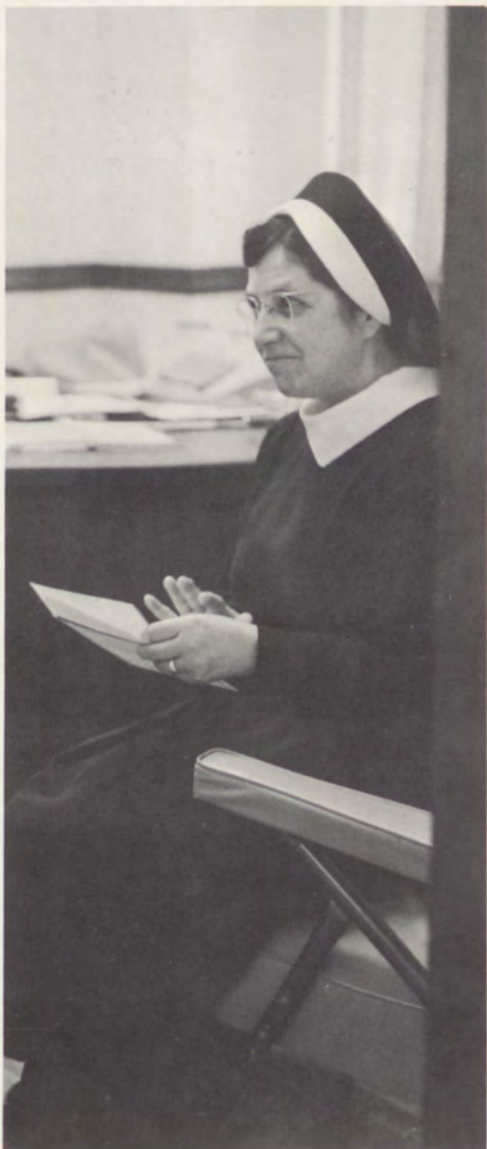

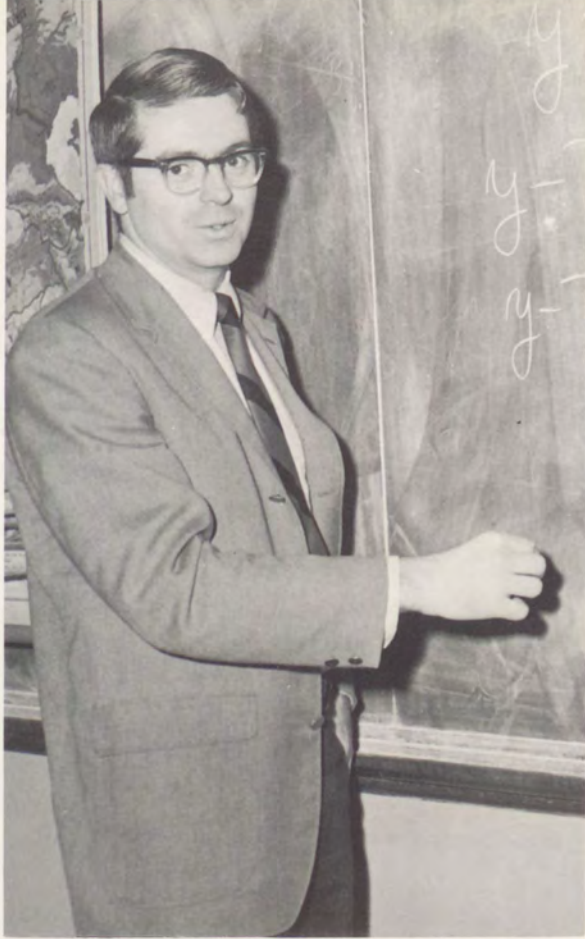

Crusaders Finish 4-5

After several weeks of preparation under the direction of first-year mentor William Perkins, the John Bapst Crusaders began the 1968 season against their traditional rival, Brewer. This well-attended game saw the hopes of the Crusaders disappointed by a 43-0 loss. However, outstanding defense provided the team with the impetus needed to defeat the next opponent, Old Town, with a score of 13-7. A week later under a very hot sun, Bapst rolled over Rockland 24-0, with the bench seeing much action. The winning skein was extended to three by a 13-0 romp of Winslow. Unfortunately, the Crusaders suffered a great loss by the injury of Jerry Dumont. All hopes of a Pine Tree Conference Championship by Bapst were extinguished when the Belfast Lions, led by powerhouse Dennis Hall, moved into town for a 47-0 sweep.

