

Dear Denny:



General Secretary of Rotary International

George R. Means of Evanston, Illinois, U.S.A., is general secretary of Rotary International, which is composed of more than 13,600 Rotary clubs in 145 countries and geographical regions on six continents with a membership of 648,000 business and professional executives. Since he became a member of the Rotary headquarters staff in 1935, he has held various assignments, including those of convention manager, head of the former Middle Asia office in Bombay, India, and assistant general secretary.

Mr. Means was born in Bloomington, Illinois. He was graduated from Illinois State University with a bachelor of education degree, and from Clark University in Worcester, Massachusetts, with a master of arts degree. Prior to joining the staff of Rotary International, he was engaged in map editing and map publishing. He is a founder member of Gamma Theta Upsilon, national (U.S.) professional geographic fraternity, and he is a Fellow of the American Geographical Society.

A Rotarian since 1932, he is a former member and past vice-president of the Rotary Club of Bloomington, Illinois, and is now a member of the Rotary Club of Evanston, Illinois. He is an honorary member of the Rotary Clubs of Bloomington, Illinois; Tokyo, Japan, and Osaka, Japan.

Rikkyo University in Tokyo and Illinois Wesleyan University in Bloomington have conferred upon him the degree of doctor of humanities, and he has been decorated with the Chilean Order of Merit and the French Legion of Honor. He is a member of the Associates of Illinois Wesleyan University, and a member-at-large of the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

During World War II, Mr. Means served with the U.S. Navy as a commander. He has traveled extensively in Europe, Asia, North and South America, and Australia and New Zealand.
