HISTORICAL JOURNAL

Special Troops 102d Infantry Division

SECTION I

The Special Troops of the 102d Infantry Division were activated at Camp Maxey, Texas, 16 August 1943, in compliance with a revised table of organization, (7-3) which consolidated the service companies of the Division; Headquarters and Headquarters Company with the Military Police Platoon and the Division Band Attached, the 802d Ordnance (LM) Company, the 102d Signal Company and the 102d Quartermaster Company; under one tactical command of 52 Officers, 7 Warrant Officers and 904 Enlisted Men.

Major Steve Lichene assumed command of the Special Troops immediately following activation and organized the Headquarters. First Lieutenant George J. Knoll was named Executive Officer, Major Dorrance S. James, Surgeon, Captain (Ch) John G. Lambrides, Chaplain and First Lieutenant Jerome M. Piekos, Dental Officer.

At the time of activation, Captain Keith G. Chatfield succeeded Major Lichene in command of Headquarters Company. Major Richard W. Johnson commanded the Military Police Platoon as Provost Marshal and Chief Warrant Officer Frederick E. Ford was Bandleader. First Lieutenant Samuel O. Robertson commanded the Signal Company, Captain William M. Swinney the Ordnance Company and First Lieutenant Jesse E. Gilliland the Quartermaster Company.

Hardly had the encumbrances of a newly activated organization been overcome when, on 14 September 1943, the entire Division departed from Camp Maxey, Texas, and the Special Troops therewith motored to the Louisiana Maneuver Area to participate in the Fourth Phase of the 1943 Maneuvers. Here the technically skilled personnel of the Ordnance and Signal Companies developed and the Headquarters and Quartermaster Companies achieved a marked degree of efficiency in administrative and supply functions, while undergoing extensive field operations. The morale and discipline continued excellent throughout the period and on 18 November 1943, after two months of field duty, the Division moved to Camp Swift, Texas, for post maneuver training.

Up until this time a number of changes had occurred in the Staff and Organizational Command personnel of the Special Troops. Lieutenant Piekos became ill prior to joining and was replaced by First Lieutenant Luther Webb. Chaplain Lambrides was replaced by Captain (Ch) James R. Barnett, who distinguished himself on maneuvers by his untiring efforts and

benefaction in holding religious services whenever and wherever the men of the Special Troops could be released from their duties. Shortly following his request for Foreign Service, he was transferred to New Caledonia in the Southwest Pacific. Chaplain Barnett was succeeded by First Lieutenant Harry G. Coiner, then a newly commissioned Army Chaplain. Lieutenants Robertson, Commanding Officer of the 102d Signal Company and Myron B. Keyes, Platoon Leader of the Special Platoon of Headquarters Company, were promoted to the grade of Captain.

While the Division was stationed at Camp Swift, Texas, the Division Commander, Major General John B. Anderson was promoted to Commanding General, XVI Corps and Brigadier General Frank A. Keating assumed command of the Division on 21 January 1944.

Major Lichene was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel and Lieutenants Knoll, Webb and Coiner were promoted to the rank of Captain.

Captain Chatfield, Commanding Officer of Headquarters Company, requested service with the Infantry and was transferred to the 407th Infantry Regiment. Captain Keyes assumed command, to be superseded shortly thereafter by Captain William F. Kidder, newly assigned to the Division.

First Lieutenant Jesse E. Gilliland, Commanding Officer of the Quartermaster Company was promoted to the rank of Captain and later transferred to Headquarters Fourth Army. First Lieutenant Jay E. Haynes succeeded him as Commanding Officer and was subsequently promoted to the rank of Captain.

Captain Robertson relinquished command of the 102d Signal Company when appointed Assistant to the Division Signal Officer. First Lieutenant Richard D. Speer succeeded him in command of the Signal Company.

Captain William M. Swinney relinquished command of the 802d Ordnance Company when appointed Assistant to the Division Ordnance Officer. First Lieutenant Roger W. Spigelmoyer succeeded him as Commanding Officer and was later promoted to the rank of Captain.