After a two weeks respite, the team lost to Gardiner 27-0. The opposition was limited to one touchdown in the first half, but the Bapst offense just couldn't get started, as was the trouble all year long. An 87 yard kickoff return by Sanborn Miller was one bright spot in the 29-19 defeat to Skowhegan. After a 27-7 loss to Madison, the Crusaders ended the season with a 4-5 mark by a 13-7 victory over Fairfield.

The 1968 Crusaders were led by the outstanding performance of all Pine Tree Conference end Charlie Greer, who was in his first year of football. Mark Williams as quarterback and Paul Lagrange as wingback must be commended for a fine job of replacing transferrals. Tailback Pat McGinley aided the offense with his fine running. Other seniors leaving the team were Tri-Captains Sanborn Miller, Jerry Nadeau, and Claude Rioux, also Mike Giles, Jerry Dumont, Paul Poisson, Dave Thibodeau and Pat McGinley.

In all the team's record does not indicate the spirit and devotion and work of the 1968 team. The team overcame the great odds of small numbers and lack of size during the season. For next year, Coach Perkins is looking forward to the return of Paul Lagrange, Fred Gallant, Owen Gould, and Rick Varney.

Guard Dana Rush was a major plug in both the offensive and defensive lines. Other members of the team's small but powerful front were defensive tackle, Greg Watson; monster Francis Moore; offensive tackles Tom Hogan, Paul Hansen, and Rick Hughes; guard, John White; and center, John Roach. Fine performers for both ways were ends Jim Russell and Ed Cawley.

These devoted Frosh players should certainly be given credit for their hard work because they are the unacclaimed sportsmen of Bapst. Their two coaches also deserve commendation for their long hours.

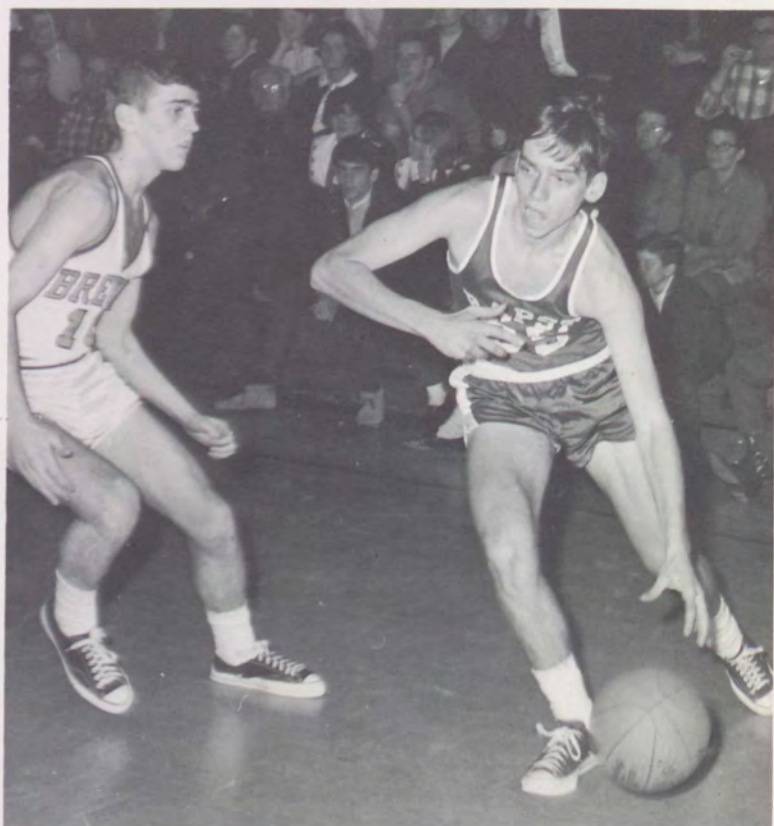

The Many Faces of the Crusaders





It was not surprising to see the '68-'69 edition of the Crusader varsity basketball team achieve the heights of accomplishment that it did. The Crusaders played like a team. Individual efforts throughout the season only complemented the fine performance shown by the team as a whole. The record of the Crusaders speaks for itself. It is the best season a Baptist varsity has had in many, many years; 15-3 during the regular season and 16-4 overall.

