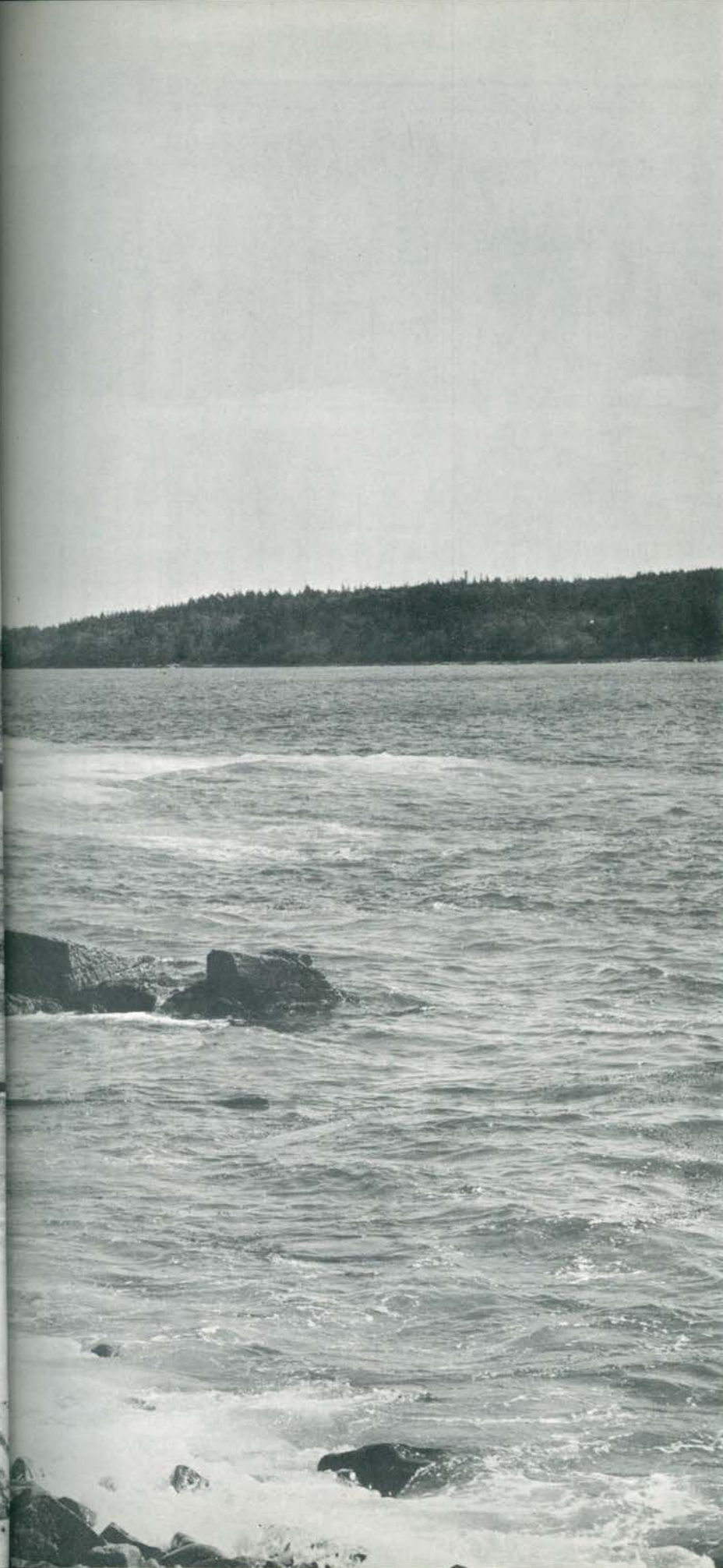
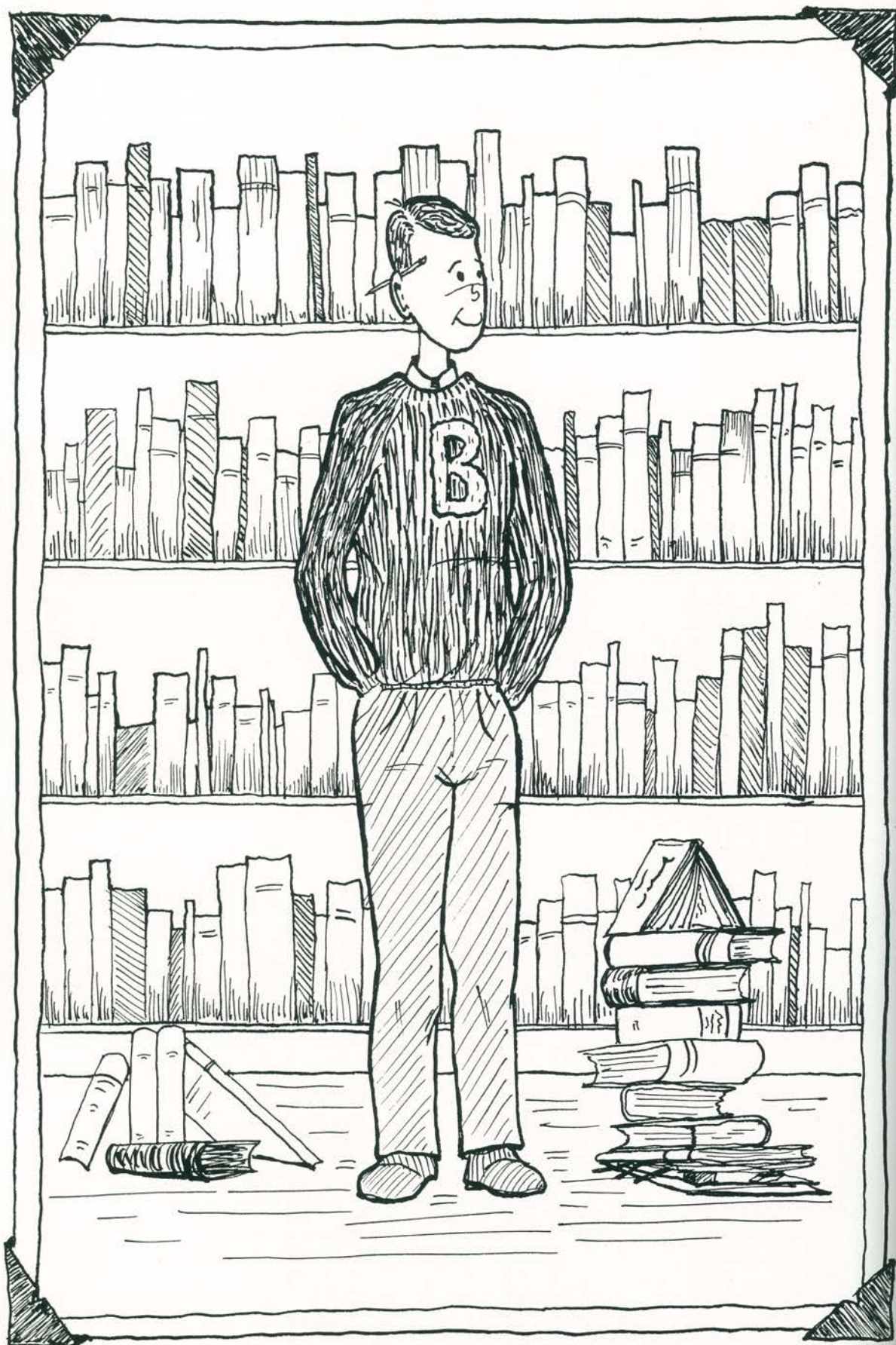

