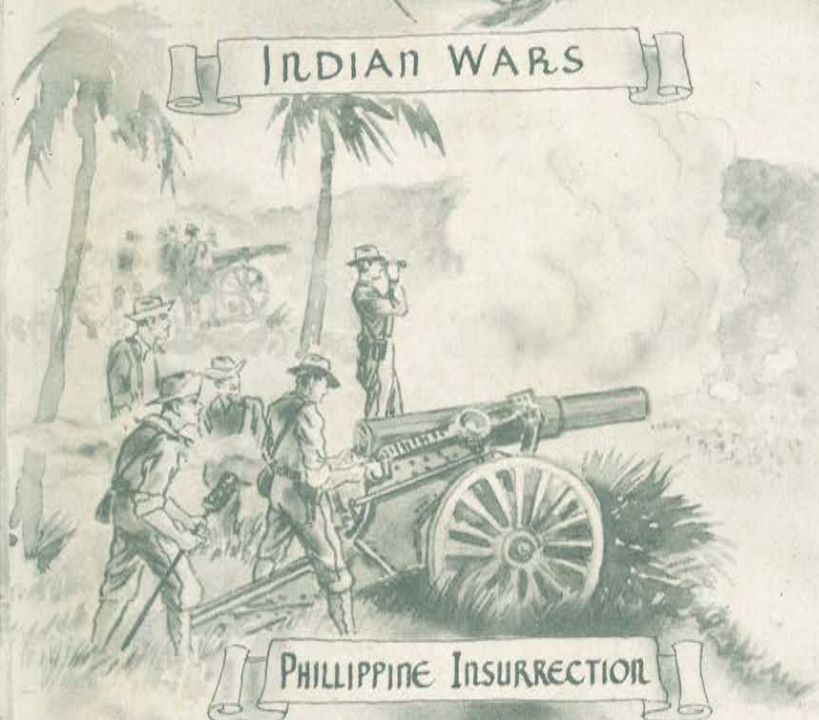

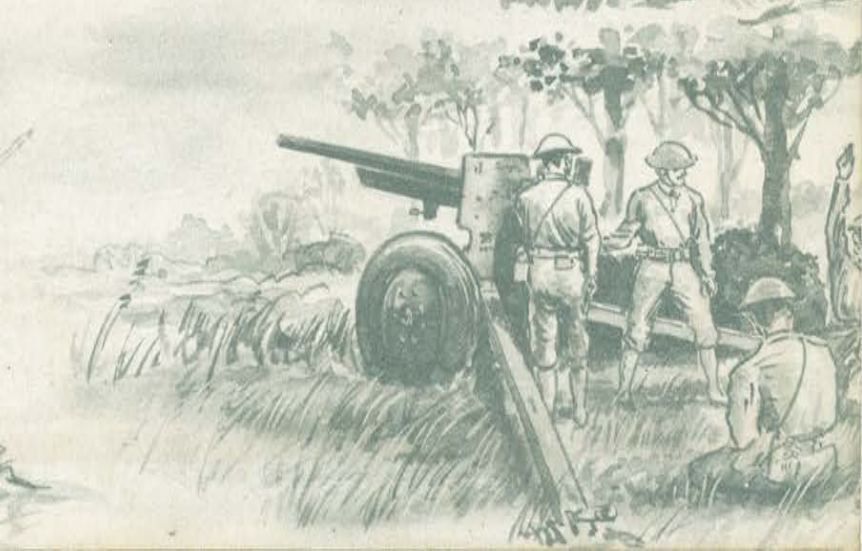

TO THE OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE THIRTY-THIRD INFANTRY DIVISION:

COMMANDING THE 33rd DIVISION

Graduated from the John Marshall Law School with an LL.B. degree in 1905, and admitted to the Illinois Bar in 1905. He enlisted in the 1st Illinois Cavalry in 1909, and after successive promotions as an enlisted man was appointed 1st Lieutenant in 1912; promoted to Captain in 1913 and commanded Troop I on the Mexican border in 1916. He served with the 33rd Division in France during the World War as Executive Officer of the 2nd Battalion, 122nd Field Artillery. In 1926 he was promoted to Colonel and commanded the 122nd Field Artillery until he was promoted to Brigadier General in 1936. In June, 1939, he was promoted to Major General and assigned Division Commander.

Born, November 10, 1894, Pontiac, Illinois. Enlisted March 3, 1913, as a Private in Company F, 3rd Infantry Illinois National Guard, and served successively as a Corporal, Sergeant and Regimental Staff Sergeant. From June 19, 1916 to Feb. 21, 1917 he spent as a 2nd Lieutenant at Fort Houston, Texas. Being recalled into Federal Service for World War I, July 25, 1917, he was commissioned 1st Lieutenant, 129th Infantry, October 21, 1917. He participated in many important battles: Meuse-Argonne; Daunevoux-Gucourt; Meuse River; Somme Amiens (Albert Sector) and Verdun Sector Hill 304. From October 17 to December 21, 1918, he spent in the hospital suffering from effects of gas and exhaustion. He returned to the United States May 22, 1919, and was discharged June 21, 1919. Commissioned Captain 129th Infantry, October 6, 1921; Commissioned Major, Machine Gun Officer, 129th Infantry January 18, 1924; Commissioned Lieutenant Colonel Machine Gun Officer, 33rd Division July 13, 1927. In June, 1929, he was transferred as Lieutenant Colonel, Ordnance Officer, 33rd Division. Commissioned Colonel G.S.C.: Chief of Staff, 33rd Division, January 30, 1941.

He enlisted at Kenosha, Wisconsin, on May 24, 1917, and became successively Private, Corporal, and Sergeant in the 128th Infantry, Wisconsin National Guard until he was honorably discharged as a Sergeant on February 17, 1919. He re-enlisted in the U. S. Army December 29, 1920, as a Private and became a Sergeant in the Infantry and DEML until he was again honorably discharged January 31, 1925. He again re-enlisted in the U. S. Army June 16, 1925 and became successively a Private, Sergeant, Staff Sergeant, Tech Sergeant, and Master Sergeant in the Infantry and DEML until he was honorably discharged to accept a commission on March 3, 1941. He was appointed Major of Infantry and appointed Assistant G-1, 33rd Division on March 5, 1941. Detailed to the General Staff Corps on May 17, 1941, appointed Acting Assistant Chief of Staff G-1 on May 22, 1941, and then appointed Assistant Chief of Staff G-1 on December 19, 1941. G-1...PERSONNEL

This section is charged with the formulation of policies and the supervision of the execution of administrative arrangements pertaining to the personnel of the command as individuals, civilians under supervision or control of the command and prisoners of war. However, there are many other varied duties that come under this section. Some of them are:

Procurement, Classification, Reclassification, Assignments, Pay, Promotion, Transfers, Retirements and Discharge of all Personnel.

Replacements of all Personnel.

Decorations, Citations, Honors and Awards.

Leaves of Absence and Furloughs.

Rewards and Punishments.

Internal Arrangements of Headquarters.

Religious, Recreational and Welfare Work; Supervision of Military and Non-Military Agencies devoted to such work.

Army Postal Service.

Finished Reports and Grants, Casualty Reports, Prisoner of War Reports, Station Lists and other Personnel Statistics.

General Regulations and Routine Administration which especially concern individuals or Routine Administration not specifically assigned to any other General Staff Section.

Furnishing the Commander advice on Morale.

Collection and Disposition of Stragglers.

Collection and Disposition of Prisoners of War.

Sanitation.

Relations of Civil Government Civilians in the theatre of operations including Initial Establishment and operation of Military Government or Martial Law.

Maintenance of Law and Order within the Command.

Graves Registration Service including Burial.

Supervision of matters concerning members of our forces who are prisoners in enemy hands.

Enlisted March 30, 1917, Company L, 1st Illinois Infantry, now known as the 131st Infantry. Served as Private, Corporal and Sergeant during World War I, until June 5, 1919. During the war he was awarded the British Military Medal for bravery in the field while the 131st Infantry were joined with British forces in the Somme offensive, France, July 1918. He also received the American Silver Star Medal for valor in the Meuse-Argonne offensive.