An individual player has to be recognized, in view of the quality and consistency of his performances. Charlie Greer continually supplied the spark the team needed, whether it was a key rebound, a clutch basket, or an important foul shot. Charlie finished the season with a record-breaking 312 rebounds, also establishing a career total record of 888 rebounds. Greer reached the paramount of his basketball career when he was named to the first team of the eastern LL All-Tourney Team.

Perhaps the most improved ball player was Jon Beaussang. He led the team with a 21 point average, and he also was second in rebounding with 198 rebounds. Claude Rioux provided the extra effort in the clutch, sometimes scoring as many as 10 points in the last tense minutes of a ballgame. Henry Sockbeson, who was often underrated, provided the extra strength under the boards. Rounding out the first team was guard, Paul Lagrange, who was known as the best defensive player on the team. Dick McDonald and Dick Bryce supplied the needed bench strength that proved to be so valuable during the course of the season.

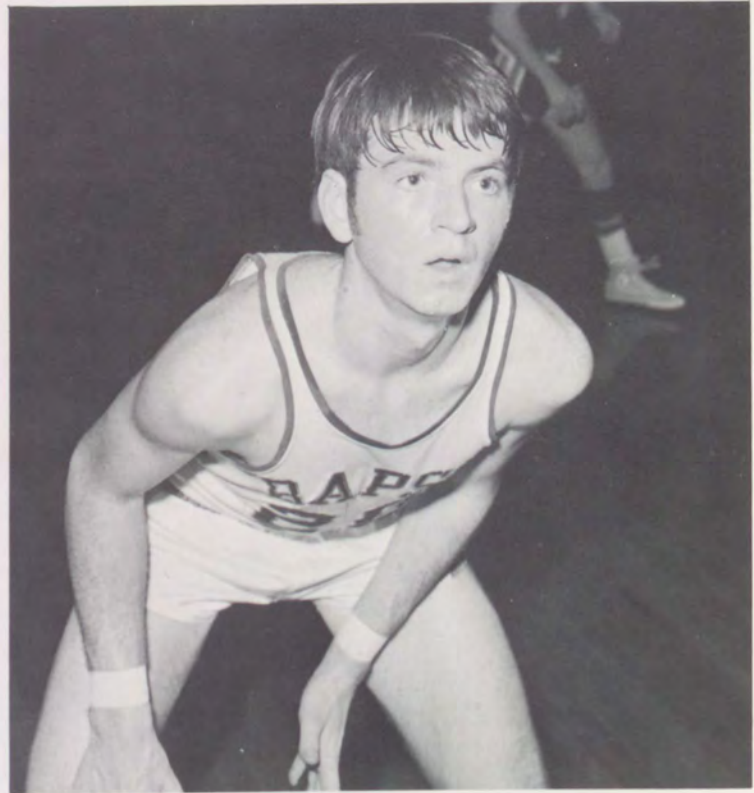

Most observers agreed that the Eastern Maine LL Tournament of 1969 would be the closest and best contest in many years, since none of the top eight teams completely outclassed the others. Entering the tournament in fifth place, John Bapst found its opponent to be vengeance-minded Stearns. Throughout, the game was a close-knit battle, with the starting five of Greer, Beausang, Sockbeson, Rioux, and LaGrange playing to their utmost. Finally the Crusaders edged Stearns for the third consecutive time, bolstered by the fine performances of Dick McDonald and Dick Bryce. In the next game, however, the destiny of Caribou was not to be denied. John Bapst played catch-up ball much of the way, but failed short of overcoming a thirteen point deficit in the last quarter, despite a tremendous rally. Yet again the campaign was a team effort, and all players must be commended for their great courage.