Major Dorrance S. James, Special Troops surgeon, was transferred to the 111th Evacuation Hospital and was succeeded by Captain Marcus D. Hilker, who was subsequently relieved of this assignment to be replaced by Major Ronald A. Bettie.

Chief Warrant Officer Frederick E. Ford, Bandleader was evacuated because of illness

and was replaced by Warrant Officer Junior Grade George H. Nolte who had been acting as Assistant up until that time.

During the period at Camp Swift, CWO Ford wrote the Division Marching Song, "Men of the Ozarks," which was copyrighted, published and widely publicized on National Networks as well as within the Division. A musical comedy, "Ozark Capers," was produced to which the Special Troops contributed a large majority of the producing and performing talent. Several of the Division's most successful parties were held at Camp Swift, in addition to a number of colorful reviews.

From 20 June to 29 June 1944, the Division moved by rail, from Camp Swift, Texas to Fort Dix, New Jersey. The main body of the Special Troops departed from Camp Swift on 26 June and arrived at Fort Dix on 29 June 1944. At Fort Dix, preparations were made for overseas and the majority of the time was spent in packing and crating of equipment and supplies.

Two months after the arrival of the Division at Fort Dix, New Jersey, on 22 August 1944, the advance party departed and proceeded, under secret orders, to Fort Hamilton, New York, where they were processed for the overseas movement. On 28 August 1944 they embarked aboard the Queen Elizabeth and sailed to Gourock, Scotland, arriving at the Firth of Clyde on 3 September. On the same day they proceeded to Camp C5 near Winchester, England to await favorable channel weather, which cleared on 7 September. The Advance Party embarked this date aboard the Landing Ship Tender, "Princess of Astrid," from Southampton, England, arriving at Utah Beach, in the vicinity of Bayeaux, France on 8 September 1944. Here they loaded onto trucks and motored to Camp "500" at Valognes, France, to await the arrival of the Division.

On 6 September 1944, the main body of the Division departed from Fort Dix and entrained for Camp Kilmer, New Jersey where they were processed for overseas movement. On 11 September 1944, the Division embarked from the New York Port of Embarkation for France, arriving at Cherbourg on 23 September 1944. The following day in an autumnal downpour the troops disembarked and moved by truck, 23 kilometers to St. Pierre Eglise, France, to await the arrival of the Division's equipment. Here the troops were bivouacked along the hedgerows that, three months before, were running red with the blood of the invasion forces. The Division Headquarters was established in an old French schoolhouse which was released to the Division for that use by the Mayor of Theville and the townspeople furnished it with tables and chairs from their homes. Everywhere were the evidences of the German occupation. The massive pill boxes, mine fields, tank traps and tactical wire entanglements along the coast, air

fields, road blocks and robot launching sites further back, the ruins of Carentan, Montebourg, Valognes and St. Lo, giving everyone the opportunity for first-hand study of the battlefields of the invasion coast. Reminiscent of Normandy were the orchards of tart apples, narrow medieval streets of the villages, chateaus of former grandeur, hedge-row upon hedge-row around fertile grazing fields, unseasoned Calvados and Cider, the ruddy complexions and wooden shoes of the natives, yellow jackets by the thousands and the incessant rain and mud. This was the tempestuous Normandy Peninsula, our first introduction to the Old World.

Early in the month of October, various elements of the Division departed on missions to aid in the efforts of carrying the war to the enemy. On 28 October, the Special Troops, one of the last elements of the Division to depart from Normandy, proceeded to the vicinity of Schimmert, Holland, arriving thereat on 31 October 1944. This was our longest motor march ever accomplished in one continuous move. The first day out the column passed through Le Haye du Puits, Coutances, Avaranches, Fougères, Ernee, Mayenne, Sille-le-Guillaume and Le Mans where they bivouacked the first night. The second day they passed through St. Calais, Fontaine, Chateaudun, Toury, Angerville, Lonjumeau, Paris and Clinchy-Sous-Bois where the second night's bivouac was established. The third day they journeyed through Nanteuil, Soissons of World War I fame, Laon and Hirson where the third night was spent. On the fourth and last day out they passed through Rocroi, Givet, Namur, Tongres, Maastricht, the first Dutch City to be liberated, and Schimmert, where the last bivouac was spent. Here, tactical Command Posts were established and on 1 November the Rear Echelon continued on to Brunssum, Holland to establish the Division Administrative Headquarters in a Dutch School. The following day the Forward Echelon moved to the vicinity of Niederbusch, Germany where the first Division Command Post of the 102d Division to be on German soil was established. While in this sector General Dwight D. Eisenhower, Commander-in-Chief of the Allied Expeditionary Forces, made his first visit to the Division.