He re-enlisted in the 131st Infantry, July 21, 1924, and was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant on June 26, 1929.

Other dates of promotion are: 1st Lieutenant, April 15, 1931; Captain, July 13, 1932; Major, January 15, 1940; Lieutenant Colonel, December 6, 1940.

A graduate of Infantry Officers Course and the Battalion Commander-Staff Officers Course at the Infantry School, Fort Benning, Georgia.

This section is charged with the planning of preparation of orders and to some extent with operations pertaining to the collection, evaluation, interpretation and distribution of information of the enemy and with counter-intelligence activities. The primary purpose, however, is to keep the Commander and all the others concerned informed regarding the enemy's situation and capabilities. Some of their many duties are as follows:

Protection by personnel of the section, of information bearing on enemy capabilities or terrain not under our control.

Maintenance of contact and exchange of information with Intelligence Sections of subordinate, higher, and neighboring units.

Maintenance of contact with other Intelligence Agencies of the Government and duly accredited foreign attaches and missions.

Supervision of the solution of the enemy's secret communications (code).

Co-ordination of requests for aerial photographs and to some extent determination of distribution.

Planning and supervision of combat intelligence training within the Units.

Regulation of the activities of newspaper correspondents, photographers, broadcasters, visitors and other civilians accompanying or serving with troops.

Regulation of the dissemination of information to the public.

Censorship.

Propaganda or dissemination of false information to the enemy.

Supervision of the preparation and use of codes and ciphers.

Enlisting in the U. S. Army in September, 1918, he entered the United States Military Academy on June 12, 1919, as a cadet, and graduated on June 12, 1923, and commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant, Corps of Engineers. He returned to civil life and then became successively 2nd Lieutenant, Corps of Engineers, ORC; 1st Lieutenant of Infantry, Illinois National Guard, Commanding Company M, 132nd Infantry; then Captain, Corps of Engineers, as Aide-de-Camp to the Commanding General, 33rd Division; then Major, Corps of Engineers, Asst. G-3, 33rd Division; then Lieutenant Colonel, Corps of Engineers, as Inspector General and G-3, 33rd Division.

G-3...PLANS AND TRAINING

The operation and training section is charged with those functions of the staff which relate to organization, training and combat operations. It is responsible for tactical and training inspections as directed by the Commander. Some specific duties of this section include:

Preparation and co-ordination of plans for and supervision of (a) mobilization of the command, (b) organization and equipment of units.

Preparation of training directives, programs and orders, selection of training sites and firing and bombing ranges; organization and conduct of school.

Determine where and when any of our units needs replacements or reinforcements. Determine status of equipment and supplies. Location, morale and capabilities of the troops; action of adjacent and supporting units and the enemy's situation which is done in connection with G-2.

Preparation of plans, forms, supervision of activities concerning:

Reconnaissance and security measures.

Troop movements.

Tactical employment of units.

Defense of administrative installations in lines of communication.

Practical measures to preserve secrecy and effect surprise.

Preparation and authentication of field orders and operation maps required to carry out technical plans and their transmission to units and staff officers concerned.

Supervision of signal communications.

He enlisted in the U. S. Army in May, 1918, and was detailed to the C.O.T.S., Camp Gordon, Ga. He was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant, Infantry, ORC, on November 30, 1918, and made a 1st Lieutenant, Infantry, ORC, on February 23, 1924. On January 17, 1927, he was made a Captain of Infantry in the Illinois National Guard and assigned to Headquarters Company, 130th Infantry. On January 1, 1936, he was promoted to Major, Infantry, Illinois National Guard, in the 1st Battalion, 130th Infantry. On August 24, 1940, he was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel, Infantry, Illinois National Guard, in the 2nd Battalion, 130th Infantry, and on January 27, 1941, as a Lieutenant Colonel, was assigned to the General Staff Corps, Headquarters, 33rd Division, G-1.

He graduated from the Infantry School at Fort Benning, Ga., on May 25, 1935; from the 6th Corps Area, Command and Staff School on January 21, 1939, and from the Command and General Staff School, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, on June 12, 1939.

He saw active duty (state) in the Taylorville Mine Riot, Taylorville, Illinois, 15 days in December, 1929; 124 days from August 15, 1932, to December 31, 1932; and 49 days in 1933. Also 67 days flood duty in 1939 in southern Illinois.

In 1930 he coached the Illinois National Guard Rifle Team at Camp Perry, Ohio.

He was Commander of American Legion Post No. 105 in 1925 and Chef de Gare in 1926. He was National Rifle Champion, A.L., in 1929 at Louisville, Kentucky.

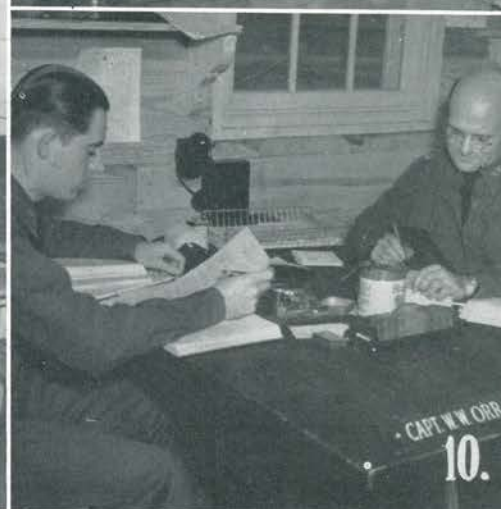

G-4 . . . S U P P L Y

The supply and evacuation section is charged with the preparation of policies for and the supervision of execution of arrangements for supply, evacuation, transportation and other administrative matters related thereto. It is responsible for advising the commander relative to the extent of the administrative support that can be given any proposed strategical or tactical line of action and the recommendation as to the necessary decisions concerning supply and evacuation. Some of the specific duties of this section are:

- Procurement, storage, distribution of all supplies including animals.
- Location of supplies, evacuation and maintenance establishments.
- Transportation of supplies by land, air and water.
- Construction and maintenance of roads and trails, docks and airdromes.
- Maintenance of equipment.
- Recommendations for allocations of small arms ammunition and anti-tank mines.
- Traffic control.
- Construction, operation and maintenance of utilities and other facilities relating to supply, shelter, transportation, hospitalization exclusive of fortifications.
- Evacuation and hospitalization of men and animals.
- Assignment, movement of supply, medical, technical and labor troops not employed as combat troops.
- Salvage.
- Collection and disposition of captured supplies and equipment and animals.
- Acquisition and improvement of airplane bases.
- Property responsibilities.
- Construction, operation and maintenance of military railways.
- Operation of inland waterways.
- Procurement of Real Estate, shelter and facilities including their leasing, repair, maintenance and disposition.
- Acquisition and improvement of airplane bases.

SPECIAL

ADJUTANT GENERAL'S SECTION

The Senior Officer of the Adjutant General's Department assigned to the Division is designated as Adjutant General, 33rd Division. He is a member of the Special Staff and operates under the Commanding General. He is the agent through whom the Division Commander handles administration, the coordinator of administrative matters pertaining to the Division, completing action on cases covered by existing policies and initiating action for decision of the Commanding General on cases for which no such policy exists. His duties include the handling of official correspondence; operation of all activities of the headquarters pertaining to assignment, transfer, promotion, retirement, discharge, classification, procurement, replacement of personnel, leaves of absence, furloughs, assignment of quarters, decorations, citations, honors and awards, education, recreation, and welfare; authentication and distribution of all orders and instructions, except those pertaining to combat operations; preparation and submission of returns, reports of strength, casualties, captured material, and prisoners of war; preparation and distribution of the station list; the direction and supervision of the Army Postal Service in the command.

His office is the office of record for the headquarters and the Adjutant General will personally control all completed files, confidential or otherwise, except those pertaining to intelligence matters.

