed in 1917 by redesignating Troops B and C of the 1st Ohio Cavalry as 3rd Ohio Field Artillery. Units were organized in Columbus, Cincinnati, and Youngstown. Colonel P. Lincoln Mitchell was given command of the Regiment and following a short training period at home station the Regiment was mobilized at Camp Sheridan, Montgomery, Alabama, where it underwent nine months of intensive training. During this time, the Regiment was redesignated as the 136th Field Artillery and assigned to the 62nd Field Artillery Brigade, a part of the 37th Division.

In June of 1918 the Regiment was prepared for overseas service and transferred to Camp Upton, New York, at which point it was split into two contingents, one sailing out of Baltimore, Maryland and the other out of Montreal, Canada. These contingents were assembled as a part of a convoy at Halifax and sailed for England on July 4, 1918. Two days off the English coast the convoy was attacked by hostile submarine and one of the ships on which a portion of the Regiment was being transported suffered slight damage.

After a few days in England the Regiment was transferred to France and at Camp DeSouge, near Bordeaux, the finishing touches of the Regiment's training for active service were applied and in September the Regiment was ordered to the front where it saw service in the Marbache, St. Mihiel, Argonne, and Meuse Argonne sectors. Following the signing of the Armistice the Regiment was billeted in northeastern France. In February the Regiment was transferred to an embarkation area adjacent to LeMans, France, and in March the Regiment proceeded to Brest and was transported to the United States aboard the U. S. S. Connecticut, landing at Newport News, Virginia.

Following a short stay at Camp Stuart, Virginia, the Regiment toured through Ohio, parading at Youngstown, Cincinnati, and Columbus and was demobilized on April 10, 1919, at Camp Sherman, Ohio.

The 136th Field Artillery, Ohio National Guard was reorganized in the fall of 1936 by Colonel Leo M. Kreber (now Brig. General, 62nd Field Artillery Brigade), with organizations at Dayton, Columbus, Circleville, Wapakoneta, Cambridge, Caldwell, Dover, Sandusky, and Fostoria.

In the spring of 1937 the Sandusky and Fostoria Batteries were transferred to the 135th Field Artillery for their veteran Batteries located at Piqua and Lima. Subsequent to organization the Regiment trained yearly at Camp Perry, Ohio, Ft. Knox, Kentucky, and Warrens, Wisconsin.

On October 14, 1940, the Regimental Commander, Col. Leo M. Kreber, was transferred to command of the 62nd Field Artillery Brigade and command of the Regiment was given to Lt. Col. Kenneth Cooper, Executive Officer, 135th Field Artillery. On October 15, 1940, the Regiment was inducted into federal service at home station, arriving at Camp Shelby, Mississippi, on October 26. The time to date has been spent in intensive field training and a reorganization of the Regiment from a three battalion status to a two battalion status with the addition of Antitank Batteries and Battalion Service Batteries and the reception and training of such selectees to bring the organization to prescribed strength.

HISTORY OF THE 112th ENGINEERS (COMBAT)



CREST: That for regiments of Ohio National Guard.

WREATH: Argent and sable.

MOTTO: Bello Ac Pace Paratus (Prepared in Peace and in War.)

DESCRIPTION: The field is from the arms of Gen. Moses Cleveland, founder of the city of Cleveland, and the Captain of a company of Sappers and Miners in 1779. The three billets represent the pillars set in the roads to Montfaucon which were blown out by this regiment. The lion of Belgium is a reminder of the service in that country under King Albert.

The 112th Engineer Regiment, United States National Guard, traces its origin to 1837, when a military company known as the "City Guards" was organized in Cleveland. From that time to the present, the 112th Engineers Regiment has been variously designated as: Cleveland Grays; First Company, First Regiment, O. V. I.; Company A, First O. V. I.; The Battalion of Engineers, Ohio National Guard; Companies A, B, C, and D, Eleventh Provisional Engineers, U. S. A.; First Ohio Engineers; 112th Engineers, Ohio National Guard; 112th Engineers, U. S. National Guard (Combat).

