We at Bapst like to think that every issue of the Crusader that rolls off the presses is somehow a special issue. But those of us who have worked on the '67 issue know that it is more special than usual for it marks the passing of our "Bapst generation". And indeed these years have been colorful, intense, sometimes bewildering but utterly invaluable. And so in presenting the '67 Crusader we show our esteem for the past and our exhilarating concern for the future. Here, then, are the men and women to match the mountains.





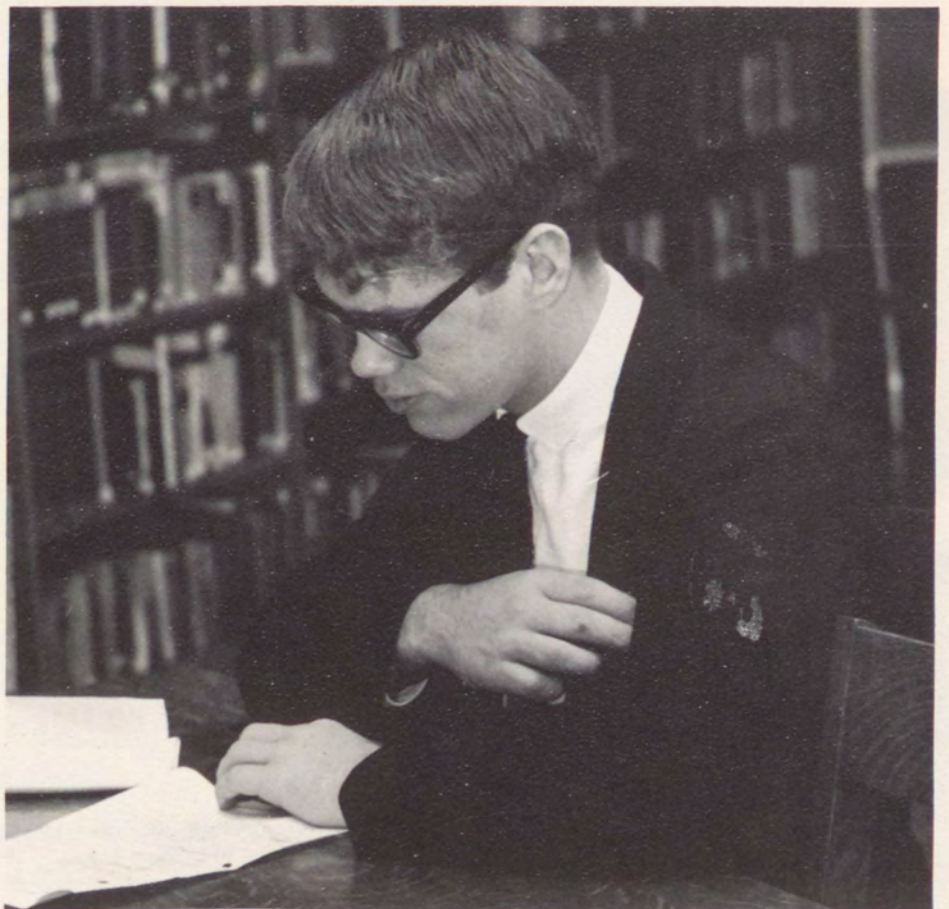

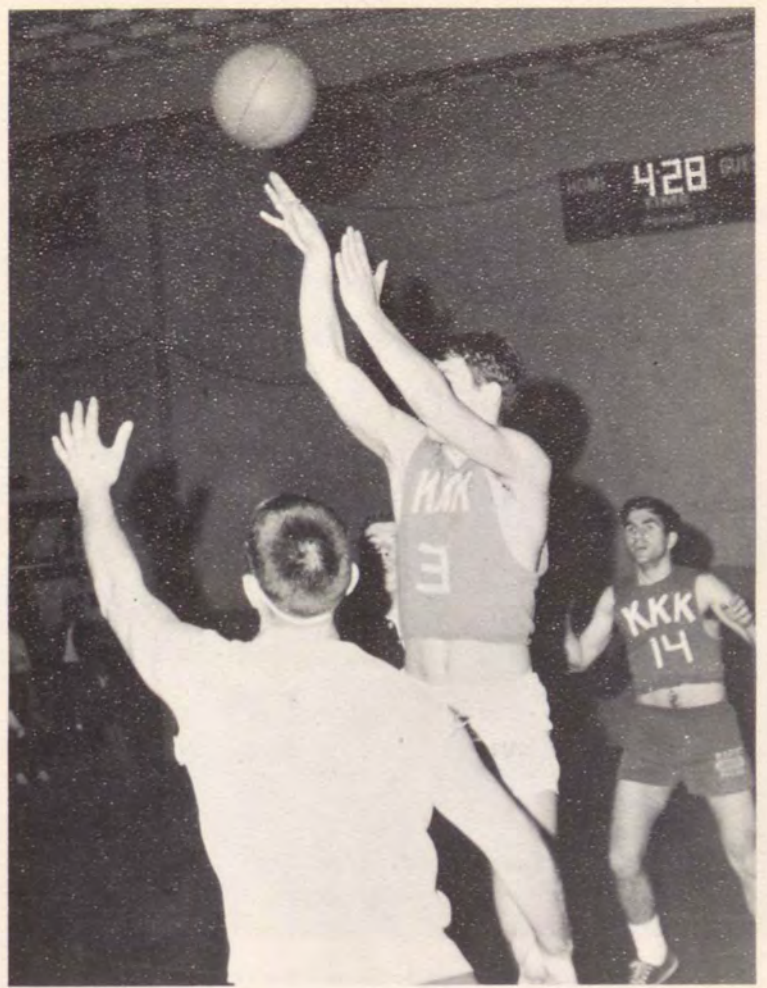


## *Key Klub Kapers*

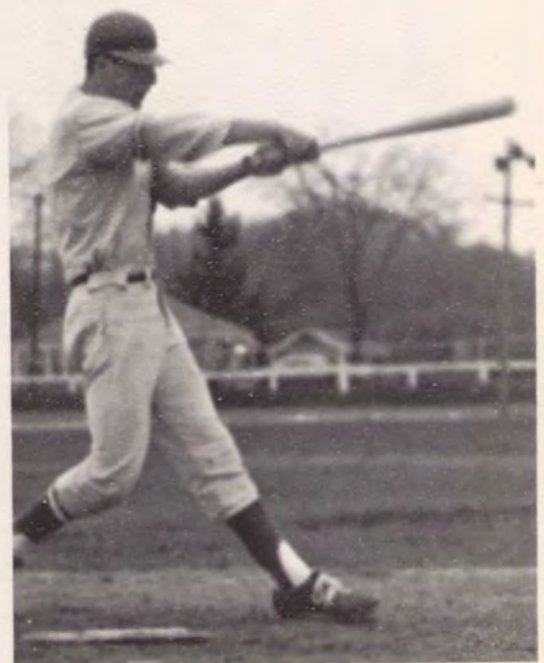