CHEMICAL WARFARE SECTION

The Chemical Warfare Section consists of the division chemical officer, two captain assistants, and seven enlisted men. The division chemical officer is an adviser to the commander and the staff on all matters pertaining to chemical warfare, both offensive and defensive, and is responsible to the commander for the proper execution of chemical warfare training, the supply of protective equipment, the protection of the command against chemical attack, the collection and dissemination of all chemical warfare information, and technical and tactical advice on all operations involving chemicals.

CHAPLAIN'S SECTION

The Chaplain is the Minister of the Gospel in the army. He serves all the military personnel alike, irrespective of faith or creed. His duties differ from the work of the pastor in civilian life only as they are modified by military conditions. HISTORY OF



Troops of the 129th Infantry, 33rd Division, coming ashore in English Lighter, No. 34, Brest, France, May 24, 1918.

WAR OF 1812. In 1809 Nathaniel Pope, Secretary of the Territory of Illinois, as acting Governor began preparations for the erection of a military department. From that time until 1811, there were organized in Illinois four regiments. In 1811 Captain White's company of Gallatin County militia was active in the Battle of Tippecanoe. In 1812 an expedition of 312 Illinois militia attacked villages of the Kickapoo and Miami Indians and again in 1813 Illinois militia made successful attacks on the tribes of central Illinois.

BLACK HAWK WAR. During the Black Hawk War of 1831-32, the State of Illinois furnished 174 companies of volunteer rangers and spies, which were actually mustered into the service of the United States for various periods of time. No decisive engagements were fought until July 21, 1832, when Black Hawk was defeated. On August 2 a battle on the banks of the Mississippi virtually ended the war. Abraham Lincoln, who was a volunteer from Illinois in this war, may be said to have been a member of one of the antecedents of the 33rd Division.

MEXICAN WAR. During the Mexican War, Illinois supplied four regiments for a twelve-month service period, two regiments for "during the war," and four independent companies of cavalry for "during the war," and several companies as parts of Regular Army regiments.

THE CIVIL WAR. Typical of other post-war periods, the years between the Mexican and Civil Wars were marked by military decadence, so that when the President issued his call for volunteers on April 15, 1861, Illinois had no trained and organized militia companies to offer. There were, however, several independent militia companies throughout the state and many of these formed the nucleus of splendid companies. In every phase of this great war, Illinois troops played an important part. At Shiloh, Fort Henry, Fort Donelson, Corinth, Vicksburg, Chickamauga, Gettysburg and other battle fronts, Illinois troops contributed their share to the saving of the Union by courageous and brilliant fighting.

POST-WAR PERIOD. In the years that followed, the Illinois National Guard became more efficient, better trained, better equipped than in any preceding period. One of the first suggestions of motorization was made during 1890-91, when each regiment of Infantry organized and maintained a bicycle corps for messenger service. When the call came for active service in the Spanish-American War, Illinois was prepared to send her share of well-trained soldiers to the front.

SPANISH-AMERICAN WAR. In this war, as in all other emergencies of the past, Illinois not only filled her quota, but was ready to send more troops into service. However, they, like many other mobilized units throughout the United States, were not allowed to engage the enemy in battle.

EARLY PART OF THE CENTURY. Following the Spanish-American War, the Illinois troops resumed peace-time military training. A great impetus to the development of the National Guard came in 1903 when Congress passed and approved an "Act to promote the efficiency of the militia," which provided that the National Guard become a part of the military force of the U. S. Another impetus was the passage by the 40th General Assembly of Illinois of a code requiring examination of all candidates for commissions. An appropriation of \$395,000 was made to begin the erection of armories.

MEXICAN BORDER. During the Mexican border dispute of 1916, Illinois units were stationed in Texas all the way from El Paso to Brownsville. There they engaged in maneuvers and other military training.

WORLD WAR. When the President's first call came in 1917, most of the regiments of the Illinois National Guard, following a few months of guarding railroad bridges and industrial plants and preliminary training near home, were again mobilized in Texas, this time at Camp Logan. There they were formed into the 33rd Division under command of a regular army general, an Illinoisan, Major General George Bell, Jr. Intensive training began and in 1918 the first units were sent to embarkation points. By early summer, the entire division was in France. With the exception of the First Field Artillery and the Eighth Infantry, all of the Illinois regiments were reorganized in Texas into four war strength regiments of Infantry, two to a brigade; two additional regiments of field artillery; a regiment of combat engineers; a field signal battalion; three machine-gun battalions; a trench mortar battery; a military police company; and ammunition, sanitary and supply trains.

ORGANIZATION OF 33RD DIVISION. The division was commanded by Major General George Bell, Jr. The 65th Infantry Brigade was commanded by Brig. Gen. Edward L. King, and Brig. Gen. Paul A. Wolf commanded the 66th Infantry Brigade. The 58th Field Artillery Brigade was commanded by Brig. Gen. Henry D. Todd, Jr.

The two infantry regiments comprising the 65th Brigade were designated the 129th, commanded by Col. Charles H. Greene, and the 130th, commanded (in France) by Col. John V. Clinkin.

The 129th Infantry was made up entirely of units of the old Third Illinois, a regiment with a history dating back to 1811. The 130th Infantry, made up of the old Fourth Illinois, was originally organized in 1882.

The two regiments of the 66th Brigade were the 131st Infantry, commanded by Col. Joseph Sanborn, and the 132nd Infantry, commanded by Col. Abel Davis. Both regiments were from Chicago. The 131st, formerly the First Illinois, was organized in 1874. In France, 353 members gave their lives. The 132nd, formerly the Second Illinois, was originally organized in 1875.

Three regiments composed the 58th Field Artillery Brigade. They were the 122nd, commanded by Col. Milton J. Foreman; the 123rd, commanded by Col. Charles G. Davis; the 124th, commanded by Col. Horatio N. Hackett.

From the handful of courageous pioneers who first settled in the area now covered by the State of Illinois and who organized into bands of militia to protect themselves from marauding Indians, there leads down the years to the present a trail of unselfish service and glorious military achievements which today form the proud traditions and heritage of the Illinois National Guard.

PRE-REVOLUTIONARY PERIOD. Boisbriant, Commandant of the Illinois District of the Province of Louisiana for the French Government, organized the provincial militia during the period from 1712-1723. These organizations fought the Fox, Natchez and Chickasaw Indians.

REVOLUTIONARY WAR. Through the use of local militia, George Rogers Clark won and held the Illinois country for the United States during the Revolution. Without a fight, Clark managed to win the Illinois country, established it as a county of Virginia, made the French his allies, and gained the neutrality of the Indians. After a one-day siege he captured Vincennes from the British.

THE THIRTY-THIRD DIVISION

The 122nd was made up of the Chicago element of the old Illinois First Cavalry, organized in 1894 and converted into field artillery in 1917. The 123rd was converted from the Sixth Illinois Infantry. The 124th had as its nucleus three troops of the old First Cavalry located in Springfield and Urbana. The rest of the personnel came from East St. Louis and Peoria. The 58th Brigade served in France as an Army rather than as a divisional artillery brigade. At no time was it in action with its own 33rd Division. Instead, it served with great success as supporting artillery to five other infantry divisions in succession.

One of the finest combat organizations of the 33rd Division was the 108th Engineer Regiment, commanded by Col. Henry A. Allen. It was organized in Chicago in 1911 as Engineer Co. A, Illinois National Guard.

The three machine-gun battalions of the division, the 122nd, commanded by Major Mariano B. Southwick, the 123rd, commanded by Major Albert L. Culbertson, and the 124th, commanded by Major Floyd F. Putnam, were made up of troops formerly belonging to the Fifth and Seventh Illinois Infantry Regiments.

The 108th Trench Mortar Battery was commanded by Captain Charles J. Kraft.

The 108th Field Signal Battalion was commanded by, in turn, Majors Charles R. Forbes, John P. Lucas, and Alvin A. McNeal. It was originally organized as a Signal Company in 1891.

