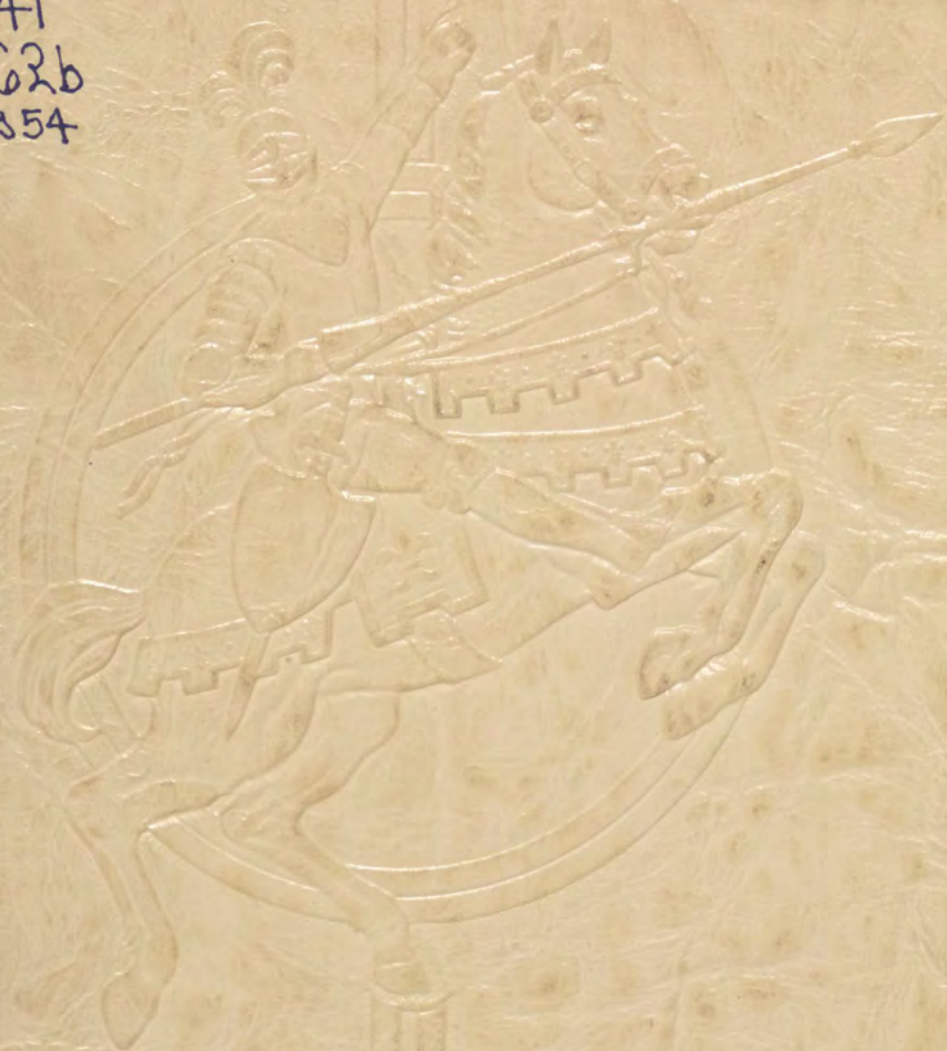

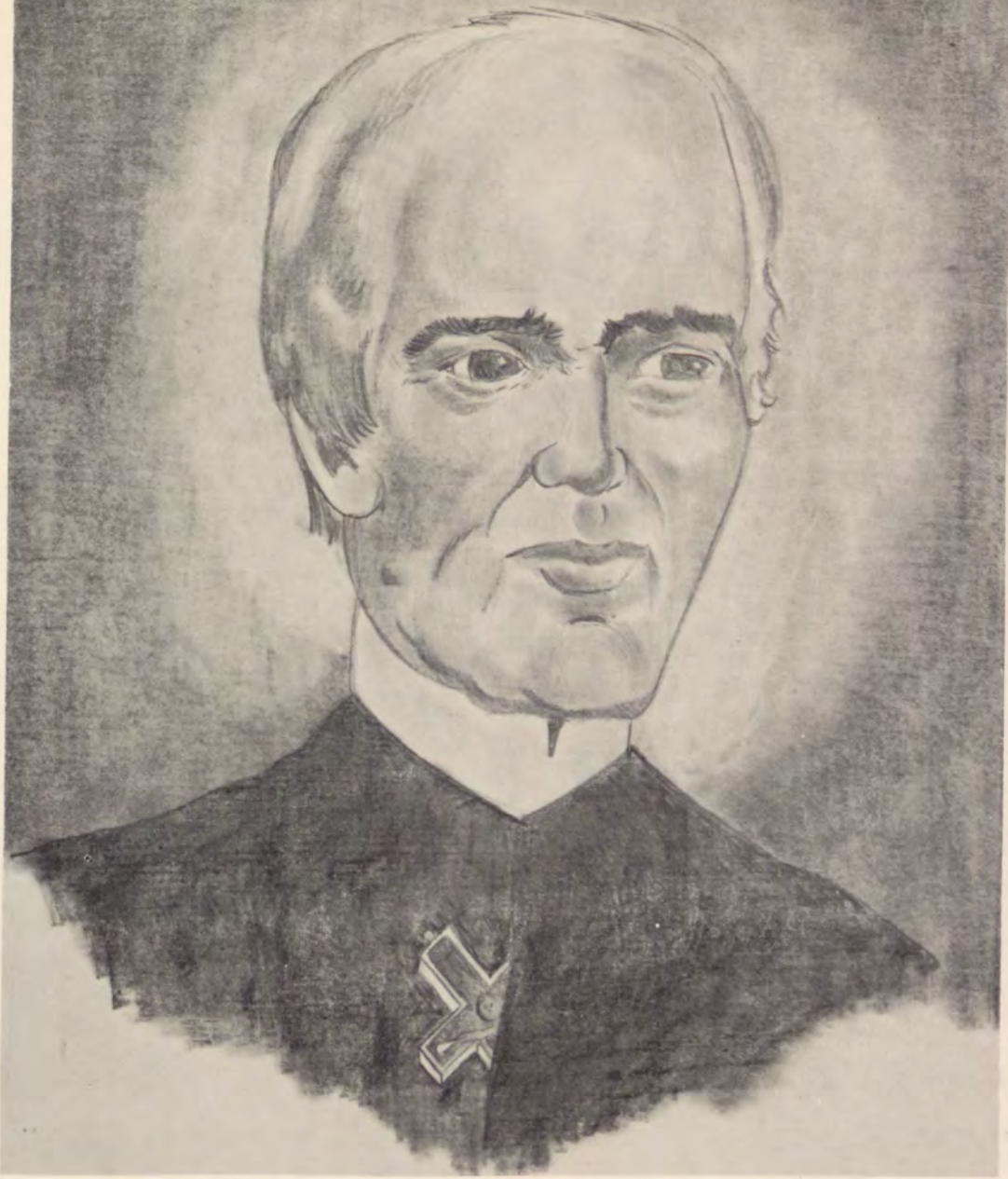

John Bapst High School, constructed in 1926, is an outstanding monument to the diligent efforts of Monsignor Thomas J. Nelligan, the late Father Timothy Houlihan, the late Father Martin Cleary, and to all the faithful Catholics of Bangor.

A mere glance at the outward appearance of John Bapst immediately attests to the fact that it is an unusual structure. The Greek columns which line the forepart, and the trio of stately main doors add grace and dignity to this impressive edifice.

Upon crossing the threshold, one finds himself standing within the marble foyer which is a fitting entrance to the structure. Just beyond this foyer lies the spacious and beautiful auditorium with its large and often-used stage. The sculptural design, prevailing throughout the hall, is striking. The auditorium is, as it were, a nucleus around which are the modern library, the well-equipped science laboratories, the up-to-date cafeteria, and the well-appointed classrooms.