DEDICATION

The one hundredth victory of G. Vincent Cuozzo's cross-country team in the fall of 1960 was a milestone in a long, dedicated teaching career. For fifteen years, spurred on by his warm encouragement and enthusiasm, Mr. Cuozzo's track and cross-country teams have won meets against stiff competition.

After graduating from B.H.S., Mr. Cuozzo became a track star during his four years at the University of Maine. There he received his B.S. degree in mechanical engineering and his Master's degree in Education. In 1939 he joined the faculty of B.H.S., teaching mechanical drawing. His teaching career, however, was interrupted by his term of service in the Air Force during World War II. Returning to Bangor High, he began his work with the cross-country team.

After seventeen years of service, G. Vincent Cuozzo holds the position of acting head of the Industrial Arts and Home Economics Department. His drafting students have won statewide awards. Two years ago, he instituted a special class in mechanical drawing for seniors. In 1960 Mr. Cuozzo represented Bangor Schools at the Technifax Corporation Seminar, whose purpose was to promote visual education.

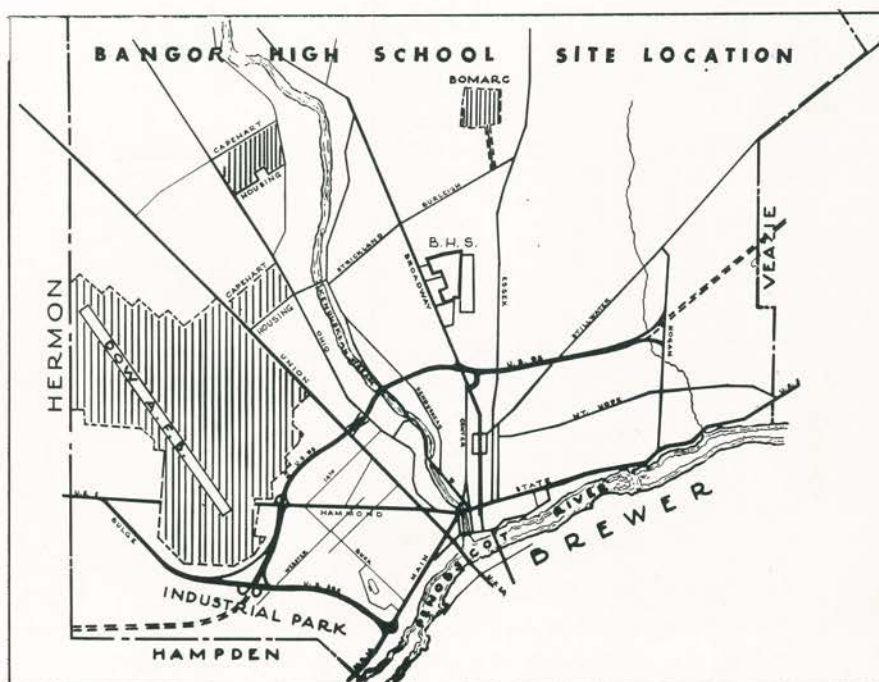
To you, Mr. Cuozzo, because of your unflagging efforts both in sports and in the classroom, we dedicate the 1961 *Oracle*.

A result of the School Board's untiring efforts was the successful referendum on March 20, 1961, to accept the bond issue for the new senior high school.



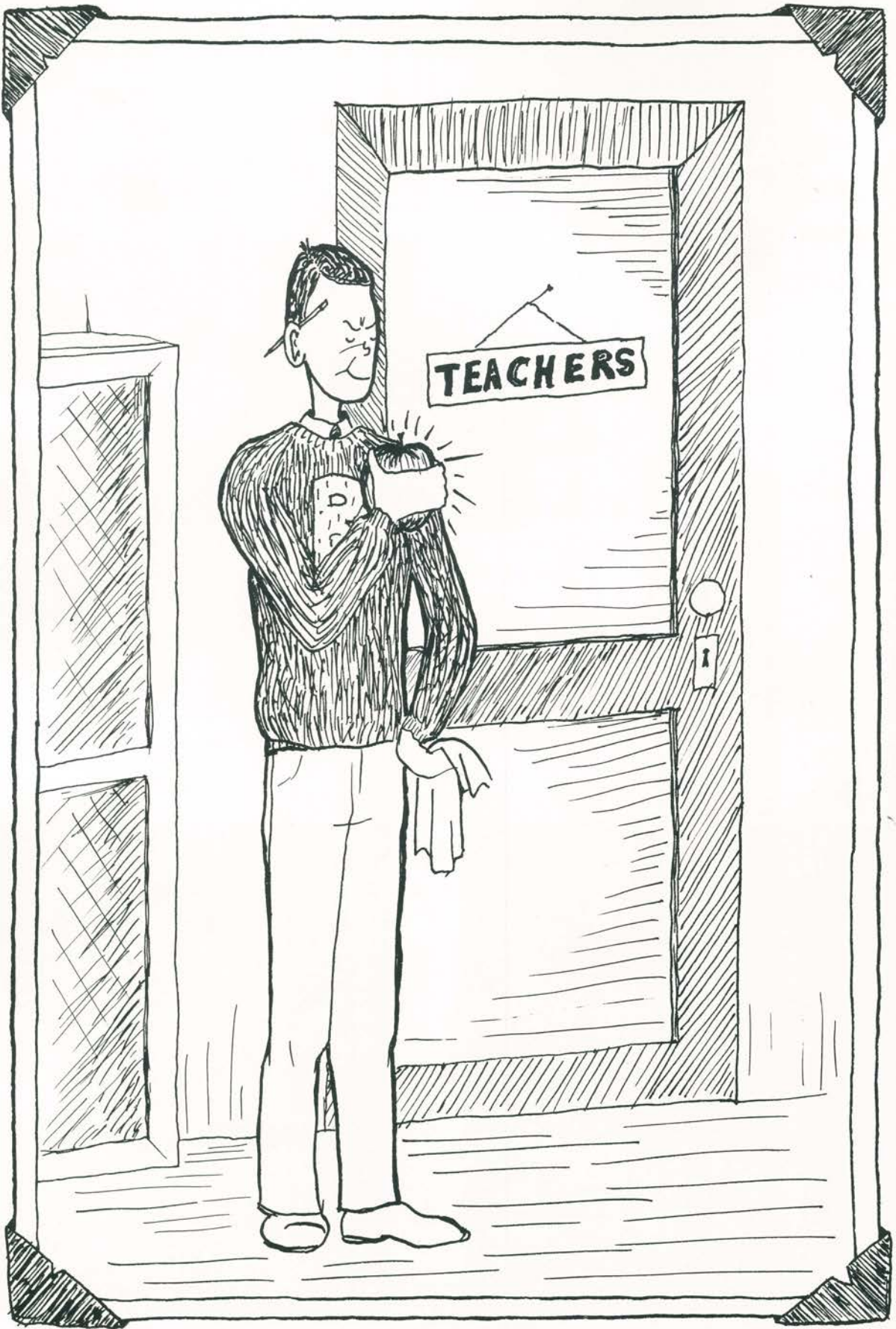

Was Karen Andre innocent or guilty? That was the question in everyone's mind at the presentation of Bangor High's Senior Play, "The Night of January 16th."