The ammunition, supply, and medical trains and the military police were all grouped with divisional headquarters troops, under the command of Col. Charles D. Center.

The 108th Ammunition Train, commanded by Lt. Col. Walter J. Fisher, was attached to the 58th Field Artillery Brigade.

The 108th Sanitary Train, commanded by Col. Harry D. Orr, was composed of four field hospitals and four ambulance companies.

COMBAT RECORD OF THE 33RD DIVISION. No finer summary of the combat actions of the 33rd Division in France could be cited than that written by General John J. Pershing in a letter of commendation to the Division. He wrote: "The Division had an interesting and varied battle experience. One of those schooled with the British Expeditionary Forces, it arrived in France towards the end of May, 1918, where it trained with the Fourth Army. Although, as a division, it did not enter the line here, yet the majority of the organizations had hard fighting experience before they left the British sector. On July 4, 1918, parts of the 131st and 132nd Regiments of Infantry, brigaded with Australian troops, successfully attacked Hamel and the Hamel and Vaire Woods. On August 9, the 131st Infantry, under the 58th British Division, successfully attacked Chipilly Ridge and the Gresaire Wood, an operation made especially difficult by the nature of the terrain. Towards the end of August, the division joined the First American Army in the Toul sector, remaining in reserve until September 5. On September 10, it relieved a French division in the Blercourt area, southwest of Verdun. It took part in the opening of the great Meuse-Argonne offensive, capturing the Bois-de-Forges, and occupying the sector facing the Meuse River. Beginning with October 8, it participated in the operations east of the Meuse, pressing vigorous attacks on the 11th, 12th and 13th in the vicinity of Consenvoye and the Bois de Chaume and the Bois de Plat Chene. It remained astride of the Meuse until it was relieved on October 21, during which entire period it was constantly subjected to heavy artillery and machine-gun fire from the heights of the west bank, and was continually in action. On October 26 it re-entered the line in the Troyon sector, where it took part in the attack of the Second Army, driving the enemy from the towns of St. Hilaire and Marcheville and occupying the towns of Butgneyville and Riaville. The division was advancing when hostilities ended with the armistice."

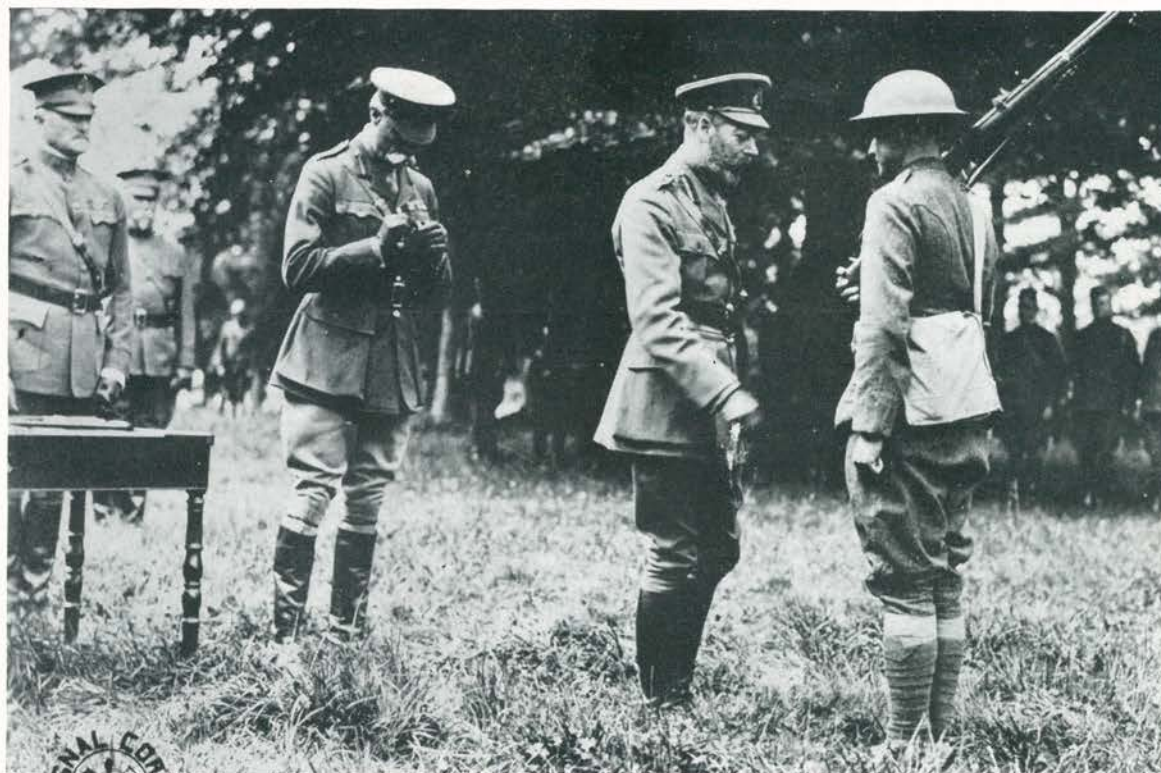
In a final message to the people of Illinois, Major General Bell said, in part: "The 33rd Division accomplished every task assigned to it, and often in less than the time allotted. Not a single failure is recorded against it. Not a scandal has occurred to mar the glory of its achievement. It is a record surpassed by none, and equaled by few."

33RD DIVISION TODAY. In 1921 the Illinois National Guard was reorganized and designated by the War Department as the 33rd Division. Since then its commanders have been Major Generals Joseph Sanborn, Milton J. Foreman, Roy D. Keehn, and Samuel T. Lawton, its present commander. At the end of 1940, the 33rd Division and attached troops were organized as follows: A major general commanding, assisted by a staff of 22 officers; two infantry brigades, each having two regiments;

HISTORY OF SPECIAL TROOPS



BATTALION HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY, 33rd INFANTRY DIVISION. Badge: Approved May 12, 1930. Superimposed on a yellow cross cantoned with rays of silver forming 12 points, a gold annulet bearing on sinister side 3 heads of wheat and on dexter side 3 ears of corn, and surrounding an enameled disk divided per pale argent, gules and azure, surmounted by a silver head of Abraham Lincoln.

33rd MILITARY POLICE COMPANY. Badge: Same as Division Headquarters except disk is divided per chevron reversed vert and or.

33rd SIGNAL COMPANY. Badge: Same as Division Headquarters except disk is divided per chevron reversed argent (white) and tenne (orange).

108th ORDNANCE COMPANY (MM). Badge: Same as Division Headquarters except disk is divided per chevron reversed or (yellow) and gules (crimson).

The history of Special Troops, 33rd Infantry Division is a history of the individual units for the period prior to 1924.

From the standpoint of history, the 33rd Signal Company is the oldest organization of the Battalion. This company traces its ancestry prior to 1896 when several telegraph operators enlisted in Co. B of the Second Illinois Infantry and formed the nucleus of a regimental signal platoon. In 1896 it was designated Company A Signal Corps, Illinois National Guard. During the Spanish-American War it served in Puerto Rico as the Seventh Company, Signal Corps, United States Volunteers, being mustered out December 4, 1898. On June 19, 1916 the company was ordered to the Mexican border, served for 6 months and was mustered out at Fort Sheridan January 3, 1917.

On August 5, 1917, it was mustered into Federal Service in preparation for the World War and expanded into a field signal battalion. It reached Calais June 10, 1917 and participated in three offensives—Hamel, Molliers, and Meuse-Argonne. After forming a part of the Army of Occupation, the battalion returned to New York, May 24, 1919 and was demobilized.

MILITARY POLICE COMPANY

The 33rd Military Police Company traces its ancestry to the 108th Train Headquarters and Military Police Company which was formed October 10, 1917 at Camp Logan, Houston, Texas. The company sailed with the 33rd Division and landed at Brest, France, May 18, 1918.

It participated in the Somme offensive, on the Meuse-Argonne front, and in Lorraine.