Committed to combat, the 102d Infantry Division pushed through the Siegfried Line across the Roer River plain. At the beginning of this drive, the units of Special Troops remained in Holland near the German border in the vicinity of Heerlen. Thanksgiving Day was spent in Holland and the Quartermaster Company provided everything needed for a fine turkey dinner. Shortly after Thanksgiving Day all Special Troop units moved onto German soil. The Division CP (Forward Echelon) was set up in a school building at Ubach with the 102d Signal Company nearby. The Rear Echelon, together

with the 102d Quartermaster Company and the 802d Ordnance Company, moved into the large buildings of the Carolus Magnus Coal Mine in Palenberg. All units remained in these locations during December and January and until 23 February 1945, when the crossing of the Roer River was made. While in these locations, Special Troops saw their first action against the enemy. On New Year's Day, anti-aircraft defenses of Special Troops and other anti-aircraft units shot down five of the six enemy planes which came over to bomb and strafe.

These months on the Roer plain were cold and rough. When the Rundstedt Drive came in December to the south, the 102d Division was selected to defend the vital Wurm corridor through which the enemy might strike down from the north through Geilenkirchen to link up with the Ardennes salient in the south. During these anxious times, the men of the 102d Quartermaster Company kept a continual flow of supplies coming in and every man in the division will give them credit for a job well done. The men of the 802d Ordnance Company worked day after day and many times nights in all sorts of weather and conditions to keep the vehicles rolling and the weapons in repair. The 102d Signal Company did an outstanding job of communication work, laying mile after mile of wire in cold and snow and keeping it in repair. An underground cable was discovered which had been used as a communication line in the Siegfried Line. This was converted to the use of the division, thus making possible very excellent communication during an important time. The men of the 102d Military Police Platoon guarded and patrolled a large area, directing traffic in many dangerous spots. These were days which called for the best in every man and that best was plenty good enough. The men of Special Troops found themselves tried, and they stood the test. Unit Citations for Meritorious Service have since been awarded to the 102d Military Police Platoon, the 102d Quartermaster Company, the 802d Ordnance Company, the 102d Signal Company, and the 102d Infantry Division Band.

When the Roer River was crossed and the drive to the Rhine began, Special Troops began to move deeper into Germany through Linnich, Gevenich, Erkelenz, Viersen, to Krefeld. At Krefeld all units spent Easter, 1 April 1945. Shortly after Easter the Division crossed the Rhine on the spectacular drive which ended on the Elbe River. The pace was very fast. Moves were accomplished almost every day. Lembeck, Buldern, Handorf, Werther, Bückeberg, Bad Oeynhausen, Bad Henndorf, Lehrte, Gifhorn, Oebisfeld, and Bismarck—all in rapid succession in the space of a few days. The men worked like beavers to keep the supplies and equipment rolling. So rapid was the advance that many enemy pockets were by-passed, and ev-

ery man had to be alert and ready for any emergency.

On April 9th, on a reconnaissance tour in advance of the Special Troops movement, Lt. Col. Steve Lichene and Major Samuel Robertson, together with Sgt. Emerson Poticher and T/5 Jack Peckham and Pvt. Tony Pardi, ran into an enemy road block near Buchholz. A battle followed in which the little group fought stubbornly and bravely against overwhelming odds. Sgt. Poticher was killed by mortar fire after fighting valiantly and, when their ammunition was exhausted, the others were taken prisoner. Two days later they rejoined the Division, bringing with them twelve German officers and two hundred and fifty German soldiers who had surrendered to them.