One of the most glorious pages in the history of this organization is its record made in the Civil War. Battle honors of the Regiment won in the War of the Rebellion are Bull Run, Shiloh, Murfreesborough, Chickamauga, Atlanta, Kentucky, 1862, and Tennessee, 1863-64. At the close of the war the returning Grays, together with those members who had remained in Cleveland, carried on an independent military company.

In April, 1865, during the obsequies of President Lincoln, the Grays had the signal honor of acting as honor guard in the funeral procession. On March 2, 1881, the Grays visited Washington to act as escort to President Hayes and General Garfield from the White House to the inaugural ceremonies. Six months later the organization was selected to act as a guard at the funeral of President Garfield. The Grays again visited Washington on March 4, 1889, to attend the inauguration of Benjamin Harrison.

At the outbreak of the War with Spain, the United States Government adopted the policy of accepting for service only those organizations already a part of the organized militia. After some rearranging of military provisions, the Grays were admitted to the service as a Battalion of Engineers, of the Tenth Ohio Volunteer Infantry. The outfit was never given the opportunity of serving outside the continental limits of the United States, and was mustered out of service March 23, 1899.

The street railway strike of 1899 made it necessary for the Battalion of Engineers to be called out in answer to the state's call, notwithstanding the fact that no arms or equipment had been furnished by the state. Materials were soon obtained, however, and the men were ready for any duty. After this tour of active duty the work of reorganization was taken up where it had been dropped. The civil and social side of the Gray's organization had been carried on by the old members and men who did not enter the United States service, and after the return of the Battalion from its winter camp in Georgia in 1898, the two came together once more in order that the original purpose of the organization might be carried out.

On May 26, 1902, the "Scots Guards" of Cleveland, a famous and splendidly organized independent company, came into the Battalion as Company D. For the funeral of President McKinley the entire Ohio National Guard was assembled at Canton. The Engineers arrived early to lay out the camp site for the troops and provide necessary facilities.

In 1913 the Regiment rendered valuable service during the Dayton flood.

In the spring of 1916, strained relations with the government of Mexico necessitated calling out of the National Guard, and the Battalion of Ohio Engineers prepared for service. The companies were recruited to war strength and intensive training started. The four Ohio Engineer Companies were combined with those of Michigan and South Carolina to form the Eleventh Provisional Engineer Regiment. The work of the Regiment on the border consisted mainly of guard duty and further training.

In March, 1918, orders were received to entrain for Fort Sheridan, Ill., for muster out, but before this could be accomplished war was declared with Germany and it was necessary to retain the troops in Federal service. The Battalion of Engineers was expanded to form the First Regiment of Engineers, Ohio National Guard. Col. John R. McQuigg was in command, with Lieut. Col. Fred M. Fanning second in command. The Regiment had its preliminary training at Camp Sheridan and in Montgomery.

HISTORY OF THE

112th QUARTERMASTER REGIMENT



CREST: That for regiments of Ohio National Guard.
 MOTTO: Servitudo Pro Acie (Service for the Line).
 DESCRIPTION: The shield is buff and blue, the colors used by the Quartermaster Company and the three fleurs-de-lis represent the engagements in the World War.

The 112th Quartermaster Regiment, Ohio National Guard, was organized in 1917 as the 112th Supply Train, Thirty-seventh Division. The 112th Supply Train served overseas during the World War and participated in operations of Meuse-Argonne, Ypres-Lys and Lorraine. It returned to the United States and was demobilized in April, 1919.

The Regiment was reorganized as the Thirty-seventh Division Quartermaster Train, Ohio National Guard, November 14, 1921, and redesignated the 112th Quartermaster Regiment April 1, 1936.

Headquarters was originally organized November 14, 1921, as Quartermaster Section, Headquarters Thirty-seventh Division; it was redesignated Headquarters, 112th Quartermaster Regiment, May 15, 1936.