In November, 1918, it was redesignated 33rd Military Police Company and ordered to Luxembourg, where it remained until ordered home. Demobilization was completed June 5, 1919.

The present company was organized and received Federal recognition October 23, 1923.

HEADQUARTERS COMPANY

When the 33rd Division was created at Camp Logan, Houston, Texas, the forerunner of the present Headquarters Company was organized as Headquarters Detachment and Headquarters Troops. It went overseas with Division Headquarters, arriving at Brest, France, May 24, 1918 and received its preliminary training in the Huppy Training Area. It returned home and was mustered out with the rest of the 33rd Division.

The present Headquarters Company was organized and received Federal Recognition December 17, 1923.

108th ORDNANCE COMPANY

This organization was organized and received Federal recognition October 29, 1923.

HEADQUARTERS SPECIAL TROOPS

In order to take care of the administration and supply of the battalion, the headquarters detachment was organized and received Federal recognition, February 25, 1924.

MEDICAL DEPARTMENT DETACHMENT

Prior to 1936, there was no medical detachment organically included in Special Troops. However, in 1936 a detachment was organized and received Federal Recognition on May 23, 1936.

SIGNAL COMPANY

The 33rd Signal Company was formed and received Federal recognition June 8, 1922.

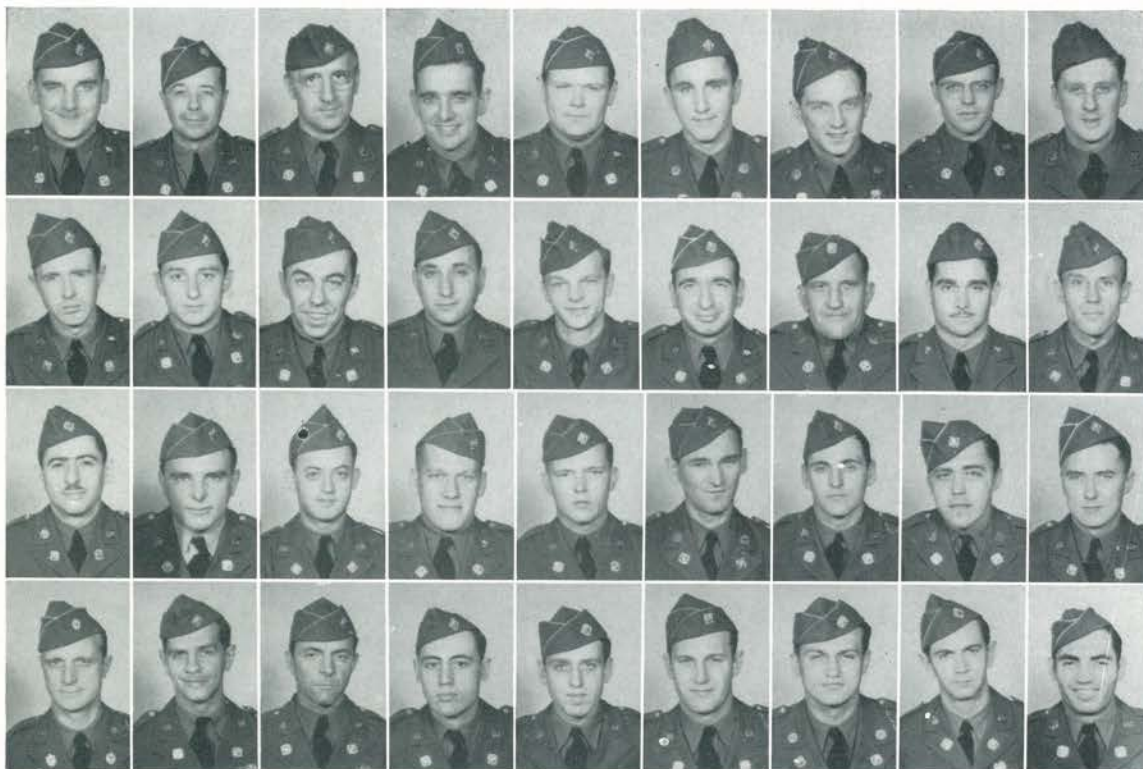

HISTORY OF THE 65th INFANTRY BRIGADE



Badge: Approved May 12, 1930. Superimposed on a yellow cross cantoned with rays of silver forming 12 points, a gold annulet bearing on sinister side 3 heads of wheat and on dexter side 3 ears of corn, and surrounding an enameled disk of solid white, surmounted by a silver head of Abraham Lincoln.

The 65th Infantry Brigade came into being through the Tables of Organization for the 33rd Division in 1917 soon after our entrance into World War service.

The brigade, one of two infantry brigades of the 33rd Division, was composed of the 129th and 130th Infantry Regiments, both of which date back to the War of 1812.

The 129th Infantry was made up entirely of units of the old Third Regiment, Illinois Militia, organized in January, 1810. The regiment, right through changes in officer personnel and through its redesignations, has seen hard soldiering service at least once in each generation since then. Shortly after its organization, it was pressed into service to protect settlers in the Illinois Territory from Indians, incited by the British in the War of 1812.

The Black Hawk Indian Wars in 1831 caused four companies of the regiment to be called out for active service once again. In less than another generation, it was mustered into Federal service for the Mexican War (1846). Barely 20 years later, it was mustered into Federal service again for Civil War enlistment. Then, with the coming of the Spanish-American War, 1898, the Regiment was redesignated the Third Illinois Volunteers, on being mustered into Federal service for the Puerto Rican campaign.

With its exemplary service on the Mexican Border and in the World War, the Regiment's war record is complete.

The 130th Infantry Regiment, the second unit going to make up the present 65th Infantry Brigade, was originally organized in 1811 as the Fourth Illinois Militia. This unit, too, saw strenuous service in the War of 1812, largely in repelling Indians. A mere 15 years later, in 1827, it was called upon to fight off the hostile Winnebago Indians. Five years later, the Indians once more gave the Regiment trouble, for the governor of Illinois called four companies to Beardstown in the Black Hawk Wars. One of these was from Sangamon County—captained by Abraham Lincoln.