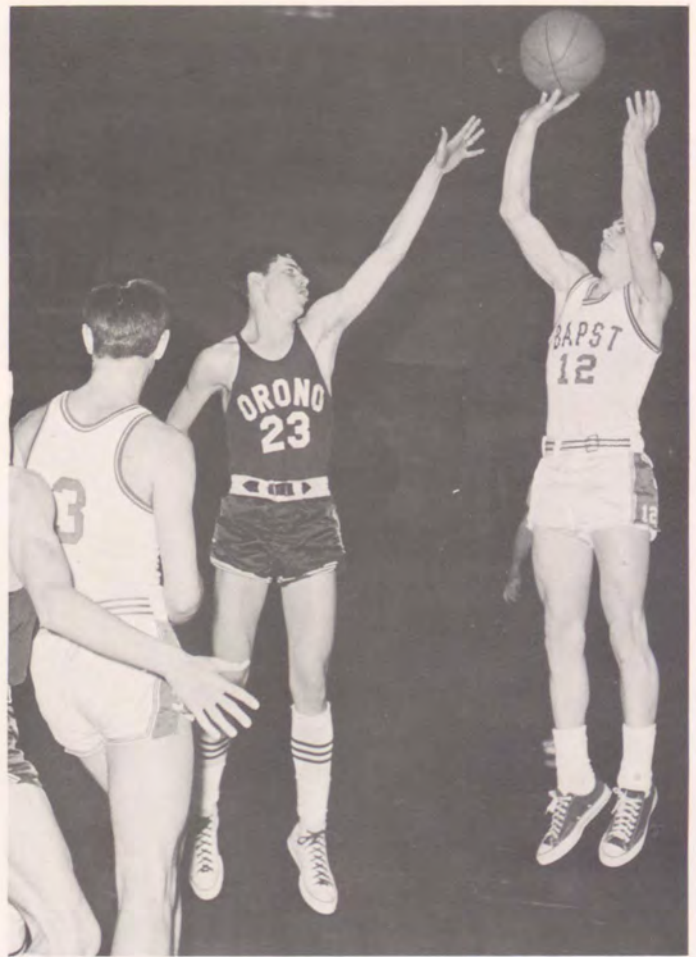

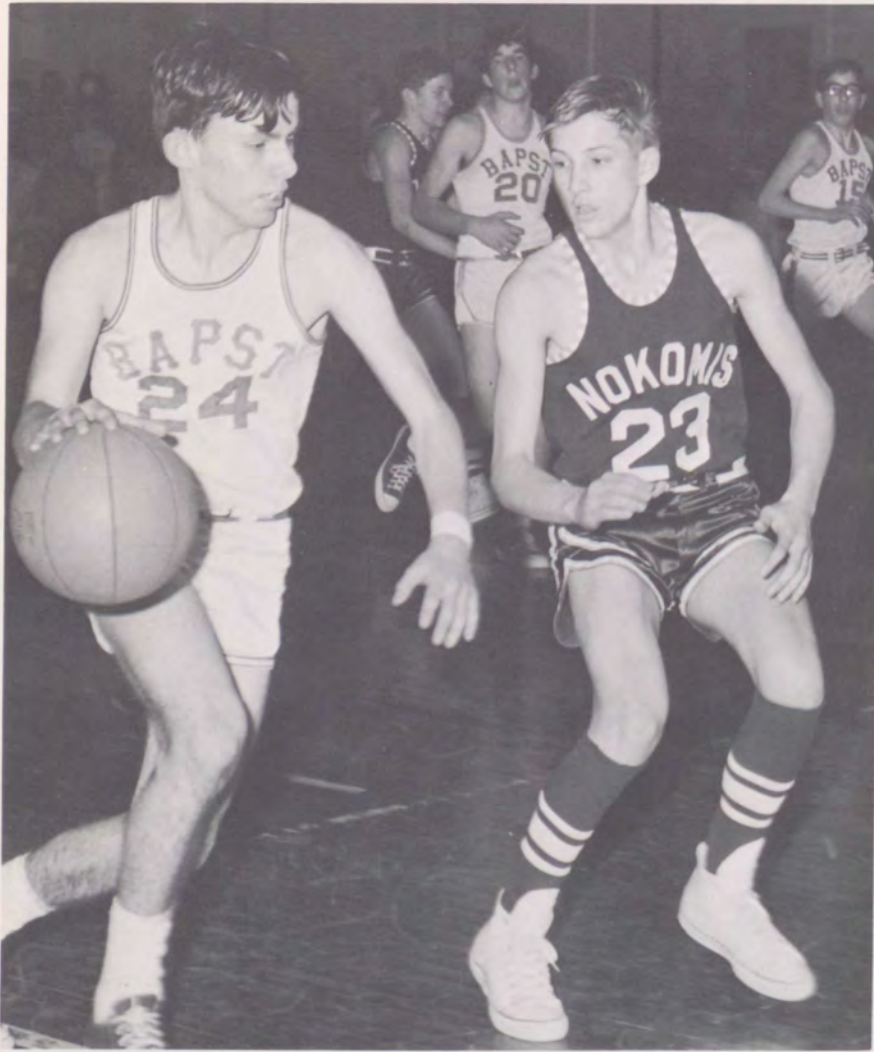