On the same day, Lt. Col. Kenneth Rees and his driver, Pfc. William Umbricht, ran into a group of German soldiers who were resting alongside the road. They halted their vehicle and ordered the Germans to advance with their arms raised. This they did, when suddenly a sniper from a hidden position opened fire, killing Pfc. Umbricht and wounding Lt. Col. Rees.

V-E Day came with all units of Special Troops in Gardelegen except the Rear Echelon which was located at Stendal. Since the end of the war in Europe the 102d Infantry Division has been engaged in occupational duty in various parts of Germany. From Gardelegen the Division moved to the very heart of Germany to Gotha, from Gotha to southern Germany on the Danube River at Vilshofen.

In June 1945, the personnel of Special Troops underwent a number of changes due to re-deployment based on the point system. Major Ronald A. Bettie, Major Richard W. Johnson, and Captain George J. Knoll were transferred to the 76th Infantry Division. Major Bettie was succeeded by Captain George H. Mansfield. Captain Knoll was succeeded by Captain William F. Kidder, who in turn was succeeded by Captain Myron B. Keyes as Executive Officer of Special Troops. Captain Dewey M. Hutchins assumed command of Headquarters Company. Captain Roy S. Conlisk succeeded Captain Jay E. Haynes as commanding officer of the Quartermaster Company, Captain Haynes being transferred to the Office of the Division Quartermaster.

The men of the Special Troops may well look back with satisfaction upon a task well done, a task that has not been easy in many ways, a task which called for work and cooperation and devotion to duty. Yet, we together have done what we set out to do. Our true record will stand in the heart of every man among us who in the time of need joined hands with other men in the common desire to preserve freedom and justice among men and to bring peace once again to our world.

From the Indian bowmen who were found by French explorers in the hills and mountains of Arkansas and Missouri came the Division name and insignia. The French TERRE AUX ARCS, Land of the Bows, became OZARK in American folklore. The arc in the insignia represents a bow superimposed on a circular target, together symbolizing marksmanship. Z completes the design, making O-Z-ARC for OZARK. Gold is for "valour" on a background of blue for "distinction." Marksmanship, valour, distinction are the OZARK ideals.