Headquarters Company was organized November 14, 1921, as Headquarters Detachment, Thirty-seventh Division Quartermaster Train, which on May 15, 1936 was redesignated Headquarters Company, 112th Quartermaster Regiment.

Medical Department Detachment was organized May 3, 1922 as Medical Department Detachment, Thirty-seventh Division Quartermaster Train, and on May 15, 1936, redesignated Medical Department Detachment, 112th Quartermaster Regiment.

Company A was organized November 17, 1919, as Company C, Third Infantry, Ohio National Guard, redesignated Company C, Second Infantry, March 1, 1921; redesignated Second Separate Company, Infantry, May 1, 1921; redesignated Company G, 148th Infantry, July 1, 1921. On May 13, 1936, Company G, 148th Infantry was converted to the 123rd Wagon Company, Thirty-seventh Division Quartermaster Train, which latter unit, on May 15, 1936, was redesignated Company A, 112th Quartermaster Regiment.

Company B was organized July 3, 1928, as Headquarters Company, Second Battalion, 147th Infantry, which, on April 1, 1936, was converted to the 124th Wagon Company. On May 15, 1936, it was redesignated Converted Company B, 112th Quartermaster Regiment.

Company C was organized May 12, 1921, as the 145th Motor Transport Company, Thirty-seventh Division Quartermaster Train, being redesignated on May 15, 1936, Company C, 112th Quartermaster Regiment.

Company D was organized September 20, 1921, as the 147th Motor Transport Company, Thirty-seventh Division Quartermaster Regiment Train, the latter unit on May 15, 1936, being redesignated Company D, 112th Quartermaster Regiment.

Company E was organized September 23, 1921, as the 123rd Motor Repair Section, Thirty-seventh Division Quartermaster Train, which, on May 15, 1936, was redesignated Company E, 112th Quartermaster Regiment.

Company F was organized December 27, 1935, as the Twelfth Motorcycle Company, Special Troops, Thirty-seventh Division. On May 15, 1936, it was redesignated Company F, 112th Quartermaster Regiment.

Service Company was organized August 1, 1940, just prior to the famed Wisconsin maneuvers, with Captain Glenn Williams in command.

First Battalion Headquarters was organized on May 15, 1936.

Headquarters, Second Battalion was organized May 15, 1936, at Fremont, Ohio. On January 11, 1941, Headquarters Detachment, Second Battalion, was organized.

The Third Battalion was organized on May 15, 1936, with Major George R. Walters in command.

The 112th Quartermaster Regiment under the command of Colonel Stanley Wolfe was inducted into Federal Service October 15, 1940, by authority contained in Presidential Order number 8551, dated September 25, 1940.

Colonel Stanley Wolfe was born in Sandusky County, Ohio, August 22, 1893. He attended the public schools in Fremont, Ohio. In 1912 he graduated from Fremont High School and in 1913 he entered Kenyon College at Gambier, Ohio.

Colonel Wolfe has had a long and brilliant military career. He enlisted in Company K, Sixth Ohio Infantry in April, 1914. In June, 1915, he had elevated himself to the rank of Second Lieutenant, and one year later changed the gold bar for a silver one. In September, 1917, he was sent to Montgomery, Alabama, to train for service overseas. The Sixth Ohio Infantry was changed to the 147th Infantry at Montgomery, and the Colonel was transferred from Company K to the command of the Supply Company. Throughout the entire war he served as Supply Officer for the 147th Infantry Regiment under Colonel Frederick W. Galbraith.

On June 16, 1918, the 147th sailed for France. Until September, 1918, the Colonel was stationed in the Baccarat Sector. From September 26th to October 1st, the 147th was engaged in the Battle of the Argonne Forest, and it was during this battle near Ivory that Colonel Wolfe was wounded in the left arm.

On September 23, 1918, First Lieutenant Wolfe became Captain Wolfe. From October 7 to October 13, he served in the Metz Sector. The Colonel's outfit was engaged in the Belgian Drive of November first to fourth, and the last drive, which began on November 10th and lasted until the Armistice.