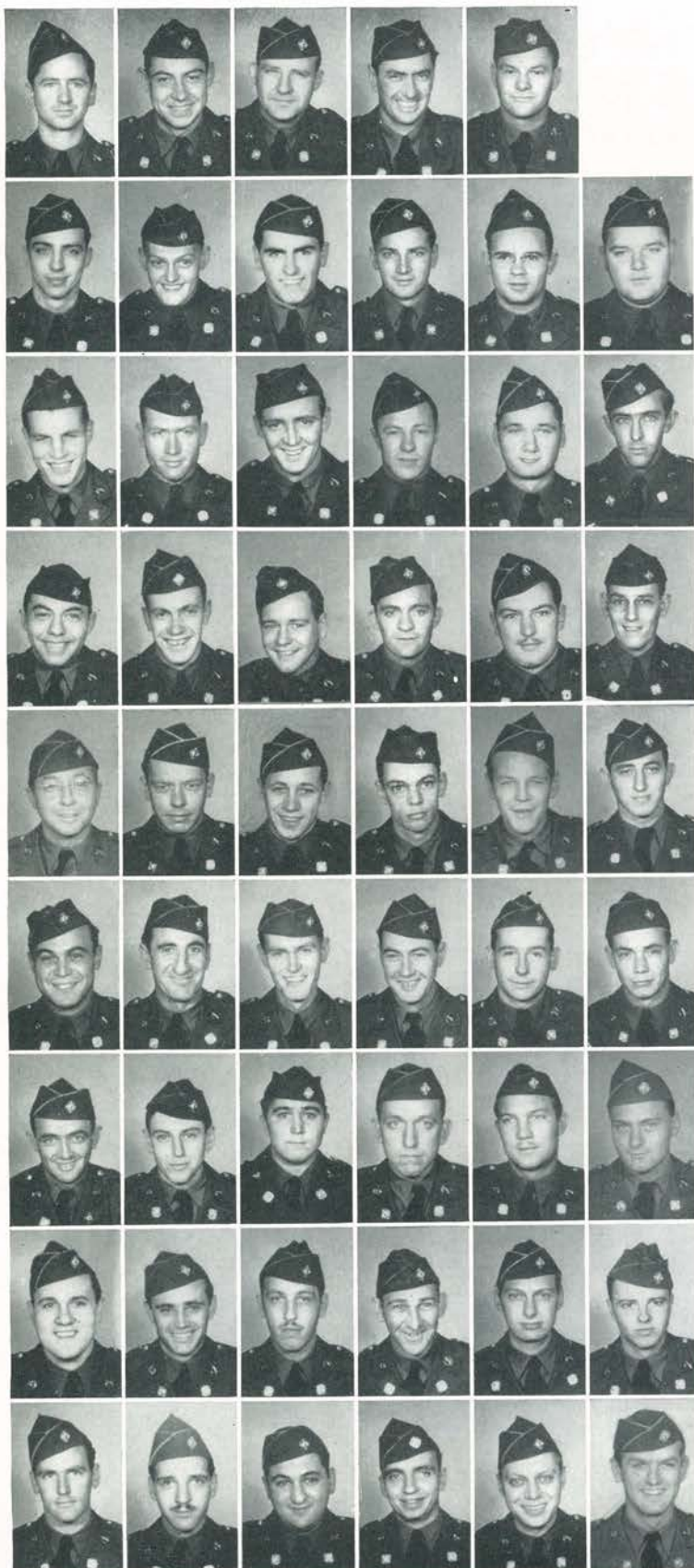
The Mexican War, the Civil War, the Spanish-American War, the Mexican Border trouble, and finally, the World War, enriched the battle tradition of the Regiment. In the first, Santa Anna's famous wooden leg was captured by a sergeant of Company G.

Of these two regiments, the 129th Infantry, commanded by Colonel Cassius Poust, originated in Northern Illinois. The 130th Infantry under command of Colonel Robert Davis, originated in Southern Illinois. Both of these Commanders served overseas with distinction.

The 65th Infantry Brigade was ordered to active duty under Executive Order No. 8863 and proceeded to Camp Forrest, Tennessee, March 5, 1941. The Brigade is commanded by Brigadier-General Diller S. Myers.



HISTORY OF THE 129th INFANTRY



The shield is blue for infantry. The Spanish castle and cactus are for Spanish-American War and Mexican border service, respectively, while the four fleur-de-lis are for the World War honors of the organization, namely: Somme offensive, Meuse-Argonne, Picardy, and Lorraine.

The 129th Infantry was originally organized under the authority of the territorial government of the Territory of Illinois in 1810. It was designated the Third Regiment, Illinois Militia. Officers were commissioned, beginning with Colonel Isaac White, June 27, 1810.

June 15, 1831, four of its companies were mobilized at a camp near Rushville, Illinois, and marched to the Rock River where they took part in the Black Hawk War.

July 2, 1846, the regiment was mobilized at Alton, Illinois, under command of Colonel Ferris Foreman, and was mustered into the service of the United States for the Mexican War. It was brigaded with the Fourth Regiment, Illinois Militia, and placed in General Paterson's Division. It was mustered out of the service May 25, 1847.

At the outbreak of the Civil War, the first regiment called to service was numbered the Seventh, because the first to sixth numbers had served in the Mexican War. The regiment was mobilized at Pontiac, Illinois, and was mustered into the service September 8, 1862, under the command of Colonel George P. Smith. It participated in various campaigns, and was mustered out June 10, 1865.

After the Civil War, separate companies of the old regiment were reorganized and were known by names relating to the cities in which they were located, and on December 21, 1875, were reformed into and designated the Third Regiment, Illinois National Guard.

May 7, 1898, the regiment was mustered into service as the Third Illinois Volunteers, for the Spanish-American War. After taking part in the Puerto Rican Campaign, it was mustered out January 24, 1898. It was reorganized as the Third Regiment, Illinois National Guard, under command of Colonel Arthur E. Fisher, of Rockford, Illinois. Colonel Fisher was succeeded in 1905 by Colonel Richings J. Shand, also of Rockford, Illinois; and he by Colonel Charles H. Greene, of Aurora, Illinois, in 1910.

June 19, 1916, the regiment, as the Third Illinois Infantry, under Colonel Greene, was mustered for duty on the Mexican Border. It was mustered out February 21, 1917. It was reorganized in the service of the Illinois National Guard, and was mustered into service for the World War under Colonel Greene, July 28, 1917. It trained at Camp Logan, Houston, Texas, under Colonels Greene, Matthew C. Smith, and Charles H. Payne, was redesignated the 129th Infantry, and May 2, 1918, entrained for its journey to France. The regiment took part in the following major offensives: Amiens, Verdun-Frommerville, Meuse-Argonne and Troyon. In July, 1918, Colonel Edgar A. Myer succeeded Colonel Greene in command. The regiment remained as part of the Army of Occupation after the Armistice, until May, 1919, when it returned to the United States. It was mustered out June 6, 1919, at Camp Grant, Illinois.

Regimental reorganization was commenced in 1921 under command of Colonel Diller S. Myers, of Pontiac, Illinois. The regiment was redesignated 129th Infantry, National Guard of the United States, and was again assigned to the 65th Brigade, 33rd Division. Colonel William F. Hemenway, of Sycamore, Illinois, in 1930, succeeded Colonel Myers, who had been promoted to command the 65th Brigade. He served until his retirement as a Brigadier General early in 1939, when Lieutenant Colonel Cassius Poust, of Sycamore, Illinois, the present Regimental Commander, was promoted to Colonel. All three Regimental Commanders since the World War were active officers of the regiment throughout its World War Service.

The Regiment has participated in all annual field training periods of the 33rd Division, including the Second Army maneuvers in Michigan in 1936 and in Wisconsin in 1940.

Date of induction—March 5, 1941. Arrived at Camp Forrest, Tennessee, on March 20, 1941.

HISTORY OF THE 130th INFANTRY



Shield: Argent, a fess gules, of the first, and vert fesswise between in chief two arrows of the second saltirewise behind a black hawk proper and in base a fleur-de-lis of the second: over all a saltire azure.

Crest: That for the regiments of the Illinois National Guard: On a wreath argent and azure the blockhouse of Old Fort Dearborn proper.

Motto: Always ready.

Description: The shield is white, the old Infantry color. Service in the Black Hawk War is symbolized by the black hawk and the two red arrows. Service in the Mexican War by the horizontal belt across the shield of red, white and green, the colors of the Mexican flag. The Civil War service is indicated by the blue saltire cross from the Confederate flag. The service in France during the World War is indicated by the fleur-de-lis.

The Fourth Regiment of the Illinois Militia was organized during the administration of Governor Ninian Edwards. Served as such in the Federal Service October 14th to November 5th, 1812; again in the Black Hawk War, April 21st to May 27th, 1832; in the Mexican War from June 5th, 1846, to May 23rd, 1847, and answered the call of the President for volunteers in 1861, being mustered into the service April 29th as the 10th Regiment, Illinois Volunteer Infantry, this designation being given by Act of the Illinois Legislature which met April 23rd, 1861, as a mark of deference to the Mexican War Service.

Upon reorganization of the State Militia after the Civil War this regiment was reorganized in the same territory and given the same name as the original organization.

This regiment served during the Spanish-American War as the Fourth Regiment, Illinois Volunteer Infantry, from April 26th, 1898, to May 2nd, 1899.

In the Mexican Border Service, served as the Fourth Infantry, Illinois National Guard, from June 27th, 1916, to March 15, 1917.

In the World War this regiment was mustered into the Federal Service as the Fourth Infantry, Illinois National Guard, and subsequently the 130th Infantry, 33rd Division, and was in the United States Service from July 25th, 1917 to May 31st, 1919.