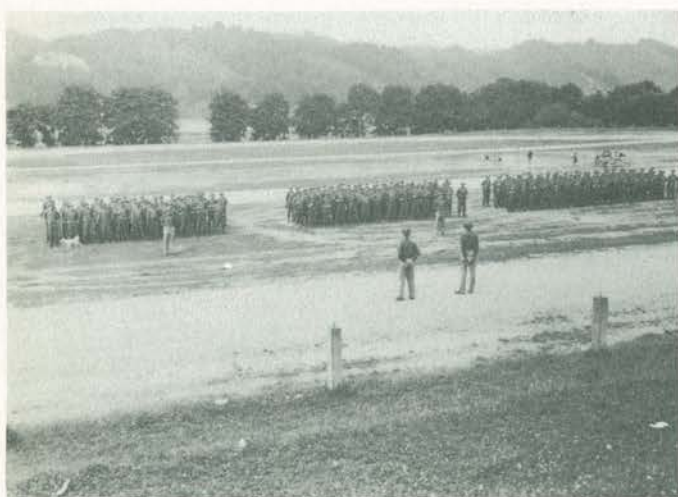

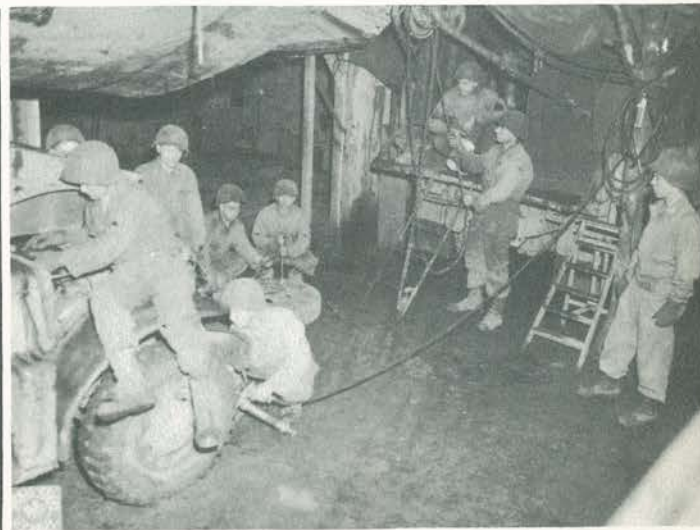

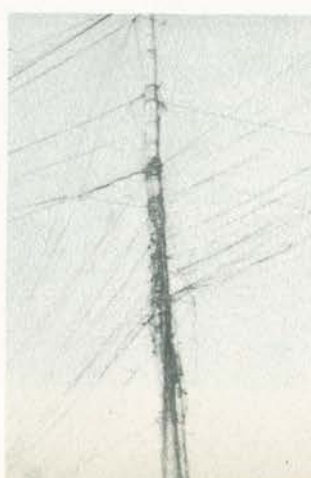