In May, 1919, Colonel Wolfe returned to the United States, after having been sent all over Belgium and France. On May 29, 1919, he was discharged from the Army. When the 148th Infantry was organized in 1921, he rejoined the service as Supply Officer for this Regiment. Here he served until January, 1930.

On January 1, 1930, Captain Wolfe became a Major, and was placed on the State Staff of the 37th Division. When the 112th Quartermaster Regiment was organized on May 15, 1936, he was transferred to this organization in command of the Second Battalion. On August 1, 1940, he became Lieutenant Colonel Stanley Wolfe, and on February 25, 1941, he was promoted to Colonel.

For distinguished service during the War, the Colonel was awarded the Purple Heart, and for feeding the troops of the 37th Division under fire in the Argonne Forest, he was awarded the French War Cross.

HISTORY OF THE 112th MEDICAL REGIMENT



SHIELD: Per chevron reversed sanguine and argent, in chief the skull and horns of a Texas Longhorn steer of the second, in base a conventionalized poppy and a fleur-de-lis of the first.

WREATH: Argent and sanguine.

DESCRIPTION: The shield is maroon and white. The M. D. colors. The skull and horns of the Texas Longhorn steer represent service on the Mexican border, and the poppy and the fleur-de-lis symbolize service in Flanders and in France, respectively, during the World War.

MOTTO: Auxilium semper adest (Help always ready.)

In 1903, medical units, or as they were called, "companies of instruction," were formed in Zanesville, Columbus, Cleveland, Cincinnati, Dayton, Toledo and Findlay. The formation of these medical units really was the beginning of the present organization known as the 112th Medical Regiment.

Many and varied changes as to location, designation and organization have occurred through the years: companies of instruction to hospital or ambulance company sections—to ambulance and field hospital companies, to 112th Sanitary Train, and now companies grouped together in one regiment. The present 112th Medical Regiment consists of a Headquarters and Band, Headquarters and Service Company, 3 collecting companies, 3 ambulance companies and 3 clearing (Hospital) companies.

The 112th Medical Regiment, under different designations, has seen service on the Mexican border in 1914, and the World War in 1917, besides rendering assistance in numerous floods and storms.

This Regiment entered the World War in 1917 under the designation of 112th Sanitary Train under the command of Lieut. Col. John C. Darby. Participation was had in the Meuse-Argonne offensive and Ypres-Lys offensive to the Baccarat Sector and St. Mihiel Sector, entitling the regiment to carry two streamers attached to their Regimental Colors.

During the year 1920, and 1921, reorganization of the Medical units of the Ohio National Guard was in progress. In 1921, authority was granted for the organization of a new unit to be designated as the 112th Medical Regiment.

Ambulance Company No. 1 at Columbus was mustered into service on February 25, 1921; Sanitary Company No. 134 at Ashland on April 19th; Regimental Headquarters at Columbus on April 25th; Hospital Company No. 1 at Barberton on March 18th, which on July 1st was redesignated 134th Hospital Company; the 112th Veterinary Company at Westerville on May 17th; Ambulance Company 134 (horse drawn) also at Westerville on May 14th.

The first Field and Staff (Regimental Headquarters) was composed of Col. Harry H. Snively, Commanding Officer; Lieut. Col. Harry D. Jackson, Executive Officer; Maj. Howard E. Boucher, Plans and Training Officer; Capt. F. M. Stanton, Adjutant; Maj. Harry W. Brown, Division Veterinarian; Lieut. Frederick Kirker, Chaplain.

In 1931, the Regiment suffered the loss of Col. Harry H. Snively, who was succeeded by Col. Harry D. Jackson.

The Regiment was ordered into Federal Service by Executive Order 8551 on October 15, 1941, and reported at Camp Shelby, Mississippi, on October 21st, for a year's field training.

Captain, Medical Corps, February 11, 1918 and Major, Medical Corps, March 18, 1918. Sectors: Luneville, Baccarat, Suippes, Essey-Pannes. Major Engagements: Champagne-Marne, Aisne-Marne, St. Mihiel, Argonne.