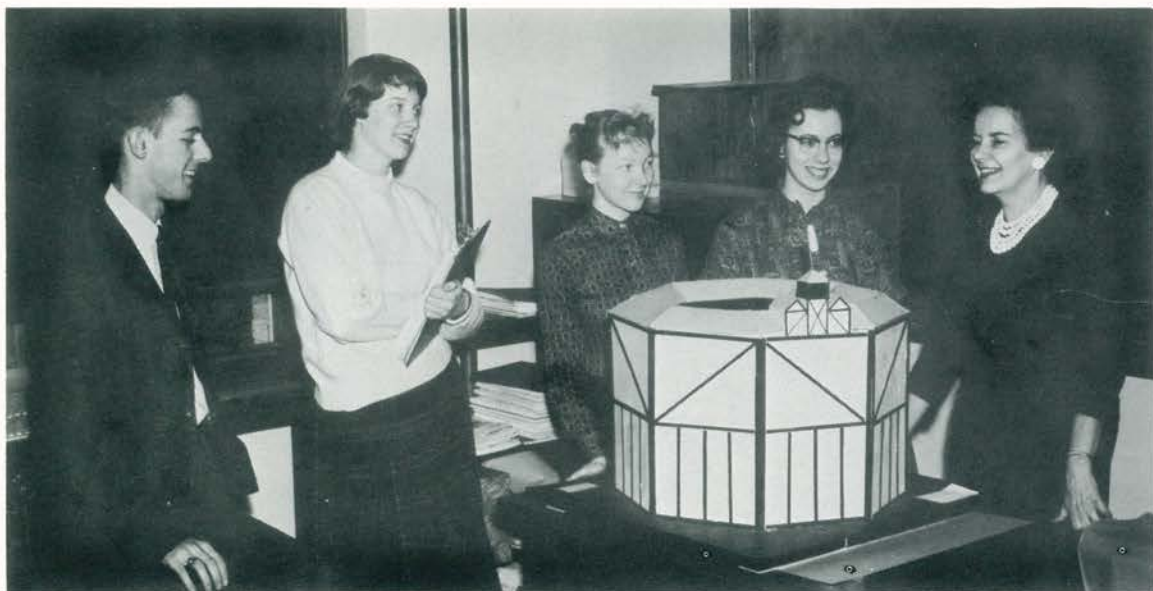
This play was different from most theatrical murder trials in that the jury was chosen from the audience, and the witnesses were seated in various places throughout the audience.