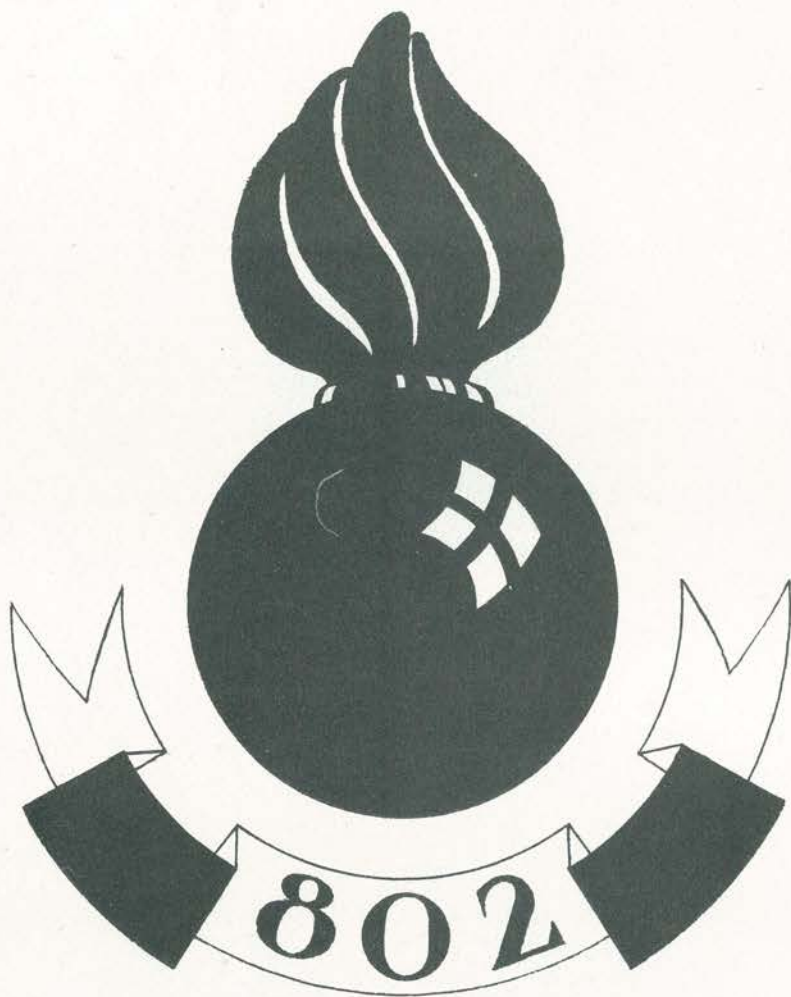

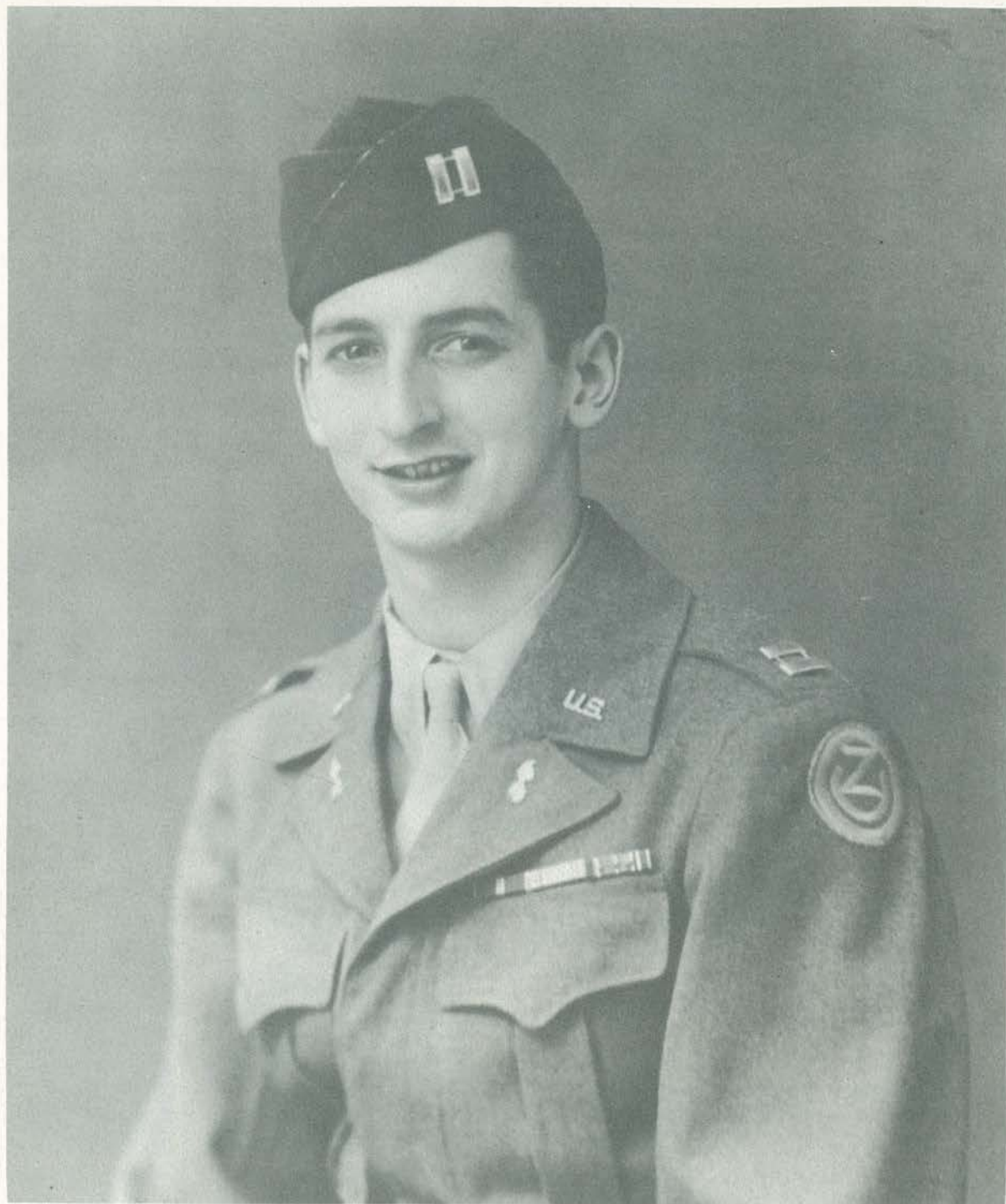

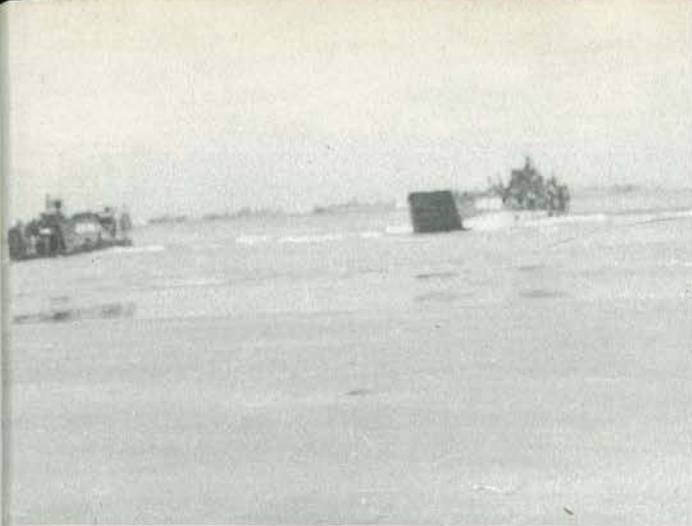

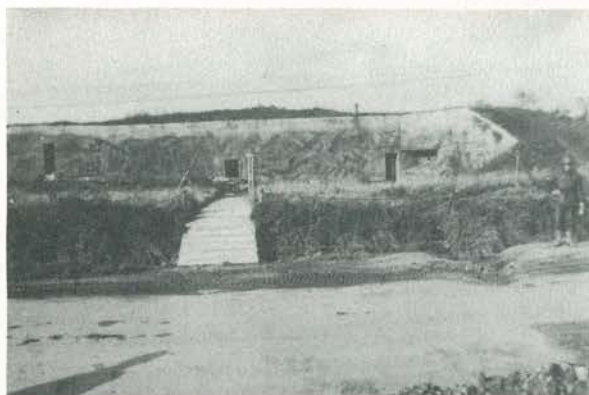