Discharged June 6, 1919. Decoration: Silver Star.

In reorganization of National Guard after the war, was commissioned Lieutenant Colonel and served as Executive Officer of the 112th Medical Regiment until the death of Colonel Harry H. Snively, when he was commissioned Colonel, Medical Corps, August 3, 1931, and placed in command of the 112th Medical Regiment.

Baccarat Sector, the 145th Infantry, with the rest of the 37th Division, moved to the U. S. 1st Army Area, taking station at Recicourt (Meuse) on September 21, 1918, attached to the U. S. 5th Corps. The 37th Division took over the Avocourt Sector on September 23, 1918, from the 79th Division and served there until that Sector was merged into the Meuse-Argonne offensive on September 26th. While the 37th Division was in the Montfaucon-Avocourt Sector, the 145th Infantry was the division reserve. When the Meuse-Argonne offensive commenced, the 145th Infantry was in the front line with the 37th Division and served in that operation until the division was relieved on October 1, 1918, returning to the vicinity of Recicourt (Meuse) and remaining in the U. S. 5th Corps Area until October 3, 1918. On the latter date the 145th Infantry, with the 37th Division, moved to the U. S. 2nd Army Area and was attached to the U. S. 4th Corps. On October 7, 1918, the 145th Infantry relieved an infantry regiment of the 89th Division in the front line trenches in the Pannes Sector and remained in the front line until relieved by a regiment of the 28th Division on October 16, 1918. The 145th Infantry moved on October 18, 1918, to the Ypres (Belgium) Area, arriving October 21, and with the 37th Division was attached to the Army of France in Belgium, being assigned to the French 30th Corps on October 28, 1918. The regiment served with this French Corps until November 7, when it was assigned to the French 34th Corps with which it served in the Ypres-Lys offensive until the armistice. Upon return to the United States, the 145th Infantry was demobilized at Camp Sherman, Ohio, on April 22, 1919.

The 145th Infantry is entitled to bear on its colors battle streamers in the color of the victory ribbon with the following inscriptions: Lorraine, Meuse-Argonne, Ypres-Lys.

During 1919, several units of the Third Regiment of Infantry, Ohio National Guard, were organized; and on August 2, 1920, the Third Regiment of Infantry, O. N. G., was organized. On July 1, 1921, the Third Regiment of Infantry, O. N. G., was formally redesignated the 145th Infantry, O. N. G., and the State of Ohio announced that the regiment was organized to perpetuate the history of the Fifth Regiment of Infantry which served in the Spanish-American War as the Fifth Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry, reorganized after the Spanish-American War as the Fifth Regiment of Infantry, O. N. G., and which served during the World War as the 145th Regiment of Infantry, 37th Division, A. E. F.

Since the World War the 145th Infantry has been called out on emergency duty within the state upon the following occasions: Coal mines—S. E. Ohio, 1922; Lorain & Sandusky tornado, 1924; Niles riot, 1924; Cadiz, 1932; Toledo riots, 1934; Warren, 1937.

The regiment has an unusually competent Corps of officers and non-commissioned officers and maintains their high standards by Army extension courses and regimental schools. 28 of its officers are graduates of courses at the Infantry School at Fort Benning, Georgia, and 16 of the officers and several of the non-commissioned officers are veterans of the World War. Two of these officers, Lt. Colonels Cecil B. Whitcomb and Rudolph S. Ursprung were awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for gallantry in action.

Since its organization the regiment has been commanded by Colonels: Allan T. Brinsmade, 1877-1881; Emery W. Force, 1881-1882; Hosea E. Hill, 1883-1884; Fred H. Flick, 1884-1889; J. W. Gibbons, 1889-1893; Cortland L. Kennan, 1893-1899; Charles X. Zimmerman, 1899-1917; A. W. Davis, 1917; S. B. Stanbery, 1917-1918; Frank C. Gerlach, 1918-1919; Florence S. Van Gorder, 1919; Ludwig S. Connelly, 1920-1929; William L. Marlin, 1929-1937; and Luke P. Wolfford, 1937 to date.