Reorganized as the Fourth Infantry, Illinois National Guard, 1921. The Fourth and Fifth Regiments, Illinois National Guard, consolidated under the name of the Fourth Infantry, Illinois National Guard, June 22nd, 1921, Special Orders No. 74, AGO of Illinois.

The Colors of the 130th Infantry are decorated with Streamers of eight campaigns and the regiment has participated with distinction in twenty-eight battles and engagements.

STATE SERVICE

This regiment has served the State of Illinois, under official call of the Governor, during disorders and disasters, a far greater number of occasions than any other regiment of the Illinois National Guard, and as far as records are available, the regiment has had more service of this kind than any other National Guard regiment within the United States. During the years of 1932-33, units of the regiment were continuously on duty in Sangamon and Christian counties for a period of fourteen months. Its most recent duty of this kind was during the flood in southern Illinois from January 21 to April 5th, 1937, during which duty the officers and men of the regiment distinguished themselves with honor to the regiment and to the National Guard of Illinois.

Born June 1, 1884, at Delavan, Illinois. Enlisted as a Private in Company K, 5th Infantry, Illinois National Guard, on June 18, 1904. Commissioned 2nd Lieutenant, October 1, 1904. Appointed 1st Lieutenant, January 1, 1912, and promoted to Captain the following year, on November 25th. Entered Federal service at the call of the President, March 27, 1917. Graduated from Infantry School of Small Arms at Fort Sill, in August that same year. Commanded Company K, Fifth Infantry (a part of the newly-organized 123rd Machine Gun Battalion) during its entire service in the American Expeditionary Force. Commissioned Major, January 3, 1918. Graduated from the Machine Gun School in March of that year.

While overseas, his command distinguished themselves in the Somme offensive, the Meuse-Argonne, and in Picardy and Lorraine. Was decorated with the Silver Star and the Order of the Purple Heart.

Upon returning to the United States, was discharged from service May 31, 1919. Re-entered the Illinois National Guard on December 7, 1921, as Major. Reorganized the 130th Infantry Regiment and became Colonel of that Regiment on March 9, 1922. Served on the War Department General Staff from August 18, 1922, until May 6, 1923. Was graduated from the G-2 Course in the Army War College in 1926, and in 1927 from the Command and General Staff School at Fort Leavenworth. Returned to Washington in 1929 to serve as Chief of the Regulation Division of the National Guard Bureau until 1933. Was promoted to Brigadier General on May 14, 1940, and assigned to command the 66th Infantry Brigade.

HISTORY OF THE 66th INFANTRY BRIGADE



Badge: Approved May 12, 1930. Superimposed on a yellow cross cantoned with rays of silver forming 12 points, a gold annulet bearing on sinister side three heads of wheat and on dexter side three ears of corn, and surrounding an enameled disk of solid blue, surmounted by a silver head of Abraham Lincoln.

HISTORY OF THE 66TH INFANTRY BRIGADE

When the 33rd Infantry Division was organized at Camp Logan, Houston, Texas, in 1917, the 1st Brigade consisting of the 1st Illinois and 2nd Illinois Regiments, and commanded by Brigadier General D. Jack Foster, became the 66th Infantry Brigade, by General Order, 33rd Division, dated October 9, 1917. The 1st Illinois Regiment, known as the "Dandy First," was formed in 1874 and the 2nd Illinois Regiment was formed in 1875. The regiments were re-designated the 131st and 132nd Infantry Regiments, respectively, and the 124th Machine Gun Battalion (made up of Companies C and D, 5th Infantry and the Machine Gun Company 7th Infantry, with later Company C, 122nd Machine Gun Battalion, Company C, 5th Infantry) added to complete the Brigade.

When General Foster retired because of ill health, Brigadier General Paul A. Wolf of the Regular Army was assigned to command in March, 1918. He took the Brigade overseas in May, 1918, commanded it during all its active operations and brought it back to the United States when it was mustered out in 1919.

After a period of seasoning back of British sector near Amiens, four Companies of the 66th Infantry Brigade participated with the Australians in the capture of Hamel, July 4, 1918. In August the 131st Infantry fought at Chippilly Ridge and Gussaire Woods. The Brigade participated in the Somme Offensive of 1918 and held defensive Sector in Picardy. After leaving the British Sector late in August, the Brigade as a part of the First American Army took over the Famous Dead Man's Hill Sector north of Verdun and in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive as the extreme right of the First Army on September 26 captured Forges Wood, "an exceptionally formidable position bristling with machine guns, which successfully had defied the French, and which the Germans boasted never could be taken by direct assault." On October 7th, units of the Brigade participated in the crossing of the Meuse at Consenvoye and the actions east of the Meuse. Upon being relieved from the Meuse-Argonne action on October 24th after almost a month of hard fighting, the Brigade saw action in the St. Mihiel Salient where it was engaged in the operation of the Second American Army against Metz where the Armistice put an end to active combat.

Following the Armistice the Brigade was stationed in Luxembourg as a part of the Army of Occupation during the Winter of 1918-1919, returned to the United States in May, 1919, and was mustered out of service of the United States at Camp Grant, Rockford, Illinois.

Upon the re-organization of the Illinois National Guard in June, 1920, Brigadier General Abel Davis, war time Commander of the 132nd Infantry, became Commander; he was succeeded upon his retirement in September, 1930, by Brigadier General John J. Garrity, who in turn retired for age in 1933 and was succeeded by Brigadier General Thomas S. Hammond who resigned in May, 1940, when the present Commander, Brigadier General Albert L. Culbertson, was assigned.

HISTORY OF THE 131st INFANTRY



BLAZONRY

Shield: Azure, a closet between two wavy barrulets, surmounted by a pairle argent, over all the old insignia of the First Infantry, Illinois National Guard. (Wheel within a diamond) proper; in chief four fleur-de-lis, three and one, of the second.

Crest: That for regiments of Illinois National Guard.

Motto: *Ducit Amor Patriae* (Led by love of country).

DESCRIPTION

The shield is blue—the present Infantry color—and the main charges are silver or white—the old Infantry facing color. The pairle is taken from the Chicago seal; the first wavy barrulet represents Spanish War service; the closet Mexican Border duty, and the second wavy barrulet represents the second time the organization was in Federal service overseas; the four fleur-de-lis represent the engagement during the World War; the charge in the fess point is the insignia of the old First Infantry, Illinois National Guard.

The organization of the 131st Infantry, then known as the First Infantry was started in August, 1874, and completed December 21, 1875. Later it was redesignated as the First Illinois Volunteers.

The following Colonels have commanded the regiment in turn: Price G. Sherman, A. C. McClurg, George R. Davis, Wm. G. Sherer, Act., Edgar D. Swain, Charles Fitzsimmons, E. B. Knox, C. R. E. Koch, Henry L. Turner, Joseph B. Sanborn, Anson L. Bolte, Francis M. Allen, John M. Richmond, and Andrew T. McAnsh, present Commander.

The regiment participated in the quelling of seven instances of uprisings throughout Illinois, and has represented the state at seven celebrations, as follows: World Columbian Exposition, Atlanta Exposition, Pan-American Exposition, Louisiana Purchase Exposition, Illinois Soldiers' Monument Dedication, Crown Point Auto Races, and the Panama-Pacific Exposition.

The regiment's record in the World War is memorable. It served along the entire front in the following armies and corps: First, Second and Third American Armies; Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth and Ninth American Corps; Fourth Army, British E. F.; 19th and 111th British Corps; Fourth Australian Corps; Second French Army, 17th French Corps, and 11th French Colonial Corps. Twenty-four engagements and local operations are recorded; 13 officers and 262 men killed in action; 62 officers and 2,245 men wounded or gassed; two officers and 17 men were captured by the enemy and returned after the Armistice.

The advances gained by the regiment total 24,615 meters; 12 German officers and 2,088 other ranks were captured, as were five pieces of heavy artillery, 57 pieces of light artillery, six trench mortars, 210 machine guns, 266 rifles and one German airplane.