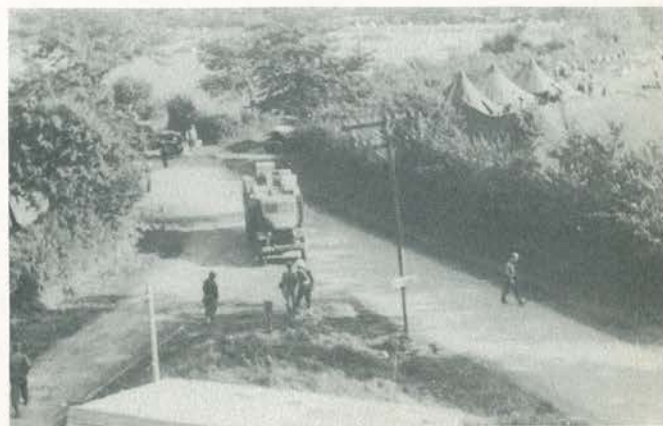

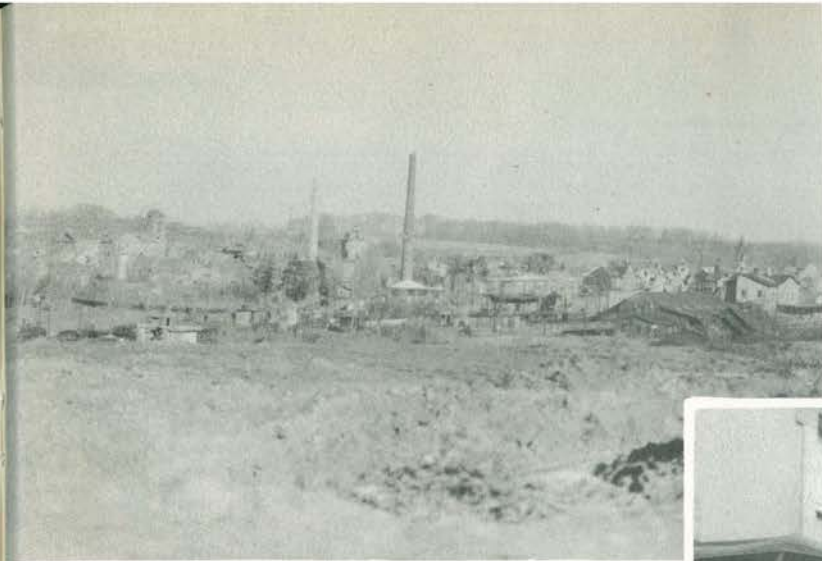

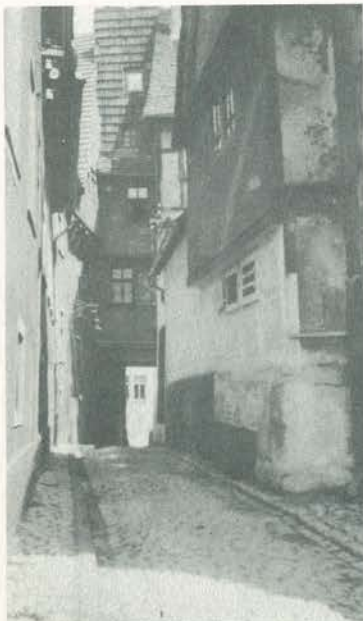