Supply company. Four others, who are now in the 147th, saw service: Major Edward Heilman and Lieutenant Robert Walker, both of whom served with the 166th Infantry; Major Frank T. Balke in the Navy; and Captain William Burton with the Cavalry. No enlisted man remaining in the present 147th has an overseas record with the regiment.

Returning from Europe the 147th was demobilized at Camp Sherman, Ohio on April 19, 1919. By General Orders No. 3, A. G. of Ohio, May 15, 1919 authorization was promulgated for two provisional regiments of infantry

to perpetuate old State units which had served in the World War. On August 4, 1919, General Orders No. 12, A. G. of Ohio defined just what units, according to arm or service should be organized and it is recorded in Bulletin No. 2, A. G. of Ohio, June 30, 1922 that the first unit of the 1st Ohio Infantry so organized was Federally recognized and accepted as Company A, 1st Ohio Infantry, on November 13, 1919. On July 1, 1921, the 1st Ohio Infantry was renamed the 147th Infantry, Ohio National Guard, in order to carry on down through the corridors of military history and state lore the valiant and full service of the 147th Infantry in the World War.

Since the World War the 147th has not rested upon tradition or its battle record. Commendations and testimonials of its efficiency and training have been accorded the regiment by the War Department Authorities, and peace time service has demonstrated the invaluable service the organization has rendered. In the mining troubles of Eastern Ohio, in the floods at Lorain and Cincinnati, in the Columbus prison disaster, in the processing of Selective Service men, and at Reception Centers, the 147th Infantry has established an enviable record and a saga of heroic and brilliant service.

Summoned again to United States Service, the 147th Infantry is now stationed at Camp Shelby, Mississippi, having been inducted into such service on October 15, 1940. Under Colonel John A. Blount as Commanding Officer, the 147th is going forward to fulfill its motto: "Always Ready."

time at St. Genevieve. Considerable action was seen during this period and the regiment having suffered rather heavy casualties in men and animals during a continuous ten-day period, was withdrawn to a rest area. After seven days of recuperation during which time replacements were obtained the front was again its destination, this time to the vicinity of Vigneuilles, Pannes sector, in support of the 28th Division, where the regiment reinforced the artillery brigade of Brig. Gen. Donnelly. The signing of the Armistice on November 11, 1918, found the regiment still in support of the 28th Division.

In August, 1919, directly following the return from France, the First Field Artillery, Ohio National Guard, was reorganized as a full regiment. In 1920 the regiment was again re-designated the 134th Field Artillery and Batteries E and F and Service Battery, 134th F. A. were on July 1, 1921, designated as the 135th Field Artillery, to which further units were to be added to constitute the regiment. On February 1, 1922, regimental organization was completed.

Peace time service since World War I has seen the regiment in many capacities of mercy and assistance as well as honorary assignments. On June 29, 1924, various units arrived at Lorain, Ohio, to succor the victims of the great Lorain tornado, remaining for ten days. Honorary salutes have been rendered for the late Ambassador Myron T. Herrick; Colonel Charles A. Lindberg; former President Herbert Hoover and many other dignitaries, including high British and Canadian officials at Canadian-American Border Day celebrations. Valuable assistance was also rendered by certain units during the disastrous Ohio River floods of 1937.

Called into Federal Service again on October 15, 1940, the regiment moved to Camp Shelby, Miss., on October 21, arriving on the 25th after a five day overland march. Its full war strength compliment of men and officers was completed in February, 1941.

The regimental standard bears seventeen battle streamers dating from 1861 to 1918.

112th ENGINEERS (COMBAT) HISTORY

The Regiment, less Company F, landed at Brest, France, on July 5, 1918, and saw its first action in the Baccarat sector. After routine Engineer work in the Baccarat sector, the Regiment, under its new designation of 112th Engineers, was made ready for combat service. This duty was performed in the same excellent way as had been its work as a construction outfit, and the Regiment received many commendations for its service in France. It participated in the Meuse-Argonne and Ypres-Lys offensives and served in the Lorraine and San Mihiel sectors.