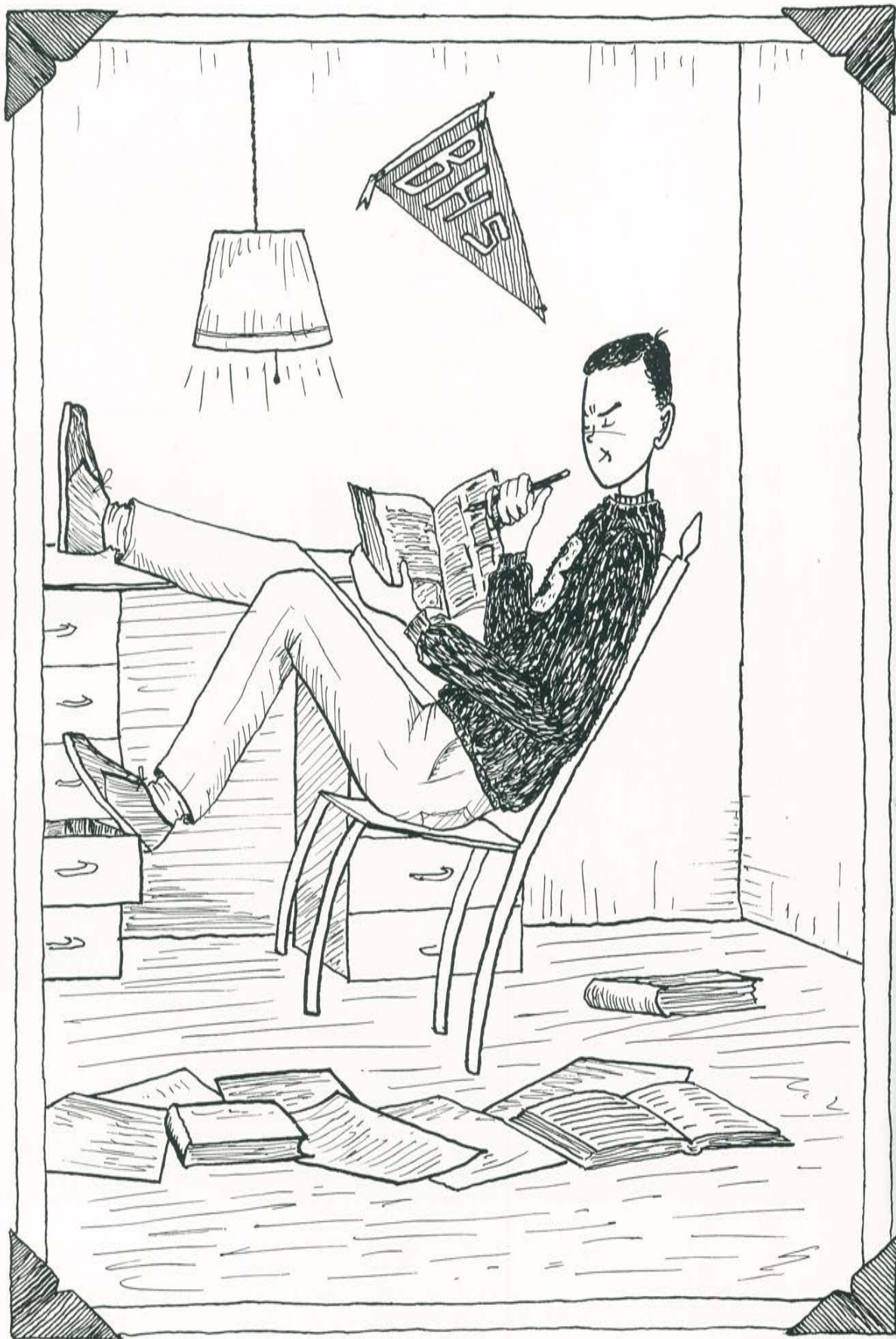

The Freshman Football team had great school spirit and should be congratulated for its fine effort.