Although our school was built over twenty-five years ago, it is still nevertheless a most modern and outstanding high school. For us, the Graduates of Nineteen Fifty-four, John Bapst will always be the OUTSTANDING HIGH SCHOOL, for here in our youth we learned those lessons, academic and moral, that will serve us throughout our lives.

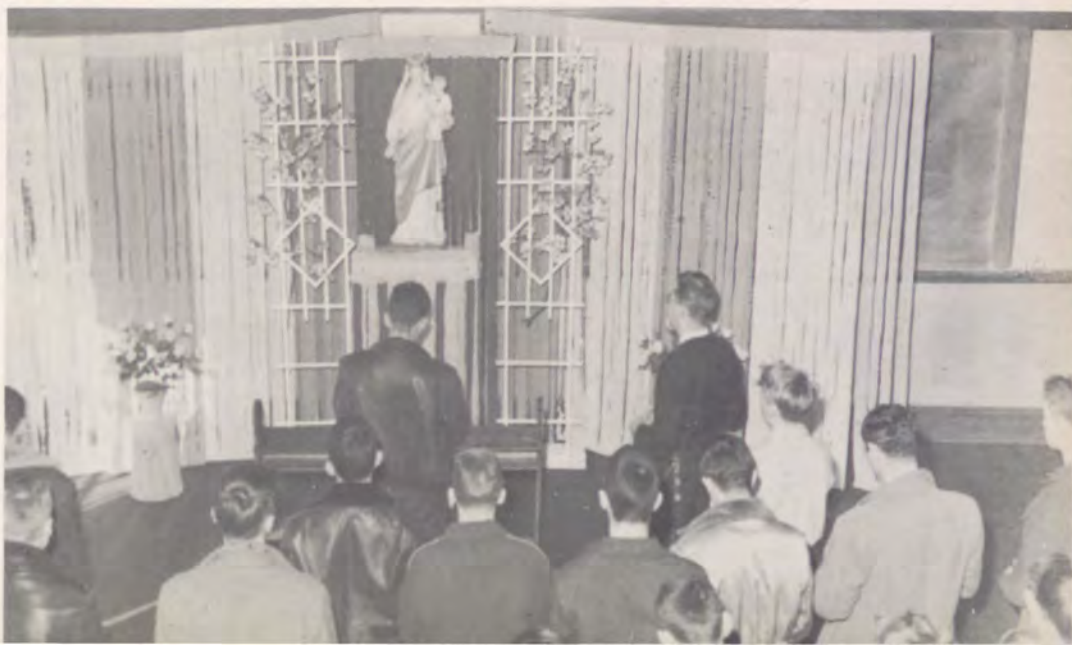

SEASON'S RECORD

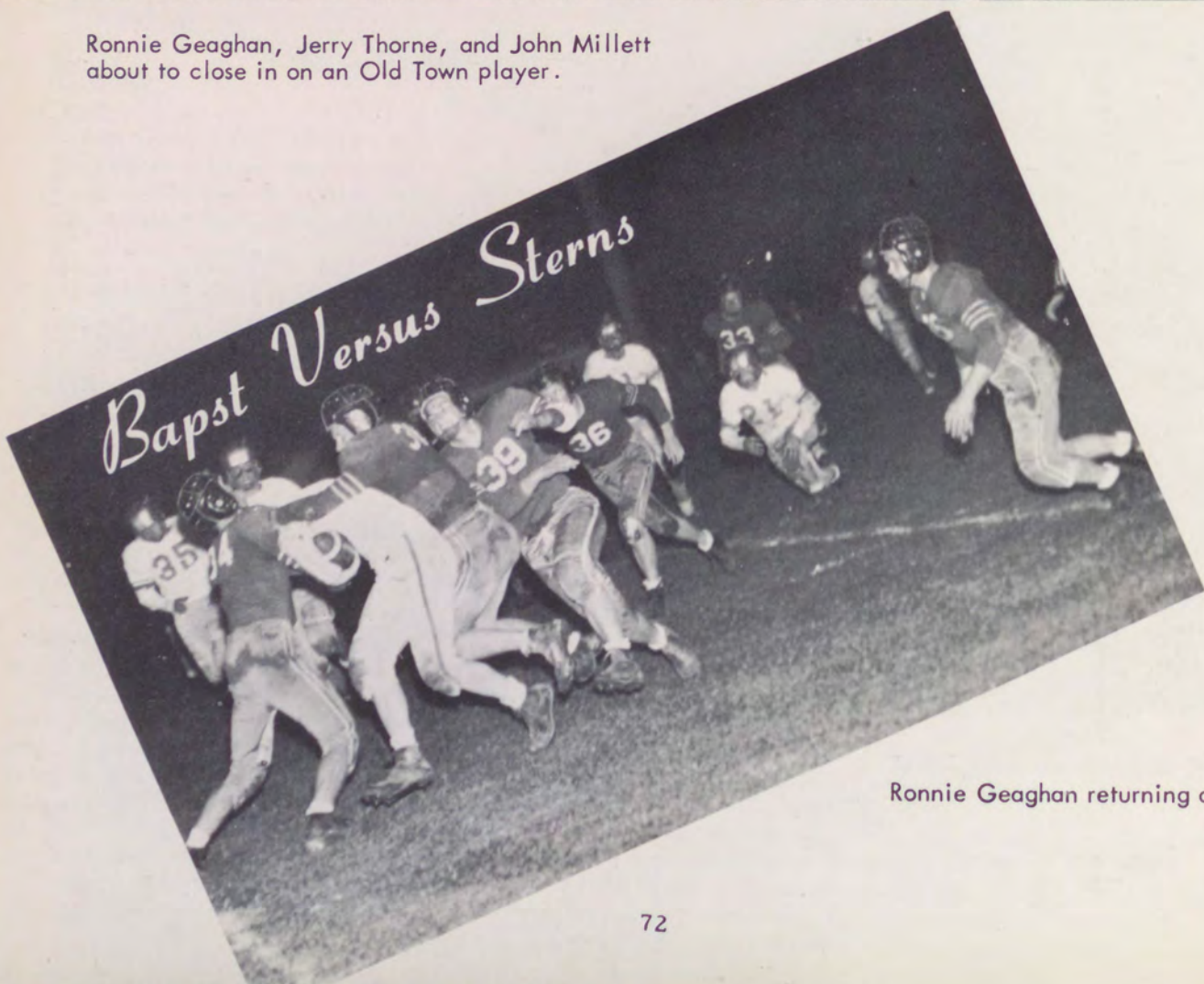

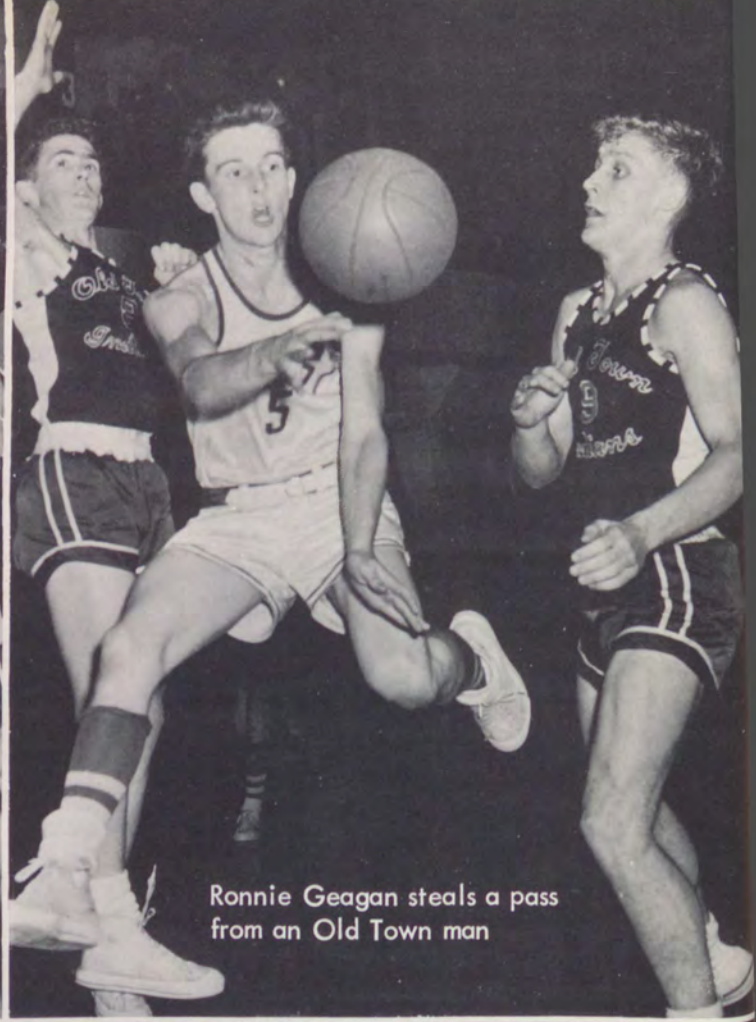

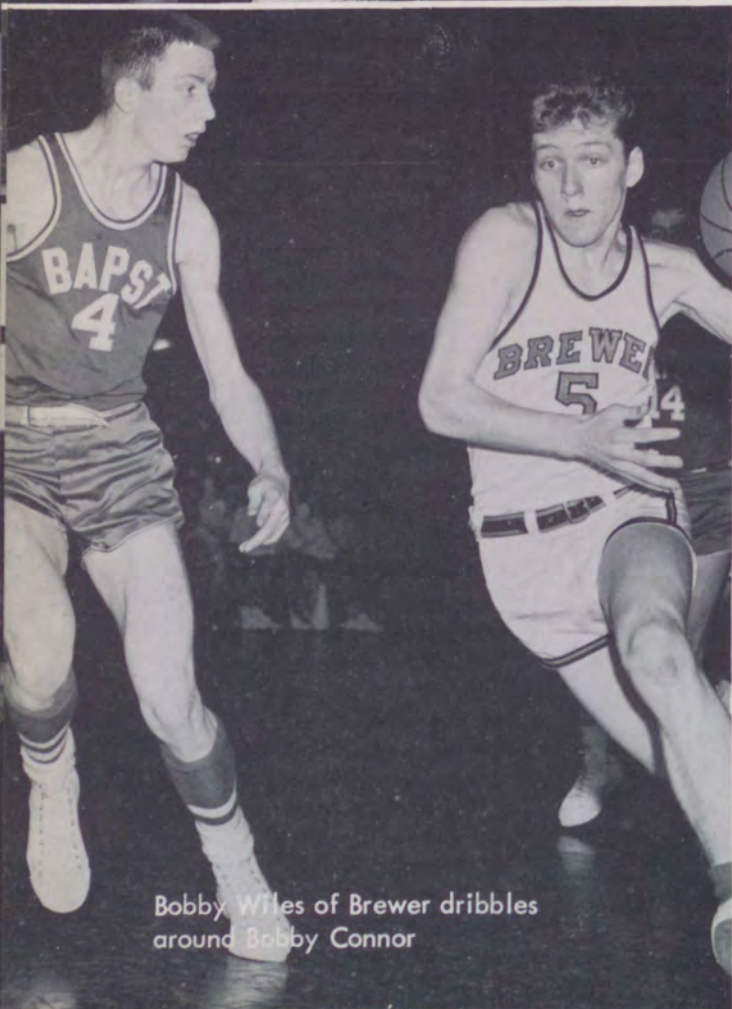