As a part of the movement to reorganize the National

Guard following the World War, Col. John McQuigg instituted recruiting for the Regiment of Engineers. The organization of the Regiment was completed with the muster of the Medical Detachment under Major Byron Colvin on April 1, 1920. The Regiment was designated First Engineers, Ohio National Guard, and upon the promotion of Colonel McQuigg, was put under command of Col. Andrew W. Lea.

The Regiment's outstanding services to the state since the World War include service following the Lorain tornado of 1924, and the Mahoning Valley steel strike of 1937. In both of these instances the Engineers performed their duty in an efficient and commendable manner. Col. D. F. Pancoast relieved Col. Elliott Whitlock in 1930 as Commanding Officer.

On October 15, 1940, the 112th Engineers were inducted into Federal Service by virtue of an Executive Order signed by President Franklin D. Roosevelt, September 25, 1940. After completing the physical examination of the officers and enlisted men, the Regiment entrained on October 19 at 11 P. M. and arrived at McLaurin, Mississippi, at 6:30 P. M. on October 21, 1940. The Regiment was now under the command of Col. A. E. Henderson. The following week, the Regiment began a thirteen week period of basic training. During this time, it was honored by being chosen to survey and design the new rifle range on the reservation and the new airport in Hattiesburg. On December 19, 1940, the Regiment moved from its tempo-

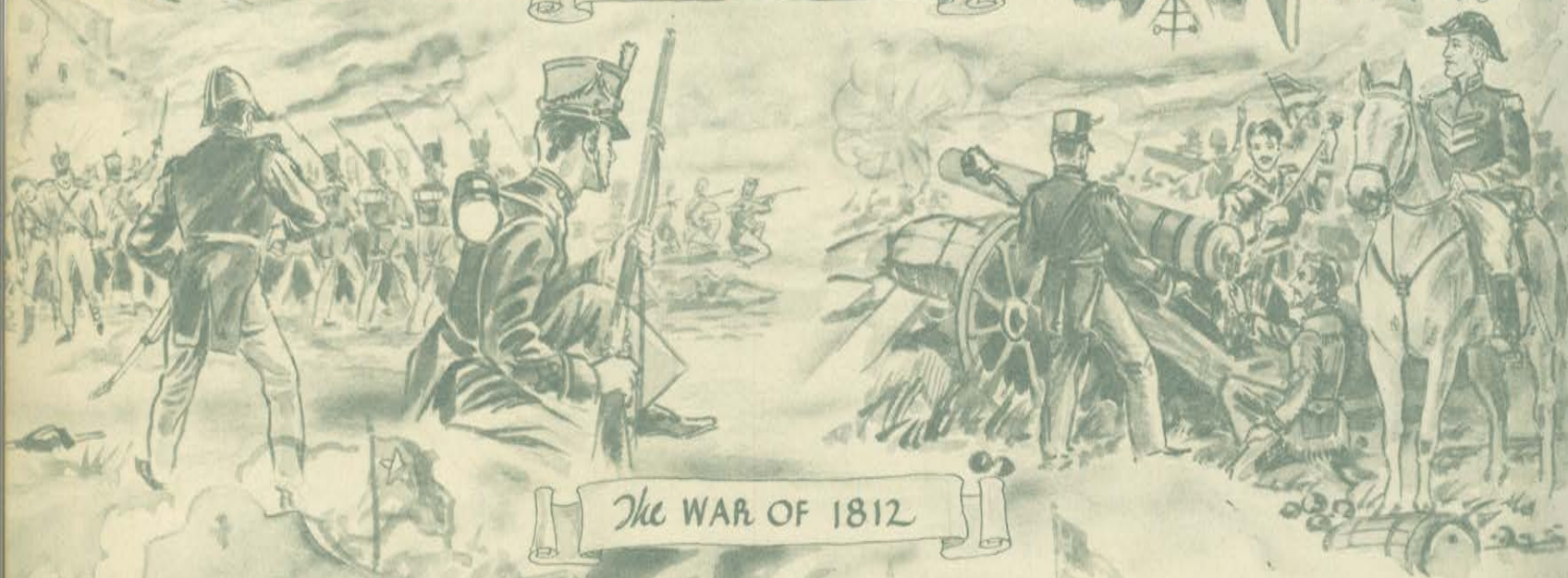
rary quarters to its permanent location in Area H, between 18th and 22nd streets on Highway No. 24. During the second week of January, 1941, the Regiment was the first to fire on the new range that they helped to construct. During the general inspection of the Division on January 17 and 18 the Regiment gave a satisfactory account of itself and Company B was publicly commended by General Beightler for an excellent demolitions demonstration.