Also captured were thousands of high explosive shells, and enormous quantities of material, including a complete narrow gauge railroad, hand grenades, lumber, ambulances, signals, Lewis guns, clothing and other articles used by the Germans.

Decorations received by members of the regiment consist of 87 American medals, 45 British, 32 French and nine Belgian, a total of 173, and about 200 citations for meritorious conduct.

The official record of the regiment is as follows: Organized as First Infantry, December 21, 1875; Federal military service (Spanish War), May 13, 1898; redesignated First Illinois Volunteers; served in Cuba July 9, 1898, to August 25, 1898; mustered out November 17, 1898. Federal military service (Mexican Border), June 21, 1916; served at Camp Wilson, San Antonio, Texas; mustered out October 4, 1916. Federal military service (World War), April 4, 1917; drafted August 5, 1917; redesignated 131st Infantry, October 10, 1917; arrived France, May 30, 1918; served with British, American and French armies; mustered out June 6, 1919. Reorganized as First Infantry, 1919; redesignated 131st Infantry, December 13, 1921. Inducted into Federal service on March 5, 1941 as the 131st Infantry.

HISTORY OF THE 132nd INFANTRY



SHIELD: Argent, a pairle azure between in chief an oak tree proper within a circle of 5 mullets gules, a palm tree to dexter and a prickly pear cactus to sinister both of the third.

CREST: That for regiments of Illinois National Guard.

WREATH: Argent and azure.

MOTTO: Semper Paratus (Ever ready).

DESCRIPTION: The shield is white charged with the pairle which appears on the shield of the city of Chicago, shield and pairle are white and blue, the Infantry colors. The green oak tree is for Forges Wood and the stars represent the five major operations in which the regiment took part in France. The palm tree recalls Cuban and the cactus the Mexican border service.

The 132nd Infantry, whose home station prior to March 22, 1941, was at Chicago, Illinois, was organized in 1875 when Chicago was being rebuilt after the "Great Fire." The original units were known as the Clan-a-Gael Guards, the Emmett Guards, the Mulligan Guards, the Ellsworth Zouaves, and the Alpine Hunters. These organizations became Companies A, B, C, D, E, and F, and constituted a battalion of the Second Infantry.

Companies G and H were mustered early in 1876, completing the regiment of two battalions. John T. Torrence was commissioned as the first Colonel to rank from September 29, 1875.

July 1, 1877, the guard became a part of the First Brigade and designated Second Infantry, Illinois National Guard.

Early in 1877 the Sixth Battalion, an organization of four companies, was consolidated with the regiment.

On April 25, 1898, it received its call for service in the Spanish-American War, being mustered into Federal Service on May 16, 1898.

The regiment established itself at Camp Cuba Libre, Jacksonville, Florida, and embarked for Cuba on December 10, 1898. Evacuation of the Second Regiment from Cuba began March 28, 1899, and it was mustered out April 26, 1899.

The regiment was formally inducted into Federal Service on June 25, 1916, for duty on the Mexican border. It remained in Texas until September 3, 1916, then returned to Springfield, being mustered out of Federal Service on October 5, 1916. While Companies B, G, I, K, L, and M were on riot duty at East St. Louis, the regiment was called out for World War service. Proceeding to Camp Logan, Texas, and arriving September 12, 1917, the Second Regiment was redesignated as the 132nd Infantry, 66th Brigade, 33rd Division, U. S. Army, effective October 11, 1917, and is its official designation at this time.

The regiment arrived in Brest, France, May 24, 1918, and received its baptism of fire at Hamel on July 4. It participated in the following engagements: Amiens, July 17-August 5; Somme Offensive, August 8-20; Verdun-Frommerville, September 8-25; Meuse-Argonne, September 26-October 21; Troyon, October 25-November 11. It also participated in several minor actions. Ten officers and 250 men of the regiment were killed in action in France, and 30 officers and 1087 men were wounded. Among the many decorations awarded members of the regiment by the United States Government are five Congressional Medals of Honor, 54 Distinguished Service Crosses. In addition, the governments of England, France, Italy, and Belgium have awarded numerous decorations to members of the 132nd Infantry.

The 132nd Infantry was demobilized at Camp Grant, Illinois. In 1920 the regiment was again reorganized as the Second Infantry, I. N. G. The redesignation of the regiment as the 132nd Infantry, 66th Brigade, 33rd Division, Illinois National Guard, came on December 31, 1921.

As a component of the 33rd Division, the 132nd Infantry has participated in encampments at Camp Grant, Illinois, and participated in the Second Army maneuvers in Michigan in 1936 and at Sparta, Wisconsin, in 1940.

No history of the regiment would be complete without mentioning the names of the commanders who have helped make this regiment famous. Their names will bring back memories to many former members who are residing in all parts of the United States. In tribute to the leaders of the 132nd Infantry, we salute:

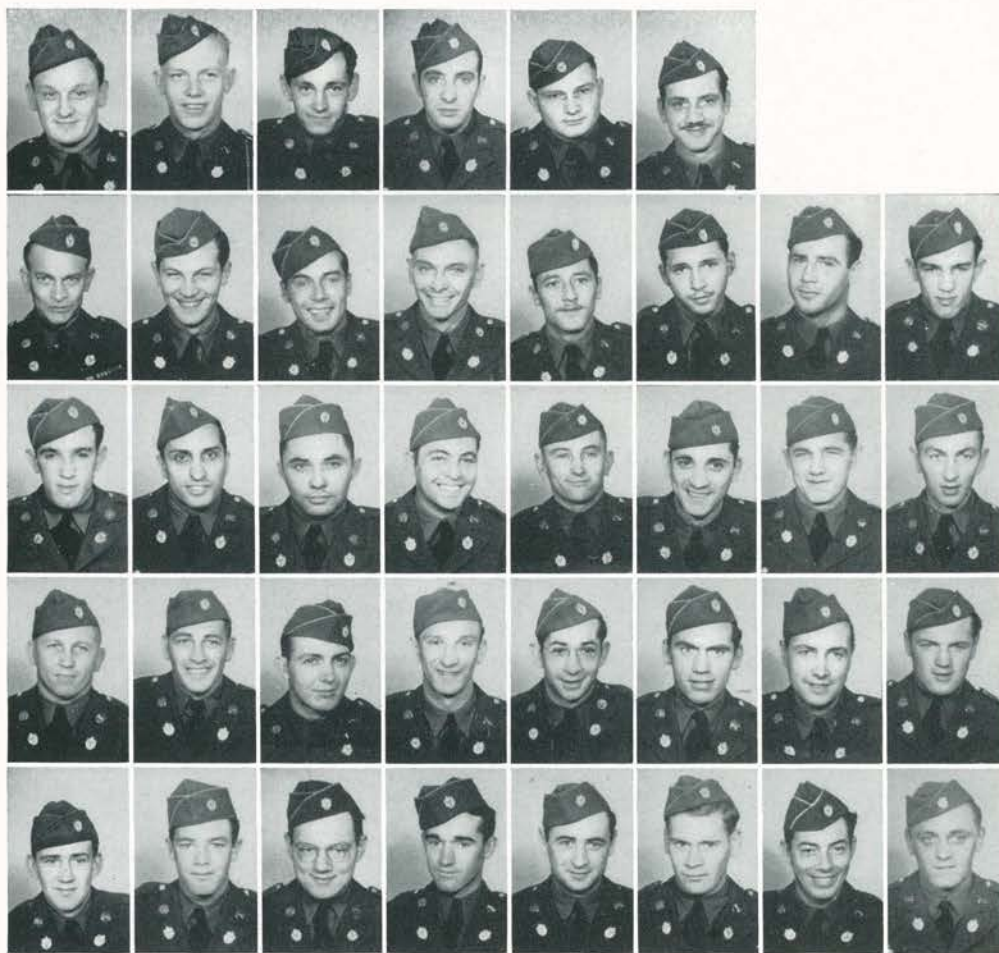