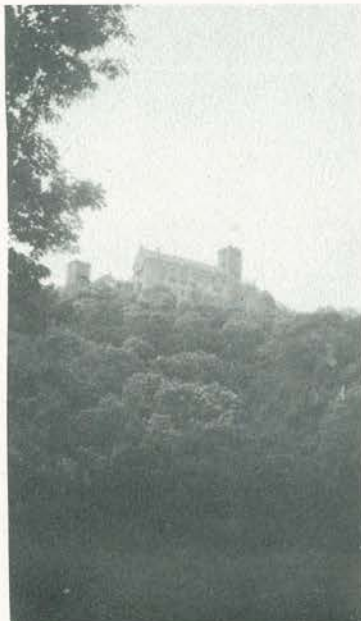

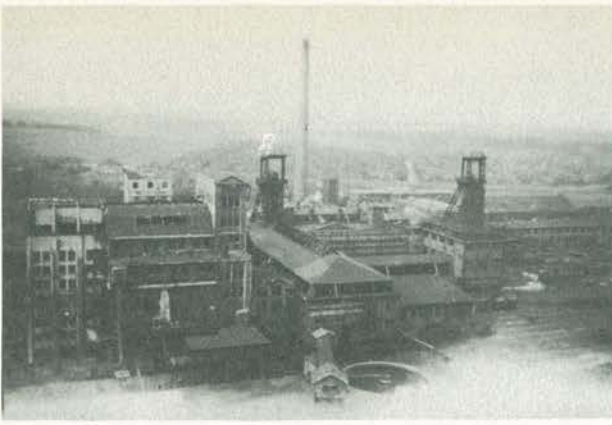

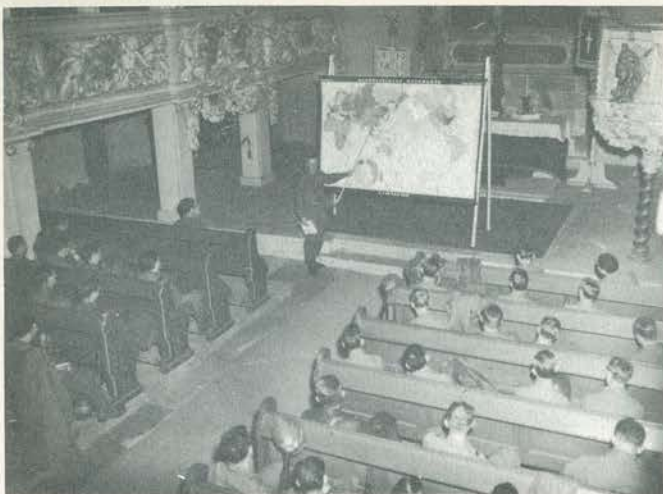

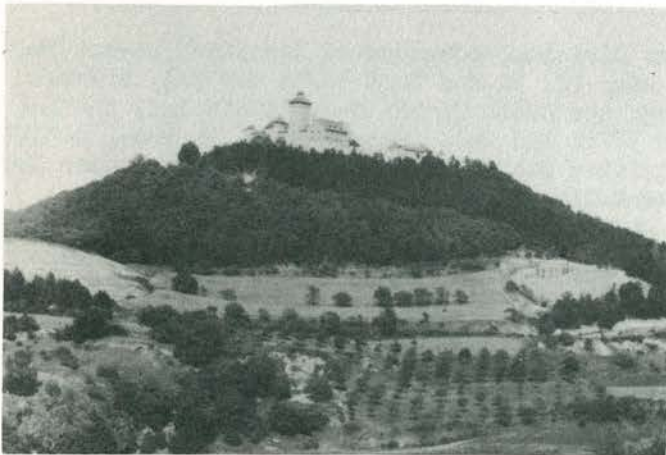