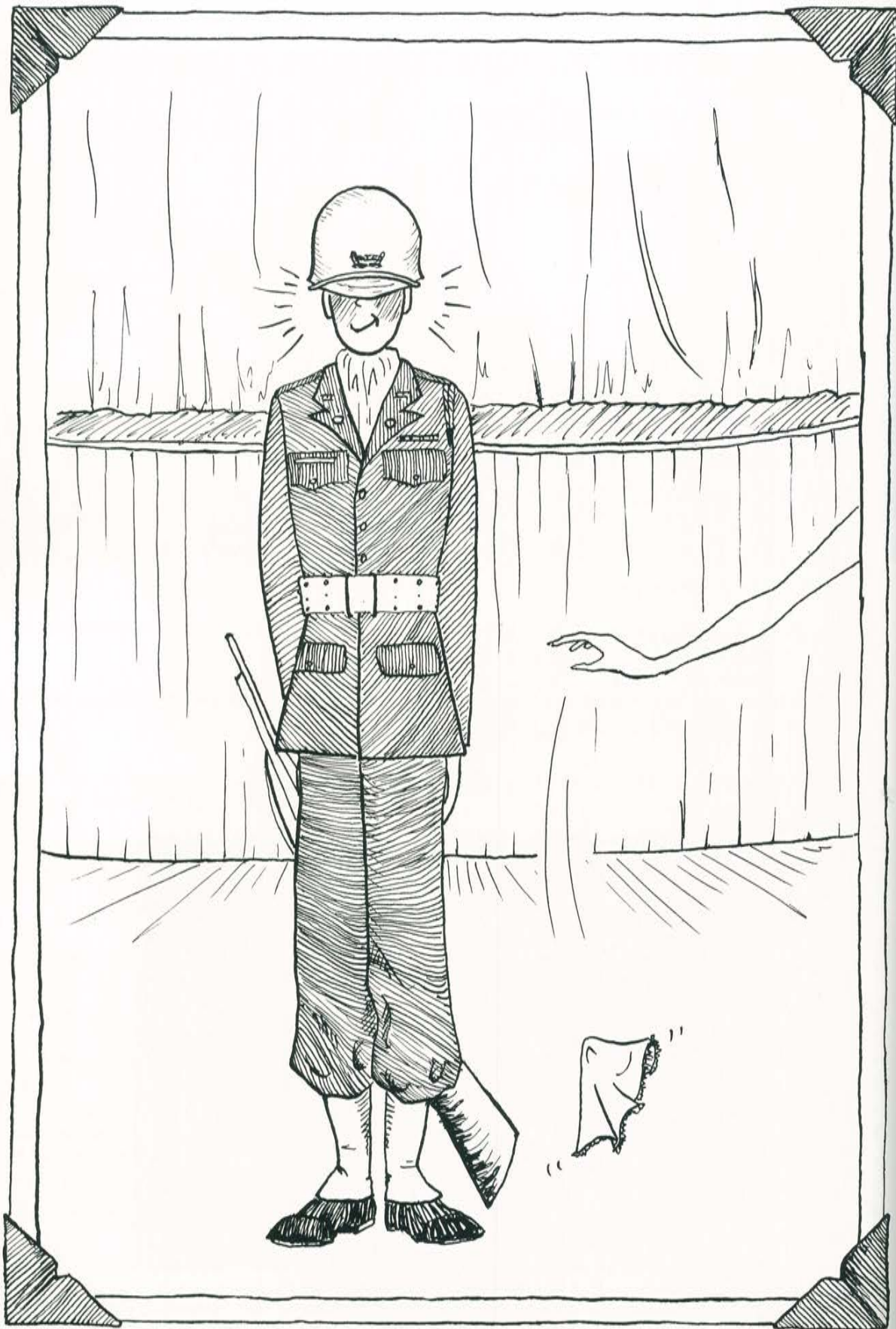
Track and baseball were spring sports. The coaches discovered some new athletic possibilities from these games.