The first contingent of selectees reached the Regiment on January 22, and the last group arrived on February 9, 1941. During the same period, promotions and additions were made in the officer personnel. Major Robert Stewart was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel, and was made Executive Officer, while Majors Walter Bishop and Eugene Kenny were given command of the 1st and 2nd Battalions, respectively. During March, the Regiment completed its mobilization program and favorably passed an inspection by General Beightler and his staff. On Army Day, April 7, the Regiment took part in the 37th Division revue. During the following week, platoons from the Engineers began taking part in the Infantry Combat Teams maneuvers. On Saturday, April 26, at 7:05 A. M., the Regiment received an alert and packed and marched out as though for extended service, but returned to its station before noon of the same day. At this time, the Regiment consisted of fifty-three officers and eight hundred and twenty-four enlisted men.





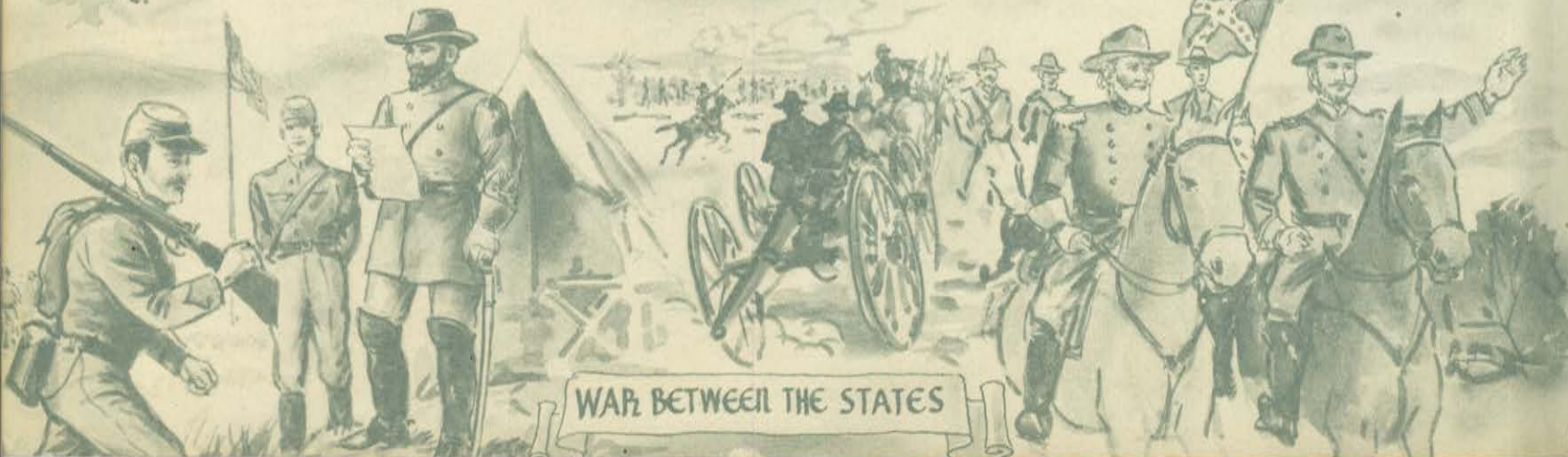