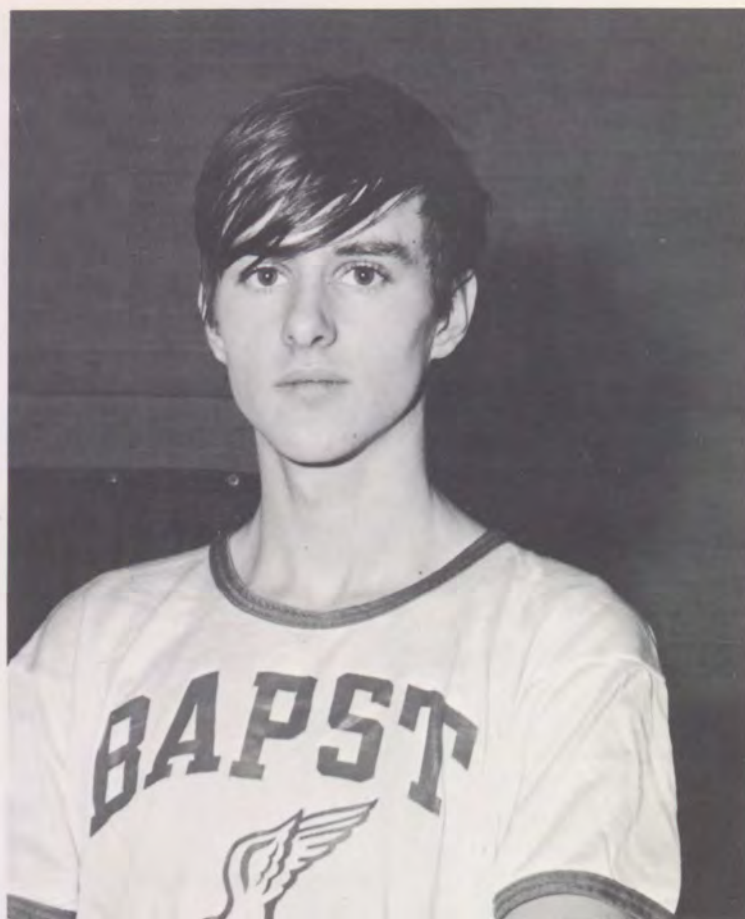
Cross Country