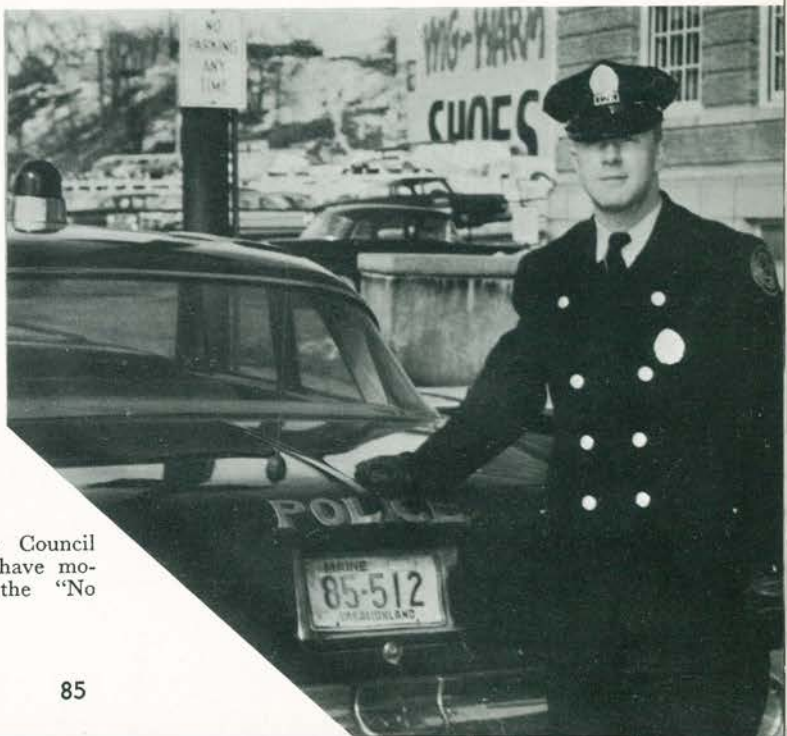
SAFETY COUNCIL

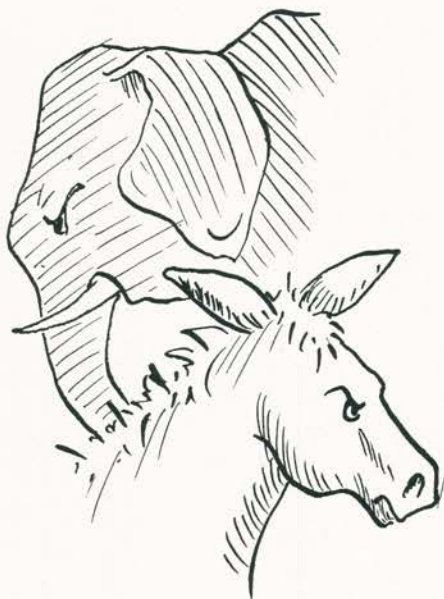

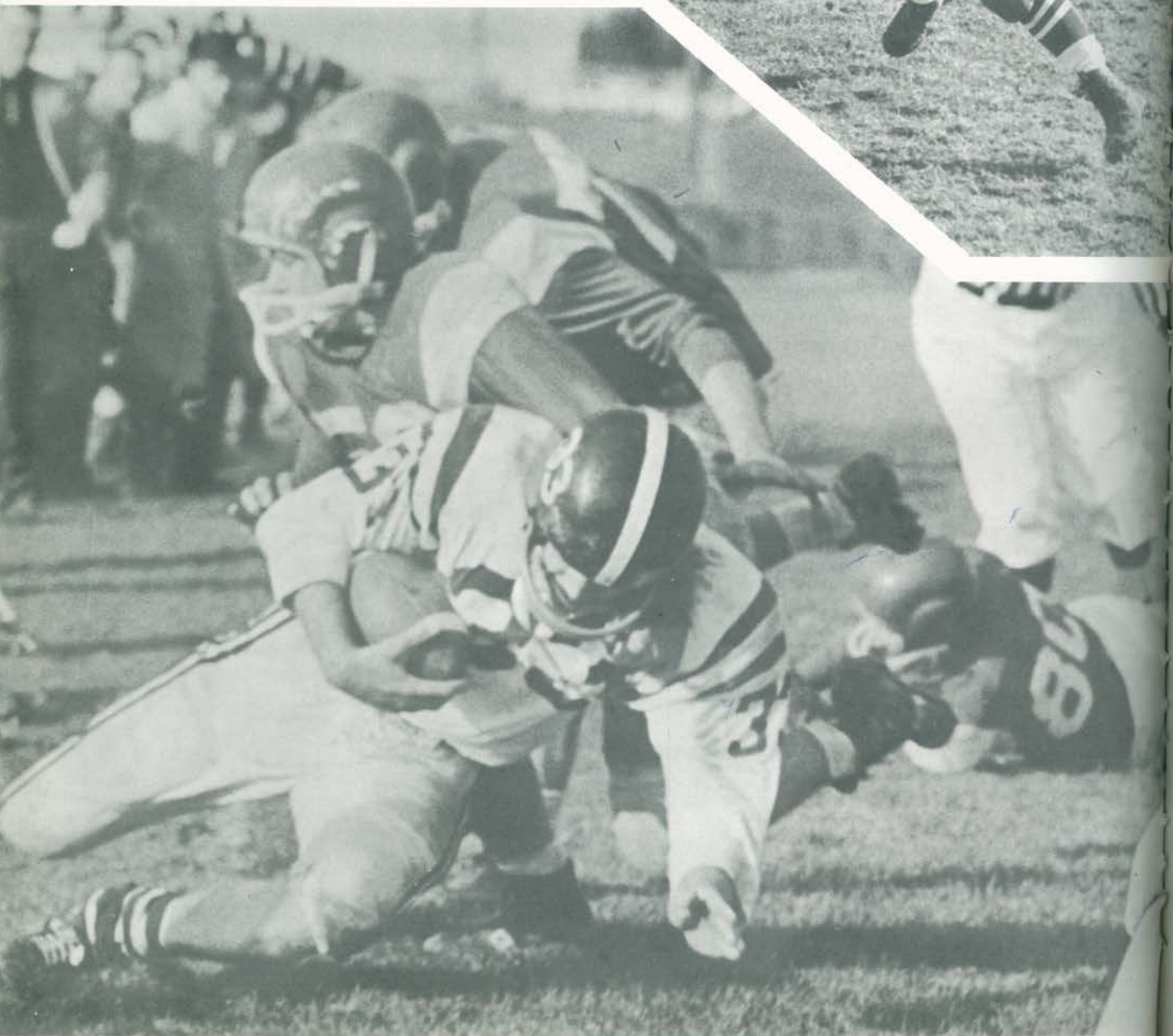

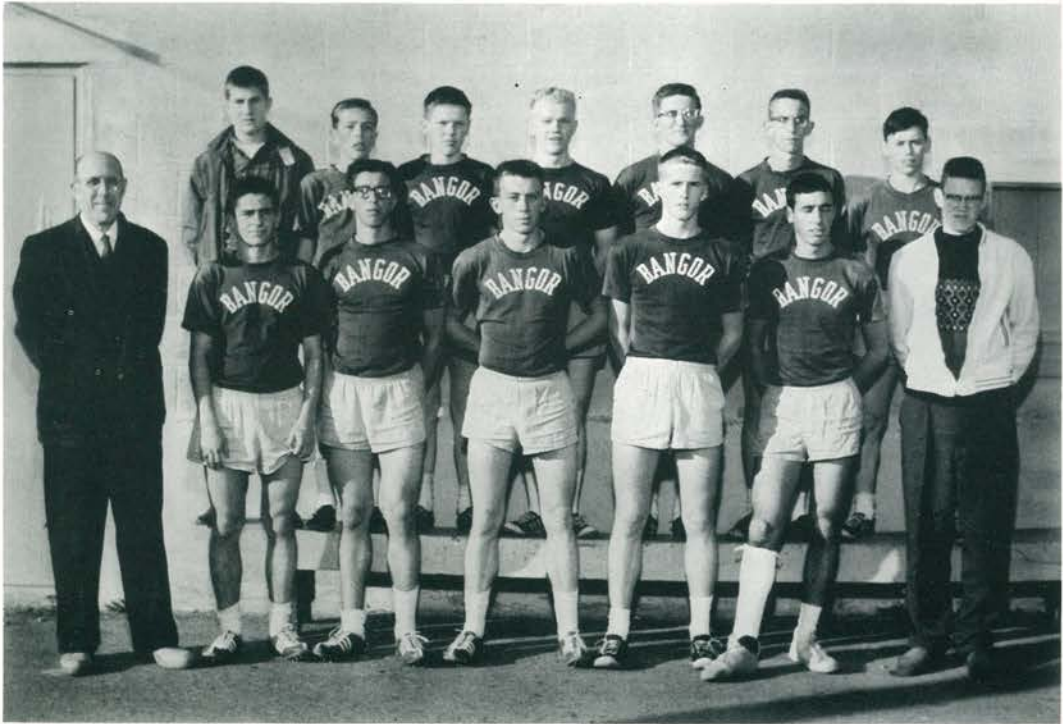

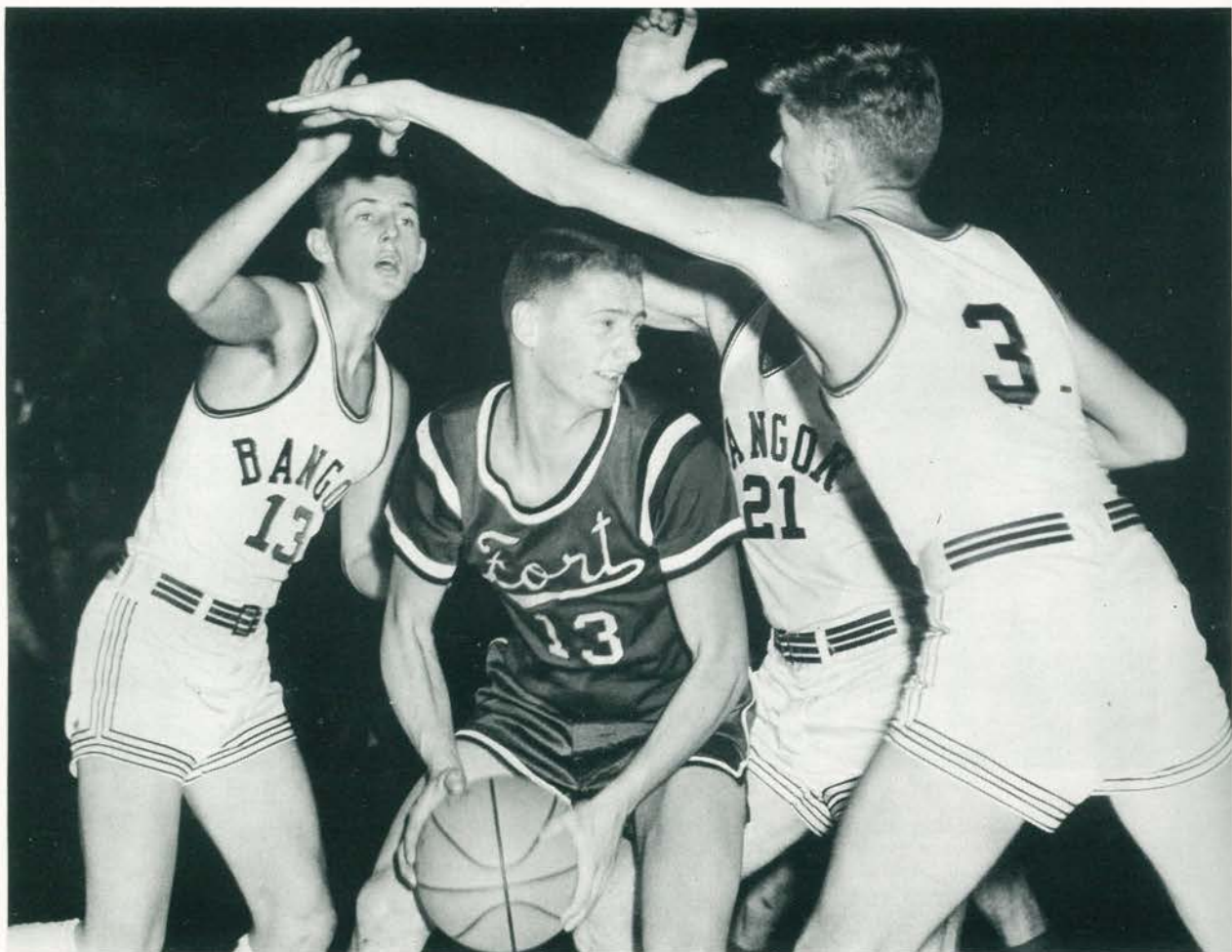
After finishing the 1960 season with seven wins, Coach Frederick "Red" Barry brought the Rams back to a 12-7 mark to end a season of fine basketball.