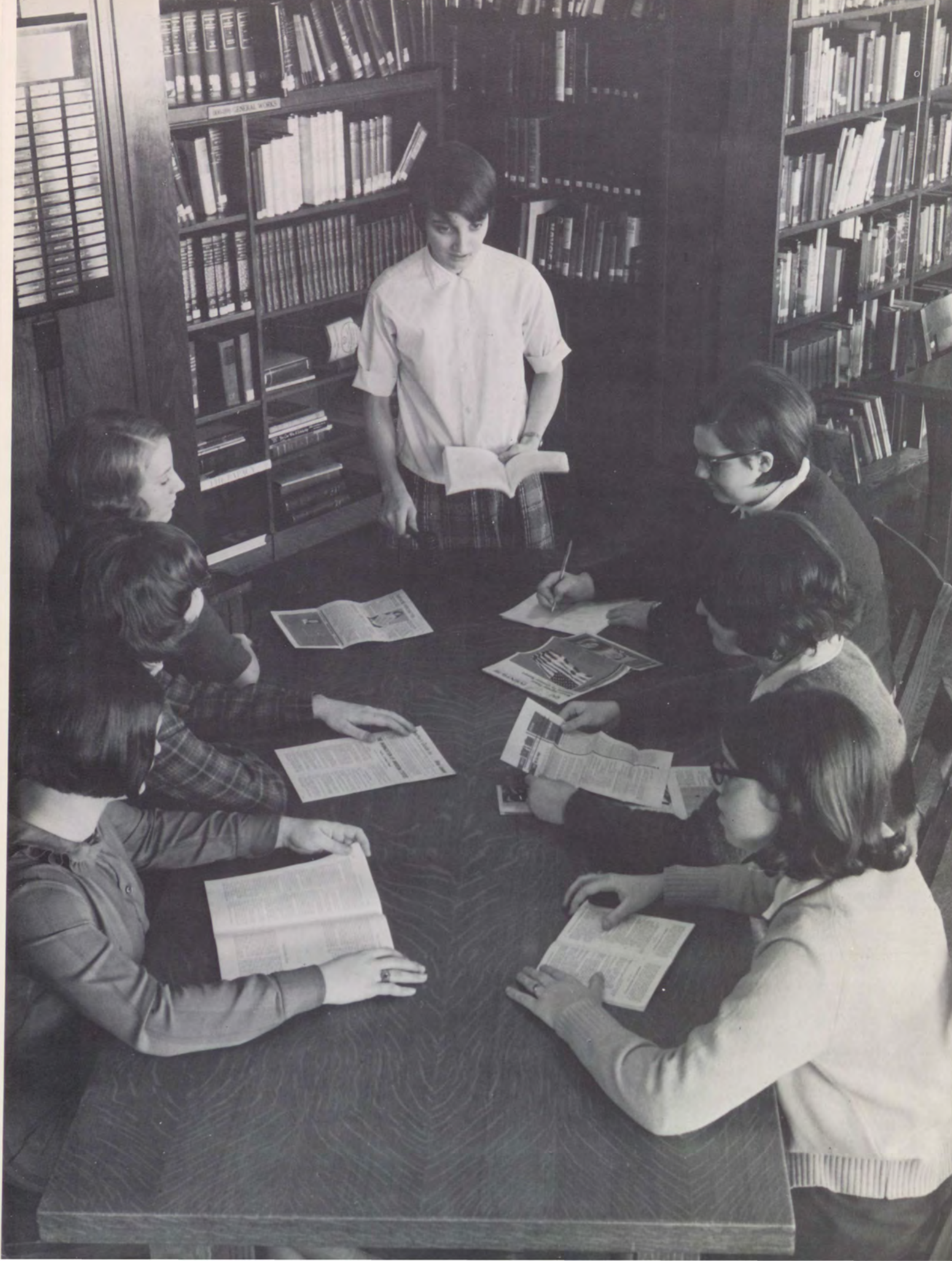

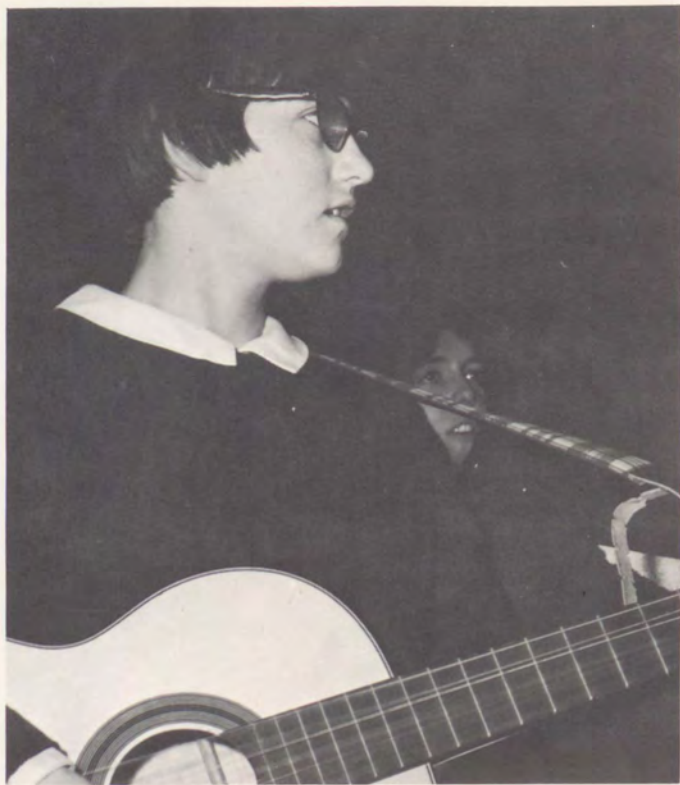
